### Greetings,

We received some welcome news last week: three of Iowa's leading cultural nonprofits received substantial grants from the U.S. Regional Arts Resilience Fund. ArtForce Iowa in Des Moines, the Englert Theatre in Iowa City and the Vesterheim Norwegian-American Museum each received about \$50,000 to help them weather the Covid-19 pandemic.

The national grant program is funded by the Mellon Foundation and regionally administered by Arts Midwest, which [distributed a total of \\$1.5 million to 30 organizations](#) in nine Midwestern states – chosen from a stack of more than 500 nominations.



Clearly, other Iowa organizations are struggling, too. But here at the Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs, we're heartened by this recent boost for three Iowa nonprofits and determined to help others follow their lead. We'll continue to spread the word about other resources and opportunities as they emerge.

## Derecho Recovery Resources

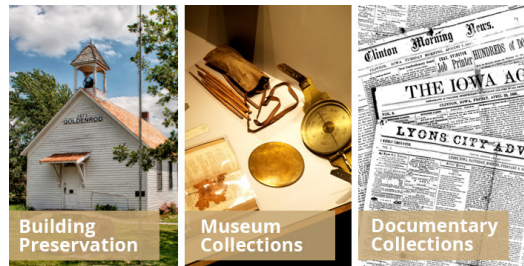
Private nonprofits and local governments in all the Iowa counties within the federally designated disaster area may be eligible for funding through the Iowa Department of Homeland Security & Emergency Management and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). ## Employer Innovation Fund

Grants up to \$100,000 are available to employers, community organizations and nonprofits for training, books and additional support – even childcare and transportation – for Iowans who are preparing for various high-demand careers that have been affected or eliminated by the pandemic. Iowa Workforce Development is offering the new opportunity through the Future Ready Iowa program and will accept applications through Sept. 16.



## Emergency Funds for Historical Resources

If a historic building, museum or collection in your area was damaged by last month's derecho storm, it may be eligible for an emergency grant through the Historical Resource Development Program, which is overseen by the State Historical Society of Iowa. Limited funds for all kinds of historical resources are available throughout the year, on a first-come, first-served basis.

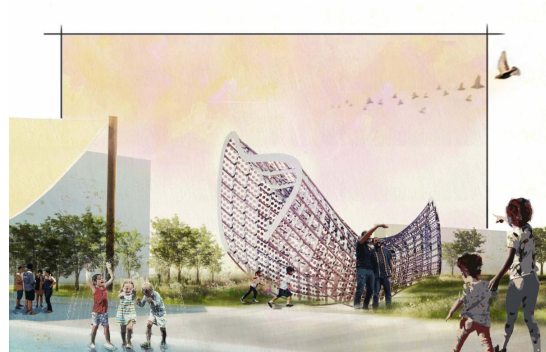

The city of Johnston is commissioning an interactive sculpture for its new town center. The winning design came from Reinaldo Correa, who teaches architecture at Iowa State University and hired some help: three students who had lost their summer internships because of the pandemic. The sculpture, called "Ripples" (aka "Big Fish"), is inspired by a largemouth bass and will feature kinetic



scales and changing colored lights after its installation, set for April 2021.
