Iowa invests \$7 million in relief for arts and culture

It's been a tough year for Iowa artists, musicians, music venues, theaters and museums, but the creative industry got [a \\$7 million boost](#) on Tuesday from the Iowa Arts & Culture Recovery Program. In all, 267 organizations and 152 individual artists in more than 100 communities across the state received one-time grants funded by the CARES Act and administered by the Iowa Arts Council, a division of the Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs.

While the relief program was highly competitive, the IAC and department funded 75 percent of requests, demonstrating support for arts and culture statewide. Additionally:

- More than half of the grants were distributed to cultural organizations with annual budgets under \$250,000.
- The average grant for organizations and venues was just over \$25,000.
- Funding was prioritized for artists and organizations that serve rural areas, culturally diverse populations or under-represented groups.

So when it's safe to gather again – for concerts, plays, festivals and more – the people who present them will be in a better position to do so.

"I'm so proud and grateful that we could support artists, venues and organizations when they need it most and thankful to our team for how they responded to the challenge of reviewing so many applications in a short amount of time," Iowa Arts Council Administrator David Schmitz said. "It's remarkable how our field has continued to create, innovate and keep us connected throughout the pandemic, in spite of the personal and financial challenges so many have faced. This funding is an important morale boost, as well as a critical investment in our future."
