FY 2021 Q4 IUP Updates Ready for Public Review

The Fiscal Year 2021 Intended Use Plan (IUP) Fourth Quarter Update for the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) and the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) are now available for public review and comment at the following locations:

The IUPs cover the period of July 1, 2020 - June 30, 2021. Public comments are welcome. Draft project lists are also available for review.

Written comments will be accepted through Thursday, February 18, 2020. It is anticipated that the Iowa Environmental Protection Commission will act on the IUPs at their March 16, 2021 meeting.

Did you know... that due to project workload and for planning purposes, the SRF staff evaluates projects that have been on the Intended Use Plan's (IUP) Project Priority List (PPL) for more than three years? A notification is sent to the applicants that their project may be dropped from the IUP if there is no progress in the six months following the notice. There are no penalties or negative implications associated with being dropped from the IUP. Applicants can reapply when the project is ready to move ahead.

IFA Water Quality Financing Program Now Accepting Applications

Applications are now being accepted for the Water Quality Financing Program.

The Water Quality Financing Program was created in 2018 as a revolving loan fund to finance projects that improve water quality. Priority is given to projects that are collaborative efforts. Projects can address either point source or nonpoint source water quality issues.

Eligible applicants include municipalities, landowners, public utilities, rural water districts and industries that are required by the Nutrient Reduction Strategy (NRS) to collect data and evaluate alternatives to reduce discharges of nitrogen and phosphorous.

Applications are due **March 12, 2021**. The application and program rules can be found on the <u>IFA Water Quality Resources web page</u>.
