





State Appropriation: General Fund resources provided to address the needs of salary adjustment.

Identified Need: Department of Management determination of the need prior to the General Assembly appropriating the funds, based on a comparison of budget and projection per each employee's position.

Difference: The total surplus or deficit after matching the need to the resources provided.

Prorate: If this equals 100.0%, resources met or exceeded the need, and the balance reverted. If less than 100.0%, resources were less than the total need.

Notes:

- FY 1997 The State appropriation includes a carryforward of \$3.3 million and \$3.0 million for health insurance.
- FY 2000 The appropriation is after a reduction of \$2.7 million in HF 2039 (FY 2000 Deappropriation Act).
- FY 2002 The appropriation is after two Iowa Code Section 8.31(5) appropriation reductions by the Governor totaling \$38,800 and the utilization of \$9.0 million from the Underground Storage Tank Fund.
- FY 2003 Utilized \$41.1 million from Regents demutualization and the Underground Storage Tank Fund.
- FY 2004 The Board of Regents employees did not directly receive salary funding. Amount includes the \$13.5 million transfer from Medicaid and \$2,900 lowa Code Section 8.31 reduction.
- FY 2005 The preliminary need estimate was \$69.6 million. However, the Governor made no recommendation and no funds were appropriated.
- FY 2006 The total includes the \$2.4 million increase from HF 882 (FY 2006 Standing Appropriations Act).
- FY 2007 The total excludes the Board of Regents and Judicial Branch.













□Solid Waste □Agriculture Management □Storage Tank □Household Hazardous Waste





The General Assembly also dedicated two other sources of revenue to the RIIF, the interest earnings from the Cash Reserve and Economic Emergency Funds, and funds from the State Wagering Tax allocation after the required distribution to local units of government and the next \$60.0 million is deposited into the General Fund.
- 2) In the 2000 Legislative Session, SF 2453 (FY 2001 Infrastructure Appropriations Act) created the Environment First Fund (EFF) and provided a standing appropriation from the RIIF. The Act provided that interest earned on the EFF is deposited in the RIIF.
- 3) In FY 2002 through FY 2004, the interest from the Cash Reserve and Economic Emergency Funds was transferred to the General Fund.
- 4) Changes were made to wagering tax allocations in the 2000, 2001, 2009, and 2010 Legislative Sessions. For more information on the distribution of wagering taxes see Fact Book page entitled State Gambling Wagering Tax Allocations.
- 5) Beginning in FY 2010, the unsecuritized Master Settlement Agreement tobacco payments will transfer into the RIIF. For FY 2012, the amount is estimated at \$15.9 million and is reflected in the Other column.
- 6) For FY 2011, the amount of wagering tax includes the unobligated amount from the \$55.0 million in wagering tax that is allocated for debt service on the 2009 and 2010 revenue bonds. In addition, beginning in FY 2011, the wagering tax total includes the unneeded amount from the debt service on the school infrastructure bonds. The allocation for those bonds is \$5.0 million, but an estimated \$1.5 million will transfer back to the RIIF annually. Lastly, as of FY 2011, the \$3.8 million allocated for the Federal Subsidy Holdback Fund that transfers to the RIIF after the subsidy is received, is included in the wagering tax totals.



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DISTRIBUTION OF IOWA'S MANUFACTURED EXPORTS (Calendar Year 2010)



Calendar Year 2010 (in millions)



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



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IOWA SINGLE UNIT HOUSING PERMITS ISSUED




VALUE OF IOWA SINGLE UNIT HOUSING PERMITS ISSUED





SALES OF CARS, TRUCKS, AND MULTI-PURPOSE VEHICLES IN IOWA



FARM REAL ESTATE IOWA AVERAGE VALUE PER ACRE






ANIMAL MIXED FEED TONAGE IN IOWA



CORN AND SOYBEAN MARKET YEAR IOWA AVERAGE PRICE PER BUSHEL







WORKERS COMPENSATION SUMMARY IOWA STATE EMPLOYEES





LABOR FORCE IN IOWA





NONFARM EMPLOYMENT IN IOWA September 2010 - September 2011




NONFARM EMPLOYMENT COMPARED TO TOTAL IOWA POPULATION

PERCENT OF IOWA POPULATION EMPLOYED IN NONFARM OCCUPATIONS



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UNEMPLOYMENT RATES IN IOWA BY ETHNIC CATEGORY OF WORKERS Calendar Year 2009












LOCATION OF STATE PARKS







(\$ in millions)













(\$ in millions)







ENROLLMENT BY TYPE OF IOWA HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTION






IOWA BOARD OF REGENTS INSTITUTIONS TOTAL ENROLLMENT FALL 2011







AVERAGE DAILY CENSUS IOWA HUMAN SERVICES INSTITUTIONS







MONTHLY FOSTER CARE COST BY TYPE OF CARE
















DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES DECATEGORIZATION PROJECTS IN IOWA





LEGAL COUNSEL COSTS FOR INDIGENT DEFENDANTS IN IOWA






- There were 1,613,740 offenders incarcerated nationally on December 31, 2009. This is an increase of 0.2% compared to one year ago.
- The prison incarceration rate is estimated to be 502 inmates per 100,000 residents. This is a decrease of 0.7% compared to one year ago. This rate includes all inmates held in federal and state prisons.
- States experiencing the most growth in 2009 are: Pennsylvania, Florida, Louisiana, and Alabama.
- There were 24 states that experienced prison population decreases led by Michigan, California, New York, Mississippi, and Texas.
- The federal system held 208,118 inmates at year end 2009, making it the largest penal system in the country.
- California (171,275 inmates), Texas (171,249 inmates), and the federal system (208,118 inmates) together held 39.2% of all prisoners in the country.
- Since 2000, the number of federal prisoners has increased 43.1%, while the number of inmates held for state convictions increased 12.8%.
- lowa's prison population increased 10.5% between FY 2001 and FY 2011.
- At year end 2009, privately-operated facilities held 129,336 inmates, a decrease of 0.1% compared to 2008. Private facilities held 8.0% of all state and federal inmates.
- Imprisonment rates are calculated by the number of sentenced inmates per 100,000 residents. Louisiana had the highest prison imprisonment rate (881 inmates) followed by Mississippi (702 inmates), Oklahoma (657 inmates), Texas (648 inmates), and Alabama (650 inmates).
- Maine (150 inmates) had the lowest imprisonment rate.
- lowa ranks 39th in the nation in terms of the imprisonment rate, with 292 inmates per 100,000 residents.
- Community supervision includes offenders on probation and parole. At year end 2010, approximately 1 in 48 adults in the United States was on community supervision.
- lowa had 25,600 offenders on community supervision as of year end 2010, a decrease of 3.0% compared to one year ago. lowa had 1,101 offenders on community supervision per 100,000 total residents.

JAILS

- There were 748,728 people held in local jails across the nation on June 30, 2010, a decrease of 18,706 (2.4%) inmates compared to one year ago. This is the second year in a row of decreases since the Bureau of Justice Statistics began surveying jails.
- The jail incarceration rate was 242 inmates per 100,000 residents at mid-year 2010, a decrease of 3.2% compared to 2009.
- Local jurisdictions reported adding 16,887 jail beds during the last year, for a total rated capacity of 866,782 beds.
- Jails were operating at 86.4% of rated capacity on June 30, 2010.

IOWA JUDICIAL DISTRICTS AND LOCATION OF ADULT CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES





Functionally Obsolete

Bridges classified as functionally obsolete do not have land widths, shoulder widths, or vertical clearances adequate to serve traffic demand, or the bridge may not be able to handle occasional roadway flooding. While it is not unsafe for all vehicles, the older design features cannot adequately accommodate current traffic volumes or vehicle sizes and weights.

Structurally Deficient


A bridge is structurally deficient if there is significant deterioration of the bridge deck, supports, or other major components. Bridges that are structurally deficient are restricted to carrying lower weight vehicles or a closed if they are found to be unsafe. The classification of a bridge as "structurally" deficient does not mean the structure is unsafe and most structurally deficient bridges can continue to serve traffic safely if they are properly inspected and maintained.










COUNTY DECENNIAL POPULATIONS MAP IOWA - 2010



REGISTERED IOWA VOTERS BY COUNTY 2011










METHAMPHETAMINE LAB SEIZURES IN IOWA CALENDAR YEAR







BIRTHS TO IOWA MOTHERS UNDER 20 YEARS OF AGE









CLIENTS RECEIVING GAMBLING TREATMENT COUNSELING







2010 CENSUS INFORMATION FOR IOWA

NATIONAL COMPARISON

- Iowa had an estimated 3,046,355 residents in 2010 according to the U.S. Census Bureau, a gain of 120,031 compared to the 2000 census. This gain of 4.1% was less than the growth rate for the nation (9.7%).
- With the exceptions of Illinois, surrounding state populations grew at a rate greater than lowa's in the last decade. However, their growth rates were also less than the national average.
- Ten states, (Michigan, Rhode Island, Louisiana, Ohio, New York, West Virginia, Vermont, Massachusetts, Illinois, and Pennsylvania) had a slower growth rate than Iowa.
- Six states accounted for 54.0% of the total national population growth: Texas, California, Florida, Georgia, North Carolina and Arizona.
- Iowa's population increased by 10.5% since 1960. Only two states, North Dakota and West Virginia, had a smaller growth rate than Iowa during this time.
- Iowa's population growth of 27.0% during the last 100 years is the lowest growth rate in the nation.
- In 1910, lowa was the 15th most populous of the 46 states and the District of Columbia. By 2010, lowa ranked 30th in terms of population.


IOWA FACTS

- The farm population decreased substantially while small towns remained relatively stable. The number of people living in the country, but not in small towns or on farms, increased throughout the last 55 years.
- The number of people aged 75 years or older have increased each of the last five decades. Data from the Census Bureau's 2009 American Community Survey indicates Iowa had more residents 75 years old or older than children under the age of 5. There are 20 other states where this occurred.
- Projections by Woods and Poole Economics, Inc., indicate that Iowa's population will continue to age and grow slowly.
- In 2008 lowa had 947 incorporated places.
 - There were 675 places with less than 1,000 residents.
 - There were 118 places with between 1,000 and 1,999 residents.
 - There were 81 places with between 2,000 and 4,999 residents.
 - There were 38 places with between 5,000 and 9,999 residents.
 - There were 26 places with between 10,000 and 49,999 residents.
 - There were 10 places with greater than 50,000 residents.
- Twenty-two of lowa's counties gained residents since 2000. Of these, 13 counties had increases greater than 1,000 people.
- Population gains for Polk, Dallas, Johnson, and Linn counties exceeded 10,000 people.
- Seventy-seven counties experienced declining populations. Fifty-seven had population declines of at least 500 people. A total of 27 counties had declines greater than 1,000 people.
- Six counties had populations in excess of 100,000 people: Black Hawk, Johnson, Linn, Polk, Scott, and Woodbury. These six counties account for 38.8% of Iowa's total population.
- A total of 51.5% of Iowa's population is concentrated in 11 counties: Black Hawk, Clinton, Dallas, Dubuque, Johnson, Linn, Polk, Pottawattamie, Scott, Story, and Woodbury.





PERCENTAGE OF IOWA CHILDREN DIAGNOSED WITH LEAD POISONING BEFORE AGE SIX






Introduction


The Legislative Services Agency presents the following "Fact Maps." Data compiled for these maps is comprised of a wide variety of information from reliable sources. The intent is to provide useful and timely information in a format that conveys a readily identifiable picture of specific issues. Information provided includes:


- Property tax data for cities, counties, and school districts
- Local government budget data
- Property valuation data by classification
- Tax data including income tax, sales tax, local option sales tax, and property tax credits
- K-12 public education data including school district budgets, expenditures, staff salary, and enrollments
- Community College data including property tax, budget, and enrollments
- Regents enrollment and funding
- Farmland values
- Other information related to programs of the Economic Development Authority, the Department of Human Services, and the Department of Corrections
- Population data from the U.S. Census Bureau

Each map lists the sources of the information displayed. In most cases, the information has been compiled from sources outside the LSA, and the LSA has relied on those sources to verify the accuracy of the information. Requests for the data used in the maps should be made to the LSA.


