Celebrate Iowa History Month!



As we commemorate [Iowa's 175th anniversary](#) this year, we're taking a deeper dive into the state's past during [Iowa History Month](#). The celebration begins today with an [official proclamation](#) from Gov. Kim Reynolds, who pays tribute to key milestones dating back to Iowa's entry into the Union in 1846. (Watch the [video](#).)

The month-long lineup of [events and activities](#) includes a new museum exhibition, a statewide book club, at-home activities for children and families, an array of online presentations and much more.

Here are some ways you can join the celebration this month:



The Iowa's People & Places" exhibition opens March 5, at the State Historical Museum of Iowa and explores more than 13,000 years of history with artifacts from across the state. American Indian settlements, court rulings, legislation, immigration and elections set the course for Iowa and continue to affect Iowans today.



The exhibition's statewide mix of artifacts represents Iowa's cultural diversity, including stone tools made by some of Iowa's earliest inhabitants, handcrafted Meskwaki beadwork, an embroidered story cloth made by a Hmong immigrant, and several items from the life and high-flying career of astronaut Peggy Whitson.

Join us for "100 Years of Donna Reed," on March 25, when Reed's daughter, Mary Owen of Iowa City, will share rarely seen family photos from her mother's early days in Denison. Reed's career includes her Academy Award-winning performance in "From Her to Eternity" (1953) and "The Donna Reed Show" (1958-1966), for which she won a Golden Globe and four Emmy Award nominations. She's best known, of course, as Mary Bailey in "It's a Wonderful Life" (1946), which marks its 75th anniversary this year.

Grants for Historic Preservation, Education and Research

Sharpen your grant-writing skills: We're now accepting grant applications for the upcoming fiscal year, which begins July 1.

Historical Resource

Development Program

This program provides up to \$50,000 for the preservation, conservation and interpretation of history by encouraging individuals and organizations to educate the public about historical resources, including historic buildings, museum collections and documentary materials.

Deadline: May 3.

Country School Grant

The Country School grant provides up to \$5,000 for the preservation and maintenance of Iowa's one- and two-room country schools. The funds also may be used for interpreting the history of country schools or

for educational activities taking place in a country school.


Research Grant for Authors

The Research Grant for Authors supports historical research and interpretive writing on topics related to Iowa history. Proposals that pursue neglected topics or new approaches to more familiar topics will receive preference. Grant recipients will be expected to produce a manuscript to be considered for publication by *The Annals of Iowa*.
