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Renewing Participation in BRIDGES

This summary regarding the **BRIDGES** eBook service is thanks to Eunice Riesberg, Consultant with Northeast District. Recently, the State Library issued an RFP for **BRIDGES**, the downloadable eBook / audiobook service for Iowa public libraries. The existing contract with OverDrive is due to expire this June, and as a state agency, we are required to go through a bid process in order to secure a new contract. The RFP is found here <u>http://bidopportunities.iowa.gov</u>. Note that this is a separate process from the current online resources review project that is happening concurrently.

Eunice writes: "...As was true in 2015, this bidding process pushes back our normal reenrollment procedure by a few months. We will wait until the new contract is signed to issue the **FY22 Letters of Agreement** for you to sign. We look for that to happen in early June, so we will be expecting a quick turnaround on the signed agreements. We suggest putting this item on your board agendas in May so you're ready to get the **Letters of Agreement** signed as soon as possible when they are released..."

Anticipated Timeline

The bidding process will also slow down the process for libraries joining **BRIDGES** for the first time. We anticipate new libraries will be able to enroll and be onboarded in the first quarter of FY22. Here is our estimated timeframe for current **BRIDGES** libraries and those wanting to join

• May == Place the topic "BRIDGES RENEWAL" on your board agendas, so that boards approve renewing participation ahead of when the *Letters of Agreement* arrive in June; this way, you can secure the needed signatures quickly without waiting for another board meeting.

- Early June == Contract signed by State Library and selected vendor; Letters of Agreement issued to current BRIDGES member libraries
- Mid-June == Return your library's signed Letter of Agreement
- Late September == New libraries enroll and onboarded to BRIDGES

Understand that this schedule is tentative and may change; we will communicate any important updates as soon as possible. If you have any questions, please contact anyone from the **BRIDGES Team**. And thank you for thinking ahead and ensuring a smooth transition to the new **BRIDGES** contract for FY22!

Join Our Collection Development Team!

The State Library of Iowa is looking for volunteers to serve on a collection development team to choose materials for the **BRIDGES** Consortium. Our goal is to have a group of eighteen people in place by late spring, with the new selectors taking over July 1st.

Here's How It Will Work

• Collection development responsibilities will rotate among team members, with each member responsible for choosing and ordering materials (both audiobooks and eBooks) two months of the year. This will be a three-year commitment, for a total of six months.

- There will be three people selecting each month: one for adult non-fiction, one for adult fiction and one for youth materials--both children and teens. Selectors will operate within an established monthly budget.
- Any staff member from a **BRIDGES** library is welcome to apply. We anticipate the time commitment to be 5-10 hours per month and again, only in the months when people are actually assigned the selection.
- Committee members will be provided with a collection development policy and instructions in the selection process.

As noted in the article above, because the State Library is going through a bid process for a product to provide a platform for downloadable eBooks, it is possible this timeline and process may change.


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
