Note.—Calhoun county was originally called Fox county; Lyon was called Bancroft, Monroe, Keokuk, Washington, Hampshire, and Franklin; Hamilton county was called Lincoln and subsequently formed part of the territory which has been annexed to Humboldt county, originally created under that name, was afterwards divided between Kosciusko and Hamilton counties. The northern part of Kosciusko county, with the northern half of that of Hamilton county, was attached to the county of Humboldt. The northern part of Kosciusko county, with the northern half of Humboldt was united with Keokuk in 1838. The territory which has since been annexed to Hamilton county as that of Humboldt was again detached. Webster county was at first called York and was united with Riley and two tiers of townships in Humboldt to form Webster; in 1837, Hamilton county was detached, and also one tier of townships to Humboldt.

SURPLUS

Agricultural Productions of Iowa, for the year ending April 30th, 1869, as shown by Shipments over the several Railways of the State.

Believing that it would be a matter of interest, not only to the citizens of the State, but to citizens of other States, wishing to migrate to Iowa, to engage either in business or agricultural pursuits, to be able to ascertain the amount of surplus agricultural productions of the State, or of any particular locality therein, for the period of one year; and believing the desired information could be obtained with less labor and more accurately by procuring the shipments for that period by the several railways traversing the State, than by attempting to ascertain it through the assessors at the time of taking the Census, I made an arrangement early in the year, by permission of the Census Board, with Hon. J. M. Shaffer, the worthy and energetic Secretary of the State Agricultural Society, to procure, if possible, the shipments of agricultural productions from the various railroad stations in the State, as shown by the books of the several railroads, for the twelve months ending April 30th, 1869. The following exhibits of shipments by months show the result of his labor.

In addition to the Tables furnished by the several railroads, giving the shipments from the various stations thereon for each of the twelve months ending April 30th, 1869, I have caused to be prepared and published therewith, tables for each of the several roads, exhibiting the total shipments from each station thereon, and the total shipments of the road; also one table, showing the aggregate shipments by all the railroads for the year. This aggregate does not show the entire surplus agricultural productions of the State for the above named period, as it will be noticed that the shipments by railroad from the cities of McGregor and Dubuque are not included therein, and the shipments by the Des Moines Valley Railroad are for six months only—ending June 30, 1869.

In addition to the above, and to complete the tables, the shipments by river from the several towns on the Mississippi and Missouri should be included—an item of much importance, but one which it has been impossible to obtain.

Hon. Ed Wright, Secretary of State, Des Moines, Iowa:

SIR—I have the honor to transmit herewith certain railroad statistics, collected in accordance with the request of the State Census Board. In the absence of definite instructions from the Board in regard to the kind and character of the statistics, I consulted with prominent railroad statisticians, and the forms now

presented were adopted. Instead of showing off the work of the roads, it was thought best to select only the principal products carried eastward from each station in Iowa, for the year ending April 30th, 1869.

My acknowledgments are due the following persons for their co-operation in this matter. The figures on the Des Moines Valley Road were furnished by John Given, General Freight Agent; Milo Smith, Superintendent. Those on the Burlington and Missouri River Road by E. A. Touzalin, General Passenger Agent; G. C. Morton, General Freight Agent; C. E. Perkins, Superintendent. Those on the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Road by Louis Viele, General Freight Agent; E. St. John, General Ticket Agent; P. A. Hall, Superintendent. Those on the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad, by M. M. Kirkman, General Accountant; Henry R. Pearson, Vice-President. Those on the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Road by Wm. McCredie, Freight Auditor; Robert Harris, Superintendent. Those on the Illinois Central by Joseph F. Tucker, General Agent; M. Hughitt, Superintendent. Those on the Milwaukee and St. Paul Road, by J. P. Whaling, Freight Auditor.

The statistics to my mind are especially valuable because they show, more satisfactorily than any other set of figures, the resources of the several localities in the State. The citizen can see at a glance the amount and kind of produce that is carried from the particular station in those neighborhoods in which he is interested, and he will often find himself astonished. The emigrant seeking a home among us can learn which will be the best locality for him to select, according to his tastes, in stock, or grain, or other product. Again, capitalists who seek investment, can have something; and already these very tables have been called for by a company of men about to locate a railroad, to enable them to make some estimate of the resources and capacities of the country along the proposed route. Hoping that the figures will meet your approbation and will accomplish good results to our glorious State, I remain, Your obedient servant,

NOTE.—The above Table was prepared from the best information at hand, and will not vary much from the true figures. The figures in the first column were obtained from the reports made to the State Treasurer pursuant to the provisions of sec. 1, chap. 196, Laws 1868, hence are correct. The estimates in the fourth column are made with the understanding, that the Cedar Falls and Minnesota Road will reach the State line by January 1st, 1870; the McGregor and Missouri River Railway will reach Clear Lake; the Iowa Falls and Sioux City will build twenty miles after this date (Nov. 4th); the Central Railroad of Iowa will reach Marshalltown; the Burlington and Missouri Road will be completed to the Council Bluffs and St. Jo. Crossing; the Des Moines Valley Road will reach Ft. Dodge; the Burlington, Cedar Rapids and Minnesota Road will reach the Washington Branch Junction, and be built from Cedar Rapids to Vinton; and the St. Louis and Cedar Rapids Road will reach Ottumwa.

In most of the foregoing cases, I am assured that the estimated amount of road to be built will be fully completed by the first of January, 1870. Should such be the case the total length of road built, not including side-tracks, from January 1st, 1869, to January 1st, 1870, will be 648 1-2 miles.

The vote for Governor and Lieutenant-Governor was not canvassed, and remains as the work of the incoming Legislature. The majorities of Merrill and Walden will be about the same as that of Judge Dillon. Merrill's majority at his first election—in 1867—was 28,790.

Total vote for Judge of the Supreme Court, 154,014. John F. Dillon over Wm. F. Brannan, 40,208; Dillon's majority over all others, 23,372.

Total vote for Superintendent of Public Instruction, 150,114. Abraham S. Kissell over H. O. Dayton, 50,130; Kissell, (including 12 votes for Abraham F. Kissell), over all others, 45,602. To fill vacancy—Kissell over Dayton, 55,602; Kissell's majority, 51,470.

Total vote, in 1868, was 194,439; diminution this year, 40,407, or 20.78 per cent; Republican falling off, 23,706, or 19.69 per cent; Democratic falling off, 16,792, or 22.56 per cent. The vote for Governor, when canvassed, will show a still larger Democratic loss.

Norrs.—The proposition to amend the Constitution of the State of Iowa was submitted to the people pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 68, Laws of the Twelfth General Assembly, and voted on at the General Election held November

2d, A. D. 1868, the result of which is shown by the foregoing table, was:

First.—To strike the word "white" from Section one of Article two, which Section defines the right of suffrage.

Second.—To strike the word "white" from Section thirty-three of Article three, which Section provides for taking the census.

Third.—To strike the word "white" from Section thirty-four, of Article three, which Section provides for the apportionment of Senators in the General Assembly.

Fourth.—To strike the word "white" from Section thirty-five, of Article three, which Section provides for the apportionment of Members of the House of Representatives in the General Assembly.

Fifth.—To strike the word "white" from Section one, of Article six, which Section defines the militia of the state.—[SECRETARY OF STATE.

EXPLANATIONS.

The data used in most cases in making up the following tables, was furnished by the several Railroad Companies of the State, and the distances from Des Moines to the various stations are computed as follows, to-wit:

To all points on the Burlington and Missouri River Railroad, west of, and including Corning, via Council Bluffs and Pacific City; to all other points via Ottumwa; to all points on the Sioux City and Pacific and western end of the Iowa Falls and Sioux City Railways, via Grand Junction and Missouri Valley; to all points on the Chicago and North-western Railway via Grand Junction; to all points on the Iowa Falls and Sioux City, and Dubuque and Sioux City Railways, west of Farley, via Grand Junction and Fort Dodge, and to all points east of and including Farley, and on the Dubuque South-western, via Grand Junction and Cedar Rapids; to all points on the Central Railroad of Iowa, via Grand Junction and Marshalltown; to all points on the Cedar Falls and Minnesota Railway, via Grand Junction, Fort Dodge, and Cedar Falls; to all points on the McGregor and Missouri River Railway, via Grand Junction, Fort Dodge, Cedar Falls, and Charles City; to all points on the Milwaukee and St. Paul Railway, (Iowa Division), via Grand Junction, Fort Dodge, Cedar Falls, Charles City, and Calmar; and to all points on the Keokuk and St. Paul, and the Burlington, Cedar Rapids and Minnesota Railway, via Ottumwa, Burlington.
