TRUSTEES' REPORT.

To His Excellency, Governor Sherman, and the General Assembly: Since our last report, the Institution has largely increased, both in numbers and importance.

The State has been very liberal to us during the last period, except in the appropriation for a main building, and we are pleased to say we are able to make what we believe will be a very satisfactory showing for every dollar expended.

On the 24th day of May, 1882, Dr. O. W. Archibald severed his connection with this Institution, and his successor, the present incumbent, Dr. F. M. Powell, took possession as Superintendent. We have been highly gratified with the management and administration of Dr. Powell. He has devoted himself to the interest of this great charity, studied its wants, and mastered the many details connected with its successful management. We are especially pleased to commend the superior financial and economical control upon his part, which brought our support from the large balance against us to a balance in our favor on the 30th day of June last.

Dr. Powell has been ably seconded in his efforts by our Assistant Physician, Dr. A. C. Rogers.

During the last period our officers and help have remained substantially the same, except the change made in Superintendent and Matron, and the resignation of two of our teachers, Miss Van Doren and Miss Russell Mrs. Dora Moore and Miss Ella Frazee were chosen to fill the vacancies, to which number was added Miss Anna Townsend, in compliance with the demand for more help in the school-room.

Our teachers have all been faithful, painstaking, and patient. The steady improvement of all classes committed to their charge is the strongest testimonial to their efficiency and competency. A success-

ful teacher of this peculiar class of children requires much more than is necessary to teach the ordinary child of sound mind. The constant exercise of patience under very trying circumstances, is an absolute prerequisite to success in the art of training the feeble mind. That our teachers have thoroughly disciplined themselves in this great virtue, is proven by the splendid results of their work.

Dr. Powell has secured the more efficient working of the help at the Institution by providing an officer known as "Supervisor" in both the male and female departments. These Supervisors are directly responsible for the faithful discharge of duty by every person under him or her. The increasing numbers require this division of responsibility in the daily administration.

The general health of the children has been remarkably good, not-withstanding the necessarily crowded manner in which they have been compelled to live and sleep. Since the twenty-fourth day of May, 1882, and prior to June 30, 1883, there have been sixty-five children admitted, but there were, during the same period, twenty-two dismissed, eleven deaths, and one deserter, leaving the number in the Institution on the last named date at two hundred and thirty-nine.

There are applications for very many more, none of whom can be admitted until our new cottages are completed, and even then only a limited number.

All the funds given us by the last General Assembly, which have been expended, have been so expended with a view to get the most possible for the money and to best subserve the interest of the State.

We have now a fine farm for the boys to cultivate, and one which has yielded a good return, as the Superintendent's report shows.

The money appropriated for a new building (\$25,000.00) we found too small to erect a main building, as we desired, and we therefore determined to build two good cottages instead. Contracts were awarded, therefore, and the cottages are nearly completed, at a cost of \$18,792.00, for both. The balance of the appropriation having been expended in steam heating, gas fitting and grading, except \$1,000.00 which was applied in building a story upon the laundry building. The expenditure of this fund has been approved by the Executive Council, as required by law.

The main building is still a great necessity, and all improvements are made with reference to its speedy erection.

We ask that the Legislature give us an amount which, while less than the amount required by similar institutions, will be sufficient to build a good, substantial structure, with corridors. For this purpose we ask \$75,000.00. With this amount we believe we can complete a substantial building.

The additional appropriations we ask, are:

These constitute the present wants of our Institution, and they are all of absolute necessity for the increased demands made upon us.

Concluding, would say, that this noble charity, which a few years ago commenced with but a single inmate, has now grown to be one of the most important of all our State institutions. Its beneficent instruction to the feeble intellect is now fully appreciated in almost every county in the State.

That a feeble child can be educated, and that to a very considerable degree, is a demonstrated fact in Iowa. The really good letters written to the parents by many of the children, entirely unaided, would greatly surprise many people unacquainted with the development of naturally weak intellects. But, as we observed in our last report, if there were no good results whatever from educational training, in such cases, still, the habits of personal cleanliness, of politeness, of good manners, of gentlemanly and lady-like deportment, would many times compensate the State for every expense. One need pay but a single visit to such an institution to become interested in its work, and surprised at its success.

To us it has been a personal charge of absorbing interest, increasing with time and associations. Although the coming year must sever the connection of some of us as members of the Board of Trustees, yet we are confident it can never lessen the almost fraternal solicitude we feel for these confiding wards of the State, nor dim the recollection of pleasant associations at an Institution which we hope may, strengthening as it grows, soon be the peer of any similar one in any Commonwealth in the Union.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.

To the Board of Trustees:

Gentlemen—I have the honor to present herewith (1), a statement of the affairs of the Institution when I assumed its management under your direction; (2), the disposition of affairs since; (3), the most pressing needs for the immediate future.

On the 24th day of May, 1882, by your order, I assumed the control of the Institution, and at once caused an inventory of property to be taken with as great a degree of accuracy as was consistent with the circumstances. An abstract copy of the result you will find attached as "Table A."

I found in the Institution two hundred and eight inmates; one hundred and thirty-two males, and seventy-six females; one of the latter being supported as a private pupil, all of the remainder by the State.

They were distributed as follows:

There was no serious sickness of any kind, except in the case of one little girl, who died soon after my administration began.

A general description of the location and buildings has been given by my predecessor, Dr. O. W. Archibald, and it only remains for me to say that while the rooms of the buildings were arranged as nearly as possible to suit the work of the Institution and were in good order, having been recently papered, calcimined, and painted, the buildings lacked proper protection from the weather; the roofs were in bad condition, several of the rooms being flooded by every rainfall, while the windows and floors of several rooms were out of repair, and the foundations of the buildings imperfectly drained.

The school-rooms were inadequately furnished with apparatus, and the school desks few and out of repair.

Workmen were engaged in putting in water-closets and plumbing work, the same having been begun under contract previous to my connection with the Institution.

As you will see by the inventory, there were about fifteen acres of land belonging to the place which were used for pasturage and yards. Fourteen acres of land adjoining had been rented for cash, of which two acres were planted with potatoes, and twelve were sown in oats.

Without further specific notice, I refer you to the inventory for the amount of stock on the place, and such other information as may be of interest to your body.

The condition of the finances is shown below by the following table which exhibits: 1. The balance of funds in the treasurer's hands May 24, 1882. 2. The amount since paid from the several funds on account of indebtedness contracted by Dr. Archibald (exclusive of current indebtedness for the first twenty-four days of May). 3. You will observe that the Institution was in debt on account of support fund and ordinary funds to the amount of \$6,411.78; in other words, there were warrants issued to the above amount more than there were funds to pay.

You will also observe that \$9.31 was the amount at my disposal for repairs.

As the Nineteenth General Assembly ordered that the fiscal year end June 30, this report covers a period of a little over thirteen months, or exactly four hundred and one days.

During this period the movement of population has been as follows:

The school department has been in as good condition as the limited room and material would permit. No change was made in the corps of, teachers till the close of the session last summer, when the places left vacant by the resignations of Miss Jennie Van Doren and Miss Lucy Russell were filled by Mrs. Dora Moore and Miss Ella Frazee. Miss Anna Townsend was also added to the teaching force.

The progress made in each room has been creditable, and a review of the standing of the pupils is as follows:

Sixteen read passably well in the Fourth Reader.

Twelve read passably well in the Third Reader.

Twenty-four read passably well in the Second Reader.

Thirty receive instruction from chart and primer.

Eighteen can write to their friends without assistance.

Thirty-four can print and copy words and sentences.

Eight can perform examples in division.

Twenty-two receive instruction in numbers.

One hundred and twenty are taught by object lessons.

Sixty receive oral instruction in Geography.

One hundred and eighty are drilled in articulation and calisthenics.

Twelve receive instruction in drawing.

A large class, varying in size, has been doing plain sewing, and has done a large amount of work.

The whole number in school has been two hundred; one hundred and twenty-eight males, and seventy-two females. They have been divided during the year into five classes:

The first grade, taught by Mrs. Dora Moore, received instruction in the elementary branches taught in common schools. They read quite nicely in the Third and Fourth Readers, and their copy books, both as to penmanship and neatness, compare favorably with those of classes of much higher pretensions. Most of them correspond with their friends in a very intelligent manner. They are quite proficient in the fundamental rules of arithmetic, performing creditably examples in multiplication and division, and reciting and applying correctly the standard tables. They receive oral lessons in Geography and United States History, and are familiar with the outline map of the United States. Vocal music and articulation form a part of their exercises; while calisthenics, which is an important element of each, has been a specialty in this class. Upon this kind of concert exercise mainly we depend for developing the power of fixing the attentions.

tion, of awakening the dormant sensibilities, of stimulating the disposition to put forth effort to equal or excel others; in short, of furnishing that essential mental and physical discipline which becomes the foundation of whatever we may reasonably hope to accomplish in the way of permanent improvement.

The second class, taught by Miss Laura Baker, are familiar with the first lessons in notation, numeration, addition, and subtraction. They can copy short sentences on the blackboard and on slates, and can read in the First and Second Readers. They also receive oral ins ruction in United States History and Geography; and are drilled in Arithmetic and Calisthenics.

The third class, taught by Mrs. Phœbe Rogers, are instructed in word reading from charts, and by the association of objects with printed words. Names of objects learned are printed on blackboards and slates. Before leaving this grade, the pupils must have learned to read short sentences correctly from charts, and read creditably from the First Reader. They, also, as well as the following classes, receive movement training, articulation, marching, and calisthenic exercises.

The fourth class, taught by Miss Ella Frazee, are given first lessons in numbers, naming words and letters by the use of the charts and blackboards. In this class special attention is given to object lessons. These are entertaining and instructive, exercising at once the patience and ingenuity of the children. They are also drilled in the general exercises of marching, singing, articulation and dumb bell exercises.

The fifth and lowest class, taught by Miss Anna Townsend, are the most helpless, noisy, and restless of any, requiring patience and tact on the part of the teacher to entertain and instruct them. A variety of objects are used to attract attention and arouse interest, and thus cause an exercise of will, however feeble, in the direction of executing simple movements. Simple apparatus is used, adapted to this special purpose, as colored cups and balls, blocks cut to fit special recesses, ladders, steps, buttons, peg boards, bean bags, pictures, etc., etc. An important function of this department, which is to a certain extent true of the whole Institution in all its departments, is to correct improper habits of conduct, and establish those of propriety and neatness.

I feel that our teachers have done earnest and faithful work, and I

take pleasure in making this expression of appreciation. I regret to say that no department is more seriously crippled for want of room and appliances. The Institution can very poorly afford to neglect the school, which is the central feature of the work, and by far the most important. So much has been said from time to time, and by those of riper experience and more extended observation, and the direct results of this training are so evident throughout every other department of the Institution, that it seems useless to enlarge upon it. I shall refer to the matter of room again.

The health of the household has been good in general, and the mortality, as you see, has been 4 1-34 per cent, which, in my opinion, is very low for this class of children. We were visited by epidemics of scarlet fever, diphtheria, and mumps, during the winter, but, fortunately they were light ones. I will speak of them again.

Of the deaths, five were from phthisis, two congestion of the brain, two marasmus, one typhoid fever, and one cardiac lesion.

Our location is certainly quite fortunate as to health, the high altitude exempting our household from a large share of sickness, otherwise almost certain. No case of ague or malarial poison has ever been recognized in the Institution, so far as I have been able to learn, except where the patients' systems were saturated with the poison when admitted.

Here let me call your attention to a very important matter in the administration of the Institution, viz.: the necessity for better hospital accommodations. A large per cent of our children possess low vitality, and must of necessity be under treatment much of the time. Under the most favorable circumstances we need ample and convenient hospital facilities. Again, many of our children are exposed to contagious diseases during their journey to the Institution, and either from ignorance of the fact or indifference on the part of parents or friends, the officers of the Institution are unable to ascertain the facts till some disease manifests itself. A little girl was admitted from Davenport during the winter, who, the sequel proves, had been exposed to scarlet fever, but as we had no knowledge of the fact; she was admitted to a regular class till she was taken sick and the disease recognized. I at once took every precaution with this malady, the circumstances would permit, by taking all of the children from one story of the south wing and devoting the whole of the same to the care of the sick. Communication was cut off from other parts

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of the building and from the outside community for a time and thorough disinfection employed. Thus the scarlet fever epidemic was limited to twelve mild cases. I consider that we were, to say the least, very fortunate in escaping so easily, for the well-known variability of these epidemics, as to malignity, reminds us that another, coming under, so far as observable, the same conditions, might produce a fearful mortality. A department should be provided not only for the sick, but also for the care of recent admissions during a short probationary period. The building for this purpose should be separated from the other buildings and provided with accommodations suited to its purpose.

The balance of funds in the treasury May 24, 1882, have been disposed of as follows: The \$254.07 cow fund has been spent as designed except a small balance, and has been a valuable aid to our support, though not sufficient to afford as much milk as needed during a large part of the time.

A portion of the school apparatus fund has been spent, leaving only a balance of \$15.65 to aid in fitting out the school for the approaching year. I would respectfully recommend that you ask for \$600,00 for this purpose.

The appropriation for an oven has not been expended. After due consideration it seemed injudicious to build an oven in connection with our present buildings, from their evident lack of adaptation to their present use, and the strong conviction that the next General Assembly, after examination, will regard increased accommodations a necessity. This fund could then be expended to advantage in a new structure.

I have found it impossible with the \$400.00 appropriated for barn, to build anything very near meeting our wants, though it enabled us to move the horse barn to a location at a greater distance from the living rooms where an appropriate place was selected for permanent barnyards, and then to construct near it a small stable for our cows. This has rendered good service but we have been unable to store away any great quantity of either hay or grain, both of which should be provided for, as should also straw, which we use in large quantities for beds.

The appropriation for water closets, of \$800.00, was expended in providing these much needed conveniences, but any one familiar with the cost of plumbing work will readily understand that this

amount was of itself sufficient to meet the barest needs of but a small number of our large household. By using the small balance remaining from the sewerage appropriation to apply on soil pipe and fittings, and drawing some on the water supply fund to complete the water connections and then using current funds for enclosing the work in plain pine boxing, we have gotten along quite fairly in this particular. As you remember, the contract for plumbing and water closet work was made previous to my connection with the Institution. By your order everything was eliminated from the work that could be consistently at the time. We have been compelled to resort to the old plan of portable commodes for the use of quite a number of our children, which we should not be obliged to do, and we have not been able to provide any water closets for the cottages under process of construction. To fit these in closets and bathing facilities, and meet the expense of changing this work in the old buildings, will require \$3,000.00. The necessity for this is so evident that I will not speak of it further.

Having only \$9.31 of the \$1,500.00 appropriated for repairs, I have been entirely unable to make any of the improvements which the condition of the buildings, above referred to, has demanded. It will require \$4,000.00 to put the roofs, floors, doors and windows in proper shape.

One hundred and ninety-eight dollars and fifteen cents has been expended in improving the fences and extending the same, leaving \$257.23 unexpended June 30, 1883; but I have reserved this for material which our farm help can use to the best advantage when the summer's work is out of the way.

I have also reserved the sum of \$667.76 of the appropriation for furniture to provide bedsteads, chairs, etc., so far as it will, in the cottages under process of construction, the balance of the fund having been expended in supplying bedsteads, chairs, carpets, etc., for the old buildings. The estimated appropriation needed for the next period will be covered by the size of new buildings of which I shall speak hereafter.

The appropriation for range was practically expended prior to my administration.

The aid furnished our library has been highly appreciated.

The disposition made of the heating and laundry funds should be noticed together. After carefully considering the subject it seemed

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desirable that the laundry should be adjacent to the boilers, both for the advantage of steam, and, in the future, power. Again, the appropriation of \$1,000.00 not being sufficient to furnish a laundry building and machinery, and as new machinery could not be run to advantage without proper room, it seemed advisable to combine the heating and laundry funds and build a plain house of brick, so arranged that the lower story could be used for boiler rooms, and the upper story for laundry purposes. This was accordingly done so far as to build two stories, cover and floor, leaving it unfinished otherwise. The heating has been in every way satisfactory during the late severe winter. The boiler for the job was located as suggested above, and so arranged with reference to a second boiler, intended to be used for pumping and power purposes, that both can be used for either high or low pressure, one for high and one for low, and so arranged that two more boilers can be added as needed.

I recommend that you ask the General Assembly for enough to finish the bnildings inside and furnish at least three good power washers, wringers, mangle, dry room, etc. This will require \$2,000. You will remember that our washing is done by our boys, with only two persons employed to manage the work, and that without even a dry room. You can readily see that the Institution has grown to dimensions too great to depend much longer upon such poor facilities for this kind of work. The domestic management is sadly interfered with and annoyed by this condition of affairs. The character of many of our children is suggestive of the quantity of clothing that goes through the wash daily, and the necessity of the very best facilities for cleaning it.

We shall also require two other boilers as soon as they can be put in, to furnish radiating surface for the cottages.

As stated above, the severe winter just experienced gave the heating apparatus a thorough test, there being no time the house could not be thoroughly warmed by using both boilers.

One of these boilers properly belongs to the water supply department, and is needed most of the time for pumping, so we cannot depend upon it for heating; and the additional room of the cottages referred to above, will make additional boilers an immediate necessity. These with fittings will require \$1,500.00.

The question of water supply is always of importance. The last General Assembly quickly recognized this in the case of this Institution, and I found last May \$3,500 in the treasury for improving this supply and giving some fire protection.

The question of spending the appropriations in the younger institutions is constantly embarrassed by the lack of uniform design in the various details of improvements, so that however urgent may be the demand for improvements, every conscientious person interested in part or altogether with the execution of such improvements, is often perplexed to determine how far ultimate economy and design should yield to expediency. I wish to speak of this again in connection with the subject of new buildings.

As to the water. You are aware that the old well has given promise of a bountiful supply, but it is about one hundred and twenty-five feet deep, and requires frequent attention to keep the sand from shutting off the inlet, so it did not seem advisable to put machinery of sufficient dimensions to supply the growing demand of the Institution into this well and depend upon it alone for our supply.

After making some investigations upon the bottom land something over a thousand feet from the buildings, it was found that water could easily be found at from fifteen to thirty feet depth, and a well was sunk for this purpose, and so located that in case of failure a supply can easily be obtained from Keg creek. A No. 8 Blake pump was placed here and supplied with steam from the boiler on the hill, throwing a stream of sufficient size to supply all that the Institution will use for years to come. The mechanical portion of the plan works admirably and in every way satisfactorily, but the well which I have since re-enforced by another, does not furnish a sufficient supply, so that if a small amount more invested in boring does not afford enough, it will, I think, be advisable to open up communication with the creek where a supply for general purposes can be obtained in abundance. For cooking and drinking purposes no better water can be found than is furnished by the old well, which we have drawn upon continually to help out the lower ones. I believe it advisable to put a deep well pump in the old well, which will furnish all of the pure water needed. The pump which has been used here was a cheaply fitted one, put in two years ago, when there were no funds to furnish a better one, and is nearly worn out. This latter change I shall feel compelled to make from current funds if the matter meets with your approval.

. I have provided a good coil of two inch hose for each story of our

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building, so that a partial, but not satisfactory, fire protection is afforded so long as the small tank of water holds out. The most serious matter connected with this whole subject now, both as concerning general water supply and fire protection, is the matter of tank capacity. You will remember that it was deemed advisable to make the old tank (of one hundred and thirty barrels capacity) answer till an appropriation could be had for what would be deemed necessary by this year. Accordingly the tank was placed in the attic of the old building, the only available place that could be used temporarily for giving sufficient pressure. Of course this is only temporary, as its position is both unsafe and annoying from leakage, and the capacity not over one tenth what it should be, as we are compelled to run the pumps either continually at a slow rate, or very often during the day, so that a minimum amount of work is done for the fuel consumed. In my opinion we should have a separater water tower erected, designed to support on brick or iron, at least two tanks of sufficient size, and at such height that a pressure could be had constantly at the highest part of any building on the grounds. Such a structure could also be used for shops and tool rooms.

I can see no reason why this matter, so important in every respect, cannot be disposed of during this period, and that in such a manner as to dispose of it for all time to come, so far as any calculation can

It would, I think, require \$12,000.00 for this purpose and the completion of the fire protection, and I can think of no direction in which that amount could be more satisfactorily invested.

The appropriation for land was expended as designed, and we feel highly gratified with the result. While our farm of one hundred and eighty acres will soon be small for the Institution, it affords us already appreciable remuneration. Our garden has afforded us up to June 30, 863 dozen radishes, 816 dozen onions, 327 dozen pie plant, 56 bushels lettuce, and 12 bushels peas. Besides we have seven hundred grape vines, one hundred and fifty apple trees, and some other small fruit growing. There are over two hundred apple trees on the farm, some of which already bear fruit. Of the farm, fifty acres are in corn, thirty acres in oats, and eight acres in potatoes, which latter are furnishing our tables abundantly with a fine article at the present writing. All of our crops are in good condition, and promise good results.

You will recollect that I purchased last year thirty acres of corn in the field, just after planting, which was tended by our men and boys, and furnished corn for our stock till May. The fodder was also carefully gathered, and lasted both cows and horses till May following. We will have forty or fifty acres for pasturage this year, having been heretofore compelled to herd our stock most of the time. The farm can now represent a feature of the work which, at no distant day, will be a very important department of training, as well as an important element of support. On this subject my predecessor has already dwelt at length in former reports, and it only remains for me to express satisfaction in the fact that our land fortunately combines good farming qualities with the advantages of pleasant pleasure grounds for our children. Not only have we the grove in front of the buildings, which will require but little to develop it into an elegant park, but we have a good grove of ten acres about one mile from the buildings, which can in a short time be made a beautiful, shady picnic ground, where our whole "family" can be handsomely entertained at times during the pleasant weather. This is a fact of no mean importance in the exercise of the functions of an institution of this kind. Nothing relieves the monotony of our routine life and inspires new energy into even the lowest of our children like these frequent excursions into the groves, where they can indulge in swinging, romping, climbing, or such other sports as their nature and the occasion suggest, in the pure open air.

The business connected with the construction of the cottages is already so familiar to your body that no special mention need be made, but I desire to call your attention to the necessity for additional room now.

It will be remembered that the proper method of expending the \$25,000 appropriation granted by the Nineteenth General Assembly was an embarrassing question to your body, from the fact that it was not nearly adequate to build what was needed, and what was contemplated by your body when asked for; and as I became familiar with the work, I was convinced of the positive necessity of limiting the accessions to the population in the Institution; and, acting upon this, I have admitted only (1), those already promised; (2) those who from their higher grade would be the least expense and care; (3) those whose circumstances of poverty, etc., were such that I could not consistently refuse them. This policy has continued during the

entire year, limiting the admissions to sixty-five out of one hundred and nine applications. In addition to this there are a few promised that will make our population two hundred and fifty at the opening of the coming session of school.

I do not see how we can be justified in exceeding this limit till more room can be supplied for their care and for the general management. It is to be remembered that not only the living and sleeping rooms for our children are over-crowded, but every department of the Institution is similarly and literally packed. All of the room that can be used for dining purposes is crowded full (including a basement cellar room, poorly lighted, a portion of one hall and a part of the kitchen), so that a person can scarcely pass through when in use, and then from twenty-five to fifty have to be fed in their rooms. .

In the school department the only room that we can use for general purposes is twenty-seven by thirty-three feet, so that it is readily seen that, after deducting room for piano and stairway, there is not comfortable standing room for all of our children, and barely enough for those who assemble every day, saying nothing about seating capacity. We should have a chapel, or general assembly room, centrally located, and of sufficient capacity to seat all of our children when desired. For lack of this we have not been permitted to give the children any collective entertainment, which we should be able to do frequently. We have three school-rooms for five teachers, having been compelled to use one play-room and one dormitory for school purposes. The rooms we have are not over one half the size they should be; and, for the number of children we have, we should have at least twelve teachers.

A room fifteen by eighteen feet serves as best it can for hospital no comments are necessary! The general office is a room nine by seventeen feet. Our help are crowded together in a very unsatisfactory manner - more to get along than to live.

Three classes, comprising about eighty children, are kept in a frame building, unsafe, and otherwise unsuitable for their care, and one grade of forty boys has been accommodated for sleeping-room in one story of the unfinished laundry building, using the room for sleeping at night and for ironing during the day. Even if we had the room needed, in the present shape it would be exceedingly inconvenient. The classification of the children, as in my opinion they should be classified, is entirely impossible, while the domestic departments are constantly embarrassed by the want of adaptation of the various departments to their respective kinds of work, and their inconvenience with reference to one another. It has only been by using the same rooms for various purposes, without reference to convenience, that we have gotten along without very serious difficulty, and we have only permitted this in anticipation of better accommodations soon.

The new cottages will accommodate about one hundred and fifty children, thus leaving still one hundred in the old buildings, and about one third of these in the old frame referred to. We can also increase the dining-room and the hospital some, and make a few other slight changes; but we will not then be able to give any department what it positively demands in the way of room. While we shall appreciate highly our new buildings, which will be very satisfactory to the extent of their capacity, you will readily see that our needs are really relieved only to a very small degree.

So far I have only considered the number of inmates that are in the Institution, or will be this summer. This is but a limited view, while, with the charge that the State has to provide for now, she certainly cannot avoid her evident duty to provide, as soon as possible, all accommodations needed. It would be a very short-sighted policy on the part of those of us who are held responsible for the work, to fail in recognizing the demands of the future, as well as the needs of the present.

There are at the present time one hundred applications on file for which admissions have not been granted, so that after eliminating those who, from age and other reasons, could not be admitted, there are at the lowest calculation three hundred pupils who would be in the Institution at present if there were room. Further, the number of applications is constantly increasing, and we have every reason to believe that they will till we have at least double the number of which we now have any account. I certainly should not place the number below six hundred of those who will be the constant wards of the Institution in a very few years; and I draw this conclusion as a legitimate deduction from the history of this, and similar institutions in other States, and the late census returns.

The State of Iowa reports two thousand three hundred and fourteen feeble-minded children, of whom one thousand nine hundred and sixty were, in 1880, at home, neither provided for in insane hos-

pitals or institutions of this class. The number of insane reported at the same time was two thousand five hundred and forty-one; and as the collection of statistics upon the former subject is so much more difficult than in the case of the insane, both from the failure to recognize mental imbecility in young children, and the usual perseverance in denying it when recognized, we readily conclude that the census returns give us an estimate much too small.

What we want then is a main building of sufficient capacity for the general work, dining-rooms, kitchen, assembly and school-rooms, and offices. The building now used for these purposes could then be used as a cottage, and we need every foot of it to properly care for our children.

The State could then build cottages as the population increased, and each one so built would be a part of the general whole.

The main structure need not be a ponderous one, but it should certainly be well built and fire proof.

In my opinion we cannot condemn too highly the practice of erecting, in a superficial and flimsy manner, buildings of this character which will settle, crack, and in a short time be in a condition demanding constant repairs, that in a very few years cost more than a good edifice originally.

I believe it of the utmost importance that everything spent in the way of permanent improvements, be spent in the execution of a general plan, so that instead of so much remodeling from year to year, each additional appropriation will build to the best advantage a part of a symmetrical whole. The expenditures of the past year have been made in accordance with this idea; and for this reason, as you know, after the unsuccessful efforts to procure plans last year that would provide the room we most needed and not exceed the amount appropriated, I have emphatically discouraged the idea of trying to build a main building until it could be done properly; and it seems to me that time has certainly come. Our present situation demands it, and the immediate future makes it doubly imperative.

I find that we are not able to give our children the full benefit of the \$10.00 per month support fund intended for them as was contemplated by the last General Assembly when it authorized the appropriation for general expenses, for we cannot properly organize without drawing upon the support fund for paying wages. This we should not be compelled to do, and your attention is respectfully directed to this necessity of increasing the ordinary fund.

Occasional complaints are sent to this office because bills for clothing are sent to counties made out against persons who have moved out of the counties. As the law now is we have no option, but must send to the county from which the child came. This sometimes leads to the trouble mentioned, and in justice to the counties the law should be changed.

To all friends of the Institution who so kindly and generously remembered our household in the matter of Christmas presents, newspapers, and other donations, I wish to acknowledge my sincere thanks. I owe much of whatever success has attended my efforts in the administration of the affairs of the Institution to the officers, teachers and employes, and it is with pleasure that I take this occasion to express my gratitude and appreciation of their fidelity to the cause and their faithful and earnest work. I gratefully acknowledge the many courtesies that you, gentlemen of the Board, have shown me, and I feel that to your wise and generous counsel and full support, I owe very much. I beg that whatever imperfections you may have found in my administration may be looked upon with a reasonable degree of charity, and charged, rather to a lack of extended experience, than to a disposition to be either arbitrary on the one hand, or indifferent on the other.

Trusting that this, one of the noblest of the State's charities, the support of which is one of the plainest duties of the State, may grow into continually increasing usefulness, and meet at the hands of the State that generous support which I realize it deserves, I respectfully submit this report to you, and ask for it that consideration which the work demands, however poorly its cause may be represented.

It was with a profound feeling of sorrow and regret that we received the sad news of the death of Dr. Hervey B. Wilbur, at his home in Syracuse, N. Y., on the first of May, 1883.

During my brief connection with the work it had not been my good fortune to meet Dr. Wilbur but once; that once left an indelible impression of a master mind and a generous heart. He was the most advanced thinker upon the subject of training idiotic and feeble-minded children in America, if not the world. He spent a long and active life in his chosen profession, and while his works are standard, his system of organization is that which has characterized all of the American institutions. Beginning his labors amid many obstacles, when the conception was novel in America, he ended them after his ideas had become almost universally recognized and embodied in the laws of many States. The universal expressions of sorrow that have come from all ranks of life where be was acquainted, are sufficient evidence of the esteem in which he was held by the profession and laity alike. Upon receipt of the news of his death, the Iowa Institution was draped in mourning, and though far away from his immediate acquaintance and influence, it can do no less than give this slight testimonial of his work and worth.

CIRCULAR.

This Institution was established by the Sixteenth General Assembly of the State of Iowa, in the year 1876, and located at Glenwood, in the building formerly occupied by soldiers' orphans.

The object of this Institution is to provide special means of improvement to that class of children so deficient in mind, or afflicted with such marked peculiarities of intellect as to deprive them of the benefits and privileges of other educational institutions and ordinary methods of instruction.

The education imparted to this class, includes not only the simple elements of instruction of our common schools, where that is practicable, but embraces a course of training in the more practical matters of every-day life, the cultivation of habits of cleanliness, propriety and self-reliance, and to develop and enlarge their capacity for useful occupations.

To promote these objects, children will receive such education, and such moral and hygenic treatment, as their peculiar and varied conditions demand.

Mental imbecility depends upon some abnormal or imperfectly developed condition of the physical system, a condition in which the nervous organization is especially defective, preventing the harmonious and natural development of the mental and moral powers.

Idiots and imbeciles, as a rule, are feeble in body as well as in mind. Their gait and voluntary movements are generally awkward and slow, and their special senses inactive and undeveloped, and are wanting in nervous and muscular power. Physical training and development, therefore, are essential, in order that their mental improvement may become permanent, hence the importance and necessity of gymnastic and calisthenic exercises in their treatment.

The very feeble power of attention must be cultivated and increased by the most attractive means. The special senses must be

trained and educated, vicious habits are to be corrected, and the idea of obedience and moral obligation must be planted and nourished.

Some, who are only backward, and are undeveloped from being misunderstood, or abused, can be brought out and reclaimed by special means. Many others can be arrested in their downward course, made orderly and obedient, docile and industrious; and all can be improved in their general condition and habits.

In order to secure these blessings to this afflicted class, they must have that special care, treatment and instruction, which cannot be obtained in the family at home, or in private medical practice, or by any of the ordinary methods of education; and it is only in some institution, well arranged and directed for the accomplishment of these special objects, that they can receive such benefits. Each individual case must be studied, and treated as its peculiarities demand.

Every child and youth residing in the State, between the ages of five and eighteen, who by reason of deficient intellect is rendered unable to acquire an education in the common schools, shall be entitled to receive the physical and mental training and care of this Institution at the expense of the State.

The special system of instruction, training and management adhered to in this Institution, renders it a desirable residence for all children of this class.

Applications for admission shall be made, "First, By the father and mother, or either of these if the other be adjudged insane. Second, By the guardian duly appointed. Third, In all other cases by the board of supervisors of the county in which the child resides. It shall be the duty of such board of supervisors to make such application for any such child that has no living sane parent or guardian in the State, unless such child is comfortably provided for already."

"The form of application for admission into the Institution shall be such as the trustees prescribe, and each application shall be accompanied by answers to such interrogatories as the trustees shall require propounded."

The Institution is under the management of medical officers, and the inmates receive all ordinary medical and hospital treatment free of charge.

The progress and improvement of our children have been very encouraging, and parents and friends almost invariably express satisfac-

tion with the results in the comparatively short time their children have been under training.

Our Institution is open daily, except Sundays and Saturdays, to visitors and the public, at all reasonable hours, and all are not only cordially invited to visit our school, but earnestly requested to do so.

Each child admitted should be provided with at least two changes of clothing, which will be registered when the child is admitted. Such clothing as may be needed subsequently will be furnished by the Superintendent, registered, and a bill of the same rendered.

As a matter of convenience these bills will be sent to the auditor of the county in which the parents reside, so that they can be settled by said parents near home.

The board of supervisors of said county shall determine as to the ability of said parents to pay their bills so rendered, and in case of inability, they shall be paid by the county.

Any other information desired will be cheerfully given by the Superintendent.

REPORT.

To the Twentieth General Assembly:

Your committee appointed to visit the Asylum for Feeble-minded children, at Glenwood, respectfully present the following report:

On the 6th and 7th insts. we visited the Asylum and made a careful examination of the buildings, grounds, and general management of the Institution, including the expenditure of the money appropriated by the last General Assembly. We are of the opinion that the funds so appropriated have all been wisely and economically expended.

There are now employed forty-nine persons to care for the inmates and perform all the duties necessary to the management and control of the Asylum.

The following table shows the names of these persons, the kind of service they severally perform, and the price paid each. All of these employed have their board, fuel, lights and washing, at the expense of the State:

The above list of employes may, to such as have never visited the Institution, seem too large, but your committee are satisfied that no more help is employed than is absolutely necessary. The price paid is really a poor compensation when considering the constant vigil necessary to properly control and care for two hundred and fifty pupils. the number now in the Institution, whose every movement must be directed by some one of the teachers or other employes. These teachers seem inspired with a commendable zeal far beyond that which can be induced by a mere money consideration. Seldom, if ever, is such patience, perseverance and energy manifested as we here witnessed. Your committee are unanimous in the opinion that this Institution should be made perpetual and so enlarged at the earliest possible date as to accommodate all this unfortunate class of imbeciles. This should be done not so much on the theory of charity but on the higher ground of public policy, or, rather public safety The reports show that a large majority of the inmates are congenital mental imbeciles, the very sight of which is really distressing if not absolutely revolting. We know of no reported case where one such of the class referred to has been cured or materially benefitted by any course of treatment now known to science. To turn out into the world one such, to reproduce its kind, is, in the opinion of the undersigned, not only cruel but a high crime against the true spirit of our laws, both human and divine, and almost certain to visit the present and future generations with untold misery and misfortune.

To advance them intellectually only in a small degree, which is all that can be expected, and then turn them adrift on society only enhances the danger already referred to. Had your committee the remotest idea that such would be the future policy of the State, we would not recommend the appropriation of a single dollar to perpetuate the Institution, but, on the contrary, would earnestly urge that it at once be abolished as an institution calculated to infuse the most dreadful poison into the veins of our progressive race. Again, whatever advancement may be made in the class just referred to, can in no case be sufficient to qualify them to meet and discharge the duties of life not even so far as to support themselves for any considerable time. When turned out then, or permitted to go from the Institution, which should be their permanent home, they at once become the easy prey of the crafty, the unscrupulous and the vicious, and

sooner or later die of starvation and want, or drift into alms or poor houses. Certain it is, that what little scholastic attainments they may be able to acquire can be of no protection to them, and of but little or no value whatever.

As viewed by your committee then, less time and labor should be expended by way of vainly attempting to instruct them in letters, and more attention given to manual labor and pursuits. Many of them, we think, may be so trained as to in a degree be of service to the State by way of cultivating the farm belonging to the Institution, and producing a large portion of the necessary food that now has to be purchased in the markets. The females should, as far as possible, be instructed and required to do the kitchen and laundry work, nearly all of which is now done by hired help. In this manner the running or ordinary expenses could be, by a few years careful and persistent training, greatly lessened, and with a reasonable amount of cultivatable land might, we think, if properly managed and utilized, place the Institution on a self-supporting basis, or nearly so.

True it is, we think, that the State should adopt a rigorous policy, and quarantine such cases as are hopeless for life, and so increase the capacity of the Institution as to be able to furnish a permanent home for all such as are now there, or may hereafter be admitted. We are led to believe that the commingling of the sexes, of the class last referred to is wholly pernicious, and adds greatly to the care and responsibility, which is certainly very great now, devolving upon those in charge. But to effect this necessary change much more room is required.

The present Superintendent, Dr. Powell, concurs with your committee in the views hereinbefore expressed, and is, as we verily believe, doing all that can possibly be done to advance the best interests of this asylum, and to carry out the spirit and intent of the act that created it. The State may well be congratulated on securing the services of so faithful and able an official.

We have carefully examined the report and recommendations of the Trustees of this Institution, so far as the same relate to appropriations by the General Assembly. They earnestly ask an appropriation of \$75,000 to construct a central building, with corridors.

Such a building, as we believe, is absolutely necessary and in fact indispensible, but owing to the pressing demands of some of the other State institutions at this time, we have concluded to reduce the amount asked and recommend that \$60,000 be appropriated and applied to this purpose, and that the same be so expended as to partially complete the building at least and fit it, or the greater portion of it, for occupancy within the present year.

We find the old building formerly occupied as a Soldiers' Orphans' Home sadly out of repair, especially the roof and floors. A better and larger supply of water must be had, and cannot be delayed with safety to the lives of the inmates.

In addition to the \$60,000 for the new building referred to, we recommend appropriations as follows:

For school apparatus, \$600.

Baths, water closets in new cottages and changing same in old building, \$2,500.

Repairing old building, \$4,000.

To complete inside of laundry, etc., \$1,500.

New boilers, \$1,500.

Permanent water tower, \$12,000.

Painting, bedding, etc., \$2,500.

Necessary grading and completing basement story under gymna sium, \$4,000.

Enlarging smoke-stack, \$200.

By reference to the report of the Trustees it will be seen that the above appropriations recommended by us, are, in the aggregate, many thousands of dollars less than the sum by them asked, not on the ground that they have asked more than is really needed, but on the theory that the State is not prepared to meet all the demands that will be made upon her treasury.

In conclusion permit us to say that the present management is admirable and reflects great credit upon the State, but that it may still be much improved by adopting some, if not all, of the changes herein referred to and recommended, will not, we think, be questioned by any one giving the subject a careful and impartial consideration.
