SECRETARY'S REPORT.

CONDITION OF THE SCHOOLS.

We are gratified in being able to report that the condition of the schools proves the wisdom of the State in adopting our present school system. While public attention has been so earnestly directed to momentous national questions, there has been an in creasing interest in our schools. Throughout a large portion of the State, they have been little affected by the disturbing influences caused by the rebellion. We must except, however, the border counties on the south, west and north-west. The latter, especially, have witnessed unusual scenes of excitement, caused by the Indian massacres near the border, and by threatened incursions into the State. Hundreds of families abandoned their homes, and sought safety from the real or fancied dangers threatening them. And although quiet was restored and security insured by our troops on the frontier, the schools were in many instances suspended, and the school house was occupied by the soldier. In many of the western and southern counties, the supply of teachers has not been equal to the demand; and the inexperienced and poorly qualified have supplied the place of those who are in the army. In other portions of the State, though a large number of experienced teachers are in the army, the schools have been supplied by female teachers no less qualified, and not less successful. Notwithstanding the inconveniences experienced in school affairs in some portions of the State, the cause of popular education has, on the whole, been advancing. We infer this from the increased liberality of the people in levying taxes for school houses; from the demand for better qualified teachers; from the increased interest in Teachers' Institutes, and from the universal desire that the duties and pay of County Superintendents be increased.

The schools, however, are by no means what they should be are not accomplishing all that is demanded of them. The Constitution requires that education shall be provided for all the youths

of the State, through a system of Common Schools. It will not be claimed that this provision of the Constitution has been satisfied by simply providing for the establishment of schools in each subdistrict. The State is the guardian of the schools, and it is her duty not only to provide for their establishment, but to make them of such a character as to ensure suitable instruction to those attending them. The statistics show that, although free schools are found in nearly every neighborhood, far too great a number attend irregularly or not at all.

This state of things has induced many zealous friends of Education to ask the enactment of a law compelling parents and guardians to send their children to school. They urge that the State, having made provision for the education of all children, has the right, and is in duty bound to require all to be educated. Without denying the justice of this proposition, we shall decline asking the enactment of the contemplated law until further efforts have been made, both voluntary and legislative, to give our schools such a character that pupils will be attracted to them; to make them good enough for all classes, so that none will have an excuse for sending to the private school or not sending at all.

If with comfortable and convenient school houses, with well qualified teachers, with a systematic course of instruction, and with Superintendents to visit and watch over the schools, there shall still be found those so dead to all sense of obligation to the community and to the State, as to neglect the education of their children, we will then favor a most stringent law compelling attendance.

Tables "A" and "B" in the Appendix to this Report present the statistical reports of the County Superintendents, for the year 1862.

According to these returns over 80,000 youths between the ages of 5 and 21, have not attended the public schools during the past year. This representation conveys an incorrect view of the case. While the enumeration includes all between 5 and 21, the fact is, very few under 7 and over 15 ever attend the public school. We may safely calculate that a small fraction only, of the above number should be returned as not attending school; and of this fraction more than 3000 are in private Schools, Academies and Colleges.

In July last we issued a circular to County Superintendents, requesting them to state in their annual reports, the number of pupils attending private Schools, Academies and Colleges in their respective Counties; the number of schools graded, &c., hoping from the data thus furnished to give a full exhibit of all the educational agencies in the State. Several Counties, however, having failed to furnish the information asked for, we necessarily omit the contemplated statement.

GRADED SCHOOLS.

For the purpose of introducing system and uniformity into our

methods of instruction, Hon H. A. Wiltse, then acting Secretary, issued, on the 1st of January, 1863, the following Circular to County Superintendents:

OFFICE OF THE IOWA BOARD OF EDUCATION, DES MOINES, 1ST JANUARY, 1863.

Superintendent of County.

Sir:—In your last Annual Report to me, no mention is made of the Course of Study pursued in the Schools of your County. The blanks furnished from this office, as suggestive of Subjects for your Report, were silent upon this and other subjects of the first importance. It is not too late to supply this deficiency, and I earnestly request you at once to visit the Schools of your County, and from personal inquiry and observation, to ascertain and transmit to me, as soon as possible, complete information upon the following subjects:

1. The Course of Study pursued in each Public School in your

County.

2. Where the Course of Study extends to branches not required by law, whether or not the additional branches are authorized by the proper District Board.

3. The schools in which the course of study is graded; into how many grades the course is divided, and what particular studies con-

stitute each grade.

4. The number of classes into which the schools respectively, which are not graded, are divided, with the number of pupils in each class.

5. All the Text Books in use in each school.

6. The name and P. O. address of the President of each district in your county.

7. The corporate name of each independent district.

8. All other information which you deem worth communicating

in reference to the subjects above named.

While engaged in gathering the above information, you will request all the teachers to grade their schools; in which you will please to assist as far as the time at your disposal will permit. To aid you in doing so, I have divided the branches authorized by law, with History of the United States added, into six grades, as follows:

This gradation is of course based upon the Text Books recommended by the State Board. Each grade will be found to end with and complete a subject.

The time necessary to complete any one of the above grades, is eight months, and the lessons should be arranged with reference to this time. The whole Course should be completed in forty-eight months.

No pupil can be in two grades at the same time, nor can a pupil be received into a grade higher than the first, unless he can pass an examination in all the grades below the one which he applies to enter. All the pupils in a particular grade, progress together; and if a pupil from inattention, incapacity or absence, falls behind, he must return to the next lower grade, and if on the contrary, a pupil is disposed to advance, by studying out of school hours, or otherwise, more rapidly than the time prescribed requires, let him, as soon as qualified, be promoted to the next grade above.

If the course of study in a particular school extends to more branches, than is embraced in the above course, the studies for each grade may be proportionally compressed, or the number of grades may be extended.

Teachers should make a record of the names of the pupils in each grade, and this record should show all promotions that are made from one grade to another, and especially the promotions made at the close of the school.

Among the results of adopting a course of study and dividing it into steps or grades, and of grading the pupils in accordance therewith, are the following:

1. It compels uniformity in Text Books.

2. It secures punctuality in attendance.

3. While it inspires diligent pupils with higher motives, it quickens all others to a degree that enables them to complete the whole course—a result to which the majority would never attain under any other system.

4. Every pupil in the school will complete the course in *one-half* the time required in a school which is not graded.

5. If a teacher finds the introduction of the graded system above his experience or capacity, or having introduced it, fails in enabling his pupils to complete a grade within the time prescribed, the District Board will of course know the fact, and know further, that the teacher is unfit for the position. Thus a much needed check upon teachers will have been established—a criterion by which both parents and the Board may judge of the fitness and efficiency of a teacher.

6. It will excite ambition in pupils and emulation in parents, and infuse new life in the one and increase the liberality of the other.

Since issuing the edition of this Circular of first of January last, I have been repeatedly requested to explain more at length the plan proposed therein, and to describe the difference between a graded school and one that is simply classified. This I will now briefly do:

A fixed course of study—certain specified studies—is not necessary to, nor is an incident of a classified school; whereas it is inseparable from, and is the foundation of a graded school. In the former, little or no reference is had in the arrangement of the

studies with reference to the order of development of the mental faculties; in the latter, this order is carefully studied and followed. In the former, little, and very often, no regard is paid to uniformity of progress in different studies; in the latter, this uniformity is compulsory. In a classified school, much and generally all, depends upon accident; while in a graded school, everything is fixed and permanent-every part bears a due and important relation to the whole. In a classified school there is no limit to the number of classes, each class is in effect, an independent school, pursuing such studies as the pupil, parent or teacher may choose to select-the choice in either case resulting largely or altogether from accidental circumstances. In such a school, a pupil may be in the highest class in reading and in the lowest in arithmetic; may be advanced in geography, and never have opened a grammar; may be in studeis in advance of the development of his mind, and know nothing of others which could and should have been learned at an earlier period. It is impossible to determine in a school of this character, whether teacher or pupils perform all, or half, or less than half of what either should perform in a given time.

A graded school, on the contrary, divides a fixed course of study into, say six equal or nearly equal parts. The pupils of a school large or small, in city or country, wealthy or poor, are examined with reference to their knowledge of the branches prescribed, and are placed respectively in that part of the course which is next above the parts in which the examination demonstrated that each was competent. Each then, pursues all the studies of the part in which he is placed-keeping step precisely with all the pupils that are in the same part-and when these studies are completed, he enters upon the studies of the next higher part of the course-never being in two parts at once—so that when he has completed all the studies of the last part of the several parts into which the course is divided, he has completed all the studies of the course. The plan of such a school is not thwarted nor affected by the length of them, nor by the fact that some pupils attend the year through and others in winter only; because there is a place, to be determined by examination, for each pupil—that part of the course next above the parts in all which the pupil can bear an examination. As far as a pupil does go, he goes thoroughly and symmetrically. He is as thorough in one branch as another. The pupils in one part progress at the same speed with the pupils in all the other parts, and all know the time that should be consumed in completing the studies of one part. Parents know just how their children progress and Boards know just how much teachers accomplish.

In a classified school one-twentieth of the pupils recite at once. In a graded school, one-sixth or less of the pupils recite at once. In other words, the pupils in the latter receive three or four times more of the time and attention of the teacher than in the former. In a classified school both teacher and pupil are without aim. In a graded school the work of both is prescribed and the highest motives to exertion are ever present. Instruction upon the classified plan is a waste of time and money, while instruction upon the graded plan economizes both to the utmost. A classified school is like referring for definitions to a dictionary in which the words are accidentally jumbled together, while a graded school is like referring to a dictionary which is alphabetically arranged.

In the above, we have had in mind a classified and a grade school as both exist in our own State. Some of our classified schools are better and many worse than above described.

Permit me to call your attention to section 72 of the Acts of the last session of the Board (as altered by the General Assembly,) upon the subject of a "System of Common Schools." If you answer that your compensation is too small for the labor hereby required, I reply that it indeed is, simply because the controlling necessity for this labor was not before the Legislature when your compensation was fixed. But you in effect, promised under oath to perform this labor when you entered upon the duties of your office. I promise you that both the inadequacy of your compensation and the amount and fruits of your labor, shall be faithfully laid before the Legislature at its next session; and if you promptly and faithfully discharge the duties herein devolved upon you, that body will liberally and cheerfully compensate you. A people who have exhibited both liberality and patience in providing all the enginery of education, are not likely to complain at the cost of oil and workmen.

I think that an examination of the law, and a careful survey of the necessities which have prompted this circular, and the benificent results at which it aims—results attainable by means within your control—will prompt you to enter upon the duties imposed

with promptness and alacrity. In no other way can the standard of education in your county be advanced; in no other way can you signally contribute to the education of the dear children committed for this purpose to your charge.

It will give me pleasure to answer any questions, to explain any and all matters of doubt, and in short, to aid you in carrying out the objects of this circular by every means and all the time at my command.

Let us stand by the Schools, as the only hope of preserving and perpetuating civil and equal freedom in our rising State.

The subject of "Graded Schools" was also presented to teachers and school officers by General Wiltse, in "The Iowa Instructor and School Journal" of January, 1863, as follows:

A graded school is simply one in which a prescribed course of study is divided into a given number of equal or nearly equal parts, and where the first one of these parts—which may be the first, third, or fourth, or sixth, or eighth, or ninth, or twelfth, or otherwise, depending upon the number of parts into which the course is divided—becomes the first grade, the second part the second grade and so on.

The first graded schools in the country were the Colleges, in which a given course of study was divided into four grades, and one year given for instruction in each grade. The only difference in general outline now, between our Colleges and what our public schools should be in respect to gradation, is in the branches of learning of which the course of study is composed, and the limit of time within which the course is to be completed.

In the public schools it has long been both fashionable and foolish to confound the term grade with either class or department, or both. To those who know that it is a blunder, and are able to ever bear the distinction in mind, no harm is done; but by sanctioning the bluder, the public have been kept in the dark as to the true meaning of a Graded School, till we doubt whether there are ten men in Iowa who can answer the question as to whether there is a graded school in the State. People generally have no idea of the meaning of the term, and naturally, therefore, feel very little interest in the establishment or support of graded schools.

There are very many thoroughly graded schools in our State, the pupils in which are acquiring in six years, a more complete education than ever was or can be acquired in a school that is not graded in twelve years. Still there is not in Iowa a fiftieth part of the number of such schools that there might and ought to be.

In all the graded schools of Iowa with which we are acquainted, the term graded is either confounded with department, or partly with department and partly with class. In these schools the course of study is usually divided into either six or twelve parts, and instead of being denominated the 1st, 2d, 3d, &c., grades, they are styled A, B, &c., rooms, or the A, B, &c., class of A, B, &c., room of the Primary, Intermediate (or Secondary) and Grammar departments.

A grade is a step; and when applied to a school, means that all the pupils in a particular grade step at once; and that the second step cannot be taken until the first is completed, nor can the third be taken by a pupil who has not taken both the first and second. So much of the course of study as is prescribed for one step, must be mastered by every pupil taking that step in the same length of time and at identically the same time. If a pupil fails or falls behind, he is returned to the next lower grade. That school in which the grades are in separate buildings, or in separate rooms of the same building, will, of course, much soonest master a prescribed course of study. But there can be a thoroughly graded school where all the pupils are in one room and all under a single teacher. The course of study should be the same in the one room, as where separate rooms are employed. More time will be required to master the course, if divided into more than three grades; but the whole school will advance certainly twice as rapidly, when properly graded, as the school which is not graded, and ten pupils will acquire a complete education in the former to one in the latter.

One important effect of a graded school is to diminish the number and increase the length of recitations. Another effect is that each pupil, if continued at school, masters the whole course and all are thoroughly educated. Another effect is to compel uniformity in text books and punctuality in attendance; to excite ambition in pupils and emulation in parents, and to infuse new life and higher objects and hopes in both parents and pupils.

In a school instructed by a single teacher, the course of study ought not to be divided into more than three and should never be divided into more than six grades. In case the course is divided into three grades, there will be given by the teacher, two hours the day to each grade, and in case of a division into six grades, there would be given one hour the day to each grade.

By the foregoing discussion it is manifest that what is now termed a class in graded schools, is in fact a grade and should be so denominated. The grades are easily distinguished by prefixing a figure or letter to each. It is further manifest that the high sounding term, Department,—which is at present generally employed, is but the name of a certain number of grades,—is responsible for much of the confusion, and uncertainty and ignorance prevailing upon the subject of graded schools. The moment we depart from a real name and substitute an artificial one, we incur the danger of losing identity; and this has been the result in substituting the term class, for grade, and the less pardonable because more dangerous substitution of Department for a number of grades.

The County Superintendents generally responded promptly to the circular, expressing sympathy with its objects, and a willingness to aid in accomplishing them. But it was found that many of them were engaged in teaching, and that they could not leave their schools to attend to the duties required of them in the circular. Others were not willing to engage in the work of visiting and grading the schools and collecting statistics, without some assurance of compensation for their services. The result was, that detailed reports were received from only a few counties; but enough were received to show what was too evident before, that the want of systematic instruction and of uniformity in text books, is causing a great waste of money and a greater waste of time. The Superintendent of one county reported one school of 10 pupils with 10 classes, another of 24 pupils with 17 classes, and another of 15 pupils with 19 classes; and these were an average of the schools in the county. Another Superintendent reported one school of 32 pupils with 50 classes, giving 7 minutes a day to each class for recitation.

The multiplicity of classes is owing in a great measure to the want of uniformity in text books. In one county the pupils were using the Geographies of seven different authors, and Grammars of four different authors. In the same school were frequently found three or four different sets of Reading and Spelling books. In other counties school officers have taken an interest in the subject, the text books recommended by the Board of Education have

been adopted and adhered to—the schools have been better classified and in some instances graded.

Wherever the schools have been graded the attendance is more regular and the instruction more thorough. This system also saves time. Pupils attending Academies and Colleges often pursue studies properly belonging to the Common School, where the common branches should be finished. Our higher institutions of learning can never exert a commanding literary influence while their halls are filled by those pursuing elementary studies. The graded system gives special attention to those essential studies, spelling and reading. These are too frequently neglected by pupils anxious to advance, and Algebra and Natural Philosophy are studied by those who can neither spell nor correctly use the English language. More applicants for admission to the Military Academy at West Point are rejected for failures in spelling than for deficiencies in other branches. In nothing is it more difficult to enforce the motto, "hasten slowly," than in a course of elementary instruction, and yet in nothing is it more important. The graded system checks the break-neck speed with which "Young America" attempts to rush up the "Hill of Science."

TEACHERS' INSTITUTES.

The law requiring teachers to attend the Teachers' Institute in each county where held, gives general satisfaction. Each teacher in the State is thus benefitted by the appropriation, and through them the schools in each sub-district. We know of no other agency that can reach so many teachers with so little expense to the State and so great profit to the people. Of the 8,500 teachers in the State, more than half, as nearly as we can ascertain, have attended Teachers' Institutes during the last two years. The Institutes are generally in charge of practical teachers, or of men who devote most of their time to conducting them.

Eminent Educators in other States have expressed their approval of Teachers' Institutes. Hon. Henry Barnard, of Connecticut, says: "During nearly a quarter of a century's study and observation of schools, school systems and educational agencies, in different States and countries, I have tried, seen or read of nothing so universally applicable, or so efficient in awakening and directing rightly both professional and parental interest in the broad field of

popular education, as a well attended and wisely conducted Teachers' Institute. A single educational lecture or address, or a convention in which a number of addresses are delivered, may occasionally move a sluggish community into sudden and vigorous action; but generally it is only after years of effort, by a few individuals, against all sorts of obstacles, that a good school-house is built, a proper classification of studies secured, and well qualified teachers employed and adequately paid, in schools of different grades. But I cannot recall a town where I ever held a well conducted Institute, where the teachers were distributed through all the principal families, and the evenings were devoted to public addresses and discussions on topics connected with the organization and administration of the school system, and the classification, instruction and discipline of public schools, where the work of educational improvement did not at once begin, and begin too where all improvement in the education of children must begin, in the heads and hearts of parents, in the enthusiasm, enlarged knowledge and practical skill of teachers, and in the well considered and liberal action of school officers and the public generally."

Teachers' Institutes are most highly appreciated in those States taking the lead in educational matters. In Massachusetts and New York Institutes are held in nearly every county, although the former supports four State Normal Schools and the latter one, besides making appropriations to nearly one hundred Academies for the purpose of instructing Common School teachers. The Normal Department of our State University is doing a good work, and its graduates are giving a good account of themselves wherever we hear from them; but the great majority of teachers cannot avail themselves of its benefits.

REPORTS.

Nearly all the County Superintendents complain of the difficulty of obtaining reports from the District Townships in season to prepare their annual reports by the time fixed by law. They not only complain of delay, but of such glaring defects and imperfections as to render them in some cases almost worthless. The charges of

inaccuracy and negligence are most severe against Sub-Directors. In view of this wide-spread difficulty I would suggest that the District Secretaries be required to furnish the statistics now sought for in the reports of Sub-Directors, and that their compensation for such service be fixed by the Board of Directors by whom they are appointed. Statistics are of no value unless reliable, and I am satisfied we shall not obtain correct reports until competent men are selected to make them and are paid for their services.

SCHOOL FUND.

I would respectfully call your attention to the condition of the School Fund. The delinquent interest in September last, amounted to \$333,341 94. The amount of interest apportioned to the several counties during the year 1863, is \$212,720 16, being \$00 79 for each person between five and twenty-one years. Not only is the interest delinquent, but in some cases the original fund is becoming less, in consequence of losses by insufficient security or the depreciation of property held as security. Moreover, at the present time, in some of the Eastern counties, portions of the original fund are unproductive in the hands of the County authorities, they not being able to obtain 10 per cent. interest on loans as the law requires. The present is regarded as a favorable time for calling in this fund and investing it where the annual returns will be certain although they may be somewhat less than they would now be if interest were promptly paid.

STATEMENT OF THE ANNUAL APPORTIONMENT OF THE SCHOOL FUND INTEREST.

The following statement shows the annual apportionment of the interest of the Permanent School Fund, from the commencement of our school system to the present time. This is exclusive of the County and School District Tax. It shows that we have realized and expended \$1,402,326 64 from the annual income of a fund, which was generously donated to the State for the education of our youth:

COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT.

The present law requires the County Superintendent to examine applicants for teachers' certificates, hear and decide cases appealed from the District Board of Directors, and transmit his annual report to this office. The opinion is unanimous, so far as expressed, that the duties of this officer should be enlarged, requiring him in addition to what is now prescribed, to visit each school in his County twice during the year, and to lecture once in each District-Township. As an examiner, he can ascertain the literary and scientific qualifications of the teacher; but the ability to teach can be determined only by a visit to the school room. Too often directors and parents having employed the teacher and placed their children under his care, manifest no farther interest, while the teachers' work of all others should be subject to the inspection of competent judges. County Superintendents are in a great measure responsible for the success of the schools and must visit them in order to judge of their character. With the present law it is difficult to find suitable men who will accept the position; and it is often filled by those who are not qualified or by those who manifest no interest beyond the nominal discharge of their duties. By imposing additional duties and fixing a suitable compensation, the services of competent men can be secured. We respectfully suggest that you make the duties of this office such as to require the best talent in each County to fill it.

We know that the present time is unfavorable for recommending any action requiring additional expenses, that our taxes are SECRETARY'S REPORT.

increasing with the continuance of the war, and that economy should be exercised in every department. But economy does not consist in withholding appropriations where the interests of the people demand them. Your legislation for the schools looks beyond the present, and will determine the future character of the State. Enlightened patriotism and true philanthropy alike dictate a liberal policy in behalf of our Common Schools. It would be doubtful economy to expend all our resources in contending for our rights and at the same time to neglect the means for preserving those rights. Said Madison: "A well instructed people alone can be a permanently free people."

The republic once restored will be more securely protected by intelligent and virtuous citizens, than by the strong arm of military power. A few thousand dollars annually expended for the schools may secure for the State its highest safeguard, enlightened citizens.

CONCLUSION.

We respectfully suggest that as the last edition of the School Laws has for some time been exhausted, provision be made for publishing a new edition, immediately after your adjournment, which shall contain all the School Laws in force. The expense will be slight compared with the obvious advantages.

In conclusion, we earnestly commend the schools to your guardian care, believing you will consider their interests second to none with which you have been entrusted by the people. Other claims, local or transient in their nature, will be pressed upon you; but the claim of the schools knows no section—no party—it comes from all the children in the State; and you will leave no more enduring monument of legislative wisdom, than laws, which shall contribute to make these children, the educated citizens of a great and prosperous commonwealth.

REPORT OF ACTING SECRETARY WILTSE.

DUBUQUE, Dec. 15th, 1863.

To the General Assembly of Iowa:

Both the Secretary and Acting Secretary of the Board of Education have solicited me to submit a report for the period that the schools were under my charge, and especially to present my view of the present School Law. As it is out of my power to either visit the School Office or avail myself of its records, for the purpose of a report, I will briefly examine portions of the School Law and point out such defects therein and such alterations thereof, as my own experience suggests.

The people of the State, speaking through the Constitution, have determined that the schools—the highest and most thoroughly diffused interest of our State-should be placed under the control of a body of men selected for that one purpose. The Constitution itself goes further, and provides not only for a Board of control, but devolves upon this Board, until the year 1863 shall have expired, the making of the school laws. In their desire for a Board of control, the people simply availed themselves of the experience of some of the older States, while in providing that this Board should legislate, they not only went beyond all precedent, but actually "took a step in the dark." The Constitution provides that (until after the year 1863) the educational interests of the State shall be managed by a Board, the members of which shall be elective, and that this Board shall have full power to legislate in relation to all the schools which receive aid from the State; but it denies to this Board the power to levy taxes or make an appropriation of money; invests the Legislature with complete revisory power over the Board, and inhibits it from re-enacting any law of its own which the Legislature has, by virtue of its supervisory power, altered, amended or repealed. To the Legislature the Constitution gives the exclusive power over both the school lands and the school funds.

The first session of the Legislature under this Constitution, met in January, in the year 1858, but the first session of this Board was not convened until the next following December. The Legislature finding the State without any law in reference to the schools, save the provisions of the Constitution, and finding that to leave the schools in this condition would be virtually to suspend them for a year, passed a detailed and well considered school law, under which all the schools of the State at once went into operation.

On the threshhold of the first meeting of the Board, the Supreme Court, the Court of last resort in the State, declared this law unconstitutional, and that the Legislature, in making it, had usurped the powers of the Board. But the Court declined to state what particular powers had been usurped, and in effect declared that it was impossible to draw a line that should divide the powers which belonged to the Board from those which belonged to the Legislature.

When the Board met, it simply had the alternative of adopting the law made by the Legislature, or, by ignoring that law, to bring the powers of the Board and the Legislature into collision, to create instability and uncertainty in the law, and to throw the schools of the State into complete confusion. The Board wisely adopted the Legislative Act, and passed a law, which the Supreme Court has since pronounced valid, legalizing all that had been done under the law of the Legislature.

In the little legislating for the schools which the Board has done, the Legislature has freely exercised its revisory power. The effect of all this has been to deprive the Board of the exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the fundamental law—to throw the responsibility of the school laws upon the Board, and the actual making of them upon the Legislature.

Under the Constitution, the Board is to make the laws, but only such laws as are liable to be altered, amended or repealed by the Legislature, and when so either altered, amended or repealed, they become perpetual; for the Board cannot re-enact the laws nor twice act upon the subject of them, nor is the power to alter, amend, or repeal to be held in abeyance or be twice exercised. And as nearly every subject of legislation affecting the schools, and certainly all the important ones, has already passed finally from the hands of both bodies, there is next to nothing touching the schools which either the Board or the Legislature can do.

The difficulties already encountered are only a small part of what inhere in the system. Never has there been devised a more complete intertwining of powers, and nothing in theory even could be more certain than that powers disposed as are those of the Board and the Legislature, would never work in harmony. Had the subject been any other than the education of our children—a subject upon which the tenderest forbearance is felt and exercised by the people of this State—its impracticability would have been much earlier manifested.

The idea of a Board of Education having powers subordinate to the law-making power, is an old one, and has been in practice of the highest benefit to the schools. This idea, clearly expressed in the Constitution of this State, was overworked by being moulded into a new or fourth branch of Government. Had the Constitution simply provided that there should be a Board of Education, consisting of the Governor and Lieutenant Governor and six persons appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, to hold office for six years; that this Board should appoint its own Secretary and have control of the internal arrangement and management of the schools, but that it should receive no compensation other than its own and the actual expenses of its members, the idea of a Board would have taken the form that it long ago took in some of the older and wiser States. Two members of such Board, until the Legislature meets annually, should retire at the expiration of every two years and their places be filled by appointment, as in the first instance. The members of such Board would of course be selected on account of their ability, integrity and interest in the subject. None others, it is fair to presume, would accept a position to which no pecuniary compensation was attached. In his discharge of the duties prescribed by law, the Secretary would be ever supported and largely assisted by, and at the same time be amenable to the Board; thus enlarging the sphere of his influence and usefulness, and at the same time holding him to a strict accountability, compared with a Superintendent of Public Instruction, acting independently of a Board, who if elected for two years, can be held to no accountability during his term of office, and whose acts or failures to act are hid from the public, and the advantage of a body of men whose business it is to see that their Secretary does his duty, and who know thoroughly what that duty is, must be obvious to all. The choice of a Superintendent will not always be of a proper person nor will successive Superintendents entertain like views or pursue a like policy; while the choice of Secretary will ever be of a proper person, and however many changes there may be in the person, there will be none in the policy of the Board; the Superintendency will lack and the Secretaryship secure certainty and uniformity.

The existing School Law, though ample in its financial provisions, and excellent in its District system, fails in not holding the officers who administer it, to accountability. The law asks of its officers the number of school children; the number of schools and branches taught; the number and average attendance of pupils; the number of teachers and their compensation; the length of term and cost of tuition; the amount paid to teachers; the text book in use; the number of school houses and their value, and the amount arising from taxation and received from the public fund respectively. These questions, though proper in themselves. do not reach the subject upon which it is of the first importance to have information. The funds and school houses and teachers are simply the means by which an object is to be attained. These are provided solely that the children may be instructed, and may all be provided in abundance and the children fail of instruction. The law should require of its officers full and detailed information upon the subject. The President or Secretary of each District should be required to report the government, method of instruction, course of study, classification and progress of each school in the District. Where the population of the District reaches one thousand, the law should require the report to be printed.

Of each County Superintendent the law should require a detailed report in print of the manner in which he has discharged every duty devolved upon him. The duties of this office bear and ever should bear a controlling relation to the schools; but they are now discharged in as many different ways as there are counties in the State. Some of these Superintendents realize the magnitude and sacredness of the interests confided to them, and are prompt and thorough in the discharge of their duties, even at great personal sacrifice, others do in a heedless and inefficient manner, just as little as possible—aiming apparently to make money out of the pitiful compensation which the law provides. To the information

derived from the reports of the several Districts in the county, the Superintendent should add the results of his own visits, observations and efforts. He should by all means publish his method of examining teachers and the results of these examinations. In no particular is so much power exercised over the schools as in the one of these examinations, and in none therefore is a strict accounting by the Superintendent, so important. Whether in many instances favorites and relatives are passed and competent teachers rejected; whether or not the examination is made, the occasion of rewarding friends and punishing enemies, depends entirely upon the uprightnesss of the Superintendent. Besides, I have been repeatedly informed by County Superintendents that they have granted certificates to incompetent persons, as the only means of supplying the schools of their counties with teachers. Who does not see the effect of publishing to the world this humiliating confession; or rather who does not see that no Superintendent would dare to publish it? The fault lies in the manner of the examination. There are a few subjects upon which a candidate can best be examined orally, but as a rule the questions and answers should both be of record. The Superintendent should prepare, either in writing or print, twenty or more questions upon each branch and prescribe just rules in conformity to which the answers of candidates are to be written out. These rules should secure to each candidate and to all alike, a fair opportunity to exhibit what they know upon the subjects with which the questions deal. Attach the questions and answers with name and residence, that they may become a record of the competency or incompetency of the candidate—a record to support or refute charges against Superintendents, and from which Boards may judge of both competency and com-

All the questions now propounded by the law to its officers are answered in the briefest manner, and generally in figures, and answered alike by competent and faithful officers, and by neglectful and worthless ones. A Board or Superintendent may deserve all praise, may have, by the right use of means, achieved results of an important nature; may have set an examply eminently worthy of being followed, and no benefit arise therefrom to other Boards or Superintendents, simply because they never hear of it. Nothing is known to the public upon the vital question of instruction, and

nothing will be known until reports throw open the school house doors.

In the State where popular education is most fostered, and its results most beneficent, the annual printed school reports are as one to every four thousand people. In Iowa, it is one report to seven hundred thousand people. In Massachusetts, with a population of twelve hundred thousand, there are annually printed of the public schools, between three hundred and four hundred reports; while in Iowa, with a population of more than half that of Massachusetts, we have a single report once every two years. As a financial measure, on the score of economy, these reports are of the first importance. In nearly every county of the State, more money is annually wasted through their absence, than is requisite to the printing of them all.

Through special reports made to me in the capacity of Acting Secretary, I obtained a view of the condition of instruction in our schools. Instead of its being systematic, as it should be, I found it to be purely accidental. There is rarely a fixed course of study, and when fixed it is often made to embrace improper studies, or too many studies. Generally, no reference is had to arranging studies with reference to the development of the intellect. No limit is fixed to the number of classes, and they often reach to one half the number of pupils, rendering it impossible for a teacher to give of his time to any one class, more than fifteen minutes the day. The pupil is permitted (his parents consenting,) to pursue and to omit particular studies at will. Pupils are advanced in some studies, and know nothing of others that should first have been acquired. No given amount of labor is to be performed by either pupil or teacher, and no definite result or rate of progress, is aimed at by either. No one knows-there is no criterion by which to judgewhether the teacher has performed more or less than his duty, or whether he has performed any part of it; nothing to demonstrate the proficiency or delinquency of a pupil. There is no reward for the parent who has made sacrifices that his boy might be punctually and regularly at school, and nothing to shame him who has sacrificed his boy rather than incommode himself.

Instruction is as susceptible of being systematized as is any branch of business. It derives higher advantages from being systematized, and suffers more from want of system, than does any department of industry. The law should make systematized instruction obligatory. It should provide that a course of study be adopted: that this course of study be divided into a given number of equal, or nearly equal, parts; that no pupil shall pursue the studies of two of these parts at the same time, nor shall he pursue the studies of any part but that one which is next higher than that or those of which he has completed all the studies. A school thus arranged is termed a graded school—a school that progresses by steps—because two steps cannot be taken at once, and because the second cannot be taken until the first is completed.

This plan is as well adapted to the country schools, and to the small and poor schools, as to the larger and wealthier ones; to the schools where the large scholars attend only in the winter, and the small ones only in summer, as where all attend together the year through. The results of substituting system for the uncertainty and confusion that now prevails, will, among others, be to lessen the number of classes from fifty to seventy-five per cent., and to increase in the same proportion the length of time which the teacher may devote to each pupil in the school. Instruction will be both symmetrical and thorough. All the children will be taught—not only the bright ones, and those that are encouraged and assisted at home, but the dull and unfortunate children as well.

The length of time necessary to complete one part of the course and of the whole course, will be definitely known, and will form a just and lasting criterion by which to judge of both teacher and pupil. Every parent in the District can be accurately informed from day to day of the progress being made by his child, and the Board may know of the progress made by their teacher. To the faithful parent and diligent pupil there will ever be the stimulus of promotion, and to the selfish parent and delinquent pupil there will be the fear not only of failing promotion but of being reduced to a lower grade.

A very few of the Schools of our State are graded, and I refer to these and their results when I speak of the benefits to be derived from the plan proposed.

I have thus briefly discussed what I regard as grave defects in our School Law, and have incidentally referred to subjects of the highest moment to the subject of popular education in Iowa. In doing this I have not traveled beyond my own observation and experience. During the half year that I occupied a position of responsibility to the schools, I diligently endeavored to ascertain their exact condition. I did ascertain the condition of very many of them, and, with rare exceptions, found it one simply to be deplored. The records of the school office will bear witness that I labored assiduously to correct the evils to which I have referred, but I soon found that nothing less than the potent arm of the law could bring reform.

The Legislature should, as it can do Constitutionally at its present Session, assume exclusive jurisdiction of the School Laws; should require instruction in the schools to be systematized upon the plan herein pointed out; should direct the mode of examining teachers and should require of every officer and agent upon whom a duty, even the smallest, is devolved, a report as to how this duty has been performed, and should require these reports to be in print in all cases where it is practicable. It should in my judgment further provide for a Board of Education which should have the appointment and removal from office of their own Secretary, whose compensation should be large enough to enable him to promptly and thoroughly carry into effect, in all parts of the State, the requirements both of the law and the Board. There should not only be devolved upon this Board the execution of the laws, but they should be empowered to make, in the interim of the Sessions of the Legislature, such rules and regulations as are required to carry out vigorously the purposes of the law.

Upon assuming the duties of Secretary, I found the school office barren of information upon the subject of instruction. I could not hope to do anything that would result in benefit to the schools, without accurate information upon this subject. It would have required ten years to have visited, in term time, one-fourth of the schools of the State, visiting at the rate of one the day. The medium of communication which the law had provided, was the County Superintendents. To these I issued the Circular of 1st January, 1863. To those who did not answer the Circular I sent a second with a letter urging compliance. A large number of these officers furnished the desired data and a few of these labored efficiently to systematize the instruction upon the plan proposed by the Circular. The records of the office will show who did and who did not do so. For this labor the law provides no compensa-

tion. The service rendered was of great value to the schools, and I respectfully recommend the passage of a law authorizing the respective Boards of Supervisors to audit and pay the accounts for this service.

ABSTRACTS FROM REPORTS OF COUNTY SUPERINTENDENTS.

ALAMAKEE COUNTY.

There are two private schools in this county, in which advanced English, Latin, Greek and Mathematics are taught.

I have not succeeded, as I could wish, in grading the schools according to the plan recommended. A marked improvement however is seen in those schools where an attempt has been made at grading them. A great hindrance to success in grading the schools is found in the frequent changes of teachers and the short terms during which the schools are in session; still I would continue to urge a systematic course of study.

I have examined 171 teachers, by oral questions—perhaps written would be better. My standard of qualifications is so high that very few obtain certificates of the first grade.

A large number of teachers have gone into the army.

I am satisfied that the better the school law is understood and executed, the better it will be appreciated.

I think the Superintendent should be required by law to visit all the schools, and that he should be paid for such service.

BLACK HAWK COUNTY.

We cannot have accurate reports until we have a better method of collecting statistics. I would suggest that the District Secretary report for the entire District, without depending on the Sub-Director. We may then hope for uniformity and accuracy.

Let the County Superintendent be paid for his services, and, like other officials, require him to give bond for the fulfillment of his duties. I would make no change in the general features of the school law.

BUTLER COUNTY.

Last Winter and Spring I visited every school in Butler county then in session. I found the schools of the county in as good condition as perhaps ought to be expected in a county so new, and where so many of our most successful teachers are in the army. One of the greatest evils I found in connection with our schools, was the multiplicity of classes, varying from 13 to 36. In a majority of the schools the teacher could not give more than four or five minutes each day to a class with a suitable number of recitations. Two things account for the great number of classes, first, a want of uniformity in text books, second, forming classes of nearly the same grade.

Considerable interest was created in the schools of our county last winter, and these evils to some extent have been corrected. In the village of Clarksville a building has been rented for a High School, and \$1000 subscribed to furnish it.

The plan of *Graded Schools*, as set forth in a circular from your office, was recommended to each school.

CASS COUNTY.

I take pleasure in reporting to you that the schools in this county as a general thing are prospering. Several new school houses have been erected. I have established the graded system in a few of the schools, and I think it will work well; but owing to the sparseness of settlements it cannot be introduced every where. We use the text books recommended by the Board of Education. In most of the schools none but the common branches are taught.

CEDAR COUNTY.

There are three private schools in this county (counting the Catholic school) containing respectively 18, 20 and 25 scholars, and collectively 63 scholars.

Thirty schools of the county are graded, but not all of them

upon the plan suggested. Those schools that are graded show a larger and more regular attendance, and a more rapid and general advancement than those that are not graded. Those teachers who have graded their schools and prefer to have them graded, are the best teachers in the county. My general examinations are always in writing. When I have time I sometimes allow applicants to choose, but not often—generally those whom I know to be well qualified.

Whole number of examinations 196. Forty of these were rejected. Those who answer on an average of from 60 per cent. to 70 per cent. of the questions asked are entitled to 3d class certificates—from 70 to 85 per cent. 2d class—from 85 to 100 per cent. 1st class. In making out the per cent., the answer together with the manner in which it is expressed, and the method of obtaining it, are taken into consideration. My knowledge of the general success of a teacher is also considered in determining the class. First class, number issued this year, 31; second, 71; third, 54. These are also graded with reference to time.

Since the success of our schools depends in a great measure upon the number and kind of teachers, and these depend on the efficiency and vigilance of the County Superintendents, which depends on the powers and pay attached to the office, I would suggest that it be made the duty of the Superintendent to visit all the schools in his county for the purpose of becoming acquainted with the qualifications of the teachers, for the purpose of instructing them and introducing uniformity into the schools. Since change of teachers is frequent, and as scholars frequently change from one school to another, the efficiency of the school system depends, in a great measure, on the uniformity of the schools and the teaching. This uniformity is one of the great advantages of the graded schools.

I would also suggest that private examination be dispensed with and all the teachers be examined at public examinations to be held once a month, or less frequently if necessary, and that the Superintendent be required to call to his aid in public examination, two competent persons.

CERRO GORDO COUNTY.

The people generally would prefer the independent district sys-

tem. They object to giving the control of the sub-district to one man. The sub-director will frequently hire a particular favorite or relative against the wishes of a majority of the inhabitants; and will often pay high wages with the understanding that the teacher is to board with him, and pay a high price for board. By making the sub-districts independent, and placing this power in the hands of three men, it could not thus be abused. If we would have correct reports from the counties, there must be a different system of collecting statistics.

Many of the sub-directors are too ignorant to make out a correct report; others are too careless or take too little interest in the matter. Either the Secretaries of the District Townships should make out the reports for the Township, or the County Superintendent should have charge of the whole matter, including the apportionment of the Teachers' Fund. Lastly I would suggest that County Superintendents have something to do, and that they have reasonable compensation for their services.

CHICKASAW COUNTY.

There are no private schools nor Acadamies in this County. All our schools are graded according to your circular, except one. We can not give the results of grading the schools this year. We expect to have all the schools graded next winter.

I have given certificats to 46, and limited certificates to 10, and

have rejected 27.

I would suggest modifications of the School Law, so that each Sub-District can manage its fiscal affairs, both for school houses and support of schools; and that County Superintendents be compensated so that they can devote time to the duties of their office.

All the schools of this County have been visited, and I think the people mean to carry on this work so as to make our schools number one.

CLAYTON COUNTY.

My statistical report is the best I can furnish from the material

sent me by the Secretaries of the District-Townships. Two of the items are correct, viz: Teachers' Fund and the Annual Apportionment, as I got them from the Treasurer's books. I would suggest that the office of County Superintendent be abolished, and an Examiner in each Township substituted for it. If not abolished, I would have only three examinations during each year. I would have the District Secretary take the usual statistics of the Township instead of the Sub-Directors.

There is but one graded school in the County, and that is in the City of McGregor. It is an impossibility to grade country schools

as recommended in a recent circular from your office.

We have a decidedly mixed population with a corresponding grade of schools. We have not a surplus of teachers, consequently I aim to place teachers in the schools for which they are best qualified.

CLINTON COUNTY.

Enclosed please find my Annual Report. It is as complete as I could make it from the reports of the several District-Townships.

I have during the past summer introduced the graded system as recommended in your circular of Jan. 1st, 1862, in most of the schools of the county. Teachers and patrons generally approve of the plan, and the results thus far are satisfactory. I have no doubt that the plan fully enforced will reduce the present methods of teaching to systematic accuracy.

I usually examine applicants with written questions, and issue certificates of three grades. I grant certificates of the first grade to such as answer 90 per cent. of the questions, and have taught 3 years. The second grade to those who answer 75 per cent., and the 3d grade to those who answer 60 per cent. of the questions.

We have had male teachers enough to supply the schools for the winter terms, but at present I do not think there are more than 20 male teachers in the County, the residue are in the army. I would respectfully suggest that the law be amended so as to allow District Boards to levy a tax for procuring District Libraries and Apparatus.

DELAWARE COUNTY.

During the past year I have issued 146 certificates and rejected 66 applicants. About 45 of our best teachers have gone to war, and their places have been filled by the inexperienced. To such I usually give certificates for four, six or eight months. In examining I rely mainly on written questions, requiring written answers. I have no deputies. I could find, after trying, no one with pluck enough to recomend the refusal of a certificate. The public school in Manchester City is graded, and the result is such as might naturally be expected from a systematic instead of a hap-hazard way of teaching. No other school in the County is thoroughly graded. The district school in Delhi approaches it; but the teacher has been prohibited from enforcing the system, as being erroneous in theory, and impossible in practice. Public opinion will come around right after a while.

I have visited every school in the County, except three, which were closed when I was in their vicinity, and quite a number I have visited twice during the past year. Not having a living faithin the Legislature, I presented my account to the County Board of Supervisors, and got my pay—two dollars a day.

Last winter I walked 450 miles and spoke in 55 school houses.

DES MOINES COUNTY.

I am pleased to be able to state that the schools of this county are in a very flourishing condition. The average term which the schools have been taught during the past year, lacks only a fraction of seven months. The attendance has been much larger than any previous year.

In obedience to the request of Acting Secretary Wiltse, in his Circular of January 1st, 1863, I commenced visiting the schools of my county about the first of February, with a view to grading them as recommended in said Circular. But I soon satisfied my-self that it was impracticable to carry out, successfully, in the county schools, his system of grading. I therefore, with a view to better prepare the way for successfully grading the schools, directed the attention of the District Boards to the importance of furnishing

the teachers with blank Daily and General Registers and Class-Books, to enable them (the teachers) to exhibit to their successors the standing, deportment, &c, of each pupil in school, and the respective classes to which each belong. To this the District Boards responded tavorably, and nearly all the schools of the county are now furnished with suitable Registers, Records and Class-books, which will enable the teachers, virtually, to grade the schools.

The Public Schools of the City of Burlington never were in so flourishing a condition as at the present time. They are being graded after the plan recommended by Prof. Wells, of Chicago, in his work entitled "The Graded School."

The present attendance in the four Public Schools of the city, is about eight hundred.

In answer to the 4th inquiry in your circular of July 1st, 1863, I have to say, that, since the first of September last I have examined applicants for certificates by written and oral questions. To the written questions I require written answers. I issue certificates of four grades. Applicants answering correctly 90 per cent. of all the questions asked, other things being equal, receive grade No. 1; those 80 per cent., No. 2; 70, No. 3; 60, No. 4. Nos. 1 and 2 for twelve months, and Nos. 3 and 4 for six months.

I examine also in Theory and Practice of Teaching. The branches in which the applicant has been examined, are named in the certificate, and the per cent. of the questions correctly answered, marked in each branch, respectively; thus showing at once the true standing of the holder of the certificate.

My present mode of examination will, in due time, cut off all except those that are well qualified to teach.

The number of teachers that have gone into the army from this county since the first call for volunteers, is thirty-four.

With the main features of our present School Law the people of this county are well satisfied. But while this is true, it is claimed, however, that further legislation is necessary in order to perfect the system, the most important of which is the reinstating of the County Superintendency, with an adequate salary. This is called for loudly, and nothing short of it will satisfy the people of this county.

I am now engaged in visiting the schools, and expect to continue

until I shall have visited every school in the county. I am doing so at the urgent request, not of the teachers only, but of the people. In this I have the hearty approval and co-operation of our County Board of Supervisors, who have assumed a lively interest in the welfare of our schools.

I suggest that section 50 be so amended as to inflict a suitable penalty in case of failure of sub-directors to report as required by law. The report of sub-directors being the basis of all other reports, should be strictly accurate and made at the proper time. The law relating to independent or city districts, should be separate and distinct from the law relating to district townships. Much confusion and misunderstanding has grown out of the present law on account of the general powers conferred on the two Boards, without making proper distinctions.

I would suggest that the term "School Controllers" be applied

to the Board of City Districts instead of "Directors."

I might, with propriety, refer to other matters of interest connected with our schools, but must desist. While our beloved county is being distracted in consequence of the raising of the ruthless hand of rebellion, it is truly encouraging to witness the lively interest evinced on the part of the true friends of our Government in the cause of Universal Education. It goes to show an intelligent appreciation of the fact that with the cause of popular or universal education is linked the destiny of our nation. As the masses are educated and become virtuous and good, so will our free institutions be perpetuated.

DUBUQUE COUNTY.

I am happy to be able to state, that the schools generally in this county for the past year have been as prosperous as the embarrassments of the times would permit. By reference to the statistics it will, however, be found, that the attendance of male pupils has not been as large as the two preceding years; this is doubtless owing to the fact, that a considerable number of our youth have entered the army, as well as on account of a scarcity of male labor.

I should have been pleased to comply with the instructions con-

tained in a circular issued from your office last January; but as the duty was coupled with considerable expense in a populous county like this, and the Board of Supervisors declining to allow compensation for such labor, the duty was only partially performed. During the three weeks spent among our schools, I found but one of them graded, (I do not refer to our city schools,) but little uniformity in text books, and teachers generally not anxious to assume the responsibility of introducing new ones.

In order to accomplish the two important objects of grading the schools and securing uniform text books, teachers must be aided by some legally constituted authority. Were County Superintendents required to visit schools, exact uniformity in text books and grade the schools, I think the work could be accomplished with but little

reluctance on the part of parents.

In October last we held a very interesting Teachers' Institute and expect to hold another the 19th proximo. I have no doubt the Institute held last year was productive of considerable good. I cannot say I am *entirely* in favor of the present *fashionable* mode of conducting Institutes; it strikes me there is too much done by paid lecturers, and too little by live teachers.

EMMETT COUNTY.

You may perhaps think there is no interest in this county in regard to schools, but it is not so. At the time of making reports last year there was great excitement in this county on account of the Indians, and every school officer but one either moved away or enlisted as a soldier. The soldiers took possession of the school house which prevented having school last winter.

FAYETTE COUNTY.

I have the honor herewith to submit my annual report for 1862 and '63. The District Secretaries did not report to me, which is the cause of my delay in reporting to you. Our Teachers' Institute last Spring under the direction of Prof. M. Ingalls was well

attended, and its influence has been felt throughout the county. I have visited many of the schools during the year and can say there is a strong desire among teachers and people that the duty of Superintendents visiting the schools be restored. We have a Teachers' Association that meets this month. Several good school houses have been erected this year, and the Union School House in this place is a fine edifice. The school will be graded. A majority of the people of this county are in favor of each sub-district being a district, a body corporate, believing there would be less difficulty. Another change is desired by sub-districts where they are composed of different townships, so that if the house burns it shall not destroy the District. Our schools are backward, but believe they are improving, and hope the Legislature will make some changes that will materially benefit our schools.

FLOYD COUNTY.

The schools of Floyd County are in a more prosperous condition than at any previous time. Our Teachers are of a better grade, improving each year, and of necessity the schools must improve in a corresponding degree. I addressed a Circular to the Teachers in January last, asking information with regard to the condition of their schools, habits and morals of pupils, interest of parents, &c., from most of whom I received a cordial response. The schools were represented as in a good condition, but feeling the lack of interest on the part of parents. These representations I found to be true the past season in visiting the schools of the county. It seems strange that parents have no more sympathy for our common school system and care so little for the education of their children. With regard to the School Law I have no suggestions to make; a large majority of the people of the county are satisfied with its present features.

I have granted certificates to 90 teachers within the year; re-

jected 15 applicants.

The number of Teachers who have gone to the army I am not able to determine accurately, but judge it to be about fifteen or twenty.

None of the schools are graded as suggested by your Depart-

ment. I urged the matter upon the consideration of the District Boards, but they did not deem it advisable to adopt the system. J. CHESTON WHITNEY, Co. Sup't.

FREMONT COUNTY.

The number of private schools in this County is 6, pupils in attendance 288. There is one Academy having 70 pupils. There is one graded school. I examine teachers with oral and written questions. I grade certificates both in regard to time and qualifications.

Having conversed with school officers in several of the south western Counties of the State, I think the general opinion favors making the Sub-Districts independent. The schools of this County are mostly small and backward, yet there are not half enough qualified teachers to supply the demand. Many of the school houses are unfit for school purposes either in summer or winter, and we have scarcely half enough of these.

I have visited most of the schools during the summer for which I have received nothing except the satisfaction of knowing that new interest has been awakened in behalf of Education.

HARDIN COUNTY.

The delay of my report and its defects must be charged to the neglect and carelessness of sub-directors. The County Superintendent and the district Secretaries are subject to fines for remissness in sending their reports; but the Sub-Director, upon whom they depend, delays his report with impunity. I would suggest that the Sub-Director be paid for his services and be subject to a fine for neglect of duty. The schools have not been graded in this County, and can not be until there is authority for it, and the Superintendent is compensated for the time required for such work. The people of this County desire that the office of County Superintendent shall be elevated in its duties and compensation. And until this is done we can not hope for much improvement in our schools.

HENRY COUNTY.

My report is very unsatisfactory and imperfect for the reason that the reports of district Secretaries and Sub-Directors are defective. There are two private schools in this County. One having 100 pupils and the other 50. And one College having 100 pupils. The graded system as far as introduced works well. I examine teachers with oral questions, and grade certificates by time, inferior teachers obtaining a certificate for 3 months, a higher class for 6 months and the best teachers for 12 months. I would suggest very few changes in the school law. It is desirable however that some action should be taken to secure correct reports from school officers.

HUMBOLDT COUNTY.

All the schools in this County except one have been graded. The difficulties in the way of successful grading are want of uniformity in Text Books and a strong prejudice against all innovations. But I think these obstructions can be removed by perseverance.

The result of grading has been highly satisfactory in most cases; and where it has seemed to do less good, the fault was not in the system, but in the imperfect manner in which it was carried out.

I would suggest that the County Superintendent be required to visit all the schools in his County three or four times each year. He may then excite a wholesome spirit of emulation among the different schools and forward the cause of education in various ways.

DEARMAN WILLIAMS, Co. Sup't.

JACKSON COUNTY.

The grading of the schools in conformity with your recent circular meets with favor among teachers. The only question is in regard to its practicability in the country districts where the schools continue only a part of the year, and where the attendance is irregular, and the text books not uniform. I am in favor of a law compelling regular attendance and uniformity in text books. I am also

in favor of giving the entire charge of making the preliminary reports to the District Secretary. As long as we depend on Sub-Directors the reports will be very imperfect. The County Superintendent should also be authorized to devote his time wholly to the duties of his office.

JASPER COUNTY.

You will find my report less complete than I desire, owing to the great irregularity in the reports of the District Secretaries. The prevailing idea with the officers of the Districts seems to be that there is but one essential thing in a report, and that is the number of youths between the ages of five and twenty-one. Their reports present a very imperfect view of the financial condition of the Districts. I would suggest that the County Superintendent be made the head of school system in the county financially, if we desire a report showing the exact condition of the several school funds. How can the County Superintendent exercise a "general supervision" when the most material interests are under the control of other officers? With these modifications our school system will, in my opinion, work well.

JONES COUNTY.

There are three private schools in the County, having in all 172 pupils.

We have not attempted to grade the schools as recommended in the Circular from your office, for the reason that many people of the county think that under the present law the County Superintendent has nothing to do with the schools, and furthermore the Supervisors of the County are not willing to allow ordinary compensation for time actually spent in examining teachers.

I examine teachers by oral and written questions.

I grade certificates into four classes. The first grade obtains a certificate for 12 months; second grade 8 months; third grade 5 months and fourth grade 3 months.

The friends of education in this County believe that the County

Superintendent should be required by law to visit the schools and explain the School Laws to the people. By this means the school officers would learn their duty and most of the evils now complained of in the school system would be avoided.

KEOKUK COUNTY.

The great defect in our school system is the want of visitation by County Superintendents. Let him be required to lecture to the Teachers and Board of Directors in each District Township once a year, for which pay him from the School Fund, say \$5 00. The Boards that wish him to visit their schools, pay him from the same fund \$3 00 per day.

Let schools that fail to make required reports, or that have less than 24 weeks each year, or that employ unlicensed teachers, be deprived of all or such portion of the next dividend of school money as the Board of Supervisors may direct.

The act authorizing German to be taught has occasioned some trouble. The schools must be exclusively English, or Boards must permit German Schools two, three or four months a year when a majority of the voters in any Sub-District petition for it. Seldom can the same person teach successfully both languages.

Lastly, abolish the right of appeal, except to the Secretary of State Board and let every appellant pay him \$5 00.

KOSSUTH COUNTY.

I hope there will be no radical change in the essential features of our school law, but in accordance with your invitation, I venture to suggest some modifications of the law, in order to render it consistent with itself, and more in conformity with what I suppose to have been the views of the law makers themselves.

Part 33, edition of 1862, Sec. 6.—It appears to me that provision should be made for holding an extra meeting of the District Township. Our District Township is 24 by 32 miles, situated on both

sides of the river, which frequently, at the time of the District meeting, is impassable.

SEC. 7 (second).—I see no propriety in the proviso. Our District Township purchased a building for a school house in Sub-District No. 1, and afterwards built a new school house in the same Sub-District, all from an equal tax upon the District. Why, then, if we sell the old house, should not the pay go into the common fund?

SEO. 10.—When and where are the judges of the respective Sub-District elections to meet to canvass the votes for the Director at large? Why not have the Director at large elected at the meeting of the District Township, and let it be understood that he is to be President of the Board of Directors?

SEC. 17.—It appears to me that this section places the District Township too much in the power of a Sub-District. If a Sub-District asks for money to build a house, it must have it, whether the District thinks it expedient or not.

Secs. 18 and 19.—An earlier day should be appointed for the Directors to hold their first meeting and enter upon their duties. In many Sub-Districts they want their school to commence as early as the first Monday in May, only two weeks after the first meeting of the Board. Sub-Directors usually wish to employ teachers much earlier than that. I can see no serious objection to their entering upon their duties as early as the third or fourth Monday in March.

LOUISA COUNTY.

Many of the schools in this county have been graded; but many of our country schools can scarcely be graded according to any system that can be sustained. Much more might be done, however, if the County Superintendent were authorized by law to visit and grade the schools. As it now is, few can be found qualified for the position that will accept it.

MAHASKA COUNTY.

In accordance with the School Law, I hereby submit the following report for the year ending September 20th, 1863:

The schools of this county are in as prosperous a condition as can be expected, when we take into consideration the great scarcity of competent teachers. By competent teachers, I mean those who not only understand the branches they are required to teach, but who know how to teach them.

I have granted one hundred and forty-six certificates during the last year, and have rejected thirty applicants, and I have no hesitation in saying that many of those who received certificates should have been rejected. According to the instructions from your office, a thorough knowledge of the branches named in the School Law is necessary to obtain a certificate. I immediately saw the difficulty there would be in obtaining a sufficient number of well qualified teachers for our schools; and published the following, which will explain my method of grading certificates:

"Teachers' Certificates.—I will state that the object of an examination is to ascertain the applicant's general knowledge of the branches he expects to teach, and his skill in the art of teaching.

The law contemplates that all teachers shall be qualified to teach Orthography, Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, Geography and English Grammar; and certainly every teacher should have a thorough knowledge of these branches. The fact that he has a little knowledge of each, will not answer, he should be familiar with them; ready and able at all times to explain, illustrate and simplify his subject. He must be a man of good moral character and general intelligence; one who will feel a deep interest in the welfare of his school, and who is sparing no pains to qualify himself for the faithful discharge of the ardvous duties of his responsible position. He should have a correct idea of the duties and responsibilities of a teacher. But we are told that if we grant certificates only to those who possess all these qualifications many of our schools will be without teachers. This I admit, and have therefore graded my certificates from one to three. I endeaver to grant No. 1 only to those who come somewhat near to this standard, and grades two and three, to others according to their qualifications; No. 3 indicating the lowest standard of qualifications that will entitle any one to a certificate. I will also state that in my examinations, I will endeavor not to embarrass and confuse any one with difficult and perplexing questions, for such would only defeat what we wish to accomplish.

I published the above soon after the creation of the office of

Superintendent, and have endeavored to adhere to it ever since.

EXAMINATIONS. In my examinations, I adopt both the oral and written answers.

Colleges, &c. We have in this County, two private High Schools, and one College, all in a flourishing condition.

Graded Schools. I can not say that there are any schools in this county graded according to the system recommended in the circular from your office. That circular was issued on the first of January last and at that time the schools were too far along in their terms to adopt the system; at all events, it could have been tried in but few of them; and my engagements were such that it was impossible for me to quit my business and give the subject that attention that its importance demanded. I fear, however, that it will be very difficult to introduce that system into the sparsely settled districts of this County. We have graded schools in the City of Oskaloosa, although somewhat different from the plan recommended.

Text Books. The Eclectic Series and Mitchell's and Monteith's Geographies are used in all the schools of this County.

Teachers in the Army. Since the first call for volunteers about twenty of the teachers of this County have gone into the army, thus showing that when our beloved country calls for help, the teachers are as patriotic as any other class of men; with them, the love of country appears to be predominant, and but few of them are found identified with those who are in opposition to the government.

School Law. The present school system was, at first, very unpopular, so much so that politicians were afraid to endorse it; but after a trial of about five years a great change has taken place; the system has become popular, and the standard of our public schools has been elevated. I will not recommend any radical change in the law at the present time, the people desire some stability in the legislation on this subject; constant changes tend to perplex and embarrass them. There are cases, however, where the present law may appear to do injustice in some particular locality; but the correction, by legislation, of one local difficulty, might create many others elsewhere, and make much confusion and trouble.

I think, however, that the law should be so changed as to require the President or Secretary of each school district to satisfy the County Superintendent by oath, that they had fully complied with the requirements of the law before they are permitted to draw any of the apportionment from the County Treasury.

MILLS COUNTY.

I have urged upon teachers and school officers the plan proposed for grading schools, but many objections are urged against its practicability in our small country schools on account of irregularity in attendance, &c.

I have my doubts in the matter, on the plan proposed. It has not been adopted to any extent in this county.

I am satisfied that the graded system is the true one and hope some plan may be proposed adapted to our country schools.

I think it would be impolitic to change the main features of the school law. J. M. MADISON, Co. Sup't.

POLK COUNTY.

In reply to your circular of July 1st, 1863, there are in this county some eight private schools having in all about 240 pupils. We have graded some 20 schools, as near as possible in accordance with the circular issued from your office. The results of such grading are most satisfactory to both patrons and teachers.

I examine teachers both by oral and written questions. I have examined 126, and rejected 15, and have issued certificates of first grade to 15, second grade to 26, third grade to 67. About fifty

teachers have gone into the army.

Last winter I visited nearly all the schools of this county, spending a day in most of them and talking to the patrons at night. The people every where favored the plan of grading the schools when it was explained to them. I am convinced that our schools will never accomplish their high mission until they are graded.

I also believe every school should have a library of all the books used in the school, and that the pupils should be supplied from it, the books and studies of the pupils to be under the control of the teachers. Text books furnished thus will cost less and secure uniformity.

The necessity of increasing the duties and salary of the County Superintendent have been so repeatedly urged upon the attention of the Legislature that it is hoped they will appreciate its importance.

The meetings of the Teachers' Association held in different parts of the county have resulted in much good to the schools. During the Summer several school celebrations were held, creating a lively interest among the citizens.

The people of this county generally like the school law and think changes in the law would increase instead of diminish its defects. If the people would elect men competent to execute the law we should hear much less about its defects.

VAN BUREN COUNTY.

I would recommend no change in the school law except to increase the duties and pay of County Superintendents. He certainly ought to have the "visiting power." The citizens of this county desire it, and none more than the teachers. At their Institute in September last, a resolution was passed unanimously praying the next General Assembly to enact a law requiring the Superintendent to devote his whole time in promoting the interests of D. G. PERKINS, Co. Sup't. the schools in his county.

WARREN COUNTY.

My report is somewhat defective, owing to the defective reports of some of the Secretaries. I have been at much trouble to make it as full as I have.

As to the schools in Warren county for the past year, so far as I can judge, I can report them in a healthy condition; but I desire to see a greater demand for the very best class of teachers. The folicy that has been adopted by some of our District Boards to set a limit to the wages of teachers, beyond which no Director can go, will, I fear, prove disastrous to our schools, especially as the price fixed will not command the services of the best teachers. The correct theory is, to demand the very best teachers and pay them

generously, and wisely discriminate between those who are really entitled to good wages, and those who are not. One teacher may be dear at fifteen dollars per month, while another may be cheap at fifty. I am decidedly in favor of the township district system exclusively, or the independent sub-district system; one or the other is preferable to the mixture of both. The township district system is. I think, better adapted to an older state of things than we have in this country. I believe it to be a fine thing when the District Board is composed of the best men, men who are disposed to do strict justice to every sub-district; but this is frequently not the case. There is not that equality in our sub-districts that exists in older States; and hence a measure that may seem to be well adapted to some of the sub-districts, is not adapted to others; and although the Board may try to discriminate, the result generally is that some portion of the District is much dissatisfied. On the whole, I think it would be better that each sub-district should manage its own affairs, with provisions compelling them to provide well for the education of their children, in cases where the people were disposed to not do their duty. I think the minimum of the tax levied for Teachers' Fund, should be fixed by law; also the minimum of school house tax should be fixed by law, till each subdistrict has built (where they now have none) and paid for a good school house.

I would recommend that it be made the duty of the teacher to report to the Secretary, instead of making it the duty of the director to do the same. Each district should be compelled to provide each school with a good substantially bound weekly register.

WOODBURY COUNTY.

The small proportion of scholars who have attended school is attributable, in a good measure, to the fact that many families have abandoned their homes on the frontier, and taken up their residence here (Sioux City) for protection from the Indians; and in their unsettled condition have neglected, or have been unable to send their children to school. A state of war is peculiarly unfavorable to educational interests, and our schools have suffered very

materially from the excitement attending the presence of large bodies of soldiers, and the uneasy state of mind induced by the expedition against the Indians. Many have feared for the safety of the settlements in this county, and some even for Sioux City, and have held themselves in readiness for flight on the shortest notice. Of course children participate largely in this feeling, and those who have attended school have not received the benefit they otherwise would.

I would suggest that some alteration be made in our school system, by which the office of County Superintendent may be either abolished or endowed with some effective power, and paid so that a good man for the place may have some inducement to accept it and perform its duties. A visit to all the schools in this county involves a ride of one hundred and twenty miles, and a week's time; and the entire compensation of the office, at the rate which county orders now bring, is less than five dollars! Of course the office is a heavy tax on any one who accepts it. If the officer were paid from the school fund it would not be so bad, but even then no poor man could accept it.

WINNESHIEK COUNTY.

The less change in the school law the better. I would suggest that some method be adopted for obtaining correct reports from Sub-Districts. The Secretary of every District Township complains of incomplete reports from some of the Sub-Directors. The salary of County Superintendents should be such that in a county like this, with seventy-five schools, he could devote his whole time to them. The subject of "Graded Schools" was brought up in our Teachers' Institute last spring, and was heartily approved by all; but I feared to have our teachers introduce so new a system unless I could have the authority and opportunity of being with them two or three times during the term. The schools can be graded with success, as soon as legal authority gives the Superintendents in their respective counties control of the matter.

Upon the whole, I am glad to report progress in the schools of this county. The law compelling teachers to attend Teachers' Institutes, is an excellent one. Our Institute had over 90 teachers,

many of whom had never before attended one. They will all attend voluntarily another year.

WASHINGTON COUNTY.

The reports from teachers and school officers are very defective. I would suggest that wages be withheld from teachers, and apportionments of public money from districts until they furnish the reports required by law. We can make no progress in grading schools in this County unless there is a law requiring it.

I would suggest an examining board of three in each County, instead of County Superintendent, and that they visit the schools.

There is great neglect of school houses in this County; many of them are in wretched condition; few have out-houses, which I deem disgraceful and demoralizing.

WINNEBAGO COUNTY.

The schools in this County have been graded and are making much better progress than ever before.

The school law with little patience is easily understood and executed, and should not be changed.

WRIGHT COUNTY.

The want of uniformity in Text Books and the sparseness of the population have prevented any efforts at grading the schools in this County.

The law should require the County Superintendent to visit the schools and thus enable him to determine whether the teacher is doing his duty.

The law should also regulate the salary of school officers. It is the practice in some districts of this County to pay each Sub-Director \$15 in addition to the salary of the President, Secretary and Treasurer. In one district the school was taught 28 weeks costing as per report \$141.50, and the school officers of the same district received \$107.50 for their services.

EXPLANATION.

Col. Thomas H. Benton, Jr., Secretary of the Board of Education, entered the Military service of the United States in November, 1862, leaving the office in charge of Hon. H. A. Wiltse of Dubuque, who performed its duties until the first of April, 1863. Other engagements then requiring his attention, Col. Benton requested me to take charge of the office, with the expectation that he would return in time to superintend the preparation of his Biennial Report. But finding it impracticable to leave his command without detriment to the service, he recently gave directions for the preparation of the Report, hoping to furnish material for a portion of it. We regret that he has been unable to do this, as his long connection with the public schools of the State, rendering him familiar with the school laws, eminently fitted him to make recommendations for their improvement. As the law fixes the day for publication, we can delay no longer and present the Report in its present form.

Col. Benton has just sent his resignation as Secretary of the Board of Education, and Gov. Kirkwood has appointed the undersigned to fill the vacancy.

UNIVERSITY REPORT.

To the General Assembly and

Board of Education of the State of Iowa:

The Trustees of the State University, in the presentation of their accustomed Biennial Report, in accordance with the provisions of the Statute, desire neither to ignore nor overlook the great fact, that during the past two years and upwards, our country has been involved in a gigantic struggle with armed rebellion, affecting most materially not only the commerce and currency of our land, but also every department of business and industry; and, of course, the educational interests of our country have experienced, more or less, the baneful influences of the same disturbing cause. And while some of the literary institutions of the east have been very much reduced in the number of students, and others forced temporarily to suspend, we think we have cause for mutual congratulation in the fact that the Iowa State University, in the meantime, has not only maintained its own, but has made a bold advance in the race of prosperity and usefulness. The number of students flocking to her halls for instruction and discipline, has increased over seventy per cent., while her finances have also improved in nearly the same ratio. The cause of this unexpected prosperity, it is believed, arises, in part, from a more just and general appreciation of the superior advantages which this institution affords the youth of our State who are disposed to avail themselves of its discipline; and in part, also, from the energetic labors of a harmonious and working Faculty.

CHANGES IN THE FACULTY.

Since our last Report, some changes have occurred in the construction of the Faculty. In 1862, Rev. O. M. Spencer, D. D., who had hitherto occupied the Chair of Professor of Chemistry

and Natural Philosophy, was elevated to the position of President, vice Rev. Silas Totten, D. D., resigned. In the summer of 1863, the Chair of Ancient Languages was made vacant by the removal of Rev. James Lillie, D. D., and Rev. Joseph Roberts, L. L. D., of Burlington, Iowa, was elected to fill the vacancy. And at the same session, Gustavus Hinrichs, Esq., was elected Professor of Modern Languages; Charles Borland, A. B., Tutor, and Mr. O. C. Isbell teacher of vocal and instrumental music. Subsequently, at the opening of the present session, such was the unexpected increase in the number of students, that it was found necessary to elect several assistant teachers, and Misses Louisa Brainard and Lizzie Moore were elected as such assistants.

DIVISION OF THE COLLEGIATE YEAR.

On the recommendation of the Faculty, a change was made in the division of the Collegiate Year. Under the former system the year was divided into two terms of twenty weeks each; under the new, the year is divided into three terms of about thirteen weeks each. It was suggested that long terms of study without relaxation, were more liable to impair the health of students, and besides the present division conforms more to the practice of other Colleges and Universities. By the present arrangement, three-fourths of the year is devoted to study, while the remaining fourth is given to vacation; and the year is so divided that the first vacation of two weeks includes the holidays-the second vacation of one week occurs in the Spring of the year, while the long vacation of ten weeks occurs in the months of July, August and part of September, when the heat of Summer unfits for study, and when the services of the sons and daughters of our farming population can be most profitably employed at home.

COMPLETION OF THE SECOND STORY OF THE BOARDING HALL.

The continually increasing number of students has occasioned an increased demand for room. Accordingly at its last session, the Board made an appropriation for the completion of the second story of the building known as the "Boarding Hall." The plan ultimately adopted was to finish the south-half of the second story into one large school-room, designed for the accommodation of the young ladies. This room is now nearly completed, and will be ready

for occupation at the opening of the next term. The capacity of this room is believed to be sufficient to accommodate with seats, one hundred young ladies. The north half of the same story is divided into three rooms, the two larger designed for recitation rooms. These rooms are also completed and ready for occupancy; and from the want of better accommodations, it was found necessary that they should be used temporarily by the Literary Societies of the University, conjointly with recitation purposes. What is imperatively needed, is two large suitable rooms devoted exclusively to the uses of the Literary Societies, which already are, and with the advance of time will prove still more important adjuncts and helps to the University. Policy, as well as other considerations, dictates that we should foster and encourage these Societies, and such rooms as suggested are quite essential for the purpose of accumulating libraries, for debate and other rhetorical exercises; and it is hoped that ere long this demand will be met by the completion of the third story of this same building, and donating the rooms when finished, to said Societies.

This job was let to such contractors as were the lowest responsible bidders, and cost about \$1,500.00.

GYMNASTICS.

The Board at its last Session appropriated \$500.00 for Gymnastic training and discipline, to be expended under the direction and supervision of the President of the University. And in compliance with such resolution, President Spencer engaged the services of E. R. White, a professional gymnast, who, we regret to say, was somewhat cramped in imparting the requisite instruction, for the want of a suitable room. A hall disconnected from the University was finally rented, which, however, but indifferently subserved the purposes of gymnastic discipline. It is indeed surprising to see with what alacrity and spirit the students of either sex engage in these exercises, which are so varied as to become not only attractive, but highly conducive to health; and it is believed that no appropriation has been more judiciously made or more beneficially expended.

MILITARY.

Five Hundred Dollars were also appropriated to promote Mili-

tary training and education. For want of a suitable room and person to give efficiency to this department, the appropriation remains up to the present time unexpended.

We understand, however, that the Faculty, acting under the instructions of the Board of Trustees, have employed a competent person to give instruction in Military drill during the winter session. Also that two hundred stand of arms, with accourrements, have just been received to advance the same object.

Some changes were made last September in the compensation of Teachers and Professors. The year previous, a reduction was made in their salaries, but in view of the increased cost of living, it was thought best to restore them to the old figure. Accordingly the President's salary was raised from \$1200.00 to \$1500.00, and each of the Professors from \$1000.00 to \$1150.00.

There have also been some receipts arising from the rent of several buildings belonging to the University, but the amount is small and varying from time to time.

The tuition fees for 1863 and 1864, it is believed, will considerably exceed those of any previous year, inasmuch as the number of Students at the present time is largely increased; though the great number of Students from the several Counties of the State, who avail themselves of the gratuitous instruction offered, must necessarily diminish the aggregate amount of tuition provided all were charged.

For the desired facts in regard to the *original grant*, constituting in the main the University Fund; also for similar statistics in regard to the *Saline Fund*, as well as to the manner in which both these Funds are invested, reference is made to the report of the Board of Trustees to your honorable body two years ago.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

1sr. The State of Iowa now is, and must continue to be, largely interested in Agricultural pursuits; hence, whatever tends to advance that department of industry, it is apprehended, must meet with general favor. We would, therefore, respectfully recommend that there be established in connection with the University, an Agricultural Department, and that the appropriation of lands recently made by the General Government to the State of Iowa, for an Agricultural College, be applied, in whole or in part, to this purpose. Such an application of this generous grant from the Government, it is believed, would not only inure to the benefit of the University, but would also meet the approbation of a people so largely engaged in agricultural pursuits.

2D. Experience has taught, that one thing more is absolutely essential. The Iowa State University needs, and must have, an additional building, if we desire to carry out in good faith the design of its founders, gratify the friends of sound learning, and at the same time accommodate with room the multitude of students who flock hither to share its advantages and honors. Three hundred and sixty students require room, and the Faculty, during the

present term, has experienced great inconvenience and mortifica tion from the lack of scope. The policy adopted has been to allow the students to seek for themselves, as best they may, among the private families of the city, board and study rooms, but recitation and lecture rooms must be provided—as also library and society rooms-and rooms for chemical and philosophical apparatus, &c. &c. The Board, therefore, is unanimous in earnestly recommending that the Legislature, at its present session, make an appropriation of \$20,000 or \$25,000, to be applied, under the direction of a judicious committee, to the erection of such buildings, -on the University Square,—the main part of which shall be used for a chapel, and the basement divided up into lecture-rooms, and such other purposes as the necessities of the University might demand. The University now has but two buildings-the old State House. remodeled for University uses, and a three-story brick building with stone basement, originally intended as a "Boarding Hall;" but with a change of policy, now occupied for other purposes. These buildings do very well, as far as they go; but they do not supply an imperative need. Every University requires one large room or chapel, sufficiently capacious to seat every student connected therewith. Each morning all the students of the University are required to meet in the chapel, for devotional exercise. On the Sabbath, also, they are required to meet once for religious worship, the services of which are conducted by some member of the Faculty. Other occasions likewise occur, when the presence of every student is demanded. The present chapel, with difficulty, seats 330 of the 360 students now in attendance, and should the number increase fifty or a hundred, (as it unquestionably soon will,) it will be quite impossible to collect and seat all the students in any one room belonging to the University. The campus is ample and beautiful-a most desirable site for the erection of such a building as contemplated is at hand. It might also be constructed with reference to a tower and observatory, which, with the continued growth and development of our State, will at some period in the not distant future, be needed.

A general plan for such a building as recommended, drawn up and prepared under the supervision of the Faculty, is herewith presented for your consideration.

All of which is most respectfully submitted.
