REPORT OF THE AUDITOR OF STATE.

STATE OF IOWA.
OFFICE OF AUDITOR OF STATE.
DES MOINES, November 1, 1899.

To His Excellency, Leslie M. Shaw, Governor of Iowa:

SIR—In compliance with the provisions of subdivision 11, of section 89, of the code, I have the honor to present herewith my report of the fiscal affairs of the state for the biennial period beginning July 1, 1897, and ending June 30, 1899. It is with especial gratification that I hand you this report, because of the remarkably prosperous condition in which the state's business is now shown to be. I find that, as a result of care and economies in legislation and administration, the past biennial period has seen the transference of our fiscal balance from the debit to the credit side of the ledger. A deficit of \$411,000, approximately, two years ago, has been changed into a surplus of \$415,000. The state enters the new biennial period with a reduction of the tax levy, and with prospects good for a still further reduction another year. It is, however, to be borne in mind that Iowa is still a rapidly growing community. New necessities will develop from year to year, demanding the expenditure of funds for institutions and administration. But, in general, it may be fairly said that our equipment of state institutions is nearly completed. From this time on they will grow with the growth of the state rather than be built from their beginnings. The foundations are laid, and well laid. It thus seems reasonable to hope that, with a continuation of the care and economy that have marked every department of the government during your excellency's administration, we will still further reduce the burdens of government in the near future, and that the reduction may be, unless for providential misfortune, permanent.

REVENUE AND TAXATION.

During the biennial period just closed, it is estimated that only 62 per cent of the total state revenue was raised by direct taxation. The remainder, or 38 per cent, of all funds raised for the state government, came from fees, taxation of corporations, federal aid to the Soldiers' home, payments by counties for the maintenance of their insane or other unfortunates in state institutions, refunds by the United States on account of the state's Spanish war expenditures, the collateral inheritance tax, and a few minor items. It is an interesting and perhaps significant fact, that the proportion of revenue collected in the form of direct taxes is growing smaller. Thus, during the last preceding biennial period, 67 per cent of the total revenue was raised by direct taxation, and only 33 per cent by the various indirect methods to which reference has been made.

The revenue collected during the last preceding fiscal period was \$4,101,876.84; and for the period just closed, \$5,079,408.29. There is thus shown an increase of \$78,026.45. From this, however, should be deducted the amount refunded to the state treasurer under the provisions of Chapter 118, laws of the Twenty-seventh General Assembly, providing that treasurers of institutions should return to the state treasury money previously drawn for the institutions. The amount so covered back into the treasury was approximately \$78,000. To this extent the increase in revenue was rather apparent than real, so that \$900,000 is left as the total of actual increase in revenue. This increase has gone to the payment of the old deficit, the creation of the present surplus, and the payment of the expenses of the Spanish war; so that it appears, despite its increasing population and affairs, the state's government has been administered without an increase of the current expense. By direct taxation is meant the revenue raised by the levy under authority of the legislature. The reduction of direct taxation is the result of legislation making more general the taxation of corporations and collateral inheritance. The extent to which this policy has been enforced by recent legislation is forcibly suggested by the statement that in the past biennial period the revenue from these sources has increased over 50 per cent. This indirect taxation of corporations includes fees for filing articles of incorporation, taxation and fees of insurance companies, taxation of telephone, telegraph and express companies, fees for notarial commissions, pharmacy certif-

cates, and a few other like items. On every one of these, the taxes or fees have been increased by recent legislation.

In this connection I desire to repeat a recommendation made by my predecessor in office in reference to the method of collecting taxes. While preserving the present system under which the legislature names a fixed sum for which the executive council shall levy, I should strengthen it by making the state tax a definite, fixed charge against each county. To this end the executive council should not only fix the millage of state taxes, but should divide the total of state taxes among the several counties in proportion to their valuations, and in announcing the levy should also present a table showing exactly how much each county is expected to pay. Then, instead of allowing the counties to remit their state taxes as they make collections, it should be required that 25 per cent should become due to the state, from the county treasurer, April 15th; 25 per cent July 15th; 25 per cent October 15th, and 25 per cent January 15th, making it an absolute charge against the counties. This exact distribution and arrangement of dates might be changed in the wisdom of the legislature; the point is to make the state tax a fixed charge; to make it due on a certain date or dates, and to require the counties to pay it when due. It would involve no hardship to the counties, but would rather be to their interest, for it would spur them to greater efforts in the direction of prompt and close collections. During the recent biennial period there has been charged off, as unavailable, \$56,477.68 of state taxes. Unavailable simply means uncollectible, and the seriousness of such a loss will be appreciated when it is recalled that for every dollar of state taxes uncollected there is probably \$10 of local taxes likewise delinquent. Such a measure would stimulate county officers to greater exertion, redoubling to the benefit of the county much more than of the state.

Another matter to which I desire to call attention is the present method of charging to counties the cost of clothing furnished by the state at the College for the Blind, and the School for the Deaf. These accounts are insignificant in amount, but involve no inconsiderable labor and effort in collection. I would recommend that the state pay for this clothing, or, if this is not deemed best, that more definite legislation be enacted, indicating the exact nature of the county's obligation, and a more definite requirement as to its payment.

Another suggestion which I believe will need little argument to enforce it with those who have had practical experience in the management of county affairs, is that provision ought to be made for regular, periodic examination of the accounts of auditors and treasurers of counties, by competent accountants appointed for that purpose. These examiners should be appointed by some state authority, and should do their work under the supervision of, and report to, the auditor of state. These offices should be examined yearly, at the expense of the county. It would also be well to provide that the state examiners may be called on by counties to examine other county offices, at county expense, whenever the supervisors may deem advisable. Not the least benefit of such a system would be the promotion of more uniform and satisfactory methods of keeping accounts in the offices subject to examination.

THE NEW REVENUE LAW.

The new revenue law, passed by the Twenty-sixth General Assembly, has gone into operation during the past biennium, and has proved itself a very satisfactory piece of legislation. The wisdom of the legislators who framed it has been demonstrated by the fact that the change from an old and long-established basis to a new and necessarily experimental method has been accomplished with little friction and highly satisfactory results. The first complete assessment under the new law resulted in a reduction of \$14,000,000 in the taxable valuation of the state. As the tendency is always to reduce the assessment from year to year, it is possible this decrease will eventually work a hardship in many counties. The state can increase its levy as the assessment decreases, not being limited to the number of mills it can levy. But the counties have not so wide discretion. Some counties are now compelled to levy to the full legal limit for some of their funds. If their assessed valuation should be reduced farther, it would entail serious embarrassment.

THE STATE SCHOOL FUND.

The abundance of money seeking investment, and the increasing demand for the Iowa farm loan as security, have resulted in such a reduction of interest rates as has made it difficult to invest the permanent school fund at the present

statutory rate, 6 per cent. The fund now amounts, in round figures, to \$4,750,000. Of this, about \$275,000 is in the hands of the counties, uninvested, because it cannot be placed at 6 per cent. The counties cannot return it to the state treasury, but must continue the interest payments just as if they had it invested. This condition entails severe hardship on counties which in the past have been able to furnish investments for large sums. Now, unable to invest it at the statutory rate, they must hold it, absolutely unproductive, and pay the 5 per cent interest. The natural result is that the call for these funds is limited, and the uninvested proportion is becoming constantly larger. The inequity seems especially severe because a county positively is forbidden to invest for less than 6 per cent. It cannot reinvest at a lower rate and make up the difference out of its own funds; it must hold the money, entirely unproductive, unless it can be placed at 6 per cent.

It will hardly be necessary, in view of these conditions, to recommend legislation under which these funds will again find borrowers. The simplest plan, and one which would not reduce the revenue of the school fund, would be to make optional with the county the 1 per cent commission now allowed them on loans. At present, on a 6 per cent loan, the school fund receives 5 per cent and the county takes the additional 1 per cent as commission, applying it to general county purposes. If this commission were optional, the funds could be loaned at 5 per cent, and the school fund would lose nothing. It seems not unreasonable to presume that the counties should attend to the loaning of these moneys, without compensation other than the general benefit of having access to a fund whose investment at such a rate must have a tendency to make interest rates moderate. Moreover, the patriotic consideration should not be without weight. The revenues go to the schools, and every county participates in them and ought to be willing to help invest them. General investors, among whom no other form of investment is more highly prized than the Iowa farm mortgage, unhesitatingly loan up to 50 per cent of the valuation on Iowa lands, and the state should do as well. The present limitation of loans to not over \$1,000 on any piece of property is unnecessary and could well be repealed.

At present there is no requirement that payments of interest on the Agricultural college endowment fund shall be reported to the auditor of state. This interest is paid to the treasurer,

and accounted for by him. Having no record of these payments in his own office, the auditor accepts the treasurer's record in making his quarterly check of the treasury. As the general policy is to preserve a complete parallel between the accounts of the treasurer and auditor, so that one may be checked by the other, this one omission, in itself unimportant, throws the entire system out of gear. It would be well to have these interest payments reported to the auditor of state at the same time they are reported to the treasurer, thus making the accounts of both offices cover every receipt of money by the treasury.

PUBLICATION OF THE BIENNIAL REPORT.

The law for publication of reports now requires that the biennial report of the auditor of state, the bank report, and the building and loan report shall be bound in a single volume. For reasons of both economy and convenience, this should be changed so that the biennial report could be published in one volume and the bank and building and loan reports in another. The present volume, containing all three reports in one cover, is large, unwieldy and expensive. The great majority of persons desiring one report do not want both, and there is an unwarranted extravagance in sending both. Moreover, the bank and building and loan reports, if they were published separately, could be given to the public earlier in the year, when they would have much greater value; while at present they cannot be published till the biennial report is completed, at a necessarily late date. It is, therefore, recommended that the building and loan and bank reports be published in a separate volume, yearly, as soon after January 1st as they can be completed.

ESTIMATED RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURES.

A condensed statement of the estimated receipts and expenditures for the current biennial period may not improperly be given in this connection. The detailed estimates will be found in statements No. 3 and 4.

It thus appears that, without taking extraordinary expenditures of the Twenty-eighth General Assembly into consideration, there is a prospective excess of receipts, over ordinary expenditures, of \$986,777. To this should be added the amount of surplus on hand June 30, 1899, which was \$445,002.87, making a total of \$1,431,779.87. This amount, less outstanding warrants June 30, 1899, \$30,708.35, and undrawn extraordinary appropriations, less the amount to the credit of the Spanish war and defense fund, \$244,662.62, leaves a net prospective surplus, for the purposes of extraordinary appropriation, of \$1,156,408.40. Providing, of course, that the legislature deems it wise to authorize a levy so high as that estimated in the table of receipts.

On the basis of extraordinary appropriations in recent years it seems improbable that this entire surplus will be used for such purposes. A considerable reduction of the state levy would in that event be possible.

NOTE.—The above time warrants or outstanding warrants were issued in accordance with an opinion of the attorney-general of Iowa, rendered September 14, 1898, construing chapter 75, laws of the Twenty-seventh General Assembly, in which he says: "The tax referred to in said section 2 is to be levied by the executive council in the year 1901, and such special tax will be collected in the year 1902, at the time that the other taxes are collected. It was, in my mind, the intent of the legislature that warrants should issue at the present time, payable when such additional tax is collected. The evident purpose is to provide a fund which may be used at the present time, or from time to time, as in the judgment of the board of regents it may be needed in the purchase of books for the university library. In order to anticipate the payment of such tax and to enable the board of regents to supply the library with books from time to time as the same may be needed, it expressly provides that the warrants shall be issued therefor, payable when the additional tax herein authorized is collected. While this section does not expressly provide by whom the warrants shall issue, yet taken in connection with the law authorizing the issuance of warrants upon the state treasury, it is plainly the duty of the auditor to issue said warrants, and that such warrants shall be issued upon the requisition of the board of regents or managing board of the university in the usual manner. I think without question you are authorized to issue warrants at the present time, upon the proper requisition of the university authorities, in the aggregate sum of \$49,100, payable when said tax authorized by said chapter shall be collected."

**OPERATIONS OF THE MULCT LAW, GIVING
STATISTICS.**

In response to the many inquiries received by this department, a blank was sent to each county auditor requesting information regarding the situation in each county as relates to the mulct law. After some delay, reports were secured from every county. The data submitted below, relating to the counties in which the mulct law is in force, is correct as to the number of saloons in each county, and as to the total tax collected for the year. The department experienced considerable difficulty in securing the annual tax for each locality, and undoubtedly there will be found discrepancies and errors in that portion of the report; but these errors have been minimized as much as possible.

Recognition is due the county auditors, the city recorders and township clerks of the state for furnishing so freely the information for this report.

The mulct law is not in force in the fifty-one counties given below, and the penalties of the prohibition law obtain in these counties for the sale of liquors:
