## CUSTODIAN'S REPORT.

OFFICE OF THE CUSTODIAN  
OF PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND PROPERTY. }  
January 1, 1900.

*To his Excellency, L. M. Shaw, Governor of the State of Iowa:*

DEAR SIR—In accordance with section 150, chapter 6, of the code, I have the honor to submit herewith the biennial report of this office, consolidating the expenditure of the two years preceding the meeting of the general assembly, as required by this law, showing the total expenditure for the period from January 1, 1898, to December 31, 1899, inclusive. The quarterly reports, as required by this office in compliance with the same section of the code, have been submitted to the executive council. This report comprises the last seven quarterly reports of my official duties, and also the last quarterly report of my predecessor in office.

The total expenditure for the two years for all purposes, coming proper under the taking care of the capitol and public buildings, has been \$47,465.99. This does not include the extra help of janitors and elevator attendance during the meeting of the last general assembly, as such help was hired and paid by the general assembly, and was only under the supervision of the custodian. To make the service more efficient the custodian should have the selection of his help, as the law makes him responsible for the good care of the state's property.

In compliance with the law, all the supplies for the different departments under my charge are drawn from the supply department, and contracted for by the executive council. This is a change from the old law, and works very satisfactorily.

Your attention is most respectfully called to the following exhibits:

Exhibit "A" is a classified and itemized statement of all expenditure during the two years.

Exhibit "B" is a statement of all refuse material sold, and money paid to the treasurer of state.

Exhibit "C" is an invoice of all material and tools on hand.

Under exhibit "A" it is shown that during the two years there was \$33,500.60 expended for labor. Of this amount, \$28,900.65 was expended from April 1, 1898, to December 31, 1899, in accordance with joint resolution No. 5 of the Twenty-seventh General Assembly, and under the appropriation, chapter 13, section 3, appropriating \$35,870 for the paying of the employes under the custodian. This leaves a sufficient amount, \$6,969.35, to pay all labor in the last quarter of the fiscal period, including March 31, 1900.

The section which requires the custodian to make this report also charges him to make, and include in his report, a description of all state property at the seat of government.

#### CAPITOL SQUARE.

Containing 10.02 acres, deeded by W. A. Scott and Harrison Lyon, April 28, 1856.

On this square is built Iowa's great capitol, which, with the improvements of grounds, cost about \$3,000,000. It covers about 58,850 square feet, and there are in the basement, which is 18 feet 1 inch high, twenty-eight rooms, occupied by the historical collections, dairy commission, pharmacy commission, land office, horticultural society, board of health, mine inspectors, labor commission, geological survey, G. A. R., supply department, and document room. The other rooms are occupied as storerooms for the different departments.

On the first or main floor, which is 23 feet 9 inches high, are thirty rooms, occupied by the governor, auditor, superintendent of public instruction, treasurer, attorney-general, adjutant-general, custodian, clerk of the supreme court, railroad commissioners, agricultural society, six judges of the supreme court, consultation room, supreme court room, and secretary of state. On both of these floors, extending from the center space under the dome, 66 feet in diameter, are corridors to the north and south, which are 18 feet wide, and to the east and west, which are 54 feet, 6 inches wide, the full length and width of the building.

On the second floor is located the state library in a room in the west wing, 52 feet 9 inches by 108 feet 4 inches, with a ceiling 44 feet 9 inches high. In the south wing is the senate chamber, 58 feet by 94 feet 4 inches, and 41 feet 9 inches in height. In the north wing is the house of representatives, 74

feet by 91 feet 4 inches, and 49 feet 9 inches high, besides there are special rooms on this floor for the lieutenant-governor and the speaker, and on this and the third floor are twenty-nine committee rooms and a postoffice for the general assembly.

The attic contains the nine ventilation shafts, each 6 feet in diameter, which connect with every room in the building, and are sufficiently large to renew the air in the whole building every 25 minutes. In the cellar are located all the main pipes for steam, high and low pressure, gas and also hot and cold water, the feeders for something over 40 miles of pipes scattered through all the rooms in the building. The cellar is also used for supplying the whole building with fresh air through some of the cellar windows, by drawing its greatest supply through a tunnel which connects the capitol with the boiler-house, and which is about 10x10 feet in the clear, and extends from the north portico across Grand avenue.

The capitol has a length 363 feet 8 inches by 246 feet 11 inches wide, and a total height of 275 feet, while the main roof is 92 feet 8 inches high. The whole building is practically fireproof, and while it was thought to be amply large enough for doing the state's business in when it was built, and, in fact, a number of rooms stood vacant for a long time—all the rooms are now occupied, and large quantities of paper and books are piled in the corridor of the basement for the want of more room.

#### GOVERNOR SQUARE.

Containing 5.61 acres, deeded by T. K. Brooks and W. A. Scott, April 27, 1856; also lot A, Stewart's addition, according to the plat, adjoining the square, of about  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre, deeded by J. B. Stewart, March 5, 1858. On this piece of ground there is no improvement, but the natural growth of timber is on it yet.

#### ASYLUM SQUARE, OR STATE SQUARE.

Containing about 2.25 acres, deeded by J. B. Stewart, January 9, 1858. There is no building on this piece of ground.

#### MONUMENT.

This ground was occupied by the old state house, now by the soldiers' and sailors' monument, described as lots 11 and 12, block 6, Scott's addition, deeded by the Capitol Building association, October 24, 1864. There is built on the ground, and completed, the soldiers' and sailors' monument, and the

grounds are all sodded and finished. The shaft is all of gray granite, ornamented by bronze castings. The total height is about 145 feet, and the total cost was about \$150,000.

#### CAPITOL HEATING HOUSE.

Lot 3, block 4, H. Lyon's addition to town of Des Moines, deeded by Ed Wright, widower, April 5, 1878, the consideration being paid by the capitol commission, \$1,408.50.

Lot 4, block 7, Lyon's addition to the city of Des Moines, deeded by John M. Day and Jennie E. Day, his wife, June 17, 1880, consideration, \$1,720.

The ground was bought in order to have the heating apparatus, with its coal and ash dust and smoke, out of the capitol. There is located in the building occupying this ground, a battery of seven boilers, each 16 feet long and 60 inches in diameter, which will consume over thirty tons of coal per day in extreme cold weather to heat the capitol and make all rooms comfortable.

#### GROUND NORTH OF HEATING PLANT.

Lots 9 and 10, block 4, of H. Lyon's addition to Des Moines, executor's deed, John V. Wise, executor for the heirs of John H. Wise, the consideration being \$2,750, deeded April 23, 1894. These lots were badly needed to dispose of all the ashes from the heating plant and refuse from the capitol. Of course only the back part of the grounds is used for such purpose, so that the front part of the lots might be put to some other use.

#### STATE ARSENAL.

Lots 7 and 8, block 33, original town of Des Moines. This piece of ground was bought by the city of Des Moines and deeded to the state of Iowa. Here stood the arsenal for over thirty years. By the authority of the last general assembly this ground was sold for the sum of \$15,000 to the library board of this city, with the intention to give authority to have a new arsenal built closer to the capitol.

#### GROUND FOR THE ERECTION OF A MEMORIAL HALL.

Lots 1 and 2, block 7, of Scott's addition to the town of Des Moines, deeded by Flora Wright, June 9, 1897, to the state of Iowa, the consideration being \$4,300. This piece of ground is located east from the capitol. As the law has been changed, the executive council being authorized to provide another loca-

tion for a memorial hall and historical building, this ground is yet unoccupied, and chapter 158 of the Twenty-seventh General Assembly located here the arsenal. This would be well adapted for the site of a state arsenal, as it is in near location to the capitol, and also to the heating plant, so that it would not be necessary to provide boilers, for such a building could easily be heated from the capitol boiler house. But the general assembly should provide more of the adjoining ground for the site of an arsenal, as a building such as that department needs would occupy nearly all the ground, and would not appear well as a public building, and in front of the capitol.

#### HISTORICAL BUILDING.

The ground where one wing of the historical building is now erected occupies lots 1-5 of block 5, H. Lyon's addition to the town of Des Moines, and was bought from Eliza Jane Lyon, the purchase price being \$15,000. The west wing of the building is now almost completed, but is yet in the hands of the contractor. I have no charge of the same, except to furnish the steam from the boiler house for the heating. To all appearance the heating from a central plant is a success and works well as far as I can see now, and the additional expenses for that purpose will be small in comparison with what it would be if there were a heating plant built and erected for that building.

Section 151 of the code contains a provision making it the duty of this office to take an inventory of all furniture, materials and tools in the capitol. I have, during December, 1899, made a careful invoice of the furniture in the capitol, including all furniture which is in use by the offices outside the building. I find the total value of the same is \$54,837.55, against a value two years ago of \$51,049.40, an increase of \$3,788.15, accounted for by additional furniture in the various offices. The invoice of all material and tools on hand is \$2,312.85, against \$2,017.30 two years ago, an increase of \$295.55, which amount should be deducted from the total expenditure.

To comply with the law I have tried to dispose of the greenhouse, but have failed to receive bids on the same and was compelled to make the best use of the same as possible. I have, without extra help, wintered the plants from the yard over for use in the summer.

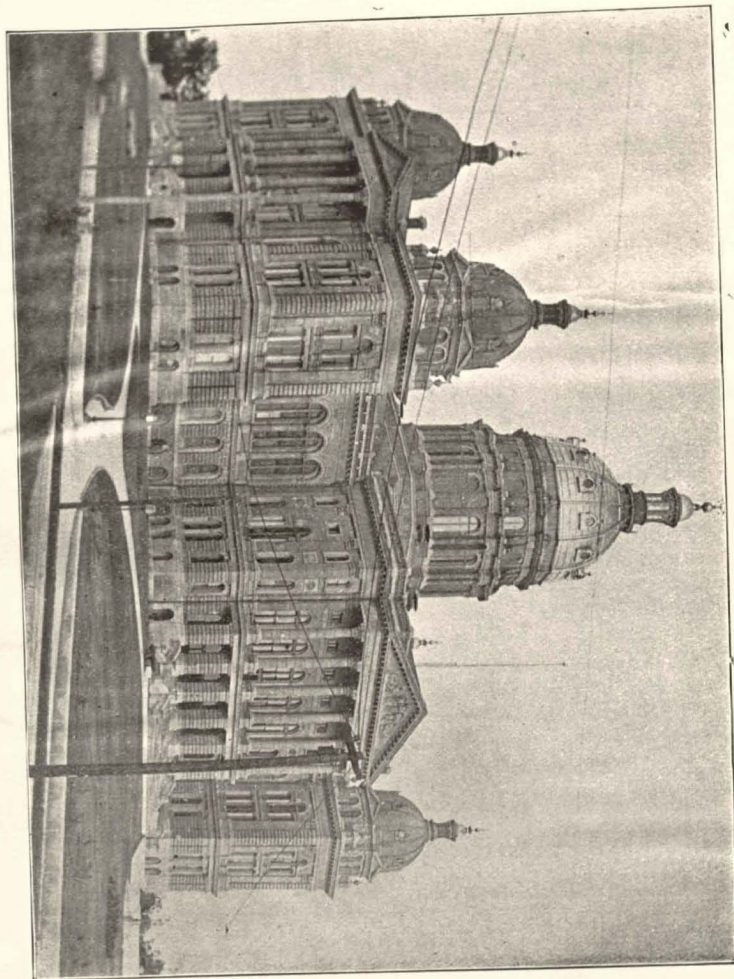
#### RECOMMENDATIONS.

In the reports of the custodian two and four years ago, and

even before that I find that all my predecessors have recommended that the capitol of the state of Iowa be finished. It surely can not be called finished as long as the walls of all the corridors and a great many rooms are not painted. After the state has spent nearly \$3,000,000 on the edifice, it seems to me that this would be only a very small additional expenditure. The walls cannot be kept clean, as the plastering absorbs the moisture and dirt, and gets open and porous. The members of the general assembly can see the need of it themselves; I would recommend an appropriation of \$10,000 to carry on this work, or as much as could be done with that money, under the direction of the executive council. I must also repeat the recommendation of the last custodian's report, on page 10 that there be created a ware and storehouse. To relieve the capitol of the unsightly piles of paper, boxes and other material in the basement of the capitol. By so doing the building would afford more office rooms, of which there is great need, besides doing away with all the trucking, nailing, shipping, and all such noisy work in an office building. For this purpose the unused and unfurnished building in front of the boiler house and opposite the capitol is suitable, and I would recommend that it be completed, which could be done for about \$1,000. Moreover, there is room for considerable enlargement of the building when it shall be deemed advisable, which, in my judgment, will be at no distant day.

The plumbing of the capitol should be overhauled, and put in good sanitary condition, for which I would recommend an appropriation of \$750, or as much thereof as is necessary to do that work.

During the session of the last general assembly there were many complaints over the elevator service in the capitol. The elevators in use are of an old make, and not as speedy as the new machines in use now, yet are still in a safe condition, although not modern. I would recommend an appropriation of \$10,000 to install modern, electric elevators in the capitol, including the machinery to furnish the necessary current, as such could be well and economically done from the power house. If such plant were installed, it could also be arranged to handle the ashes by electric elevator, which all has to be done now by actual labor. If there should be an elevator service required in the buildings built by the state, such service and power could be cheaply transmitted and furnished by the central heating

and power plant, now used for the capitol and historical building, and if such were done, by the same power could be furnished fan service to any part of the state's building, or electric light where it is more convenient than gas.

This office is very much crippled in the service of the state in not having a contingent fund for extra labor. The walks around the capitol and other state property have to be kept clean from snow and ice in the winter months, and to some little repairs in summer. During state fair, or other occasions of large numbers of people being in Des Moines, there should be extra guides and police in the capitol. Under the present law this could not be done. I, therefore, recommend an appropriation of \$250 per annum for extra labor.

To better reach the soldiers' and sailors' monument, there should be a cement walk built from the south steps of the capitol to Walnut street, and from Walnut street to the monument. As it now is, the visitors will walk across the lawn and flower beds. I would therefore recommend the building of such walk and an appropriation of \$500, or as much as needed thereof, to make that improvement.

In conclusion, I desire to tender my sincere thanks to all departments for the uniform assistance and continued courtesy extended to me during the time I have had charge of the capitol, and to testify to the ability and uniform fidelity of those I have had under my charge in the employment of the state as assistants, and to thank them for the faithful manner in which they have discharged the several duties assigned them. I believe their remuneration for the service performed is hardly sufficient to support their families, as, with increased prosperity of the whole country, the necessaries of life have also advanced in price while that of the faithful employes of the state have not.

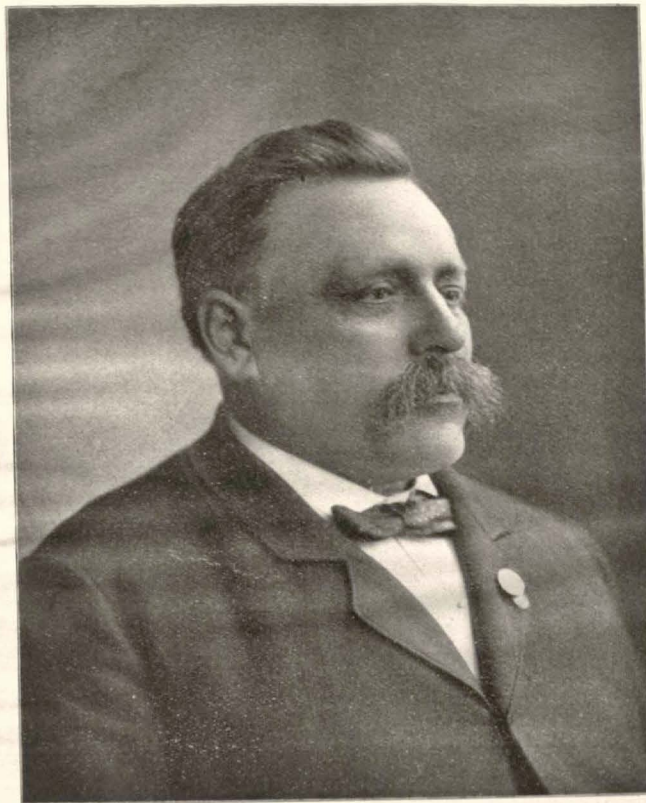

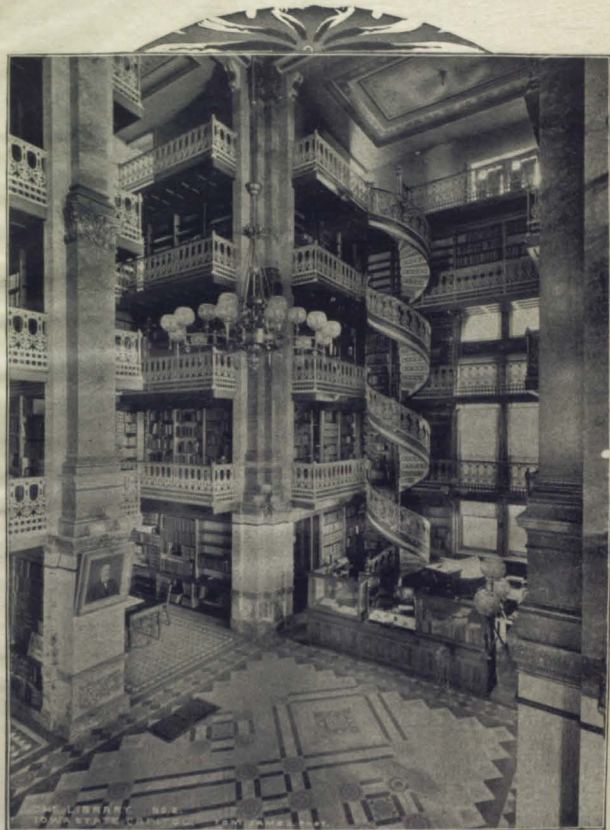
