## CUSTODIAN'S REPORT.

OFFICE OF THE CUSTODIAN  
PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND PROPERTY,  
January 1, 1904.

To His Excellency, ALBERT B. CUMMINS, Governor of the  
State of Iowa:

DEAR SIR,—Complying with the law, as provided in section 150, chapter 8, of the Code, I have the honor to submit herewith the biennial report of this office, containing an itemized statement of all the expenditures, as required for the two years preceding the meeting of the general assembly, embracing the period from January 1, 1902, to December 31, 1903, inclusive.

The quarterly reports of this office for the same period have been submitted to the Executive Council.

The total expense incurred for the two years, for all purposes, coming properly under the jurisdiction of the custodian, has been \$63,724.27.

Your attention is respectfully invited to the following exhibits:

Exhibit "A," a classified and itemized statement of all expenditures during the biennial period.

Exhibit "B," a statement of sales made of State property and of money paid to the Treasurer of State.

Exhibit "C," invoice of material and tools charged to this office.

Exhibit "D," invoice of furniture.

Exhibit "E," an itemized statement of receipts and expenditures connected with the removal of stone, dirt and refuse from sub-cellar, and boiler-room.

Under the direction and supervision of the Capitol Commission, the entire system of heating, lighting and ventilating the Capitol building has been changed, as well as other extensive improvements made, which I have no doubt will be fully described in their report.

Acting under instructions from the Executive Council, to remove the building designated as the "Engineer's House," after due consideration I concluded that it was best to sell the building, as the State did not have the proper tools or men to take down a brick building of that size. It was sold for two hundred fifty dollars (\$250), the State receiving the slate on the roof for use in the foundation of the storage building.

All but a small part of the greenhouse was taken down; the material sold to the best possible advantage, except the glass, which was turned over to the agricultural society, upon condition that it be returned on demand (in like quantity and quality) without expense to the State.

Owing to the great amount of work that has been done, and the large number of workmen that have been employed in the building the past year, the janitors have been continuously interrupted in their regular work, and have had to overcome the presence of large quantities of lime and sand, stone, brick and grease, and, in fact, every form of dirt and filth. Despite this, however, the building has been kept respectably clean. The janitors and firemen are entitled to generous commendation for the many faithful days' work done by them in the removing of the great amount of refuse that came from the cellar of the Capitol and from the boiler house, thus saving many dollars of expense to the State.

Owing to the fact that the coping around the Capitol grounds affords no protection to the lawn, shrubbery or flowers from trespass, by evil-inclined people, especially rude boys that commit many acts of vandalism on the grounds, I would recommend that there be an appropriation sufficient to erect a suitable fence on top of (at least the outside) coping walls. I would suggest an iron fence of suitable design, not to exceed thirty inches in height, which would form no obstruction of the view to the grounds, but at the same time afford great protection from the constant trespass of vicious and unruly people.

The Soldiers' and Sailors' Monument is subject to defacement and permanent injury by vandals, and it would seem to me wise to make some provision for its protection and preservation.

Owing to location, it is impossible for the employees at the Capitol building to give it that close attention it requires. Already it has been defaced and injured to a considerable extent.

The removal of the brick building on Grand Avenue, formerly designated as the "Engineer's House," made it necessary

to secure some place for a carpenter and engineer shop, as well as some place to store the tools and great accumulation of material, such as damaged furniture, lumber, and other refuse that is very necessary for repairs. On the advice of the Executive Council I rented a storeroom adjoining the State's property, on Grand Avenue. Some provision should be made for the storage of material, and articles needing repairs. This place should be easy of access, as the constantly increasing amount of furniture in the State house calls for much repair work, which can be performed in a more satisfactory manner, and at far less expense, in a suitable shop by the State house carpenter, than by outside parties.

Owing to the great danger of fire in a wooden building, such as is now occupied for that purpose, and the large amount of stores necessarily kept on hand, I would urge the careful consideration of this recommendation.

I desire to express my high appreciation and gratitude for the uniform kindness and courtesy that has been extended to me by all the officers and employees of the State house.
