

Class "C" shall include those whose gross annual earnings, per mile, shall be less than \$3,000.

SEC. 2077. All railroad corporations, according to their classification as herein prescribed, shall be limited to compensation per mile for the transportation of any person with ordinary baggage, not exceeding 100 pounds in weight as follows: Class "A," 3 cents; class "B," 3 1-2 cents; class "C," 4 cents, and for children 12 years of age or under, one-half the rate above prescribed; a charge of ten cents may be added to the fare of any passenger, when the same is paid upon the cars, if a ticket might have been purchased within a reasonable time before the departure of the train.

SEC. 2078. The executive council shall at its regular meeting on the second Monday in July in each year classify the different railways, as provided by section two thousand and seventy-six (2076) of the code, from information as to gross earnings obtained from the annual reports of railways made to the executive council for assessment and taxation, if it shall be satisfied of the correctness of same, or from information obtained by said executive council from any other source, and when there shall be any change in classification, shall issue a certificate to any corporation or corporations affected by such change, certifying the class to which they are respectively assigned; any change of rates by any corporation pursuant to any change of classification shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of such certificate.

To His Excellency, B. F. CARROLL, Governor of the State of Iowa:

DEAR SIR.—Complying with the law, as provided in Section 150, Chapter 8, of the Code, I have the honor to submit herewith the biennial report of this office, containing an itemized statement of all the expenditures, as required for the two years preceding the meeting of the General Assembly, embracing the period from Jan. 1, 1907, to Dec. 31, 1908, inclusive.

The quarterly reports of this office for the same period have been submitted to the Executive Council.

The total expense incurred for the two years, for all purposes, coming properly under the jurisdiction of the custodian, has been \$52,297.62.

Your attention is respectfully invited to the following exhibits:

Exhibit "A," a classified and itemized statement of all expenditures during the biennial period.

Exhibit "B," a statement of sales made of State property and of money paid to the Treasurer of State.

Exhibit "C," invoice of material and tools charged to this office.

Exhibit "D," invoice of furniture.

I also submit itemized statement of expenditures under the provisions of Section 1, Chapter 202, Laws 1907, and in addition mention the fact that in the construction of sidewalks and coping stone around the Historical Building, under the direction of the Executive Council, there was applied upon the expense of the same, as the result of sales of old material, \$103.30.

The excuse for mentioning these items arises from the fact that the amounts received from the sale of old material do not appear in my report of sales, marked Exhibit "B," as above.

I would urge the necessity of making a sufficient appropriation to change from the present hydraulic elevators to either the electric or plunger system of elevators, as owing to the fact that the company who installed the present elevators, has been out of business

for some years past, it is difficult to get supplies, and further, as there are a great many leather valves used in the construction of the present elevators, which constantly need replacing, it would be economical for the State to provide elevators of the other types spoken of above.

I would recommend that there be an appropriation of \$15,000 made to cover the cost of repairing the steps; interior walks; the electric wiring of the yard and lamps to light same. The Forest City stone, from Ohio, of which the steps are constructed, on the north, west and south sides of the building, has shown its inability to withstand either the climatic conditions or the too free use of salt on the steps to remove ice, and those on the north and west should certainly be removed and replaced with granite. It might be possible then, with the perfect stones taken out of these steps to put the south flight of steps in good condition. I would therefore urge the above appropriation, so as to put the steps and interior walks in good condition to compare with the granite steps recently put in on the east side of the building and with the new walk that has been recently laid around the entire grounds.

I again wish to express my gratitude for the kindly and courteous treatment accorded me by all the officers and employes of the State House.

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There are 38,560 feet of sidewalk included in this measurement, and in this estimate no credit is taken for 400 feet of driveway, the cost of which is estimated at 25 cents per foot, owing to its added thickness, and 125 feet of coping, the surface of which only was measured, the estimated cost of which is 40 cents per lineal foot.

IOWA STATE CAPITOL BUILDING.

To answer a great many inquiries that are made from time to time, some information is given below, concerning the Iowa State Capitol Building, which may be of interest to the general public:

The Capitol grounds contain a fraction over ten acres and were deeded to the State of Iowa by W. A. Scott and Harrison Lyon, April 28, 1856. On this square is built Iowa's great Capitol, which cost approximately \$3,000,000.

It covers about 58,850 square feet. The basement story is 13 feet high, and contains 28 rooms, occupied by various offices.

On the first, or main floor, which is 24 feet high, are 30 rooms, occupied by the principal offices of the State government, and the Supreme Court.

On both of these floors, extending from the center space, under the dome, 66 feet, are corridors to the north and south, 18 feet wide and to the east and west 54 1-2 feet wide; the full length and width of the building.

On the second floor is located the State library, in a room in the west wing, 53x108 feet, with a ceiling 45 feet high. In the south wing is the Senate Chamber, 58x94 feet, with 42 feet ceiling.

In the north wing is the House of Representatives, 74x91 feet, and 50 feet high ceilings. Besides there are special rooms on this floor for the Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House, including those on third floor, 29 committee rooms and the postoffice for the General Assembly.

In the sub-basement, the full size of the building, are located all pipes for steam, low and high pressure; gas, hot and cold water and electric and telephone wiring.

The building has a length of 363 feet, 8 inches by 246 feet 11 inches, and a total height of 275 feet, while the main roof is 92 feet, 8 inches high.

The corner stone of this building was laid Nov. 23, 1871. The corner stone is 7 feet long; three feet wide and three feet thick, and was made from a prairie boulder, procured in Buchanan County.

The Twentieth General Assembly which convened on the 17th day of January, 1884, was the first to occupy the legislative halls in the Capitol building.

Due to a disastrous fire in 1905 in the north wing of the building, an expenditure of \$126,000 was incurred to make it as absolutely fire proof as possible. The work was done under the direction of the Capitol Commission, created for the purpose of repairing and decorating the building; the work, when completed, costing nearly one-half million dollars.
