

REPORT

The success obtained by this department is due in no small amount to the hearty co-operation of the clean, law-abiding sportsmen, and to them we are indebted more than to all other influences combined.

The history of the world shows that no effective legislation was ever enacted and enforced, for the protection of wild life, unless it was fathered and backed by the law abiding sportsmen, and we venture to say the same will be true to the end of the world.

We are also especially indebted to the present Executive Council, who have taken the stand that the hunting license money belongs to the sportsmen, and they should dictate how and for what it should be used. They have rendered this department every possible assistance, and we are truly indebted to them for their courteous treatment.

To the large number of Deputy Wardens who have worked earnestly and honestly for the protection of the fish and game, and who have made sacrifices in business and the loss of friends, to further the interests for which they were working, we are indebted. After a hard fight in the Thirty-fifth General Assembly, a bill was passed providing for three assistants at a salary of \$1,200 each, per year. The wisdom of paying sufficient salaries has been fully demonstrated, and the next legislature should provide for not less than eight assistants at \$1200 per year. No money has been spent through the fish and game department, which has brought as large returns as that spent for the three assistant wardens, and to their devoted effort, in a large measure, is the success of this department due.

The county attorneys and justices of the peace who have handled the prosecutions brought by this department, are entitled to commendation by us and the public, for the efficient manner in which they have handled their cases. In practically every instance, they have acted with a true spirit of fairness, to all persons concerned.

To the press in general we are indebted, for assistance in publishing the laws and keeping before the public the importance of the protection of our wild life. While there has been some criti-


cism, which was not warranted by facts, it was printed in good faith, although the information came from unreliable sources, official titles or prominent position giving it weight, in no case has it been repeated, where the facts were presented.

To the farmers and land owners, who have so willingly leased their land to the state for game refuges, and rendered splendid assistance in the protection of pheasants and partridges, we wish to express our appreciation. The reserve system in Iowa is a success and we believe the present system is the only one that can be worked out. If Iowa had large tracts of wild lands as some adjoining states have, we believe game refuges could be established thereon and better results obtained; but, we have no lands for the purpose, and must content ourselves with what we have.

IOWA LAKES.

The drainage and reclaiming of the swamp lands of Iowa for the last few years, has been carried on at a rapid rate, and with this work considerable agitation has arisen over the draining of a number of meandered lakes belonging to the state, the claim being made in each case, that these small lakes are detrimental to health, breeders of mosquitoes and blackbirds, that they are of no value to the community. Consent has been granted to drain some lakes. The Executive Council have given their consent after the proper hearing, but usually only one side appeared (that for the drainage), and naturally the Council formed the conclusion that no one was interested in preserving that particular lake, or they would appear and oppose its drainage. After the order to drain has been issued the opposition usually get busy and show their side of the case, which is usually after a large amount of expense has been incurred and the drainage district established.

In no case where the proper showing has been made, has the present Executive Council authorized the drainage of any lake. Public sentiment is strong for the preservation of all lakes in Iowa. Plans are under way for the improvement of every lake in the state by the Fish and Game Commission. Arrangements are complete to employ an expert engineer, to take charge of this work, who will begin work in the spring. A dredging machine will be purchased for the purpose of deepening the shallow lakes, dams builded to hold a sufficient amount of water to make them permanent for both fish and game. It does not matter how much of a slough it might

be, it can be made a beauty spot and invaluable as a place of recreation for the public. More pounds of fish can be raised in an acre of water than it is possible to raise pounds of beef on the same land after it is drained. Then WHY drain any more lakes, regardless of their present condition, when they can be improved for less money than it costs to drain them?

PROPOSED LEGISLATION.

The fish law should be amended to make it a misdemeanor for any person to have a seine or other device for taking fish (the use of which would be illegal) in their possession.

This department should have the right to seize and hold or destroy all such devices found anywhere in the state, and the parties, in whose possession it was found, should be made guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by fine.

No pike, pickerel, black bass or catfish should be taken less than twelve inches long. No croppie or silver bass less than eight inches long, and no sunfish less than six inches long.

Deputies should have the right to search any buggy, auto, boat, or other conveyance, for fish or game illegally killed. Also the game pockets of any coat or bag or other personal effects used by the hunter or fisherman.

All property seized should be sold to the highest bidder and the proceeds placed in the Fish and Game Protection Fund.

The bag limit on black bass, pike and pickerel, should be reduced to twelve fish of either or all kinds.

STATE FISH AND GAME WARDEN

The law should provide for the taking of carp, buffalo, sucker, and other non-game fish by the Commission, and sold to the people at a small price, the money to go to the Fish and Game Protection Fund to defray the expense of such work.

The bag limit on quail and prairie chicken should be reduced to twelve or fifteen per day, and not to exceed double one day's bag limit in possession.

The law should make it the duty of the fish and game commission to arrest and prosecute any person who destroys any crops, injures or kills any stock or poultry, tears down or injures any fence, leaves gate open, or any other act whereby any land owner or farmer is in any way injured through carelessness while hunting with a gun.

Provision should be made to give the Fish and Game Commission more authority to establish game preserves, and provide a more severe penalty for hunting thereon.

The provision of the law providing for certificates for the taking of birds, their nests, or eggs, for scientific purposes, should be amended, to safeguard against those who secure such a permit for protection and unnecessarily slaughter large numbers of song birds.

The hunting license law should be amended, so as to include fishing, and trapping fur-bearing animals. Seventy-five per cent of the requests that are made on this department, are in the interests of fish rather than game, and the man who fishes, but does not hunt, should pay his share in order to keep up the expenses of this department.

I would advise that the law be so framed that boys under fourteen years of age, and women, would not be required to secure a license, thus relieving men with large families from paying one dollar each before he and his family could go to the river or lake to fish. His boys, after they reach the age of fourteen, could earn their own dollar and secure a license.

One license which would entitle the holder to either hunt, fish or trap in the open season for one dollar, would bring revenue enough to improve every small lake in the state, making them beauty spots and producing large quantities of fish and game as well as the most healthful recreation for the people of the state.

Dams could be placed across the small streams in the southern half of the state, where we have no lakes, and small lakes created

at a small expense. Public parks could be established and this department made one of the most useful departments in the state, without any burdensome taxation, and the people who contributed one dollar each year for its maintenance would receive the entire benefit.

The open season on ducks, geese and all migratory birds should be shortened, and in so doing consideration should be given to the different parts of the state, so as to equalize the shooting as near as possible. If necessary, take part of the shooting in the northern part of the state away, so that the southern half can enjoy a little.

The principle of stopping spring shooting is right, and if the shooting can not be equalized between the different parts of the state, so that Iowa will not kill more ducks than she should, and the supply can be kept up, then the law should be made to prohibit all shooting after a certain time in the winter.

Our drainage laws should be amended so that no meandered lake could be drained unless authorized by the legislature. In case such lakes were authorized drained, the land should be the property of the state, and only disposed of by special act of the legislature. This would remove the incentive for property owners adjoining such lakes to attempt to secure their drainage, with the idea of getting land at a cheap price. The law should provide for the improvement of any meandered lakes by the Fish and Game Commission, with the approval of the Executive Council, by erecting dams to raise the water level, all damages done to adjoining property caused by such improvement, to be paid from the Fish and Game Protection Fund.

The law should make a special provision for a right of way to such lakes, to provide for free access to them without trespassing.

RABBITS.

There should be a closed season on rabbits, commencing about March first and extending to September first. Also, hunting rabbits with ferrets should be prohibited.

PHEASANTS AND PARTRIDGES.

The closed season for the killing of pheasants and partridges should be extended two years.

PERMITS FOR RAISING AND SELLING GAME BIRDS AND ANIMALS.

Provisions should be made that permits must be secured by parties who keep game birds or animals in captivity, and no birds or animals to be sold without special permit from the Fish and Game Warden.

Under the present system it is possible for parties raising game birds, to trap those put out by the state and then sell them to the state to be turned loose again.

DISTRIBUTING FISH.

During the fall of 1913, more fish were distributed than were ever before distributed, in one year, in this state. This was made possible by having a fish car that carried many more times the fish than the old car, which was at this time, out of commission.

Although it was late in the season before the fish car was delivered a remarkably large number of fish were distributed. Next year will far outnumber the year 1913, and if the people living along the streams in this state will take an active part in helping us clean up the violations (which are committed, almost daily, with nets and other illegal devices), we will soon have splendid fishing in all good streams in the state. We can handle the law violators around the lakes, for the reason that they are mostly summer resorts, and it is a business proposition for the people to see to it that the fish are protected. Therefore, we get the proper assistance from them.

SEINING PERMITS.

During the fall season of 1913, permits were issued to seine carp and buffalo in the following lakes: Okoboji lakes, Spirit Lake, Clear Lake, Storm Lake and Wall Lake.

It has been so thoroughly demonstrated that lakes that have no outlet where fish can come and go at will, are sure to become so filled with carp and buffalo that game fish do not propagate and will in time become poor and sickly, and not fit for food.

Some opposition to the seining of carp and buffalo has developed, and claims are made that nets do more damage than the soft fish. However, no proof has been furnished this department, which would lead to any other opinion than to preserve the game fish and the feed for water fowl, these fish must be kept down to a certain quantity.

The permit holders have donated one-half cent per pound for all buffalo taken, to be placed in a fund for the special benefit of the lake from which the fish were taken. On page 26 will be found the amounts collected for each lake.

RINGNECK PHEASANTS.

A number of ring neck pheasants have been distributed in this state. In some localities they are reported as doing nicely while other localities report a failure.

The practice of distributing birds in small numbers has been discontinued and game preserves are established where all birds are placed in large numbers. The present indications are that a much larger per cent of increase will be realized by this method.

We are raising large numbers of pheasants at our game farm at Des Moines, and will continue to do so, as they are about the only game bird that can be raised successfully in captivity.

HUNGARIAN PARTRIDGE.

If Iowa is to become stocked with foreign game birds to any great extent, it is our opinion that the Hungarian partridge will do the business. Our experience in noting results from these birds, leads us to believe that they will propagate and live in Iowa.

We purchased six thousand of them, which were delivered last January. We placed them in corrals at the game farm at Des Moines, especially prepared for them, and distributed them the last of March. At this time we have reports of a number of fine coveys of young birds that are all doing nicely and we look for a large increase.

FISH HATCHERY.

During the fall of 1913 we started to remodel the old fish hatchery at Spirit Lake. This work is only partially completed but we are operating on a small scale this year and from present indications will have splendid results. Iowa should spare no expense to equip one of the best fish hatcheries that it is possible to build. There is no other public improvement that the public would get as much in return for, as from the proper fish hatchery and distributary plants. The returns would come from both the commercial value of the fish and the recreation the people would have catching them. Either would pay big dividends on the money invested.

ORGANIZATION, ETC.

This report covers the last nine months of the previous administration and the first fifteen months of the present administration. In reviewing the work covered by this report, it should be borne in mind that on April 1, 1913, the present warden started to reorganize the department and to put the commission in a position to accomplish the things we believed should be accomplished. The greatest task was to get an organization together, to enforce the law. This was no small task, and even at this time the organization is not complete, or as yet as efficient as we would like, nor will the laws be fully enforced or the best results obtained, until the people in each community interest themselves in the fish and game and render this department assistance. In a large number of communities such assistance has been given, and in every instance the best results have been obtained.

We had on hand in the Fish and Game Fund, April 1, 1913, about \$140,000. It was our intention to spend all of the surplus money for permanent improvements. The first purchase of this kind was a new fish car purchased from American Car & Foundry Co. of St. Louis. The car complete cost \$15,225. This car is the best fish car in the United States and will be in service for years.

Next we turned our attention to a game farm. The State Fair Board offered fifteen acres of land adjoining the state fair grounds for use at Des Moines. This we have made into a model game farm, have added about six acres, making twenty-one acres in all. We raised twelve hundred pheasants the first year, this year two thousand, and have arranged to raise five thousand next year. The farm has been a decided success, due largely to our efficient game keeper, Mr. Chas. Howard.

PROSECUTIONS.

It has been very gratifying to be able to secure such a large per cent of convictions for violations of the fish and game laws. We have not lost one case of consequence in all of the prosecutions we have made (shown by this report), which shows that the public are with us to a large extent. But there are communities in "good, old law abiding Iowa," where it is considered an infringement on the public rights, for a game warden to attempt to enforce the laws, especially against illegal fishing, but, public opinion is changly partly in this respect, and it will not be long

before a man who will dare to use a seine or other net for the purpose of taking fish illegally, will be considered an undesirable citizen, as is the man who steals his neighbor's property.

QUAIL IN IOWA.

Iowa is a little far north to be a great quail state. They become quite plentiful at times but the extreme hard winters leave only a remnant for seed and it takes several years for them to breed up again. The last two winters has been very favorable for quail, and they are reported in larger numbers in the eastern and southern parts of the state, than they have been for fifteen years.

This department was active last winter in caring for and feeding these birds wherever they could be found, which in a measure accounts for their large increase. There has been considerable agitation to close the season on quail for a number of years, but in this state nothing is gained by so doing. If the winters do not kill them they will increase at a rapid rate. A closed series of years would reduce the revenue of this department at least \$30,000 per year, which would mean, that we could not give them the proper protection. Consequently, the first hard winter would reduce their numbers to such an extent that the increase would not be noticeable.




