LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL.

TO THE HONORABLE G. W. CLARKE,

Governor of the State of Iowa.

SIR: In compliance with the provisions of Chapter III of the Acts of the Thirty-third General Assembly, the Board of Parole begs leave to hand you herewith its third Biennial Report and the abstract of Criminal Statistics as reported to it by the Clerks of the District Court in the several counties, under the provisions of Section 293 of the Code, and the amendment made thereto by the Thirty-third General Assembly, Chapter III, Section II.

This report includes the work of the Board of Parole for the period beginning July 1, 1912, and ending June 30, 1914, and the abstract of criminal statistics covering the same period. As is shown by the tables submitted herewith, we paroled in the two years included in this report, 360 persons, 352 from the prisons and eight before commitment. We recommended to the Governor to either pardon or parole or commute the sentences of 75 others. Of these recommended to the Governor for clemency, all have been released, so that the total number going out of the Penitentiary or Reformatory by the action of the board or on its recommendation, was 435. Of the number paroled by the board 22.23 per cent had on the thirtieth day of June, 1914, proven derelict. In the two years included in this report 70 per cent of the paroles were out of the Reformatory, and 30 per cent out of the Penitentiary. Of the number paroled since the organization of the board to July 1, 1912, all were discharged or otherwise disposed of before June 30, 1914, except three, and of these two have since been discharged, so that the final result of the first 561 prisoners paroled is in 94 cases revocation of parole and return to prison, 81 cases absconded and not apprehended, and 7 convicted and returned to prison for other crimes. Of the number absconding and not apprehended some will be apprehended and returned to prison. The remainder of the 561, or 379, were finally recommended for discharge, making 67.56 per cent of the total number.

From June 1, 1911, to May 31, 1913, there were received at the Reformatory 412 prisoners who were eligible for parole during the period from July 1, 1912, to June 30, 1914, and we paroled from the Reformatory during that time 245. In the same time, there were received at the Penitentiary 250 who were eligible for parole during the period from July 1, 1912, to June 30, 1914. In that time there were paroled from the Penitentiary 107; or the paroles from the Reformatory were 59.46 per cent of the total number received, and from the Penitentiary 48.80 per cent of the number received. Including the number recommended to you for clemency and final release, there were released from the Reformatory 71.84 per cent of the total number received during the time above stated, and from the Penitentiary 52.40 per cent. Combining the two prisons, there were 64.50 per cent of the number received released on our action or our recommendation. The number above stated as received in the prisons between the dates given, does not include those sentenced for life or on sentences for death or safe keeping. To the number released as above there must be added for the purpose of determining the total number going out, those who were released on expiration of sentences, and the total thus found deducted from the total number received, would show the difference between the number going in and going out in the two years. Of course this board does not have statistics showing the expirations. The prison population has practically reached its maximum on account of the change from the definite sentence to the maximum as now imposed, and the operation of the parole law, except as it may be changed from year to year by increase of population, or increase of commitments for any other cause.

We call special attention to the table showing results in cases of paroles from July 1, 1907, to June 30, 1914, or the entire time since the taking effect of the law providing the maximum in place of the determinate sentence, and the law creating the Reformatory and the present parole system, to the date at which this report ends. Of the entire number paroled in that time, 29.09 per cent have proven derelict, 47.66 per cent have been recommended for discharge, and 20.84 per cent are still reporting; 2.41 per cent have died or cases been reversed by the Supreme Court, etc.

We desire to call your attention to that part of our second biennial report covering the period from July 1, 1910, to June 30,

1912, referring to the indeterminate sentence, and found at the top of page seven of said report.

The Board of Parole is charged with the fixing of the time of service in prison of each person, except in case of sentence for life or for treason, but not to exceed the maximum fixed by the State for the particular offense of which the prisoner has been found guilty. The Thirty-fifth General Assembly provided for the prosecution of prisoners who escape from the prison or other places where they are at work outside the prison, and for violations of parole, and fixed penalties for such offenses making of them felonies. The prosecution of men under this statute requires indictment and trial, and of course additional expenditure of money and time of courts and officers. If the person was under the indeterminate sentence, the Board of Parole could take care of such offenses without the necessity of such expenditures of money and time, and without injustice in any way to the law violator. There are men who have so often been convicted of crime, and so often been imprisoned, as that safety to society and their own good requires that they should be under custodial care longer than the maximum period provided for the particular offense for which they were committed. Under the indeterminate sentence, such cases can be taken care of by the Board of Parole. The law now provides for parole by the judges of persons convicted for the first time and under twenty-five years of age. This is a wise provision of the law. There are many men who are guilty of crime and notice must be taken of the offense by the officers of the law, yet these crimes may be but the result of indiscretion, impulse, overdue influence of others, or accident, there being an absence of criminal disposition or intent. In many such cases the finding of guilt and the sentence to prison will furnish all the discipline necessary in order to impress the seriousness of the offense on the offender and others, and the corrective and reforming effect be as great or greater without as with prison service. In such cases the judges should be clothed with power to parole and relieve the convicted man of the odium of incarceration and avoid the evil effects which probably in some cases, result from association with confirmed criminals. There is another provision of the law which provides that the Board of Parole may, on the recommendation of the judge and county attorney, parole before commitment men who are over twenty-five years of age. Such paroles are not infrequent, and results have generally been good. Recently we pa-

roled before commitment seven boys convicted of felonies in one county, all at the same term of court, this of course being at the request of the judge and county attorney, and after investigation by us into the facts and circumstances. These boys might have been paroled by the judge before whom they were tried, but he thought the results would likely be better if the cases were taken on by the board, that they would be more impressed with the seriousness of their situation if they were required to report to this board rather than to him through the Clerk of the Court, and hence asked us to act in the cases. In case of violations of parole before commitment requiring such persons to be sent to the prison, there would be in case of indeterminate sentence, opportunity to deal with such offenders without circumlocution in a summary manner, and according to the seriousness of the offense and the disposition of the violator. Under the indeterminate sentence there is no greater probability that a prisoner entitled to clemency will be denied it, than under the determinate sentence, and there is the possibility of keeping under custodial treatment the repeater and the man with criminal disposition or criminal habits. We therefore ask your favorable consideration to the enactment of a law providing for the absolutely indeterminate sentence.

We again call your attention to the need of organizing the Reformatory along reformatory lines. The commission appointed by the Thirtieth General Assembly to investigate the working of the parole system and the indeterminate sentence and reformatory methods and report with their recommendations to the Thirty-first General Assembly, reported on the eighteenth day of January, 1906, which report is found in the journal of the House of the Thirty-first General Assembly, page 128. Out of this report grew the legislation making the Reformatory out of the Penitentiary at Anamosa. In this report the commission refers very fully to information obtained by them from visits made to many reformatories in the United States, and examination of the organization and administration of such Reformatories and state as follows:

Among the activities that are greatly emphasized in practically all Reformatories, we mention the following:

Scientific physical training of all who need it.

Training to prompt and exact obedience and respect for the law, by use of military drills, rules and regulations.

A "system" which keeps the inmates, under the care of a competent keeper, continuously busy from morning bell tap until "lights out" at night.

The giving of a common school education to all who need it, supplementary to which is taught the obligations of the individual to society, the duties of American citizenship and the need of self-control.

The industrial school training, in which each is taught a useful trade or calling, by which he is able to retain employment and make an honest living in competition with the world.

And, lastly, the moral and religious work, which is encouraged in every institution, with the object of strengthening and developing the weak places in the character of the individual.

Among the recommendations of this committee were:

(a) That the prison at Anamosa be organized as a Reformatory, in which should be kept all males convicted of felonies between the ages of sixteen and thirty, except those sentenced to life imprisonment, or for heinous crimes.

(b) That the Board of Control be authorized to make such changes and improvements in the Anamosa Prison as to render it suitable for use as a Reformatory.

(c) That the Board of Control be authorized to erect such buildings as might be necessary to equip the Anamosa Prison for a Reformatory.

The Thirty-first General Assembly did not enact any legislation on the subjects included in this report, but the Thirty-second General Assembly did enact a law under which the Board of Control was authorized to change the Anamosa prison to a Reformatory, and also provided for the maximum sentence in cases of all convicted for felonies, except murder and treason, and providing that all males convicted of a felony who were under thirty years of age and had not been previously convicted, except in case of life sentence or convictions for heinous crimes, should be imprisoned in the Reformatory; and provided that all persons except those sentenced for life, might be paroled before the expiration of the maximum term for which they were sentenced, and for the organization of a board to be known as the Iowa Board of Parole, to administer the parole law.

The Thirty-second General Assembly did not attempt however, to provide at that time for the industries or schools that might be necessary in the Reformatory, and the State has not yet provided the appropriations necessary to enable the Board of Control to organize and equip the Reformatory as contemplated by the report of the commission referred to herein, nor as needed to

give best results in the handling of men in such an institution. A school is maintained where a good common school education can be obtained, and many of the boys avail themselves of this opportunity. A limited number may learn something of the art of printing, and the trades of barbering, tailoring, carpentering, stone cutting, blacksmithing, etc., and a few can work on the farm. A large number, however, are necessarily employed at kinds of labor which does not fit them for anything more than the commonest kind of day work, and when they go out they consequently must be content with the low wages which such labor commands. But the question of wages is not the worst. There is nothing inspiring in shoveling sand or dirt, or quarrying rock, handling a scraper or trundling a wheelbarrow on the public highway. When does a man learn anything out of such labor that will be especially useful to him? A man can shovel dirt for a year and not know at the end of the time how to dig a round hole in the ground; can dump concrete all his life into moulds prepared by others and not be able to construct a mould in which to make a hog trough. Better that a man in prison should do this kind of manual work than to be idle, and some there are fitted for only that kind of work. There are many men in prison who had not learned much on the outside, in some cases because of things beyond their control, in many cases all through lack of ambition, but who would if they had opportunity and encouragement after they are incarcerated and given time to consider their situation and what they have lost, like instruction in such trade or avocation, would become ambitious to succeed and would go out with much better prospects of becoming good citizens than without it. Vocational education and training in many lines of work, and that class of work calculated to fit a man for positions on the outside, are what is needed.

The object of the State should not be to make money out of their labor at the prison or reformatory. The reformatory should be a school and the ends sought should be as in any other school, to prepare the inmate capable of doing it, for the higher class of labor, that is, such labor as requires skill and the use of brain power, and commands good wages on the outside. There will always be a sufficient number who are not capable of doing such kind of work, or incapable of learning to do it, or are physically unable for hard service, to fill the places of cellhouse keeper, coal heaver and such like, all necessary and honorable employments; but there is, and always will be in the Reformatory those who will want to,

and are capable of doing the kind of work which fits them for more important pursuits, the following of which will bring better returns, beneficial to themselves, their families, and the State. Civil engineering, electrical engineering, mechanical engineering, different trades taught in all the details of each particular trade, and such like, are suggestions we make from experience in handling paroled men, and observation of men in prison that would be beneficial to the man and to the State.

The moral and religious training in the prisons should be emphasized, and much intelligent attention given to it. There are men in the Reformatory who are ready to forsake the criminal life and a per cent who are not willing criminals, even though they have committed crime. While the State must deal with even such as these according to their deeds, let it take advantage of this opportunity while these are in its custody, and seek to turn them out with higher ambitions, better ideals, stronger to resist temptation, and with a proper realization of their duties and responsibilities to themselves and to the State.

There are men who are criminal and who cannot, except by a transformation in some way, if that is possible, be made into good citizens, men who really desire to live a criminal life and who resent any effort looking to the correction of their disposition or interfering with their liberty to go their way.

The real work of the Board of Parole should be to select and classify and dispose of these classes of men according as they find their record and disposition to be. The best results cannot be obtained in the handling of the young men who are first offenders if the chief object of the State is to make money out of their labor rather than to educate and train; if emphasis is put on just keeping men employed, without regard to the kind of work they do. It is necessary that men in prison should be kept at work, but that work should be, as far as possible, the kind that fits them for more useful occupations than they knew how to follow when they went in. The benefit of such teaching and training has been demonstrated in our experience, time and again. We therefore recommend that you ask the Thirty-sixth General Assembly for legislation needed to organize the Reformatory along the lines herein suggested, and which were evidently contemplated by the commission that investigated the Reformatory system in many States and with many men of experience and in a painstaking way, and reported to the Thirty-first General Assembly in 1906.

We again commend for your consideration the proposition that the work of the Board of Parole is now of such character and proportions, that the members should be required to give their entire time to it. Investigations should be proceeding at all times by the members of the board, to the end that when a man is ready for parole, a place should be found for him, and the vote to parole and the release to a place already obtained may go together. The members of the board could then do personal work with the men at their places of employment and in securing places for them, which in some instances would be productive of good results in the administration of the law.

This board has, in the seven years since its organization, investigated the cases of more than twenty-four hundred prisoners sent to the Reformatory and Penitentiary. In the two-year period covered by this report, there has been earned by men on parole and placed in employment by the board, as shown by their reports and verified by their employers, \$149,781.17. The average of men on parole during that two years has been about 200, under rather than above that number. On the basis of that average these men have earned at the rate of \$379.45 per year, or \$31.62 per month. In some cases the wages have been less than that with board added; in many other cases more than that out of which the paroled man paid his board, and some, unable to do much work, are simply earning their maintenance. We believe it safe to say that, if the board the men were earning in addition to the earnings reported were counted with the wages received in these two years, the amount earned would reach nearly, if not quite \$200,000.00. Of course in many cases men have proven derelict, but in most cases the year on parole has aided men in becoming fixed in their habits, more industrious, economical, and less inclined to dissipation than they had ever been before. Many men paroled, and who had done little if anything for themselves or others, before they were sent to prison, are now law abiding, industrious citizens.
