REPORT OF THE TREASURER OF STATE.*

STATE OF IOWA,
OFFICE OF TREASURER OF STATE,
DES MOINES, July 1, 1887.

To his Excellency, WILLIAM LARRABEE, Governor of Iowa:

SIR—Complying with section 2, chapter 175, laws of the Nineteenth General Assembly, I herewith respectfully submit a biennial report of the financial transactions of this office, showing a full and complete statement of the receipts and disbursements of this department for the fiscal term commencing July 1, 1885, and ending June 30, 1887, inclusive.

Coupon Fund—As recommended in my last report to the Twenty-first General Assembly by the enactment of chapter 88 of its session laws authorized the closing of this account into the general revenue account, which was done the 8th day of July, 1886, as shown in this report.

State Depositories—The Des Moines National Bank, Iowa National Bank, Valley National Bank, Polk County Savings Bank, American Savings Bank, and Capital City State Bank, of the City of Des Moines, designated by me at the commencement of my first term in January, 1885, for the purposes and in accordance with chapter 57, laws of the Seventeenth General Assembly, were reappointed and filed new bonds at the commencement of my second term in January, 1887, and continue as they have heretofore to transact all business entrusted to them in a very prompt and satisfactory manner, without cost to the State for collections or exchange.

Tabulated Statement—Your especial attention is called to the tables appended to this report, a new feature, showing in detail the source from which every item of *State revenue* is derived with date and amount, which it is hoped will add some interest to the dry array of figures making up the report of this office, the last table, state-

ment "H," a consolidation of the footings of the several tables, show all in a condensed form.

State Debt—As is generally known for four years the *revenue* provided has not been sufficient to meet the *unusual* appropriations made by the Nineteenth and Twentieth General Assemblies for building new, and extending State Institutions already established, thereby creating a large floating debt. This I am pleased to say has been largely reduced, with every assurance that the fall payment of the tax of 1886, and the spring payment of the tax of 1887 will fully meet the interest bearing part of this debt.
