LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL.

HON. W. L. HARDING, Governor.

SIR: As provided by law, I herewith submit to you and to the members of the Thirty-eighth General Assembly, the Fifth Biennial Report of the Iowa State Board of Education for the period July 1, 1916, to June 30, 1918. This report contains the observations and conclusions of the Board respecting the State University of Iowa, the Iowa State College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, the Iowa State Teachers College, the Iowa College for the Blind and the Iowa School for the Deaf. It also contains the statistical reports of the executives of these five educational institutions.

IOWA STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION REPORT

When the Thirty-seventh General Assembly adjourned, a state of war between the United States and Germany had just been declared. Every one recognized that this war might; and in all probability would, work vast economic changes, and that it might exert a considerable influence on our institutions of higher learning. We knew that in Europe colleges and universities had been practically closed by the war.

With this thought in mind, the Chairman of the Appropriation Committees of the House and Senate addressed a communication to the State Board of Education, calling attention to the possibilities, and suggesting that it would be wise to consider these things when making apportionment of the support funds granted by the General Assembly to the institutions under this Board's control, so that the money requested and appropriated on the supposition that there would be continued increase in the student bodies, might not be expended unless circumstances should warrant.

This communication and its suggestions were accepted by the Board as wise, and were acted upon in good faith. Attendance did decrease in the institutions of higher learning—not to so great an extent perhaps as might reasonably have been expected, but to a considerable degree.

This report has to do with the two years ending June 30, 1918; and, so far as that period is concerned, the Board is able to report balances of considerable amounts in the support fund of each of these institutions as of the date above mentioned. Inasmuch, however, as the money appropriated by the Thirty-seventh General Assembly is for the biennium ending June 30, 1919, it is proper in this connection to call attention to what has taken place since the close of the period legally covered by this report—this for the reason that what has taken place from that date, to the date when this report is filed, has a direct bearing on the disposition of the funds entrusted to the Board's care by the Thirty-seventh General Assembly as well as on what must be requested by this Board of the Thirty-eighth General Assembly.

STUDENTS ARMY TRAINING CORPS.

Had conditions remained as they were during the college year ending in June, 1918, it is reasonable to conjecture that there would have been fewer students in most of the departments at the University, the College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts and the Teachers College; and, in consequence of this decreased attendance, there would have been continued decrease in expenditures. But, just as the college year opened, the War Department at Washington announced its program of student training for war purposes—a program nation-wide in its scope and including the independent and state-supported institutions of Iowa. Briefly stated, this plan contemplated inducting into the military and naval service of the United States all students of draft age who were physically fit and capable of measuring up to college entrance requirements, it being the intention that they should be trained for war while pursuing their studies and that such students, on induction, should be under military control, uniformed and entitled to the pay of the soldier just as men undergoing a training process at a cantonment. As soon as this plan was announced the entire situation changed in so far as college attendance was concerned. Though no young man of draft age was thereby compelled to go to college, it followed as a matter of course that not only those who had it in mind to go to college, but many others who for one reason or another had not thought of going, recognized in this plan an opportunity to get at least a few months of college training along with their military training. Instead of decreased attendance being a certainty, it became obvious that there would everywhere be an increased attendance.

As the government's plan was unfolded, it became clear that, although the government had it in mind to compensate the colleges for the work done, it was inevitable that increased financial burdens be placed on the institutions—burdens which would not be paid for, at least not without additional legislation. The institutions were directed to be prepared to house and feed this student army October 1st. By dint of unprecedented effort, these demands were met. At the time specified everything was in readiness at each of the institutions under this Board's control. But the process of induction was slow. At this writing, October 28th, the process is not yet completed at all the institutions. The government will not pay for the maintenance of any man until he

has been inducted into service. Meantime such students as have not been inducted have been housed and fed at state expense. A part or all of this deficiency may be made up by the students' paying for such maintenance out of their own pockets, but a certain portion of them are without funds.

It should be said in this connection that the amount necessary to meet these demands on the colleges is to be paid by the national government on a per-diem basis. That is to say: For instruction the government will pay the regular tuition, which in state-supported institutions is a nominal sum, and the government will also pay the amount actually expended for housing and feeding the student soldiers; but no provision has been made for the payment of salaries of additional instructors, which in the case of state-supported institutions is a considerable sum above the nominal tuition. The government ordered the institution of special courses not in the regular curriculum, and many special instructors had to be employed. As has been pointed out, that which the government does pay is on a per-diem basis, extending over a period of 270 days. The tentative sum designated by the War Department is \$1.00 a day for each student, this to be increased or diminished as the facts brought out by experience shall warrant. This method of compensation, perforce, made it necessary to use state funds to take care of the large initial expenditures incident to making ready for this student army. In many instances, such expenditures were without any direct legal sanction, but we have taken it for granted that in an emergency of this kind there is but one thing to do, viz., to fulfill to the best of our ability our manifest patriotic duty in the premises. This we have done, and the Executive Council, in so far as it could, has approved our acts. We would insult the General Assembly if we entertained even a suspicion that you would disapprove what, in good faith, has been done to meet the obligations thus imposed.

THE EPIDEMIC OF SPANISH INFLUENZA.

Immediately upon the opening of our colleges, came the epidemic of Spanish influenza and pneumonia which has ravaged the entire country. The housing of students in barracks made the spread of the disease more rapid than it otherwise would have been. Its onset was sudden and severe. Even at the University, with the largest hospital in the state, it became necessary to commandeer houses and other buildings to care for a portion

of the students who were sick, and to equip such places, as it were, overnight. At Ames similar action was rendered necessary and on a scale even larger, and it was also imperative to do likewise at Cedar Falls.

The expenses incident to caring for these sick students have been considerable. At this writing the exact sum has not been transmitted to us; but we know full well that, whatever the amount thus expended, you will approve every item thereof.

BUILDING OPERATIONS.

The Thirty-seventh General Assembly appropriated comparatively small sums for building purposes, and approved plans for the completion of buildings from these funds and from funds already on hand.

The Thirty-seventh General Assembly appropriated \$250,000 for the erection of two armories, one at the University and the other at the State College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts; and it also appropriated \$150,000 for the erection and equipment of a Children's Hospital at the University, to provide quarters for the children committed to the Hospital of the College of Medicine of the State University under what is known as the Perkins law. Owing to the fact that there had been a great advance in the price of steel and other building materials, it was found inadvisable, not to say impossible, to build the armories referred to above. Adequate buildings could not have been constructed for the sum appropriated. An advantageous contract was obtained for the construction of the Children's Hospital according to plans which did not call for the most expensive materials, and a building in all respects worthy of the object for which it has been constructed is nearing completion. We believe you will cordially approve the Board's attitude touching these matters.

STUDENT BARRACKS AT THE UNIVERSITY.

One of the most difficult duties imposed upon the institutions in connection with the students army training corps was the matter of housing. The War Department required that this student army be housed in barracks. At the College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, representatives of the War Department approved the taking over of the fraternity houses, because they were in close proximity to the drill ground. At the University, they refused to recommend like action because the fraternity houses were situated at a considerable distance from the drill

ground. At the State Teachers College, ample quarters for a comparatively small body of army students in training were provided in the college gymnasium.

As a temporary expedient at the University, certain college buildings were taken over, together with certain store-rooms, for temporary housing purposes. The War Department, however, insisted that, so far as this institution was concerned, barracks must be erected. After consultation with the War Department, it was deemed the part of wisdom to provide barracks which could be used at a later date for some permanent university purpose. After consultation, the Executive Council granted permission to use a portion of the building fund of the University for the erection of a building to serve as barracks for the students army training corps, this building to be permanent in its character. The War Department agreed to reimburse the University in a sum equal to the amount it would cost to erect wooden barracks, which, in the very nature of the case, would after a time cease to serve any useful purpose at the University. We are confident that this action would be looked upon as conforming to sound business principles.

AS TO PLANS FOR THE FUTURE.

From what has been set forth in the foregoing pages, it will be clear to the General Assembly that it is well-nigh impossible and altogether impracticable, at this writing, to bring to your attention a legislative budget which shall provide for the needs of these institutions during the coming biennial period. No one knows what a day may bring forth. Much depends upon the events of the next few months. It is our earnest hope that by the time the General Assembly convenes events will so have shaped themselves that we shall have a clearer idea of what may be expected during the two years for which this General Assembly must make provision.

We therefore respectfully crave your indulgence in the matter of a legislative program. We trust that upon the convening of your honorable body the situation may be so clarified that we can present to you a carefully worked-out program commensurate with the needs of the several institutions of higher learning for the two years ending June 30, 1921. This will be done through the medium of a special communication, either addressed to you as a whole or as individual members of the General Assembly.

THE COLLEGE FOR THE BLIND AND THE SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF.

The war has not affected these two institutions in the matter of attendance, but it has affected them seriously by the increased cost of materials, food and service. Appropriations for the support of these institutions were made on a peace basis, and if war had not come they would have been adequate, especially at the College for the Blind. But by reason of the fact that the cost of food, materials and service has greatly increased, it has been only by the most rigid economy that we have managed to make ends meet; and it is altogether possible that we shall be obliged to ask you to provide for a small deficit. Both at the School for the Deaf and the College for the Blind there were unforeseen expenditures growing out of the influenza epidemic. At the School for the Blind, three-fourths of the student body were afflicted by the disease, and it became necessary to employ many additional nurses. The same thing is true, in a lesser degree, at the School for the Deaf, where the epidemic has not yet run its course. We are glad to report that thus far there have been few fatalities at these institutions.

ENDOWMENT FUND IOWA STATE COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE AND MECHANIC ARTS.

The permanent Endowment Fund of the Iowa State College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, as reported at the close of the preceding biennial period, stood as follows:

Loans amounting to \$84,200.00 were renewed for periods ranging from five to ten years, these renewals not being included in the item of loans made.

Loan Number 1125 has interest due since January 1, 1918, of \$125.00. This loan is secured by land in Grundy County appraised at over two and one-half times the amount of the loan. This is the only past due item in connection with the Endowment Fund loans.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT, IOWA STATE COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE AND MECHANIC ARTS

R. A. PEARSON, PRESIDENT.

THE STUDENT BODY.

ENROLLMENT.

The enrollment of students showed a considerable increase in the first year of the biennium but in the second year there was a decrease. In the first year of the biennium the enrollment of graduate students was 115, exceeding all previous records. Most of these took work in agriculture and in sciences fundamental thereto. The enrollment of collegiate students in agriculture was 901, establishing a new record. In engineering, the enrollment was 672, being the largest since 1908-09. The home economics collegiate enrollment of 552 students was larger than ever before. There were 118 collegiate students in industrial science, the largest number since 1907-08. The enrollment in veterinary medicine established a new record with 130 students. There was a decrease in enrollment in agricultural engineering to 74.

In the two and one-year courses in non-collegiate agriculture, the enrollment was 243 which exceeded all previous records with the exception of the two years, 1913-14 and 1914-15. In the non-collegiate two-year engineering course the enrollment was 61, and in the similar course in home economics, 52. There were 27 students of music. The total number of students in the college taking courses running throughout the entire academic year 1916-17 was 2,915, the largest number on record. The summer session in that year showed a total enrollment of 1,055, establishing a new record. The short courses in this year were unusually well attended and brought the total enrollment of the year, without duplicates, to 7,469, exceeding the next largest previous enrollment, which was in the preceding year, by about 36 per cent. The attendance in the second year of the biennium, 1917-18,

was considerably reduced on account of the war. All branches of the work showed a reduction except the courses in two-year non-collegiate engineering, which nearly doubled in number of students. The total number of students taking courses running through the year was 2,465. The number of collegiate students in this year, 2,091, was practically the same as were enrolled in the college in 1913-14.

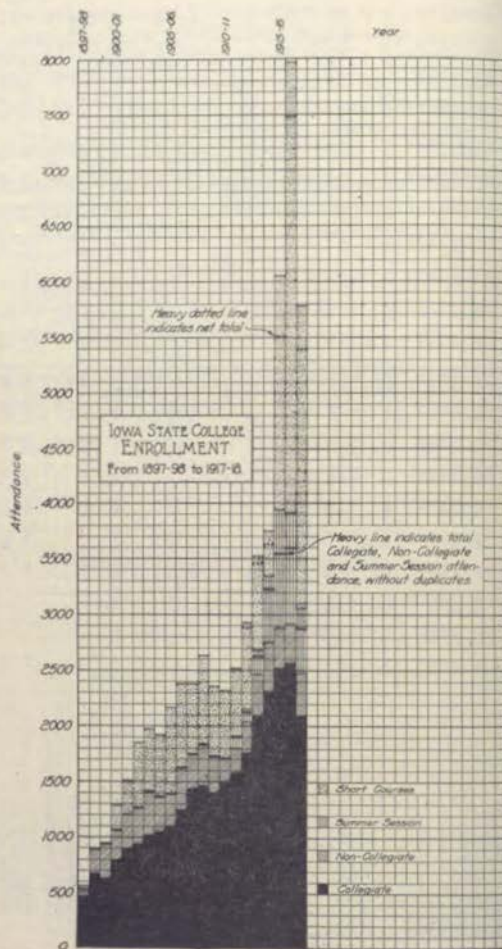
There was a heavy decrease in attendance in short courses; the total enrollment for the entire year, without duplicates, being 5,397, or within 105 of the largest number in any year preceding this biennium.

Report of the Secretary Regarding Receipts and Disbursements of All Funds from July 1, 1916, to June 30, 1918.

It has been the custom of the Secretary's office to so connect its biennial reports as to show a continuous history, through the years, of the financial operations of the institution. The present report, while more condensed than previous ones, traverses the same ground as the others and retains practically the same classifications. The college has two main purposes, namely, the conduct of an educational institution on the campus at Ames; and, second, the rendering of what may be rightly called industrial service for the state. Any intelligible exhibit of its finances must make sharp distinction between these two lines of institutional purpose and show the cost of each. With this idea in mind, the funds provided for the maintenance and development of the institution are classified as hitherto under the following heads:

Educational funds:

Non-collegiate support funds.
Vacation course funds.
Student fees.
Building, improvement and equipment funds.

Industrial Service funds:

Experiment funds.
Extension work.
Hog cholera serum fund.

EXPENDITURES FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD.

The expenditures are classified, the same as are the receipts, under the two main headings:

1. Educational work.
2. Industrial service work.

These are still further divided so as to show the expenditures along the different special lines for which the income of the college is used. It will be noted in the college educational expenditures:

- (a) That a portion of the department expense is met by fees collected from students. These fees are limited to the cost of laboratory material used by such students.
- (b) In addition to the regular current expenses of the departments, considerable equipment is purchased and many improvements are made from the support fund. Separate accounts are kept of these expenditures.

The following exhibit shows the amounts expended for the different departments and the total direct educational expenditures of the entire institution for each of the years of the biennial period.

No portion of this total balance has been drawn from the state treasury. The books of the secretary show that the college treasurer has in fact advanced, temporarily, from other funds, the sum of \$984.13 to meet the bills paid. This he has a legal right to do. It makes a present showing, however, of a balance of \$33,533.39 in the state treasury belonging to these funds.

VACATION COURSES.

These include:

- The Summer School.
- Winter Short Courses at the college.
- Veterinary Practitioners' Course.

Each is supported by a special appropriation, and, because of this and the distinct character of their work, they are given financial presentation separate from the regular collegiate and non-collegiate work of the college. The Summer School is, however, gradually taking on the character of a fourth term of college work and will probably, in the near future, be so classified.

The appropriation for the Summer School for the first year of the biennial period was \$20,000, and for the second, \$25,000. After deducting the expenditures as given above, this leaves a balance of \$5,000. The continuance of higher prices and a higher cost of living will naturally increase rather than decrease the expense of conducting these summer sessions. The desire of young men returning from the army to use the summer school and make up their back work will increase the attendance, and, because of the inevitable irregularity in classification, add to per capita cost.

WINTER SHORT COURSES AT THE COLLEGE.

The annual state appropriation for the support of these courses is \$9,500. The time given to them has been decreased from two weeks to one week, and the character of their work so changed as to make them the annual coming together days for conference and systematized discussion and study by the various industrial interests of the state of the special problems confronting them.

The exhibit which follows gives an idea of the amount and character of the expense connected with the support of these courses.

The balance on hand to the credit of this fund is \$4,826.45, of which \$4,500 is in the hands of the state treasury and \$326.45 in the hands of the college treasurer.

VETERINARY PRACTITIONERS' COURSE.

The purpose of this court is to enable the veterinary division to bring before the practitioners of the state the latest information regarding the prevention of contagious diseases and any improvements which may have been made in the technique of surgical operations. Problems arising in practice are discussed and plans formed for the advancement of the profession. Owing to the disturbed conditions caused by the war, only two meetings have been held in the last two years, one in January, 1917, and one in January, 1918. Both were well attended. The funds available for the biennium consisted of a balance brought forward of \$4,006.18, and the appropriation of \$5,000, making a total of \$9,006.18. The following is a summary of the expense incurred:

3. Special appropriation for additional equipment and furnishings for buildings and departments.
4. The annual fund from the state for repairs and minor improvements; and the room rent fund used for the same purpose; also store room and campus lake accounts.

ANNUAL BUILDING FUND.

This fund was formerly provided through a special building tax. The tax law was repealed and in its place an annual appropriation of \$150,000 was voted the institution. This was reduced by the last legislature to \$10,000 for the biennium. The account for the biennial period shows as follows:

REPAIR AND MINOR IMPROVEMENT FUND.

The grounds, buildings and general service equipment of the college approximate \$3,500,000.00 in value. The expense of keeping this plant in repair and taking care of the necessary minor improvements is met by an annual appropriation of \$50,000, of which \$4,000 is subject to renewal by the legislature at its biennial sessions. INDUSTRIAL SERVICE WORK.

The college is, at the same time, an educational institution and a center of industrial service work for the state. Each is supported by the state; each has its separate expense budget; each should be judged by results attained; neither should live off the other; the appropriations made should be sufficient to maintain each in the strength it merits. In order that the legislature may clearly understand the cost of maintaining each, a sharp line of distinction is drawn between the two in this report. At present, the industrial service work includes the following lines:

1. Extension work.
2. Experimentation.
3. Hog cholera serum.

I. EXTENSION WORK.

This includes:

- Agriculture and Home Economics Extension.
- Engineering Extension.

Considering these in their order, we have:

(a) Agriculture and Home Economics Extension.

It is twelve years now since this work received legislative sanction. For the first eight years, it was supported entirely by state appropriations. In 1914-15, the national government began to give it financial assistance. It has demonstrated its usefulness to the state, and especially during the war has proved itself a most efficient agency in directing and increasing production. Liberally supported, it will become in the future an even more important factor in agricultural development. The exhibit which follows shows the receipts and expenditures for the biennium:

(b) Horse Breeding Experimentation.

This experiment work was undertaken jointly by the college and the United States Department of Agriculture. The government decided to use its funds along other lines, and the experiment was discontinued. (c) Veterinary Investigations.

The last legislature increased the annual allowance for this work from \$9,000 to \$12,500. The war has interfered somewhat with the investigation plans as originally outlined because of the governmental demand for expert veterinarians and the limitation of building operations. The department is now well organized, a new building well suited for investigation purposes is to be erected in the near future, and every effort will be made to still further develop the work.

III. HOG CHOLERA SERUM FUND.

The original legislative appropriation for the establishment at the college of the serum laboratory was \$35,000. Of this amount, some \$24,000 was expended in the erection and equipping of buildings. A portion of this expenditure was recouped in the biennium ending June 30, 1916, so that the balance then reported on hand was \$32,382.93. The decrease in the last two years from this balance to the present balance of \$4,968.92 is due to an increase in the inventory of about \$20,000 and, as to the remainder, to a decided advance in wages and in the cost of hogs, feeding stuffs, and other materials used in the manufacture of serum, with no corresponding increase in the selling price of the product. However, the selling price has lately been advanced from 1½¢ to 1¼¢ per cubic centimeter.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT, IOWA STATE TEACHERS COLLEGE

H. H. SEERLEY, PRESIDENT.

THE EXTENSION DIVISION

The Extension Division of the Iowa State Teachers College is organized for the following purposes:

- (1) To assist county and city superintendents in improving the efficiency of their schools.
- (2) To give teachers in service an opportunity for continued growth.
- (3) To promote the general welfare through education throughout the state of Iowa, to which purpose the Iowa State Teachers College has been dedicated.
- (4) To enable the institution to keep in close touch with the needs and activities of the schools, and thereby supply such wants and at the same time be enabled to vitalize the work on the campus.

The work of the Extension Division has continued throughout the biennium with unusual acceptability to the superintendents and teachers of the state. The demonstrated merit of such service has established a demand for it everywhere. The firm foundation now established insures progress in making the resources of the institution widely serviceable.

The extension work is set apart as a distinct division of the Iowa State Teachers College, directly responsible to the president.

A director, an associate director and two office assistants are required to maintain the state-wide relationships and to care for the office.

Almost every member of the faculty has enlisted in this service. The interest of our instructors has grown with continued

participation. Only the loyal support of the faculty makes the Extension Division possible.

A few outside teachers are employed, but experience has shown that our own faculty members are greatly preferred.

DEPARTMENTS OF WORK.

GENERAL STUDY CENTERS.

In this branch of the service, two instructors go on Saturday to a town designated by the county superintendent to offer work in their respective lines to town and rural teachers.

The Study Center consists of the two groups, town and rural, and each instructor gives two hours of instruction to each group.

CREDIT EXTENSION CLASSES.

The Bureau of Credit Extension was organized at the opening of the fall term, 1917.

Any course in the catalog, except courses requiring extensive laboratory and other special courses, is offered for extension credit in any part of Iowa.

At least fifteen teachers must subscribe to a course before it is offered.

The work is conducted in the same manner as similar work in the institution, except a quarter's work is covered in thirty class hours. Outside reading is required to equalize the campus work.

Credit for such extension study, when done satisfactorily, is given as if the quarter's work had been completed in the actual class rooms of the college.

Usually the instructor meets the class on alternate Saturdays for three hours at a time.

During the year 31 credit extension classes were conducted with a total enrollment of 553. The various geographical sec-

tions of the state were represented. A total of 324 meetings were held at an approximate cost of \$5,600.00.

EXTENSION SUMMER SCHOOLS.

The Thirty-seventh General Assembly provided \$10,000 for Extension Summer Schools of the Iowa State Teachers College. This amount made it possible for that institution to organize two such schools during the summer of 1917, one in Atlantic and one in Sheldon. The former school enrolled 182 students and the latter 162. These schools constituted a new feature in teacher training by the state of Iowa.

This plan brought teacher training to the sections of the state served, thereby interesting some students who would not otherwise have attended summer schools, and also attracting the attention of the public in those portions of Iowa to the need of teacher training. It reduced the expenses of those attending and made it possible for many to spend week ends at home.

These schools were so successful that three such schools are being conducted in 1918: Denison, Red Oak and Spencer. Their combined enrollment will approximate six hundred.

The program of studies offered consists of the subjects required in examinations for a first-grade uniform county certificate, plus hand work, general methods of the common branches and illustrative teaching.

A director and nine other members were employed in each of the faculties in 1917. The director and eight other members were employed in each for 1918. However, it has been necessary to add another instructor in the school at Red Oak.

The average cost of the schools in 1917 was \$5,598.36. The expenses for each of the three schools in 1918 will be approximately the average cost of the preceding summer. The cost per student in the extension schools is almost exactly the cost per student in Cedar Falls.

Boards of education and commercial clubs have been anxious to fix the location of these schools in their communities. Splendid loyalty has been shown by these same bodies in the respective towns where the schools have been conducted.

MINOR ACTIVITIES.

I. Normal Training Centers:

In these meetings the rural teachers near a normal training

high school come together on Saturdays in conference led by the superintendent or teacher of pedagogy of that school.

II. Rural School Betterment League:

Some work was initiated in the spring term, 1918, through the co-operation of the Department of Rural Education, whereby assistance was given the county superintendents in the promotion of Rural School Betterment Leagues.

Visits extending over two to four days were made by a member of the Department of Rural Education to the rural schools in certain sections of counties where such co-operation was invited. Teachers, boards of education and patrons were met and counseled with.

III. Consultative Service:

In the consultative service, an expert in some particular line spends a day in a town or city system of schools and then meets the teachers in conference on topics in connection with his subject and his investigation.

These three fields have been little worked, but they offer possibilities for good service, and are, therefore, well worth cultivating.

BULLETINS AND MIMEOGRAPH MATERIAL.

An annual report of the Extension Division is issued. This bulletin offers a more exhaustive study to all interested in extension work.

During the biennium, bulletins have been issued on Lessons in Sewing, Lessons in Cooking, War Saving Problems, Food Conservation and the Organization and Classification of a Rural School, totaling 19,500 copies.

One hundred and five thousand pages of mimeographed lesson plans, outlines of subject matter, type lessons, suggestive helps and references have been prepared by members of the faculty in their respective subjects, and have been given to teachers in attendance at study centers where instruction in such subject matter has been given.

The extension service that is conducted by the Iowa State Teachers College is attracting the attention of educational institutions throughout the nation. Several representatives have visited us to get first hand information concerning this great and

good work. Thus, our institution is blazing a trail for extension work for teachers of America. The dawn is full of promise for a full day's opportunity.

The sharp increase in the cost of conducting this work will make it necessary for the Thirty-eighth General Assembly to appropriate a substantial increase to the funds generously appropriated by the Thirty-sixth and Thirty-seventh General Assemblies, in order that the opportunities may be fulfilled in the interest of a greater Iowa.
