PART 1

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL

GENERAL STATEMENT.

A change has been made in the personnel of the Board of Control of State Institutions since the last report. W. D. Sheean, of Anamosa, was selected by the governor and the general assembly to fill the unexpired term of J. H. McConlogue, deceased. J. H. Strief, of Sioux City, was selected by the governor and the general assembly to succeed W. J. Dixon, whose term of office expired June 30, 1917. The other member of the board is A. M. McColl, of Woodward.

The 1916 report of this board showed sixteen institutions under its control. The thirty-seventh general assembly transferred the School for the Deaf, at Council Bluffs, to the Board of Education.

The number of institutions over which the Board of Control of State Institutions has supervision, is now fifteen. Two new institutions have been opened during the past biennial period: the State Hospital and Colony for Epileptics, located in Boone County adjoining the town of Woodward in Dallas County, and the Women's Reformatory, located in Calhoun County, one mile east of Rockwell City. The first named institution was opened for the admission of patients September 3, 1917, and the latter was opened for the admission of women prisoners June 1, 1918

APPOINTMENTS BY THE BOARD,

Lena A. Beach was appointed superintendent of the Women's Reformatory at Rockwell City, on January 19, 1917. Dr. Beach took up her duties as superintendent on May 1, 1918.

J. R. Perkins was appointed warden of the State Penitentiary at Fort Madison, on August 13, 1917, to fill the unexpired term of the former warden, J. C. Sanders. Mr. Perkins assumed his duties as warden August 24, 1917.

Kenford

I. N. Baumel was appointed warden of The Reformatory at Anamosa and took up his work there on January 12, 1918. Mr. Baumel was named to fill the unexpired term of Warden C. C. McClaughry, who resigned to take up similar work in another state.

W. P. Crumbacker was appointed superintendent of the Independence State Hospital for the insane, to succeed himself, for the term beginning July 1, 1918, upon which date he entered upon his fifth term of four years. This appointment was made Tune 4, 1918.

C. F. Applegate was appointed superintendent of the Mount Pleasant State Hospital for the insane, for the term beginning July 1, 1917, when he entered upon his fifth term of service. This appointment was made June 18, 1917.

The five appointments referred to above were the only ones made during this biennial period.

STATE AGENTS.

The provision of the Board of Control law empowering this board to appoint state agents whose duty it is to find homes for the boys and girls committed to the Soldiers' Orphans' Home, the boys sent to the Training School for Boys and the girls who are students at the Training School for Girls, has worked out most successfully. Five state agents are employed in this work -one for the Training School for Boys, one for the Training School for Girls and three for the Soldiers' Orphans' Home,

Previous to 1914 the latter institution had but one state agent. The thirty-sixth general assembly authorized the appointment of an additional agent for that home and the thirty-seventh general assembly took like action, making a total of three agents for the work of placing in desirable homes the unfortunate little citizens of our state who, through no fault of their own, find their way to this splendid institution. This placement is only of children who, through the training received at the schools, are able to properly control themselves and reasonably sure of their conduct outside and away from state care. The addition of the two agents mentioned necessitated the division of the state into three districts: the northern, central and southern, each agent baving charge of a specified territory. The work of the state agents has greatly reduced the population at the institutions, making a very large saving in the expenses of maintaining those institutions, as well as providing splendid homes for the children, thus proving the wisdom of our legislators in enacting such law.

SOLDIERS' HOME, MARSHALLTOWN.

The improvements contemplated by the appropriations of the thirty-seventh general assembly have all been made with the exception of the "Building for Stores." Bids on this building as planned were in excess of the appropriation, hence this improvement could not be made.

The two new passenger elevators in the hospital and old people's building add greatly to the comfort of the members of the Home.

With the passing of the veterans of the Civil War, the need of a soldiers' home has naturally been considered a matter of years only, but as a result of the present world conflict in which our boys on land and sea have played so important a part, it is evident that the Home will now have a permanent place among the institutions of Iowa in extending its hospitality to a later generation of our country's defenders.

SOLDIERS' ORPHANS' HOME, DAVENPORT.

The gymnasium, for which an appropriation was made at the last session of the legislature, has not been built.

Because of the activities of the three state agents, placing children in private homes, the population of the institution is considerably less than during former years.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, COUNCIL BLUFFS.

This institution by an act of the thirty-seventh general assembly was transferred to the Board of Education as of July 1, 1917.

so that the financial and statistical tables which will appear in this report, cover the operations of the institution for but one year.

INSTITUTION FOR FEEBLE-MINDED CHILDREN, GLENWOOD.

Appropriations have been used as contemplated, except \$6,000.00 for building for bakery, which was found to be inadeouate, and \$2,500.00 for furniture. Both of these funds are intact.

Although this is the largest institution in population under the Board of Control, it cannot promptly receive all commitments because of its crowded condition.

STATE SANATORIUM, OAKDALE.

Because of war conditions the contract for the medical and laboratory building and installation of switchboard and cable have not been undertaken.

Work on the deep well is in progress.

The elevator and equipment for the hospital for advanced cases have been installed and the addition to the employes' building erected.

These improvements were urgently needed and add greatly to the efficiency of the institution.

EDUCATIONAL WORK.

The work of the department on tuberculosis has been carried on with uninterrupted interest. Three general lines have been followed: First education of the public by lectures, exhibits and literature; second, the organization of county tuberculosis clinics held under the auspices of county medical societies; third, the establishment of county hospitals for the care and treatment of tuberculosis.

Owing to emergencies created by the war the services of A. E. Kepford, state lecturer, were loaned and he became Iowa director for the American Red Cross. Of course, much time has been given to this great patriotic enterprise, but Mr. Kepford has been able to co-ordinate the work of the American Red Cross with this department in such a way as to very effectively organize still greater forces for the suppression of the white plague in Iowa.

A new development during the biennial period has been the establishment of county tuberculosis clinics. A clinic is organized through the county medical society. It provides free examination for all persons in the county in which the clinic is held, ¥

who may be afflicted with or suspected of having this disease. Dr. H. V. Scarborough, superintendent at the State Sanatorium, is director of the clinic. Clinics were held in Wright, Kossuth, Clayton, Plymouth, Page and Hamilton counties. Examinations were made of approximately 125 persons. A clinic affords an opportunity for physicians to study with expert clinicians and provides patients with expert diagnosis.

During the biennial period tuberculosis hospital campaigns have been successfully carried on in Polk and Dubuque counties. Polk county voted in 1916 for a \$100,000.00 bond issue and Dubuque county voted at the same election for \$75,000.00.

At present there are in operation, tuberculosis hospitals in Scott, Wapello, Polk and Woodbury counties. There is also a private hospital at Fort Dodge. About 400 beds are available throughout the state for persons suffering with tuberculosis.

There have been delivered 158 lectures and addresses on tuberculosis, with an attendance of 35,381 people.

Much literature has been distributed and a magazine entitled "The Campaign," with a circulation of 5,000, has been published intermittently.

TRAINING SCHOOL FOR BOYS, ELDORA.

The following appropriations made by the thirty-seventh general assembly have not been used:

All other appropriations have been expended in whole or in part as necessity required. The remainder will be needed and used as soon as the general conditions are improved.

TRAINING SCHOOL FOR GIRLS. MITCHELLVILLE.

Though much needed, all permanent improvements and equipment for which specific appropriations were made by the thirtyseventh general assembly, have been deferred.

MOUNT PLEASANT STATE HOSPITAL, MOUNT PLEASANT.

The condition of the heating plant at the Mount Pleasant State Hospital was such as to demand immediate attention in order to properly safeguard the patients, and contract was therefore let for boiler house and equipment.

Construction of the new laundry building has been postponed.

INDEPENDENCE STATE HOSPITAL, INDEPENDENCE.

Of the three buildings for which appropriations were made: hospital for tubercular patients, power house and horse barn, aggregating \$96,000.00, only the barn has been built.

CLARINDA STATE HOSPITAL, CLARINDA.

No permanent improvements have been made at this hospital.

CHEROKEE STATE HOSPITAL, CHEROKEE.

The only betterment undertaken was the completion of the railway switch which is now in operation. The cost of cast iron water main increased so enormously that the project of securing a new and adequate supply from the river, for which an appropriation of \$50,000.00 was made by the thirty-seventh general assembly, was of necessity deferred.

HOSPITAL AND COLONY FOR EPILEPTICS, WOODWARD.

The Hospital for Epileptics at Woodward was opened to the public on September 3, 1917, with Dr. M. N. Voldeng, former superintendent of the Cherokee State Hospital, in charge.

The number of patients received to July 1, 1918, being 127; the average number of inmates was about one hundred.

All of the buildings under contract at the time our last report was made are now completed and in addition there have been added:

The custodial building, which is nearing completion, will accommodate 150 patients and ten or twelve employes. The intention is to transfer from other state institutions custodial epileptic patients in sufficient number to fill the new building, thus relieving a congested condition.

The farm, comprising 1,144.4 acres, is a fine piece of agricultural land and is worked by convict labor. A good dairy herd has been started, furnishing an abundance of good milk for the patients and employes. General farming operations are being carried on, hogs, cattle, horses, hay, corn and small grain being grown with profit.

The roads have been much improved by grading and graveling. There remains an unexpended balance from the appropriations made by the thirty-seventh general assembly the sum of \$158.807.13.

STATE HOSPITAL FOR INEBRIATES, KNOXVILLE.

The population at this institution has steadily decreased during the biennial period and it was not thought wise to make any of the improvements provided for by the thirty-seventh general assembly, except to pave the street in front of the state's property which was completed during the summer of the present year.

With the co-operation of the business men of Knoxville, and with the good officers of the State Railway Commission, a connecting switch was secured between the Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific Railway and the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railway tracks. This switch was installed without cost to the state, greatly improves the shipping facilities of the State Clay Works, operated in connection with the hospital, and will result in a material saving on freight on coal.

STATE PENITENTIARY, FORT MADISON.

The only appropriations made by the thirty-seventh general assembly aside from contingent and repair, transportation of prisoners and \$1,000.00 for furnishing the warden's new residence, was one of \$100,000.00 for establishing and maintaining industries. This subject will be treated elsewhere in this report.

THE REFORMATORY, ANAMOSA.

The only appropriation used at this institution was about onehalf of the \$3,000.00 for tools, materials and equipment for manual training and trade instruction. All of the other funds are intact.

INDUSTRIES.

The appropriations granted by the legislature for establishing and maintaining industries aggregate \$275,000.00. Of

this amount \$27,941.66 was spent for land at the State Penitentiary and \$157,470.80 for industrial buildings, equipment and appliances at both the penitentiary and reformatory. The total amount remaining to the credit of the industrial fund is \$87,415.95. This is used as a working balance to cover operating expenses and to purchase material. It is expected that this balance will be increased very materially by the end of the calendar year.

The institution industries are of three classes: First, the manufacturing plants established by special or direct appropriation of the legislature to replace the prison labor contracts. These industries are equipped for and are doing a commercial business.

In the second class are those departments which when first organized were not equipped for a commercial business but had been established and maintained from the support funds of the institutions with which they were connected. The products were used for the maintenance of the inmates.

The third class are the institution farms, the operating expenses of which, except the state farm at Clive, are borne by the support funds, the products going back to the support of the institution.

There are three industries in the first class: The chair and furniture industry at the State Penitentiary, the cooperage industry at the Reformatory, and the brick and tile factory at the State Hospital for Inebriates.

CHAIR AND PURNITURE INDUSTRY.

The plant is the largest and best equipped chair factory west of Chicago. It was first established at the expiration of the prison contract with the Fort Madison Chair Company in 1915. The buildings vacated by that company were remodeled and equipped with machinery at a total cost of about \$75,000.00. This included the cost of generators, motors and other electrical apparatus at the power plant to furnish the additional power needed for the factory. The contract with the tool company expired in May, 1918, and the buildings they had occupied, were also remodeled and added to the factory.

Additional expenditures from time to time were necessary to provide a good stock of lumber, varnishes, seat leathers and other materials, gradually enlarging the capital invested, which is now \$152,500,00.

The aggregate of profits and reserves earned and now carried on the books of the chair industry exceeds \$98,000.00. Over

fifty different patterns of chairs in all finishes are now being manufactured.

Several hundred Iowa furniture dealers visited the factory in a body in June, 1918, and were greatly pleased and astonished at the magnitude and efficiency of the factory and the quality of workmanship. A fine display was exhibited at the state fair, which was seen and admired by many dealers and citizens of Iowa. Sample chairs are on display at the offices of the Board of Control.

The chairs are now handled by nearly all of the principal dealers in Iowa. A large number are sold in Chicago, St. Louis, Kansas City, and other points throughout the United States.

The industry provides work for one hundred and fifty prisoners. The total net sales during the period were \$247,156.75.

COOPERAGE INDUSTRY.

This was formerly operated by the American Cooperage Company under the contract system. It was taken over by the state January 1, 1915. Considering the money invested it has proved to be the most profitable of the industries operated by the state. The total cost of machinery and equipment to date is \$7,136.60 and the total investment, \$31,166.04.

The industry has earned over \$39,000.00 in profits and reserves. During the last two years approximately 650,000 butter tubs were manufactured and sold to creameries and dealers in Iowa, Minnesota, Illinois and Nebraska. The aggregate sales for the period amounted to \$207,957.01.

BRICK AND TILE FACTORY.

A large local business has been done with the farmers and contractors. Many cars have also been shipped to dealers within a radius of fifty miles of the factory. The population of the institution has been so reduced that prisoners had to be brought from Fort Madison to operate the plant. On June 30, 1918, there were three inmates and nineteen prisoners at work.

The products are drain tile, brick and building blocks. The curtailment of building operations has affected the sale of blocks and brick. The value of the products now on hand for sale is \$7,062.12. The plant is valued at about \$30,000.00. The total sales for the period were \$32,132.68. The industry has earned a substantial profit which is shown mostly in increased fixed assets.

There were originally nine industrial departments of the second class, as follows: The tailor shop, printing and binding, tin

shop and stone quarry at The Reformatory; and rug weaving, furniture repairing and upholstering, broom shop and assembling auto trucks at the State Penitentiary. The last five have, during this biennial period, been discontinued and the prisoners put at more profitable work on the farm and in the chair factory. The first five departments are still in operation and have been gradually enlarged so that work might be done for all institutions.

TAILOR SHOP.

Although each institution has a sewing department, many of the articles of wearing apparel used are made in The Reformatory tailor shop. The overcoats and suits made for the discharged men are of neat design and show good workmanship. The shop furnishes work for about thirty prisoners. The net sales for the period were \$59,743.96. No commercial business has been attempted.

PRINTING AND BINDING.

This department was established to furnish instructive employment to the men and fit them to accept and retain good positions upon release. The work has been confined to care for the needs of the state institutions and the offices of the Board of Control. Prices charged for printing could be considerably increased and still be less than prices asked by commercial firms. This would, of course, increase the profits, but it would be at the expense of other state institutions and departments. It has been the means, however, of saving the state many dollars in printing expense.

From twenty to twenty-five men are regularly assigned for work in this department. The net sales were \$14,195.25 and the plant is valued at \$13,583.05. Expert ruling and binding is also taught.

SHOE SHOP.

All shoes used at The Reformatory are manufactured and repaired in the prison shop. There are facilities and equipment for instructing eight men in the cobbler's trade and that number is able to provide for all of the local institution needs in that line. A careful accounting of this department is kept and it has been found that the shoes can be manufactured cheaper than they can be purchased and in addition the prisoners are taught a useful trade.

ITN SHOP.

Food trays, coal hods, garbage cans, buckets and other articles of tinware and galvanized iron are made and furnished to the institutions. Much local repair work is also accomplished. It provided work for eight prisoners.

STONE QUARRY.

The quarry furnishes work for about thirty men. The Reformatory walls, cell houses and nearly all of the buildings are constructed of stone taken from the quarries adjacent to the institution. All new buildings constructed in recent years are of stone taken from the prison quarry and prepared in the stonecutting department, where thirty men are regularly engaged at this work. The construction work is also done by prisoners, under supervision of an engineer.

The operating cost has mostly been paid from the support fund. The receipts are not large, as the law provides that stone must be furnished to counties at a charge of \$5.00 per car, which does not pay the cost of operating the quarry. Some stone is sold to railroads, but the margin of profit from this source has been small.

RUG WEAVING.

Owing to the great advance in dyes and all cotton materials used in the manufacture of rugs it was necessary to make a considerable advance in prices of the finished product. This, together with keen eastern competition and individual weavers in the smaller towns, has greatly decreased the sales. The board thought it advisable to discontinue the manufacture of rugs, which has recently been done. There are yet several thousand rugs on hand to be disposed of, but many of these will be purchased by the state institutions. The total net sales for the period were \$38,628.87.

BROOM INDUSTRY.

The scarcity and increased price of broom corn made it necessary to discontinue the manufacture of brooms as a commercial venture. The net sales during the period were \$9,749.32.

ASSEMBLING AUTO TRUCKS.

When this department was established materials and parts for fourteen trucks were purchased. All but three have been assembled at a cost of \$1,450.00 each and are now in use at the state institutions. The assembling has extended over a considerable period as two men did most of the work. The remaining trucks,

for which parts were bought, will be completed in the institution machine shops.

In addition to the departments enumerated, \$44,266.68 has been earned by prisoners of the penitentiary working at institution camps and other miscellaneous labor outside the prison walls, and \$12.925.74 at The Reformatory.

PARMING INDUSTRIES.

Farming operations, at both The Reformatory and the State Penitentiary, have been enlarged during the last year. Over one thousand acres were leased at The Reformatory adjacent to Anamosa. This, added to the land already owned by the institution, makes a total of 1,380 acres.

At the State Penitentiary 240 acres were purchased, increasing the total acreage of that institution to 1,263, which includes the Clive farm near Des Moines. Large quantities of fresh vegetables on both farms have been produced for the tables. Nearly 8,000 bushels of potatoes were raised at The Reformatory, also 2,060 bushels of barley, 3,691 bushels of oats, and 625 bushels of wheat. Corn and other crops promise a large yield.

STATE FARM AT CLIVE.

The farm has during the past two years earned profits in excess of \$20,000.00, which is shown in increased inventory or assets of the farm. Cattle and hogs to the amount of \$26,119.91 have been sold in the Chicago markets.

The total sales and receipts amount to \$58,739.05. The increase in the value of the land has also been considerable. Under the subject of farming this has been treated more fully.

The combined industries have made a remarkable showing during this period. The last year especially has been a very prosperous year for the chair and the tub factories. The aggregate amount of sales and receipts for services performed by the various industrial departments, including the farm at Clive, is over \$775,000.00 and the net profits not including reserves, over \$100,000.00.

Balance sheets, and profit and loss statements showing the operations of the principal industries, are shown in the financial section of this report.

THE STATE FARM AT CLIVE.

As shown in the 1916 report of the Board of Control, this farm was purchased as directed by the thirty-fifth general assem-

bly, consisting of 781 acres near Clive, ten miles west of Des Moines, at a cost of \$200.00 per acre. However, the thirty-fifth general assembly made no provision for the establishment of a custodial farm which was under consideration when this purchase was authorized. The farm has been conducted as a prison industry, the farm work thereon being performed by prisoners transferred from the State Penitentiary at Fort Madison.

Neither the thirty-sixth general assembly nor the thirty-seventh general assembly made additional provision for handling this farm; neither did either session of the legislature make provision for the purchase of other farms for use as custodial farms, as appears to have been the original intention of those of our citizens who were promoters of said plan for working prisoners convicted of minor offenses and given jail sentences.

It appears to this board that inasmuch as it evidently is not the wish or desire of the people of our state to maintain such custodial farms, and the further fact that the Board of Control finds it is impractical to operate the Clive farm with convicts from the Fort Madison penitentiary, because the land is located at too great a distance from the prison, we, therefore, recommend the sale of the Clive farm and in lieu thereof that we be authorized to purchase land near the State Penitentiary at Fort Madison and The Reformatory at Anamosa, where the best of discipline can be maintained among the prisoners working on same and a higher degree of efficiency of work secured. Such additional land could be more successfully handled and produce foodstuffs to an extent which will materially reduce the cost of maintaining the institutions.

THE STATE FARM NEAR GRANITE, LYON COUNTY.

During 1915 this farm was purchased, comprising a fraction more than two hundred acres, about thirty-six acres of which is underlaid with an extensive deposit of granite rock. The intention of a former Board of Control was to open a granite quarry on this farm and establish thereon a camp of convicts from The Reformatory to do the necessary work in the quarry and on the farm. The establishment of a quarry was found to be impractical because of the large expenditure necessary to install a proper quarry and crushing plant, and the further reason that in order to operate a quarry there it would be necessary to invest about fifty thousand dollars in a spur railroad track to the

quarry from the Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific Railway tracks running through that section of the state.

The portion of this farm which could be devoted to the growing of crops was cultivated by this board for one year, convicts from The Reformatory being used in that work. But as is the case with the Clive farm, it was found impractical to farm the Granite place with prison labor, because of its great distance from The Reformatory. We, therefore, recommend that the Granite farm be sold and the money derived from such sale be reinvested in land near The Reformatory in Jones County. The portion of the farm containing the deposit of granite can be reserved and held by the state if it is thought best to do so, as in the sale of the land the putting in of the granite section probably would add but very little to the net sum received for the farm.

Both the Clive farm and the Granite farm can be sold at a good profit to the state over and above, the price paid by the state for such lands.

CONVICT CONTRACT LABOR SYSTEM ENDED.

This system of employing convicts by contract on work for private companies was wholly abolished May 1, 1918, the contract held for such labor by the American Fork & Hoe Company at the State Penitentiary, terminating on that date. That plant was closed down on May 1st and later removed from within the prison walls, releasing for other classes of work 125 prisoners at the penitentiary. Thus a most obnoxious and ancient system for the employment of convict labor was eradicated from Iowa.

THE BOARD OF CONTROL AS A PAROLE BOARD.

By chapter 8-a, section 2713-n13, supplemental supplement 1915, the Board of Control of State Institutions was designated the Board of Parole for the Women's Reformatory. Certain rules and regulations to govern in the consideration of applications for parole have been adopted. The Board of Control will meet at the Women's Reformatory as a board of parole, semi-annually, in the months of February and August. In granting paroles, the important questions considered will be the crime committed by the prisoner, her life prior to the crime, the conduct of the prisoner while at the Women's Reformatory, and the probability that she will so guide her future life as to become and remain a useful and law-abiding person.

No parole will be granted until the prisoner's record has been carefully examined into, the community through its proper officials given an opportunity to recommend or oppose such parole, and the prisoner has presented herself to the board and been subjected to a rigid examination.

The Board of Control assumed these parole duties on the date of the opening of the Women's Reformatory, June 1, 1918.

WOMEN'S REFORMATORY OPENED.

Since the last report of the Board of Control all of the buildings for this institution, except the finishing inside of the pathological building, have been completed. The appropriation made by the thirty-sixth general assembly, \$5,000.00, for finishing the latter building was insufficient to do the work in even a partial manner, hence the building is unfinished and cannot be used for any purpose whatever in its present condition.

The buildings completed consist of two cottages for inmates, an administration building, an industrial building and school-house combined, a power house and a pump house. Also a water tower and tank.

Prior to the last report one shallow well was drilled on the farm to furnish water for building purposes. A second shallow well has since been drilled. The two wells are now furnishing the water supply for the institution buildings, but it undoubtedly will be necessary at some future time to drill a drep well to insure a more permanent water supply.

The Reformatory buildings are finished on the outside with white stucco and present a pleasing appearance. The only portion of the industrial building in use at present is the basement story in which has been installed the storeroom and cold storage and ice plant.

The Women's Reformatory was opened for the admission of inmates on June 1, 1918. This institution is for the care of delinquent women of the state. On the opening date the women prisoners in the past confined in the women's department of The Reformatory at Anamosa, were transferred to the Women's Reformatory, the prisoners transferred numbering twenty-two. During the month of June there were three new commitments.

In the two cottages for inmates, fifty-eight women can be taken care of. Upon completion of the pathological building additional prisoners can be accommodated. If the population at the Women's Reformatory should grow rapidly, a portion of the industrial building could be used by converting the third floor into several small dormitories.

In order to properly equip this institution for taking care of the delinquent women of the state as contemplated by the law enacted by the thirty-sixth general assembly, it will be necessary to complete the interior of the pathological building as originally planned, and for this purpose an additional appropriation is asked, which will be found in the section of this report headed "Appropriations to Complete Necessary Buildings."

A camp of men prisoners from The Reformatory was used for a time early this year at the Women's Reformatory, in farm work and grading, but this proved so unsatisfactory that finally such prison labor was dispensed with. The women prisoners were then placed on all farm work and general work around the institution, even unloading coal from cars at the power house. This has proved a very satisfactory undertaking and will be continued.

The construction of a sewage disposal plant, for which an appropriation of \$6,000.00 was made by the thirty-seventh general assembly, has not been started as yet. An additional appropriation will be necessary for this purpose, which is asked under another heading.

The cost of the land, buildings, furnishings and equipment at the Women's Reformatory up to this time, is as follows:

GENERAL MATTERS.

During the period of the war the board adopted the policy of suspending all building operations and permanent improvements which were not absolutely necessary. Special appropriations made by the thirty-seventh general assembly for the state institutions under control of this board, aggregated \$1,271,330.00. Of this grand total but \$416,517.71 has been expended. It must not be assumed that the purposes for which the appropriations were made were not essential. Many of them are imperative, But it was thought wise to suffer inconvenience for a period of a year or two in order to conserve the finances of the state at a time when the taxpayers were responding to so many unusual demands, and our soldiers and sailors were making such heroic sacrifices.

Under the law the legislature fixes the monthly per capita allowance for the support of all institutions under the board.

The increases asked for by the board and allowed by the thirty-seventh general assembly did not contemplate the unusual conditions caused by the war. Prices of many essential commodities, foodstuffs, fuel, wearing apparel, shoes, etc., have increased to such an extent as to make the per capita of several of our institutions entirely inadequate.

The purchase of table linen, carpets, furniture, etc., and the making of many repairs have of necessity been deferred. All regulations affecting the use of foods have been strictly observed, and every possible economy practiced, but the demands for the actual necessaries of life cannot be met from the per capita provided. In this dilemma the board appealed to the Executive Council, which very graciously responded, and under section 186 of the code, authorized the board to incur indebtedness, for necessary support items.

For the four months, March, April, May and June, 1918, the indebtedness thus incurred amounts to \$210,252,60. Without this special aid the situation would have become alarming.

INSTITUTIONS AND THEIR WORK.

We give below figures showing some of the war work of state institutions. These institutions have co-operated with local Red Cross chapters, and have turned in large quantities of surgical supplies of various kinds, such as bandages, handkerchiefs and tray cloths. Approximately 7,500 garments have been made in WAR ACTIVITIES IN STATE INSTITUTIONS

INSTITUTION VISITS AND INSPECTIONS.

The monthly and semi-annual visitations to all institutions were made, as shown in the table printed elsewhere. Complete and thorough inspection was made of all departments upon such visits.

COUNTY HOMES AND PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS.

In this department is employed an inspector of county homes housing insane patients, homes for friendless children and other private charitable institutions. Inspection of such institutions is made twice each year. We have received reports regularly regarding conditions at these various places. Those reports indicate that the wards receive good care at most of the county homes and at all of the private institutions where insane are cared for. A few counties in the state have been dilatory in providing the best accommodations for caring for the insane. A number of recommendations for betterments in county homes and homes for friendless children have been made, and, except in a few instances, the boards of supervisors of the various counties have co-operated to bring about needed improvements in harmony with the demand and established policy of our citizens and the Board of Control that the mentally afflicted and the unfortunate and orphaned children shall receive the best of care. The appropriation made by the thirty-seventh general assembly for carrying on this work was insufficient and as a result the inspector was idle during the month of June. This fund must be increased for the current period.

AID OF FRIENDLESS GIRLS.

The thirty-seventh general assembly appropriated the sum of \$5,000.00 to be expended under the direction of the Board of Control for the purpose of defraying the expenses for medical attention and treatment of friendless girls in maternity cases, who are patients in certain homes for friendless girls in Iowa. Acting under the provisions of this law, aid has been extended to girls who have been treated in the Benedict Home in Des Moines, the Florence Crittenton Home in Sioux City and the Salvation Army Rescue Home in Des Moines.

PAY ROLLS AT STATE PENITENTIARY AND THE REFORMATORY.

The reduction in pay rolls at the two penal institutions named is a matter we call to your attention with considerable pride and pleasure. The reduction during the past biennium amounts to approximately thirty thousand dollars, as compared with previous years in the management of those prisons. We wish to assure you, however, that this saving of state funds was not brought about by a reduction in the wage schedule, but by a reduction in the number of employes. Increases have been made in wages and further increases will be necessary in some departments to maintain the efficiency as it should be. The salaries of some employes of these institutions we have been unable to increase, though said employes are deserving of an increase, as

such salaries are fixed by statute. The only way such employes can procure relief in this respect during the higher price for everything is through legislative change of the salary schedule.

It is imperative that an increase be made in the monthly per capita support allowance considerably above that provided for in the law at present. We are unable to live on the present allowance.

BOARD OF CONTROL OFFICE SALARIES,

The salary schedule in this department is much below the standard now paid for similar duties in other states, in other departments of this state government, and by commercial corporations, companies and individual employers. Because of this below a living wage schedule which has been maintained in this busy department for some years, beginning at a time when a dollar had double the purchasing power it has today, we have lost a number of employes within the past year, some of whom were most efficient, and had been with the department for a number of years. The board was powerless to increase those salaries and as employers in Des Moines were very glad to pay the most efficient as much as twenty-five per cent above what was being paid by the state we lost those employes.

The present salary schedule of this department should be revised upward by the thirty-eighth general assembly.

INCREASED PRICES.

The Board of Control of State Institutions, in common with every other business organization, has been confronted with most extraordinary conditions along all the lines of its varied activities because of the abnormal prices created by the war.

These conditions involved an unusual increase in the prices of all food supplies, clothing and other commodities for use in our state institutions, in the prices of farming machinery and all equipment in the operation of the state institution farms, and for materials of all kinds that go into the repair and proper upkeep of state institution buildings; also there has been a continually increasing scarcity in the supply of labor as well as a continued rise, month after month, in wages and salaries for all labor. In a measure the Board of Control granted the many requests made for an increased wage. This included the salaries paid in nearly

every branch of the service. This action was absolutely necessary because it was impossible for the employes to live on the amounts allowed as provided by the old wage schedule in effect prior to the war period.

DECREASE IN TOTAL PAID IN SALARIES.

In spite of the fact that such increases were made and the further fact that two new institutions were opened and manned with employes during the biennial period, the total expenditure for salaries and wages for the fifteen institutions under our control has been less for the two years covered by this report than in any previous years. This decrease, of course, is due to the employment of a lesser number of people and amounted to \$62,-829,40.

FARMS, DAIRIES AND GARDENS.

The yield of farm crops as a whole during the last period has been quite satisfactory.

The yield of potatoes has not, however, been satisfactory, and as the average yield of the potato crop in the United States is ninety-seven bushels per acre, while the average yield at the several institutions in question, with careful care and attention, was little more than one-half this amount, convinced us that potatoes are not a profitable crop to raise in all parts of Iowa.

Winter wheat has been sown in greater abundance than in times past and the yield has been quite satisfactory. Owing to the drouth in some portions of the state, the yield of hay has been reduced. Alfalfa is being grown at a profit and makes splendid feed for the dairy cows. Three additional silos have been built, which provides abundance of good and cheap feed for the dairy herds.

Much care has been given to securing large quantities of seed corn and caring for it properly and in due season. Our practice being to secure enough seed corn for at least two years.

We have been raising cane and converting it into sorghum molasses which takes the place of sugar in many instances. Have established cane mills at almost all of our institutions.

Some tiling is being done from year to year, which, if continued, will soon result in having all of the state farms thoroughly drained.

Owing to the high cost of wire little fencing has been done in

the past two years. Practically all of the farms should be fenced with hog-tight wire.

More attention is being given the orchards, and with the assistance received from the Iowa State College at Ames a great improvement in production has been shown.

In connection with the Iowa farms we have experienced difficulty in securing farm labor and in keeping such labor when secured.

Additional land has been rented at The Reformatory at Anamosa and cultivated with prison labor. The prospects for crops are good and we are of the opinion that larger tracts of land could be handled at The Reformatory and the State Penitentiary at a profit to the state, utilizing more prison labor than could be used on farms at greater distance from the penal institutions.

The total increase in value over last report is \$87,743.21.

DAIRY HERDS.

We feel a just pride in the dairy herds at the state institutions under the Board of Control of State Institutions. By careful breeding and culling out of unprofitable cows, our dairy cows have been constantly increasing in the flow and value of milk until at present no institution herds in the Union equal the Iowa cows in profit and productiveness.

The herds are of the Holstein breed. We have at the head of our herds nothing but well-selected, finely-bred Holstein males. A few years ago we introduced a few well-selected, thoroughbred cows; they have increased in number until at the present time the state has quite a number of full-bred cows and heifers. We raised most of the males used at the institutions, transferring them from one institution to another, thus saving the necessity of expending considerable sums of money for males to head the herds.

When the new law went into effect the institution roads were badly neglected. The local road districts felt it should be the duty of the institutions to care for their roads, consequently little work was done on them. Under changed conditions a great improvement has been wrought and our institution roads show a very marked improvement. Much of the work was done by convicts from the State Penitentiary and The Reformatory, and by employes and inmates of the state institutions.

GOVERNMENT WAR PRICES PAID FOR COAL.

The coal used during the first year of the biennial period was purchased on contracts awarded previous to the convening of the last general assembly. These contracts were largely awarded to eastern concerns for Illinois coal; they being lower bidders than the Iowa companies.

Desiring to place the orders in Iowa and give the Iowa dealers preference, the board met in conference with them before contracting for the second year's supply, and as a result all of the coal was purchased from Iowa dealers.

Arrangements were made for a certain amount of coal to be stored at each institution during the fall for winter use. Sufficient inside storage room was not available at the institutions and a large part of the coal had to be temporarily piled in the open. There was some loss by deterioration and spontaneous combustion, but this loss was comparatively small, and the institutions were protected for the winter. This also helped to alleviate the car shortage later on.

Contracts for next year's supply have again been awarded to lowa dealers, except the institutions in the eastern part of the state where the freight rate is less from the Illinois mines.

The following is the quantity and value of coal used at the several institutions for the two years ending June 30, 1918:

Stokers and blower systems have been installed at some of the institutions, enabling them to use a cheaper grade of coal, which in some instances have, with the increased price of coal, reduced the cost over the previous period.

MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS.

Economy has been the watchword and economy has been practiced most rigidly at all of our institutions in the purchase and use of all supplies. "Help win the war through conservation," has been the slogan, and the institution heads and employes cooperated with the Board of Control to the fullest extent.

Food administration rules and regulations were followed at all institutions. Food substitutes were used as required by such rules. However, the quality and quantity of the food was maintained at a standard satisfying thoroughly the wards of the state and employes living in the institutions.

BUILDINGS CONSTRUCTED.

Building operations were halted for the period of the war, except such buildings as were contracted for or started prior to the time of enormously increased prices for all building materials. Such new buildings were as follows, and it was absolutely necessary to have same in order to take care of the population at the institutions named:

While it is the wish of this board to make no additional expenditures for new buildings, except for such as are absolutely necessary, we do desire for each state institution under our control a contingent and repair fund sufficiently large to take care of many needed repairs in buildings, power and heating plant equipment, electric wiring, plumbing, etc. It is poor economy to allow deterioration of such and we hope the general assembly will readily approve our recommendations for amounts necessary to do such work properly. While we are passing through the period of suspended building operations, let the state protect what it already has by making all needed repairs. That this will prove a matter of economy, we all know.

OTHER EXPENDITURES CONTROLLED.

Only nominal expenditures have been made for rugs, carpets, table linen and like supplies, purchase of such supplies being made only in cases where same were absolutely necessary. The old was made to do service, in many instances beyond the real life of the article, but were made to last, if possible, until the war is won.

The same economy has been practiced in the purchase of clothing and shoes. The old was repaired many times and kept in use in that way. We can assure you that the repair shops at all of the institutions for the repair of clothing and shoes have been and still are busy places. The same can be said of the sewing rooms for the repair of table linens, bedding, etc.

COST OF FOOD AND OTHER SUPPLIES.

For your information we wish to submit the following comparative statement, giving the increased cost of staple supplies during the past biennial period, as shown by the records covering purchases made on competitive bids through our purchasing department:

From the foregoing statement it will be noted that the cost of the various items of food and clothing, necessary to supply the inmates of the different institutions, has increased from 50 to 100 per cent and in numerous cases more than 100 per cent.

We note increases in four items as follows:

and other items have increased in the same proportion.

The various institutions have "done their bit" in complying with the regulations of the United States Food Administration. The use of flour substitutes has been observed insofar as possible. The consumption of sugar has also been curtailed in compliance with the food regulations and in some institutions has been reduced below the allowance of two pounds per month per capita.

The executive officers of the institutions have been instructed to raise large gardens of vegetables for summer use and to dry, can and preserve quantities of fruits and vegetables for use during the winter months.

In awarding contracts for supplies we have made it a rule to eliminate the higher-priced articles, increasing the quantity of the cheaper articles or substituting similar items at a cheaper price.

However, the advance in the price of all staple articles necessary to the welfare of the institutions has been such that it has been impossible to keep the cost of operating the various institutions from advancing from 75 to 100 per cent, as shown by the foregoing statement.

And this leads us to again call to your attention the necessity for a material increase in the monthly per capita support allowance in order that we may maintain our splendid state institutions in a manner in keeping with the desires and wishes of the people of our great state. The present monthly per capita allowance is insufficient.

Since August 1, 1914, according to the published statements of R. G. Dun & Company, the increase in the cost of living, as measured by the wholesaue price of all classes of commercial commodities has been 90 per cent. We quote as follows from a statement published in the "Literary Digest," on June 22, 1918, showing the large increase in the prices of food:

"Prices of food as a whole advanced 16 per cent between March 15. 1917, and March 15, 1918. The only decline was in potatoes, which article decreased 51 per cent. Corn meal showed the greatest increase, which was 75 per cent. Sugar showed the least increase, or 4 per cent. The increases in the price of other articles ranged as follows: Rib roast, 14 per cent; flour and sirloin steak, 15 per cent each; bread, 17 per cent; butter, 19 per cent; round steak, 20 per cent; pork chops, 21 per cent; eggs, 27 per cent; ham, 31 per cent; milk, 35 per cent; lard, 39 per cent, and bacon, 47 per cent. Food as a whole was 59 per cent higher in March, 1918, than in March, 1913. Every article increased in price 33 per cent and over. Flour was just twice as high in March, 1918, as in March, 1913. Lard increased 112 per cent and corn meal, 145 per cent. In only four articles was the increase less than 50 per cent. Eleven articles increased over 50 per cent and three of these increased 100 per cent and over. Percentages of increases in detail for this five-year period are given as follows: Corn meal, 145 per cent; lard, 112 per cent; flour, 100 per cent; bacon, 87 per cent; ham and sugar, 69 per cent; bread, 68 per cent; potatoes, 67 per cent; eggs and pork chops, 66 per cent; milk, 51 per cent; round steak, 49 per cent; rib roast, 38 per cent; sirloin steak, 37 per cent, and butter, 33 per cent."

The increased cost for care of the state's wards, in the matter of food, clothing and fuel alone can be fairly arrived at by comparison with the increased cost of such supplies to all of us in our own homes. The wards of the state are but a large family and are so taken care of.

STATE HOSPITAL FOR INEBRIATES, KNOXVILLE.

The 1916 biennial report showed there were 151 inmates in this nospital, men and boys, which was a decrease of 56 from the population shown by the previous biennial report. There has been a gradual decrease in the number of inmates in, and commitments

to, this hospital during the past two years, and on June 30, 1918, the total number of inmates was 36. This is a decrease of 105 from the number shown in the last biennial report. Indications are such at this writing that we doubt if, on the date of the convening of the thirty-eighth general assembly, there will be a dozen patients remaining at this hospital.

WHAT SHALL BE DONE WITH THE ABOVE INSTITUTION?

As the State Hospital for Inebriates has about reached the end of its career of usefulness and will within a short time be entirely depopulated, some disposition must be made of the same by the thirty-eighth general assembly. After a thorough canvass of and mature deliberation on the question: "To what use shall this institution be put in the future?" the opinion of the Board of Control is that it should be converted into an institution for the care of the feeble-minded, and we so recommend.

This change would provide two institutions for the care of the feeble-minded. The one institution the state now has for those unfortunates is located at Glenwood and at this time is filled beyond capacity. At the close of the fiscal period, June 30, 1918, the total number of inmates at the Institution for Feeble-minded Children was 1,454. The capacity of this institution is about 1,450, although there have been at times as many as 1,500 inmates there, but this created an overcrowded condition, which can in the future be avoided by converting the Hospital for Inebriates into a second institution for feeble-minded.

In nearly every county in the state there are a number of feeble-minded persons awaiting admission to the Institution for Feeble-minded Children. These comprise a long waiting list which the state at present is unable to take care of. Also, it is reported to the board that a number of feeble-minded persons are scattered over the state for whom no effort has been made to gain admission at Glenwood, because the crowded condition at that institution is known to the authorities in those localities. For the best interests of society, this class of unfortunates should have institution care and provision should be made by the state for so taking care of them.

At the Knoxville institution, the state could house that grade of feeble-minded so deficient in intellect that they are not subjects for education in the school at the institution at Glenwood. This class could do a large part of the institution work, consisting of farming and the operation of the brick and tile plant on the Knoxville farm. Because of the central location of this farm, comprising 346 acres of land, about thirty miles from Des Moines, it is an ideal location for an institution. The state has a brick and tile plant on this farm which has been doing well and where many inmates may be employed.

The buildings are in good condition, some of them are fireproof and have been used but a few years.

APPROPRIATIONS TO COMPLETE NECESSARY BUILDINGS.

The thirty-seventh general assembly appropriated \$8,000.00 for a laundry building and equipment at the Training School for Girls, \$5,000.00 for finishing the pathological building at the Women's Reformatory, \$800.00 for a hog house at the Women's Reformatory, \$6,000.00 for sewage disposal plant and sewer at the Women's Reformatory, and \$1,000.00 for a hog house at the State Hospital and Colony for Epileptics. Because of the greatly increased prices of building materials this board finds it is impossible to do such work with the amounts so appropriated. It is very necessary that the above named buildings and sewage disposal plant be completed soon and we recommend additional appropriations for such purposes as follows:

PROPOSED LEGISLATION.

Under section 2708 of our statutes, the minimum age limit is placed at ten years for commitment of boys to the Training School for Boys at Eldora, and of girls to the Training School for Girls at Mitchellville, but under the juvenile court law, boys and girls under ten years of age who are found guilty of incorrigibility and delinquency may be committed to those schools, It is the opinion of this board that the minimum age limit under the juvenile court law should be placed at ten years, and we so recommend. While it may be true that a boy under ten may be bad, we feel that the state has no right to adjudge him deliaquent at that tender age and commit him, on criminal proceedings, to a correctional institution. The same is true of girls. Local communities should feel the responsibility for this class, and the courts by exercise of their powers should solve these problems by some other method than commitment to a correctional school. The stigma of the presence of a child in such institutions will stick to him as long as he lives, notwithstanding the efforts which are made to prevent it.

We recommend that the name of the prison at Anamosa be changed from "The Reformatory" to "Men's Reformatory." This change in name is suggested because the state now has the Women's Reformatory at Rockwell City, and it is necessary to prefix "Men's" to the name of the reformatory at Anamosa to more easily and clearly designate the latter.

It is necessary to have a woman state agent to look after paroled inmates from the Women's Reformatory. At present the Board of Control is having that service performed by the state agent of the Training School for Girls. However, that agent has practically all she can properly attend to in connection with the training school. This work is certain to increase in connection with the Women's Reformatory, although at present it is not sufficient to occupy all of the time of an agent. In the law establishing the Women's Reformatory no provision was made for the employment of a state agent. The present law govern-

ing state agents and their duties is so constructed that this board is unable to employ a state agent and provide that a portion of the agent's time be given to other work at the institution. It is the desire of this board that said law be amended, making provision that, when found convenient to do so, such position of state agent can be combined with some position at the institution, for illustration: "Assistant superintendent and state agent." "stenographer and state agent," or "matron and state agent." Thus the employe would be economically utilized, giving part time service in two classes of work.
