REPORT OF BOARD OF PAROLE

This report of the work of the Board of Parole covers the biennial period ending June 30, 1918. Appended to it are compilations of statistics covering the biennial period, and also the time since the organization of the Board, together with the county reports of criminal statistics required to be made under section 293 of the Code Supplement with amendments thereto.

The last report made by this board showed that at the close of the period ending June 30, 1916, 298 men were on parole and reporting to the board. Of this number 237 have since then completed the parole period in a satisfactory manner and were discharged; 33 of the number failed to meet their obligations. by positive violations of parole conditions, and were returned to prison as parole violators; some of this number were again given opportunity on parole and earned their final honorable discharge, while others were held to the completion of the maximum sentence in their respective cases, where it was found that by bad prison conduct and personal purposes and disposition they could not be trusted on parole. Thirty of the number became absconders, some of whom have been apprehended and returned; and others, so far as we have been able to determine, are still at large, although it may be considered probable that of them a part at least may have committed crime and have been imprisoned in other jurisdictions. Four of the total number committed crimes when on parole and upon conviction were returned to prison under a new sentence. Three of the number died, and the sentence of one was commuted by the governor and he was discharged upon expiration. The result with this class, who may be termed hold-overs from the last biennial period, has been less then twenty per cent of failures, making no allowance for such as upon return to prison were subsequently paroled and made good.

During the biennial period covered by the present report a total of 831 have been paroled from the reformatory and the penitentiary, and nine were paroled after conviction and without being committed to prison. Of this total 362 were actively reporting as parolees June 30, 1918. There have been 231 finally

discharged, 151 have absconded and are not yet apprehended, eighty-one were returned to prison for parole violations, seven have died, and the sentences of two have been commuted by the governor.

Included in the totals of final discharges, returns and absconders are those who were on parole at the beginning of the period. From the very nature of our work it is impossible to report definitely as to results in the cases of all who have been paroled during the period, as nearly one-half of the whole number paroled were yet reporting and had not been discharged June 30, 1918. The determination of the percentage of success and failure during the period is in a measure approximate, although based upon definite figures, and shows that there has been a slight increase in the number of defaulters, resulting, as we believe, from causes to which we will later refer. Of the total number paroled 321 have been from the penitentiary and 510 from the reformatory. In the penitentiary are the older prisoners, many of whom have previously been convicted, and whose past lives and prison conduct offer less promise for good citizenship. In the reformatory are assembled the young men, of ages from 16 to 30, with a few of greater years, who are generally serving under a first conviction. A considerable number of them are not hardened in crime, but have needed the influences of discipline and punishment. Many of them offer real promise as to better lives, not alone by word but by changed conduct, while some seem wanting in moral fiber. To measure accurately their respective possibilities can not be done, but the results secured with the class have demonstrated, in view of the successes had, that the state can do no better service for its people than by arresting the downward course of wayward boys and young men, and turning them in the direction of right. With the older men, where they have not been of criminal disposition save for the crime which brought about conviction, there is a measure of judgment and common sense which count for much in working out the conditions of parole. Generally speaking, the proportion of men paroled from the penitentiary is much less than from the reformatory, as the former institution has so many inmates whose previous record and elements of character will not permit parole without a probable expectation of its violation. In some instances, however, men of previous convictions who have been paroled, have fully justified

our trust and have made good citizens. Speaking definitely as to the period just closed, of the men paroled from Fort Madison, seventy-five and seven-tenths per cent have passed successfully through the parole period, and have earned and received final discharge. Of those paroled from Anamosa the percentage of success is less, being sixty-eight and two-thirds per cent. In both classes there is an apparent lessening of successful results when compared with the last biennial period. Those who have absconded during the period are eighteen per cent of the total number paroled. In the previous period the number was thirteen per cent.

The tables relating to the number of prisoners paroled during the biennial period, and the number of parole violators, show a slight increase in those who have failed, either by committing new crimes, violation of the rules of the board, or by absconding. The larger number of the men who have failed to report and are classed as absconders may be in considerable degree attributed to war conditions. While it is the policy of the government not to receive into military, naval or marine service men who have previously been convicted of felony, we know that several of our parolees have either by the use of assumed names during the time when enlistment was permitted, or by a liberal construction of the law by local exemption boards, entered the service and have been engaged in the discharge of military duties. A question of no little perplexity has confronted the board in handling such cases. Under the federal law, and also from a communication addressed to our office by the Adjutant General of the United States, we have felt it our duty upon definitely learning of the entrance into the army of any of our paroled men, to inform the proper military authorities that they were under the jurisdiction of the board of parole, having been convicted of felony, leaving with them the determination of the question whether the paroled man should be dishonorably discharged from the army and returned to complete his parole. We have offered no objection to the men entering the military service, if with full knowledge of the facts the authorities desired to receive or retain them, while on the other hand, with proper respect for the federal law, we have in all instances refused permission to enlist, when so requested by the men. No man who has actually entered the service has been recalled by us. In few instances only have they been released by the military authorities. Military service alone does

not account for all of the absconders. The conditions during the biennial period, and especially since the United States entered the war, have been such as to occasion much restlessness among the younger and the unattached men, whether in free life or under the control of authorities; and cases are known to us where paroled men have entered government employ in ship yards and other works of national preparation. When such has come to our attention we may perhaps have been remiss in our duty by being blind to the facts constituting a violation of parole, by looking beyond local requirements to the national urgency.

These facts present a question which in our judgment should have legislative attention. Upon the return of such of the soldier body as may be parole violators, a strict construction of the law would not then entitle them to final discharge; but on the contrary they would be liable to be returned to prison to complete their unexpired terms. This, we believe, would be wanting in just appreciation of what public service they may have rendered. A proper recognition of the facts should, by appropriate legislation, authorize the board of parole to recommend to the governor in such instances that the services of the parolee in any branch of military service, followed by an honorable discharge, or in any constructive war work for the government, should merit the final discharge of the man and his restoration to citizenship.

One fact which does not appear in our statistical report, but which is clearly shown by our office records, is that the majority of the cases of parole violations and absconding occur during the earlier months of parole life. This fact is based upon many conditions. The paroled man, although apparently showing the purpose to do his best for himself with the aid which the board of parole endeavors to give to all its men, may have the secret purpose to enjoy his liberty in his own way, casting aside moral restrictions and duties, hoping to avoid discovery of his wrong; in the case of the absconder, that he at all times had the purpose to leave Iowa and the memories of his life there behind him as soon as opportunity might offer; and as to others, the feeling that life on the outside presents difficulties which can only be overcome by themselves, which they believe themselves unable to meet, and surrender to what seems to be the easier way. These are among the many problems which the board of

parole must meet in its work. All care and effort are exercised to give encouragement to the men, not only during that particularly restless time, but as well during the whole parole period; but no system has been devised whereby the varied purposes of the men can at all times be certainly gauged.

By Chapter 184 of the Acts of the Thirty-fourth General Assembly authority was granted to judges of the district court to suspend sentence and parole before commitment persons over the age of sixteen and under the age of twenty-five years, who have been convicted of felony, excepting certain designated crimes, provided such conviction is the first conviction of the defendant for a felony. The Thirty-seventh General Assembly amended such act by removing the age limit, making it now possible for the court, when the facts in the case fully justify such action to suspend sentence in all cases excepting in conviction for treason, murder, rape, robbery and arson. Under this law judges of the district court have in many cases after conviction but before commitment, paroled the convicted man to this board for supervision; and because of the means at our disposal for finding employment and giving personal supervision to the man during the parole period, such treatment of the cases by the court and by the board of parole has been justified by the results, the percentage of success being about the same as among our parolees generally. We believe that where the trial court determines to give the offender another opportunity, were the plan of placing the men under the supervision of the board of parole more generally followed by the courts, especially as to boys and younger men, a larger measure of permanent good would follow; for it is our experience that in many instances the salvation of the young offender depends upon removing him from the community of his local associations to some place where under different surroundings he may more easily be kept from error and crime.

In some cases acting upon the recommendations of the trial judge and county attorney, under Code Supplement Section 5718-a18, this board has granted paroles before commitment. Where such has been done the paroled man has been subject to the same rules as are paroled men generally, as to supervision, employment, conduct, and length of service on parole. In the cases during the biennial period where this board granted paroles before commitment, there have been no failures.

The number of paroles granted during the biennial period is about equal to the admissions to the two penal institutions in the same time. From this it may not be inferred that all prisoners are paroled within two years after their commitment. On the contrary, as shown by the table of average time served, which accompanies this report and which also shows the shortest and longest term for particular crimes, it appears that the length of service required has not varied materially from that shown by previous reports; indeed, in many instances the average time served has been greater than was the case when the courts passed definite sentences. The law requires that a released prisoner must serve at least twelve months on parole. Instances are few in which a prisoner having yet less than one year of his maximum sentence to serve is willing to go out on parole and be under supervision and control for at least one year. The law granting additional good time to honor men was passed by the Thirty-sixth General Assembly. The administration of that law is not with the board of parole, but is entirely by penitentiary and reformatory authorities. Its application to practically all prisoners who had theretofore been known as trusties, and those who make clear prison records, served to materially reduce the time of a large number; and because of such reduction made necessary the granting of a larger number of paroles during that period, if prisoners entitled to parole should have the opportunities intended to be theirs, and were to be kept on parole for at least one year. Under such application of that law there have been, and no doubt will be, many cases where paroles must be granted earlier than we would otherwise do, if the prisoner by his life and conduct is considered a parolable man.

The law creating the board of parole and providing for the indeterminate sentence was enacted by the Thirty-second General Assembly. Section nine of the act which is now Section 5718-a13 of the Code Supplement, provides that as to all offenses committed subsequent to July 4, 1907, with the exceptions of treason and murder, "The court imposing a sentence shall not fix the limit or duration of the same, but the time of such imprisonment shall not exceed the maximum term provided by law for the crime of which the prisoner was convicted." It would seem to have been the intent of the legislature that there should be no minimum term fixed, and that the maximum

mum fixed by statute should be taken as the limit beyond which imprisonment for the particular crime could not go. The enactment of the indeterminate sentence law was not accompanied by a revision of the criminal statutes so far as they might be in conflict with the purpose of the new law. By far the larger part of the statutes defining and punishing crimes had immediate and satisfactory adjustment to the new method of treating crimes and criminals, as they fixed only maximum terms of sentence, and allowed to the trial judge such discretion as might seem right in fixing the definite term. That power was taken from the district court by the indeterminate sentence law, and the time of service of men convicted of felony has since then been determined by the board of parole, and, in the main, with satisfactory results. There are, however, a number of statutes which fix a minimum as well as a maximum term of service. Some of them, considering the gravity of the crime yet declare a rule as to punishment which public policy would in the majority of instances hold to be right; others are a direct interference with carrying out the policy of the law, where the measure of punishment by imprisonment would be determined by this board, not alone by the crime but by other considerations. The minimum sentence which certain statutes yet require, unless it should be held that they were repealed by implication, are at times an embarrassment to the board in cases which seem worthy of more liberal treatment; and we believe that statutes which present conflict in the matter of sentence should have legislative consideration with a view to a revision in harmony with the indeterminate sentence law.

During the biennial period the governor has submitted to the board of parole for advice and recommendation under the provisions of Chapter 192, Thirty-second General Assembly, applications for pardon or commutation of persons sentenced to life imprisonment. The cases referred to us have embraced not only convictions of murder in the first degree, but other cases which under the statutes required life sentences. We have, after full investigation, made recommendations which have been approved by the governor in twenty-three life cases. Of these, ten were for murder in the first degree, in one of which we recommended pardon; against clemency in three, and for commutation of sentence in six. These latter cases were all of prisoners who had served long terms, one of them about twenty years, who was

suffering with a malignant disease which foretold his early end. He died among friends within a few weeks after his release. The others received commutations with the view of eventually placing them on parole.

The remaining life cases where recommendations were made, were under conviction for rape, where the law as construed by the courts had required life sentence upon conviction. The cases of this class in which recommendations for commutation of sentence were made have all been in instances where but for the statute a lower sentence would undoubtedly have been imposed, as they lacked the elements of force, being for what is commonly known as statutory rape.

The Thirty-sixth General Assembly made provision for establishing the Iowa Industrial Reformatory for Females, in which should be held, among others, all whose conviction under previous law would require their commitment to the female department at the Anamosa reformatory. The institution thus contemplated was located at Rockwell City, and in May, 1918. all women prisoners at Anamosa were transferred to the new reformatory. This law also transferred the duty of parole and supervision of the inmates to the board of control. Since the transfer of inmates in May last, the board of parole has had no official relation to the females of that institution, but has continued the supervision of such as were on parole at the time of the transfer.

The law creating the board of parole provided that the members should be compensated on a per diem basis. In the early days of its work the number of cases coming before it was limited, as all prisoners were then under definite sentences. Later, as the indeterminate sentence law was applied by the courts all excepting life prisoners came under the immediate jurisdiction of the board, resulting in a large increase in the requirement as to official service. The work at present should have continuous attention and supervision. It properly requires it, and in large degree receives it.

With the exception of the board of education, no other administrative office in the state is compensated as a per diem, We recommend to your consideration and through you to the General Assembly, that the members of the board of parole be compensated by an adequate salary.

The subject treated by this report is interesting to all who have given it study, and is of great importance not only to the individuals directly concerned, but to the people of the state. The treatment of crime and criminals is a problem which will always be with us; but the experiences had and the results obtained by the board of parole, and also by like organizations in more than two-thirds of the states in the Union, have demonstrated that from the driftwood of life much can be conserved and made useful by the employment of persistent, intelligent effort.
