### PARDONS

FRANCIS BERGMAN, Jasper County. Sentenced at the February term, 1918, to serve a term of sixty days in the county jail for the crime of maintaining a nuisance. Pardon was granted upon the recommendation of the trial judge and county attorney, and was issued on the 28th day of January, 1919.

GUS WERNIMONT, Dubuque County. Sentenced at the May term, 1919, to serve a term of six months in the county jail for the crime of taking and operating an automobile without the consent of the owner. Pardon was granted upon the recommendation of the trial judge and county attorney, and was issued on the 4th day of November, 1919.

FRANK McINERNEY, Dubuque County. Sentenced at the May term, 1919, to serve a term of six months in the county jail for the crime of taking and operating an automobile without the consent of the owner. Pardon was granted upon the recommendation of the trial judge and county attorney, and was issued on the 15th day of December, 1919.

LEONARD HIGGS, Black Hawk County. Sentenced at the September term, 1919, to serve a term of one year in the county jail for the crime

of malicious mischief. Pardon was granted upon the recommendation of the trial judge and county attorney, and was issued on the 28th day of May, 1920.

E. J. HOAGLAND, Boone County. Sentenced at the September term, 1920, to serve a term of three months in the county jail for the crime of contempt of court. Pardon was granted upon the recommendation of the county attorney, certain city officials and a number of representative citizens of Boone, Iowa, and was issued on the 31st day of December, 1920.

## COMMUTATIONS

CORNELIUS JENNINGS, Winneshiek County. Committed to the penitentiary at Fort Madison on the 7th day of March, 1908, to serve a term of life for the crime of rape. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, sentence was commuted to twenty-five years in said penitentiary. Commutation was executed on the 15th day of February, 1919.

FRANK D'ANGELO, Appanoose County. Committed to the penitentiary at Fort Madison on the 3d day of December, 1916, to serve a term of life for the crime of murder second degree. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, sentence was commuted to eight years in said penitentiary. Commutation was executed on the 5th day of June, 1919.

J. G. SPRINGSTEIN, Dickinson County. Committed to the penitentiary at Fort Madison on the 24th day of March, 1913, to serve a term of life for the crime of rape. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, sentence was commuted to thirty years in said penitentiary. Commutation was executed on the 10th day of December, 1919.

H. A. ROSS, Adair County. Committed to the reformatory at Anamosa on the 15th day of September, 1918, to serve a term of life for the crime of rape. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, sentence was commuted to five years in said reformatory. Commutation was executed on the 10th day of December, 1919.

HARVEY SOUTHERN, Polk County. Committed to the reformatory at Anamosa on the 28th day of February, 1913, to serve a term of life for the crime of burglary armed with a deadly weapon. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole sentence was commuted to thirty years in said reformatory. Commutation was executed on the 10th day of December, 1919.

WILBUR CARR, Webster County. Committed to the penitentiary at Fort Madison on the 28th day of November, 1908, to serve a term of life for the crime of murder in second degree. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole sentence was commuted to forty years in said penitentiary. Commutation was executed on the 18th day of March, 1920.

PETER SYLVIA, Wright County. Committed to the penitentiary at Fort Madison on the 11th day of April, 1918, to serve a term of life for the crime of rape. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole sentence was commuted to ten years in said penitentiary. Commutation was executed on the 18th day of March, 1920.

JAMES WATKINS, Polk County. Committed to the penitentiary at Fort Madison on the 27th day of October, 1909, to serve a term of life for the crime of murder in the first degree. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole sentence was commuted to thirty years in said penitentiary. Commutation was executed on the 17th day of May, 1920.

PITRO KURDIKA alias PITRO CHURDICK, Linn County. Committed to the penitentiary at Fort Madison on the 23d day of December, 1916, to serve a term of life for the crime of rape. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole sentence was commuted to twenty years in said penitentiary. Commutation was executed on the 26th day of May, 1920.

NEWTON H. GERHARDT, Scott County. Committed to the reformatory at Anamosa on the 7th day of May, 1909, to serve a term of fifteen years for the crime of larceny from the person. After violation of parole was returned to Fort Madison, and under technical transfer continued to serve under original sentence. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole sentence was commuted to a term of four years, ten months and fifteen days in said penitentiary. Commutation was executed on the 13th day of June, 1920.

TONY MANGONA, Pottawattamie County. Committed to the reformatory at Anamosa on the 10th day of October, 1919, to serve a term of two years for the crime of carrying concealed weapons. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, sentence was commuted to ten months solid time in said reformatory. Commutation was executed on the 12th day of July, 1920.

THOMAS MORAN, Monona County. Committed to the penitentiary at Anamosa on the 29th day of September, 1905, to serve a term of five years for the crime of larceny and later transferred to the penitentiary at Fort Madison. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, sentence was commuted to a term of three years and nine months in said penitentiary. Commutation was executed on the 25th day of August, 1920.

GEORGE McDONALD, Webster County. Committed to the penitentiary at Fort Madison on the 8th day of October, 1915, to serve a term of life for the crime of murder in the first degree. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, sentence was commuted to a term of thirty years in said penitentiary. Commutation was executed on the 14th day of September, 1920.

HOWARD SHERMAN, Hardin County. Committed to the penitentiary at Fort Madison on the 1st day of October, 1913, to serve a term of life for the crime of murder in the first degree. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, sentence was commuted to a term of twenty-five years in said penitentiary. Commutation was executed on the 14th day of September, 1920.



## SUSPENSIONS

ED L. O'DONNELL, Polk County. Convicted at the November term, 1916, of the offense of grand larceny, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed five years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Ed L. O'Donnell was to go to Phoenix, Arizona, for the purpose of improvement of health, there to find such employment as his physical condition would permit, he being tubercular. Suspension was issued on the 18th day of January, 1919.

HORACE EDWARD EASTMAN, Clinton County. Convicted at the June term, 1916, of the offense of breaking and entering, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Horace Edward Eastman was to return to the state of his residence, Illinois, and was to go to the home of his sister, Mrs. Louis Jetter at Dixon, Illinois, there to enter such factory employment as relatives might be able to secure for him. Suspension was issued on the 3d day of March, 1919.

G. W. DANKENBRING, Fayette County. Convicted at the December term, 1917, of the offense of uttering a forged instrument, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed fifteen years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said G. W. Dankenbring was to go to St. Paul, Minn., there to enter into the employ of Noyes Bros. & Cutler. Suspension was issued on the 25th day of April, 1919.

HENRY G. BINNING, Clay County. Convicted in vacation, 1916, of the offense of rape and sentenced to serve a term of life in the penitentiary at Fort Madison, which sentence was, on the 2d day of December, 1918, commuted to a term of ten years. Suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Henry G. Binning was to be delivered to the United States Department of Labor, Immigration Service, for the purpose of deportation. Suspension was issued on the 8th day of May, 1919.

HARRY WILLIAMSON, Pottawattamie County. Convicted at the November term, 1915, of the offense of robbery and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Harry Williamson was to be delivered to the United States Department of Labor, Immigration Service, for the purpose of deportation. Suspension was issued on the 8th day of May, 1919.

GEORGE MIKESELL, Pottawattamie County. Convicted at the April term, 1917, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed five years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said George Mikesell was to be delivered to the United

States Government for the purpose of returning him to the United States Disciplinary Barracks at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, from which he escaped. Suspension was issued on the 8th day of May, 1919.

GEORGE CLARK, Harrison County. Convicted at the November term, 1912, of the offense of breaking and entering, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said George Clark (correct name Warren Van Dyke) was to go to Harlowtown, Montana, to the home of his father, it being the intention to afford an opportunity to place the son under the supervision and guidance of the father, who agreed to secure for him suitable employment. Suspension was issued on the 8th day of May, 1919.

WARREN VAN DYKE, Wapello County. Convicted at the November term, 1906, of the offense of breaking and entering, and sentenced to serve a term of ten years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Warren Van Dyke, now a prisoner at Fort Madison, which sentence was suspended, was to go to Harlowtown, Montana, to the home of his father, it being the intention to place the son under the supervision and guidance of his father. Suspension was issued on the 8th day of May, 1919.

A. E. WOODFORD, Appanoose County. Convicted at the January term, 1915, of the offense of uttering a forged instrument, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed fifteen years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said A. E. Woodford was to go to Milwaukee, Wisconsin, there to enter such employment as might be secured for him by Mr. W. H. Lact. Suspension was issued on the 8th day of May, 1919.

ART RUSSELL, Des Moines County. Convicted at the April term, 1910, of the offense of burglary, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed twenty years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Art Russell was permitted to go to Los Angeles, California, there to enter the employment of the Cudahy Packing Company. Suspension was issued on the 8th day of July, 1919.

HARRY PARMLEY, Mahaska County. Convicted at the January term, 1914, of the offense of forgery and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Harry Parmley was permitted to go to the home of relatives in Los Angeles, California. Suspension was issued on the 10th day of July, 1919.

JAMES FLYNN, Linn County. Convicted at the April term, 1917, of the offense of breaking and entering, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years in the reformatory. This suspension

was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said James Flynn, true name James Wallace, was permitted to return to his home in Chicago, Illinois. Suspension was issued on the 11th day of July, 1919.

JOHN RYAN, Linn County. Convicted at the April term, 1917, of the offense of breaking and entering, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said John Ryan, true name, Monte O'Rell, was permitted to return to his home in Chicago, Illinois. Suspension was issued on the 11th day of July, 1919.

JOSEPH THOMAS, Pottawattamie County. Convicted at the June term, 1918, of the offense of larceny from a building in the night time, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Joseph Thomas was permitted to go to the home of his parents in Kansas City, Kansas. This suspension was issued on the 11th day of July, 1919.

WILLIAM MEDDIS, Linn County. Convicted at the November term, 1917, of the offense of receiving stolen property, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed five years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said William Meddis, true name Lester Worrell, was to be delivered to the House of Correction at Detroit, Michigan, he being a parole violator. Suspension was issued on the 18th day of July, 1919.

BOB BROWN, Buchanan County. Convicted at the June term, 1917, of the offense of breaking and entering, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Bob Brown was to be delivered to the authorized agent of the State of Illinois for the purpose of returning him to the Illinois State Penitentiary at Joliet, he being an escapee from that institution. Suspension was issued on the 18th day of July, 1919.

WILLIAM COONS, Carroll County. Convicted at the October term, 1916, of the offense of robbery, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said William Coons was to be delivered to the Indiana State Prison at Michigan City, he being a parole violator from that institution. Suspension was issued on the 18th day of July, 1919.

JOHN SWICH, Mitchell County. Convicted at the October term, 1916, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed five years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the

said John Swich, who was afflicted with tuberculosis and not able to do full work under his parole, was to go to California to secure work fitted to his condition and at the same time receive the benefit of that climate. Suspension was issued on the 15th day of August, 1919.

LOUIS MASON, Scott County. Convicted at the March term, 1918, of the offense of sodomy, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Louis Mason was permitted to serve the period of his parole outside of the state in order to secure employment in the line of work for which he is fitted. Suspension was issued on the 28th day of August, 1919.

HARRY COOPER, Marion County. Convicted at the February term, 1915, of the offense of murder second degree, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed sixteen years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Harry Cooper was permitted to serve the period of his parole outside of the state and under the supervision of Rev. Sol. C. Dickey of Winona Lake, Indiana. Suspension was issued on the 28th day of August, 1919.

BENKEMEL DAVILE, Scott County. Convicted at the August term, 1918, of the offense of larceny in a building in the daytime, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed five years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Benkemel Davile was to be delivered to the United States Department of Labor, Immigration Service, for the purpose of deportation to the Republic of Mexico. Suspension was issued on the 10th day of September, 1919.

JOHN McL. SCHOLL, Palo Alto County. Convicted at the November term, 1918, of the offense of forgery, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said John McL. Scholl was to go to the home of his father, John J. Scholl, at Martinsville, Indiana, under whose supervision and direction he was to engage in employment suitable to his condition of health, he being at the time tubercular. Suspension was issued on the 10th day of September, 1919.

JAMES D. MAJOR, Linn County. Convicted at the September term, 1917, of the offense of larceny (two commitments), and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed five years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said James D. Major was to go to the home of his mother at Fort Worth, Texas, there to enter employment arranged by the Board of Parole. Suspension was issued on the 3d day of November, 1919.

CHARLES FRIDIE, Scott County. Convicted at the August term, 1918, of the offense of manslaughter and sentenced to serve an indeterminate



term of not to exceed eight years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Charles Fridge was permitted to return to his home in the State of Wisconsin. Suspension was issued on the 3d day of November, 1919.

BOHUMEL STECK, Linn County. Convicted at the September term, 1917, of the offense of larceny and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term of not to exceed five years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Bohumel Steck was to be delivered to the United States Department of Labor, Immigration Service, for the purpose of deportation to Austria, his native country. Suspension was issued on the 22d day of December, 1919.

ALFREDO MARTINEZ, Lee County. Convicted at the November term, 1915, of the offense of manslaughter, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term of not to exceed eight years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Alfredo Martinez was to be delivered to the United States Department of Labor, Immigration Service, for the purpose of deportation to the Republic of Mexico. Suspension was issued on the 22d day of December, 1919.

WILLIAM CALL, Iowa County. Convicted at the December term, 1918, of the offense of conspiracy to commit larceny, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term of not to exceed three years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said William Call was permitted to enter into such employment outside of the state of Iowa as the Board of Parole may direct. Suspension was issued on the 2d day of January, 1920.

FRANK D'ANGELO, Appanoose County. Convicted at the October term, 1916, of the offense of murder second degree and sentenced to serve a term of life in the penitentiary, which sentence was on the 5th day of June, 1919, commuted to a term of eight years. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Frank D'Angelo was permitted to enter such employment outside of the state of Iowa as the Board of Parole may direct, the intention being that his employment shall enable him to return to the home of his father in Detroit, Michigan. Suspension was issued on the 3d day of January, 1920.

EVERETT VAUGHN, Page County. Convicted at the March term, 1913, of the offense of assault to inflict great bodily injury, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed five years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Everett Vaughn was to so conduct himself as to justify the conclusion that the public welfare would not be endangered. Suspension was issued on the 8th day of January, 1920.

ROY G. GATES, Woodbury County. Convicted at the September term, 1915, of the offense of murder second degree and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term of not to exceed ten years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Roy G. Gates was permitted to go outside of the state of Iowa in an effort to restore his health, his physical condition rendering him incapable of the service required under parole employment. Suspension was issued on the 20th day of January, 1920.

W. H. DAVIS, Wayne County. Convicted at the August term, 1918, of the offense of lewd and lascivious acts with a child, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed three years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said W. H. Davis was permitted to go to Morrison, Illinois, to make his home. Suspension was issued on the 25th day of February, 1920.

WILLIAM HUNT, Mills County. Convicted at the April term, 1918, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term of not to exceed five years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said William Hunt was to go to his brother, Joseph Hunt, at North Platte, Nebraska, who agreed to care for him, he being unable to enter any form of labor. Suspension was issued on the 26th day of February, 1920.

RICHARD PRAY, Ringgold County. Convicted at the May term, 1918, of the offense of resorting to a house of ill fame for the purpose of lewdness, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term of not to exceed five years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Richard Pray was permitted to locate outside of the State of Iowa in such employment as he might be able to find. Suspension was issued on the 9th day of March, 1920.

CORNELIUS JENNINGS, Winneshiek County. Convicted at the February term, 1908, of rape and sentenced to serve a term of life in the penitentiary, which sentence was commuted to a term of twenty-five years on February 15, 1919. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Cornelius Jennings was permitted to go to his son, Irvan A. Jennings, at Canistota, South Dakota. Suspension was issued on the 30th day of March, 1920.

BASIL JAMES, Black Hawk County. Convicted at the May term, 1917, of the offense of breaking and entering, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Basil James was permitted to go outside of the state of Iowa to secure employment. Suspension was issued on the 30th day of April, 1920.

ROLAND BARBEE, Pottawattamie County. Convicted at the May term, 1917, of the offense of assault with intent to commit murder, and sentenced to serve a term not to exceed thirty years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Roland Barbee was permitted to go to the home of his parents at Grand Island, Nebraska, there to receive medical care and treatment, he being disqualified from active service. Suspension was issued on the 3d day of May, 1920.

LOUIS ROTH, Woodbury County. Convicted at the March term, 1920, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed five years in the penitentiary, and under which sentence he was paroled before commitment by the Board of Parole. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Louis Roth was permitted to secure employment outside of the state during the period of his parole. Suspension was granted on the 24th day of May, 1920.

E. H. GEORGE, Union County and Dubuque County. Convicted at the April term, 1912, and October term, 1918, of the offenses of uttering a forged instrument and forgery, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term of fifteen and ten years in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said E. H. George was to go to the home of his brother in the State of Washington. Suspension was issued on the 24th day of May, 1920.

J. D. ANDERSON, Pottawattamie County. Convicted at the April term, 1917, of the offense of larceny from the person and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term not to exceed fifteen years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole and is for the purpose of delivering the said J. D. Anderson to the Warden of the State Penitentiary at Canon City, Colorado. Suspension was issued on the 25th day of May, 1920.

C. E. Westbrooke, Adair County. Convicted at the September term, 1917, of the offense of manslaughter, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term of not to exceed eight years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole and was for the purpose of permitting C. E. Westbrooke to go to the home of his relatives at DuQuoin, Illinois, there to remain until his physical condition has warranted his return to employment with the Rock Island Railroad. Suspension was issued on the 5th day of June, 1920.

PITRO KURDIKA alias PITRO CHURDICK, Linn County. Convicted at the December term, 1916, of the offense of rape and sentenced to serve a term of life in the penitentiary, which sentence was on the 28th day of May, 1920, commuted to a term of twenty years. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Pitro Kurdika alias Pitro Churdick was to be delivered to the United States Department of Labor, Immigration Service, for the purpose

of deportation to his native country. Suspension was issued on the 5th day of June, 1920.

Convicted at the October term, 1918, of the offense of burglary with aggravation, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term of not to exceed twenty years in the penitentiary and transferred to the reformatory at Anamosa on the 31st day of May, 1919. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Emilio Basso was to be delivered to the United States Department of Labor, Immigration Service, for the purpose of deportation to his native country. Suspension was issued on the 5th day of June, 1920.

PERCY J. CRAN, Howard County. Convicted at the August term, 1919, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to serve an indeterminate term of not to exceed five years in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Percy J.
