MINE INSPECTION IN IOWA

The coal producing counties of Iowa are divided into three inspection districts with an inspector living in each district. The duties of the inspectors are to inspect the different mines of the state, and to see that mining operations are conducted in conformity with the mining laws of the state, as regards safety to the employes therein, proper ventilation, etc.

A general office for the inspectors is maintained in the state house, Des Moines, wherein is kept a complete record of all matters pertaining to the coal industry of the state, including maps of all abandoned mines. A secretary elected by the inspectors has charge of all the books and general correspondence of the office, as the duties of the inspectors keep them almost constantly in the inspection field.

The mine inspectors are appointed by the governor for a term of four years. The terms of the present inspectors expire July 1, 1923.

The Board of Examiners for mine inspectors, mine foremen and hoisting engineers is composed of five members: Two coal operators, two miners, and one engineer. An examination for state inspectors is held the first Monday in March of even numbered years in the office of the state mine inspectors in the state house. Examinations for mine foremen and hoisting engineers are held at various times during the year in sections of the state where coal mining is done. A fee of two dollars for registration to take the examination is required. To those passing the examination as mine foremen or hoisting engineers, and additional two dollars is required when certificate is issued by the board. The law requires that each certificate issued by the board shall be recorded in the office of the examining board and shall show the name, age, residence and years of experience of the person to whom it was issued.

The Board of Examiners are appointed by the State Executive Council for a period of two years. Terms of the present officers expire January 25, 1924. Compensation of members of the board \$5.00 per day and necessary expenses.

REPORT OF IOWA MINE INSPECTORS

This report covers the biennial period from January 1, 1920, to December 31, 1921. During the year 1920, there were 234 mines in operation in the state, and they gave employment on an average to 12,787 persons, and produced 7,899,365 tons of coal.

In the early part of 1920, the outlook for a prosperous year, and a record breaking production was exceptionally good, for the effects of the general coal strike from October 31, 1919, to December 13, 1919, in the union mines of the competitive states of Illinois, Pennsylvania, Ohio, and Indiana, and of several other states, including Iowa, had practically depleted all the stock of bituminous coal that was stored prior to the strike; hence the demand for coal was brisk during the first part of the year, and all the mines of the state were operating full time. But contrary to the general expectation of most mining men, the brisk demand experienced in the early part of the year continued only for a short period. The demand for coal in the spring, summer, and fall was not heavy, and the mines operated on an average, less than full time. For this reason the total production for the year, notwithstanding the brisk demand that prevailed in the first part of it, reached only about normal.

The year 1921 had not the same prosperous outlook, nor the auspicious beginning as that of 1920. The industrial depression that commenced in 1920 had become more general, effecting not only the mining industry but practically every other industry in the country. And although there were 43 more mines in operation, and 368 more persons employed in and around the mines of the state in 1921, than in 1920, nevertheless the total production of coal in 1921 was 5,173,-490 tons, or 2,725,875 tons less than the total production in 1920.

The year 1921, as well as 1920, was free from shortage of railroad cars, and labor troubles, and the decrease of production therefore, was due entirely to the lack of market, and to the general business depression that prevailed in our state and the country over, throughout the year.

Practically all the production of the mines of our state was sold to railroad companies, and to consumers within our state. What

little coal was shipped to points outside the state was mostly slack or steam coal.

It is estimated that the total production of bituminous coal in the United States, in 1921, was 27 per cent less than the total production in 1920. We regret to report that the total production of coal in Iowa, was 35 per cent less in 1921, than in 1920. It is obvious that Iowa's loss was a factor of gain to other states, and in this case the chief gainer is not hard to find, for the total production of coal in 1921 in one of our bordering states, who's coal is Iowa's principal competitor, was 75.5 per cent of that of 1920, or, a decrease of only 24.5 per cent. This was 10.5 per cent less decrease than Iowa suffered, and 2.5 per cent less than the bituminous mining states of the United States sustained in 1921. We are inclined to believe that this great loss of production in our state in 1921 was in a large measure the result of the injurious effect made years ago, when Iowa coal was not prepared as well as it is today. Because of its lack of preparation in those days, it was easily supplanted by coal from other states, from markets that logically belonged to it, and these markets have been in possession of its competitor, more or less, ever since. The industrial depression that prevailed throughout the year 1921, created no new condition in the mining industry of Iowa, but only revealed in a plain manner the extent of the loss that the mines of our state have sustained for many years. The reputation that Iowa coal made years ago, when no proper effort was made to prepare it for market, was not a creditable one, and coal salesmen from other states were quick to take advantage of it, and to capitalize it to their own advantage, and the poor preparation it received in those days, has been their principal selling talk ever since. We are pleased to report the universal attention that is now given to the preparation of our coal for the market. The new shipping mines opened in our state during this biennial period, are as modern in their equipment to prepare their product for market, as can be found anywhere. We confidently predict that other new mines, when opened, will be equipped equally as well, and that the coal product from the mines of Iowa will constantly grow in favor once the consumer will know that the same is being properly prepared, for it is no exaggeration to say that a large per cent of the coal shipped into our state, although sold to the consumer at a much higher price than Iowa coal, is inferior in every respect to our own Iowa product.
