## REPORT OF PARDONS

#### PARDONS

R. M. SHOEMAN, Dallas County. (Conditional Pardon). Sentenced at the September term, 1922, to serve a term of two years in the Penitentiary at Fort Madison, for the crime of larceny of domestic poultry. Pardon was recommended by the Board of Parole and was issued on the 11th day of January, 1923.

CLIFFORD SOLON, Fremont County. Sentenced at the March term, 1921, to serve a term of ten years in the reformatory at Anamosa, for the crime of larceny from building in night time. Pardon was recommended by the Board of Parole and a large number of citizens, and was issued on the 7th day of May, 1923.

M. L. BRADY, Lyon County. Sentenced at the November term, 1920, to serve a term of three months in the county jail, for the crime of selling stock of foreign corporation after license was revoked. Pardon was recommended by the trial judge, the county attorney and a number of representative citizens of Lyon County, and was issued on the 12th day of June, 1923.

JOHN CONRAD, Hardin County. Sentenced at the September term, 1923, to serve a term of one year in the county jail, for the crime of bootlegging. Pardon was recommended by the trial judge, the county attorney and the sheriff of Hardin County, and was issued on the 20th day of June, 1924.

WALTER NORTON, Dubuque County. Sentenced at the September term, 1923, to serve a term of ten years in the reformatory at Anamosa, for the crime of larceny in night time. Pardon was recommended by the trial judge, the county attorney, and a number of representative citizens of Dubuque County, and was issued on the 24th day of June, 1924.

J. H. LEHN, Allamakee County. Sentenced at the September term, 1923, to serve a term of life for the crime of rape. Pardon was recommended by the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and was issued on the 8th day of July, 1924.

EDWARD WIGNALL, Marshall County. Sentenced at the March term, 1923, to serve a term of five years in the reformatory at Anamosa, for the crime of larceny. Pardon was recommended by the Board of Parole, and was issued on the 8th day of July, 1924.

JONNIE ROGERS, Linn County. Sentenced at the November term, 1924, to serve a term of one year in the county jail, for the crime of forgery. Pardon was recommended by the trial judge and the county attorney, and was issued on the 5th day of December, 1924.

ED NAESTETTER, Woodbury County. Sentenced at the December term, 1917, to serve a term of twenty years in the penitentiary, for the crime of murder in the second degree. Pardon was recommended by the Board of Parole, and was issued on the 16th day of December, 1924.

### COMMUTATIONS

R. M. SHOEMAN, Dallas County. Convicted at the September term, 1922, and sentenced to imprisonment in the penitentiary at Fort Madison for a term of two years, for the crime of larceny of domestic poultry from enclosed premises. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, sentence was commuted to sixty days in the county jail. Commutation was executed on the 11th day of January, 1923.

FRED CLIFTON, Scott County. Committed to the penitentiary at Fort Madison on the 18th day of October, 1912, to serve a term of life for the crime of murder in the first degree. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, sentence was commuted to imprisonment for a term of years to expire July 1, 1923. Commutation was executed on the 6th day of June, 1923.

EARL H. STEVENS, Polk County. Committed to the reformatory at Anamosa on the 17th day of December, 1921, to serve a term of life for the crime of rape. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, sentence was commuted to five years in said reformatory. Commutation was executed on the 6th day of November, 1923.

GEORGE W. COFFMAN, Harrison County. Sentenced to serve a term of one year in the county jail, for the crime of bootlegging. Upon the

recommendation of the county attorney, several members of the General Assembly, practically all of the bankers and a large number of representative citizens of Harrison County, the sentence, as modified and affirmed by the Supreme Court was modified and reduced to a term of ninety days in the county jail. Commutation was executed on the 31st day of May, 1924.

STUART S. HOFFMAN, Harrison County. Committed to the reformatory at Anamosa on the 3rd day of September, 1913, to serve a term of ten years for the crime of breaking and entering. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole and the Board of Control, sentence was commuted to a term of years to expire on June 13, 1924. Commutation was executed on the 12th day of June, 1924.

HENRY SMITH, Grundy County. Committed to the reformatory at Anamosa on the 16th day of July, 1923, to serve a term of life for the crime of rape. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, sentence was commuted to twenty years in said reformatory. Commutation was executed on the 8th day of July, 1924.

LEONARD W. HALEY, Dubuque County. Committed to the penitentiary on the 24th day of February, 1894, to serve a term of life for the crime of murder in the first degree. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, sentence was commuted to seventy years in said penitentiary. Commutation was executed on the 3rd day of December, 1924.

HUGH ROBBARD, Dubuque County. Committed to the penitentiary on the 28th day of December, 1893, to serve a term of life for the crime of murder in the first degree. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, sentence was commuted to seventy years in said penitentiary. Commutation was executed on the 3rd day of December, 1924.

The following named persons, whose sentence had previously been suspended by executive or judicial order, were granted final discharge and restoration to citizenship. In each case, satisfactory showing was made that the applicant should be released from further liability under the sentence.

## SUSPENSIONS

VERN WEEKS, Scott County. Convicted at the December term, 1920, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to

exceed five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Vern Weeks was permitted to go to La Crosse, Wisconsin, to enter the employment of his father-in-law. Suspension was issued on the 2nd day of January, 1923.

WILLIAM FRAYNE, Worth County. Convicted at the March term, 1921, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said William Frayne was permitted to return to his home in Buffalo, New York, to enter the employment of Harries & Hall, Architects. Suspension was issued on the 6th day of January, 1923.

LAWRENCE HUDSON, Fremont County. Convicted at the March term, 1920, of the offense of robbery in the night time, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed twenty years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Lawrence Hudson was permitted to go to St. Louis, Missouri, to enter the government hospital for treatment. Suspension was issued on the 15th day of January, 1923.

WALTER RICHMOND, Linn County. Convicted at the November term, 1921, of the offense of robbery, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed twenty years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said Walter Richmond was permitted to go to the home of his parents at Chicago, Illinois. Suspension was issued on the 18th day of January, 1923.

SIDNEY SIMMONS, Linn County. Convicted at the November term, 1921, of the offense of robbery, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed twenty years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said Sidney Simmons was permitted to go to Chicago, Illinois, to receive treatment in a sanatorium at that place. Suspension was issued on the 18th day of January, 1923.

EDGAR SIPES, Woodbury County. Convicted at the May term, 1922, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge, county attorney and sheriff, and thereunder the said Edgar Sipes was permitted to go to his home in Vincennes, Indiana. Suspension was issued on the 19th day of January, 1923.

FRANK SHEETS, Polk County. Convicted at the November term, 1922, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted

upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said Frank Sheets was permitted to go to the home of his parents at Kansas City, Missouri, to receive treatment from an eye specialist. Suspension was issued on the 8th day of February, 1923.

**HAROLD FAY**, Alias Walter LaBelle, Marshall County. Convicted at the November term, 1920, of the offense of robbery, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said Harold Fay was permitted to go to his home in Minneapolis, Minnesota, to complete his education. Suspension was issued on the 13th day of February, 1923.

**SOL DUBROW**, Polk County. Convicted at the October term, 1920, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said Sol DuBrow is permitted to go to Perth Amboy, New Jersey, the home of his parents, to finish his schooling. Suspension was issued on the 27th day of March, 1923.

**EDDIE BEETLEY**, Greene County. Convicted at the September term, 1921, of the offense of breaking and entering, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said Eddie Beetley was permitted to go to the home of his parents at Galesburg, Illinois. Suspension was issued on the 2nd day of July, 1923.

**MELVIN HEARN**, Muscatine County. Convicted at the August term, 1921, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said Melvin Hearn was permitted to go to the home of his parents in Rock Island, Illinois. Suspension was issued on the 7th day of August, 1923.

**RENE ROTTE**, Muscatine County. Convicted at the August term, 1921, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said Rene Rotte was permitted to go to the home of his parents in Illinois. Suspension was issued on the 7th day of August, 1923.

**GEORGE BARNETT**, Floyd County. Convicted at the April term, 1922, of the offense of malicious threat to extort, and sentenced to an

indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said George Barnett was permitted to go to the home of his parents in Wyoming. Suspension was issued on the 7th day of August, 1923.

**JAMES ZUBER**, Clinton County. Convicted at the October term, 1922, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the Reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said James Zuber was permitted to go to Detroit, Michigan. Suspension was issued on the 1st day of September, 1923.

**VINCENT DIVONA**, Clinton County. Convicted at the October term, 1922, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Vincent Divona was permitted to go to his home in Detroit, Michigan. Suspension was issued on the 1st day of September, 1923.

**STEPHEN KRIDER**, Marshall County. Convicted at the December term, 1921, of the offense of forgery, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Stephen Krider was permitted to go to the home of his parents at Tekamah, Nebraska. Suspension was issued on the 12th day of October, 1923.

**RALPH HOOPER**, Pottawattamie County. Convicted at the September term, 1923, of the offense of receiving stolen property, and sentenced to an indeterminate term of five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said Ralph Hooper was permitted to go to Trinidad, Colorado, to resume his position as telegraph operator. Suspension was issued on the 13th day of October, 1923.

**SAMUEL MATHEWS**, Clarke County. Convicted at the May term, 1922, of the offense of receiving stolen goods, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the penitentiary. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said Samuel Mathews was permitted to go to Chicago, Illinois, to enter the employment of his brother-in-law. Suspension was issued on the 29th day of October, 1923.

**MELVILLE HIATT**, Clinton County. Convicted at the January term, 1920, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was

granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Melville Hiatt was permitted to go to the home of relatives in New Jersey, to receive medical treatment. Suspension was issued on the 26th day of October, 1923.

CLYDE BOLTON, Floyd County. Convicted at the January term, 1921, of the offense of cheating by false pretenses, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed seven years, in the reformatory. Upon appeal to the Supreme Court this judgment was sustained, but modified to one year in the county jail and a fine of \$500 and all costs. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the trial judge, the county attorney and a large number of citizens of Floyd County, conditioned upon the complete liquidation of the fine and all costs. Suspension was issued on the 29th day of October, 1923.

JAMES BOLTON, Floyd County. Convicted at the January term, 1921, of the offense of cheating by false pretenses, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed seven years, in the reformatory. Upon appeal to the Supreme Court this judgment was sustained, but modified to one year in the county jail and a fine of \$500 and all costs. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the trial judge, the county attorney and a large number of citizens of Floyd County, conditioned upon the complete liquidation of the fine and all costs. Suspension was issued on the 29th day of October, 1923.

G. B. PROPP, Polk County. Convicted at the February term, 1921, of the offense of receiving stolen property, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the penitentiary. This suspension of sentence was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said G. B. Propp was permitted to go to his home at Kansas City, Missouri. Suspension was issued on the 8th day of November, 1923.

FRANK FUQUA, Keokuk County. Convicted at the March term, 1913, of the offense of burglary, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years, in the penitentiary. This suspension of sentence was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Frank Fuqua was permitted to go to Danville, Illinois, to enter the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers. On April 8, 1924, permission was given him to go to Hampton, Virginia, for the purpose of entering the National Military Home located at that place. Suspension was issued on the 3rd day of January, 1924.

JAMES E. CRAIG, Lucas County. Convicted at the March term, 1922, of the offense of false pretenses, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed seven years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said James E. Craig was permitted to go to the Government

Hospital at Jefferson Barracks, Missouri, for treatment. Suspension was issued on the 7th day of January, 1924.

HARRY WILSON (Alias Carl Hough), Montgomery County. Convicted at the May term, 1918, of the offense of false pretenses, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the county attorney who prosecuted the case, the present county attorney, and the statement of the judge who presided that he had no objection to the same, and thereunder the said Harry Wilson was permitted to go to South Dakota with his father. Suspension was issued on the 9th day of January, 1924.

HARRY WILSON (Alias Carl Hough), Carroll County. Convicted at the December term, 1920, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said Harry Wilson was permitted to go to South Dakota with his father. Suspension was issued on the 9th day of January, 1924.

MAURICE MILLS, Mahaska County. Convicted at the November term, 1921, of the offense of breaking and entering, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said Maurice Mills was permitted to go to the home of his mother at Lake Charles, Alabama. Suspension was issued on the 12th day of January, 1924.

RUSSELL WILLIAMSON, Benton County. Convicted at the February term, 1921, of the offense of larceny, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said Russell Williamson was permitted to go to the home of his parents at Long Beach, California. Suspension was issued on the 24th day of January, 1924.

H. BURNETT COOPER, Woodbury County. Convicted at the March term, 1923, of the offense of conspiracy, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed three years, in the penitentiary. This suspension of sentence was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge, the county attorney and a number of representative citizens of Woodbury County, and thereunder the said H. Burnett Cooper was permitted to leave the State at the direction of his employer, Hon. John H. Kelly. Suspension was issued on the 21st day of January, 1924.

SAMUEL E. CALDWELL, Jones County. Convicted at the March term, 1922, of the offense of escape, and sentenced to an indeterminate

term not to exceed five years, in the reformatory. This suspension was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said Samuel E. Caldwell was permitted to go to his former home at Ashville, Ohio. Suspension was issued on the 25th day of January, 1924.

JAMES H. RICH, Story County. Convicted at the March term, 1921, of the offense of enticing a child, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed ten years, in the reformatory. This suspension of sentence was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, and thereunder the said James H. Rich was permitted to go to the home of his father at Weston, West Virginia. Suspension was issued on the 25th day of January, 1924.

LEO ANCHETA, Linn County. Convicted at the July term, 1922, of the offense of uttering a forged instrument, and sentenced to an indeterminate term not to exceed fifteen years, in the reformatory. This suspension of sentence was granted upon the recommendation of the Board of Parole, the trial judge and the county attorney, and thereunder the said Leo Ancheta was permitted to return to his home in the Philippine Islands. Suspension was issued on the 29th day of January, 1924.
