## REPORT OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL

### GENERAL STATEMENT

The personnel of the board remains the same, J. H. Strief having been reappointed for the term of six years beginning July 1, 1923.

There are fifteen institutions under the control and management of this board, and the population has very greatly increased during the period just ended.

### POPULATION OF INSTITUTIONS

The average daily population of the several institutions under the control of the board, since June 30, 1922, is shown by the following table:

## APPOINTMENTS BY THE BOARD

During the biennial period ending June 30, 1924, there were two changes in the executive heads of the institutions under the control of this board, and eleven reappointments.

The term of Mrs. Lucy M. Sickels, superintendent of the Training School for Girls, expired March 31, 1923. She had been superintendent of this institution for twelve years. Her services at all times were very satisfactory but she did not desire reappointment. Ray M. Hanchett, who had been connected with the school for a number of years as state agent, was promoted to this position and assumed her duties April 1, 1923.

Lena A. Beach, M. D., tendered her resignation as superintendent of the Women's Reformatory in December, 1922, to accept a similar position with the state of Minnesota. Eleanor Hutchinson, M. D., formerly assistant physician at the Hospital for Epileptics and School for Feeble-minded at Woodward, was appointed to succeed Dr. Beach, for the unexpired term ending April 30, 1926. Superintendent Hutchinson assumed the duties of her office on January 1, 1923.

The following executive officers were reappointed for a term of four years:

B. C. Whitehill, commandant of the Soldiers' Home, for the term ending March 31, 1928.

F. S. Treat, superintendent of the Soldiers' Orphans' Home, for the term ending March 31, 1928.

O. S. Von Krog, superintendent of the Training School for Boys, for the term ending August 31, 1927.

H. V. Scarborough, M. D., superintendent of the State Sanatorium, for the term ending January 31, 1928.

M. C. Mackin, M. D., superintendent of the Mount Pleasant State Hospital, for the term ending March 31, 1928.

Max E. Witte, M. D., superintendent of the Clarinda State Hospital, for the term ending September 30, 1926.

George Donohoe, M. D., superintendent of the Cherokee State Hospital, for the term ending February 28, 1927.

M. N. Voldeng, M. D., superintendent of the Hospital for Epileptics and School for Feeble-minded, for the term ending February 29, 1927.

T. P. Hollowell, warden of the State Penitentiary, for the term ending April 30, 1928.

C. E. Ramsey of Woodward, was appointed inspector of county homes and private institutions, to succeed Chas. N. Martin.

T. H. Stone was appointed state agent for the Training School for Boys at Eldora, to succeed S. V. Culp.

Grace B. Paddack was appointed state agent for the Training School for Girls at Mitchellville, to succeed Ray M. Hanchett.

No other appointments were made by the board during the period ending June 30, 1924.

#### STATE AGENTS

During the last biennial period the seven state agents have placed 842 children, and on June 30, 1924, their reports show 1,225 children under their supervision.

The work of the state agents to be successful requires mature judgment, high character and a heart interest in the boys and girls, and the efficiency of the state agent department is best shown by the results they have obtained, which have been excellent and highly satisfactory.

Because of financial conditions, the work of the state agents during the period has been rather difficult. In many homes where children might have been placed, they were unable to assume further financial responsibility.

During the period ending June 30, 1924, 64 women were paroled from the Women's Reformatory at Rockwell City. They are also under the supervision of a state agent until discharged.

#### INSPECTOR OF COUNTY HOMES AND PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS

All county and private institutions where insane persons are cared for, and private institutions for neglected, dependent and delinquent children, are subject to inspection semi-annually by the inspector under the board of control. The inspector reports to the board of control any irregularities that exist in connection with the sanitary conditions maintained in county homes and private institutions, and the care and treatment of the patients and children confined therein.

The changes as recommended by the inspector in his reports have in nearly every instance been complied with by the various boards of supervisors throughout the state, and we have found the county officials very willing at all times to comply with our

requests in making such changes as would better conditions for the patients and children they have under their care and supervision.

At the present time we have subject to our inspection, sixty-eight county homes and four private institutions where insane persons are kept, and thirty-four homes where friendless girls and children are cared for.

#### STATE INSTITUTIONS UNDER THE CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL OF STATE INSTITUTIONS, THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF EACH AND THE PROCEDURE WITH REFERENCE TO ADMISSIONS, PAROLES AND DISCHARGES

##### *Soldiers' Home, Marshalltown, B. C. Whitehill, Commandant.*

This home is for the care of soldiers and their wives. For admission apply directly to the commandant for application blanks. The applicant (unless he enlisted from Iowa) must have resided in the state three years continuously previous to the date of making application.

##### *Soldiers' Orphans' Home, Davenport, F. S. Treat, Superintendent.*

Children may be admitted by court commitment or by order of the board of supervisors of the county where the children have residence. This home is intended particularly for the care of soldiers' orphans, although other orphaned and destitute children are received and cared for. All children are subject to placement and those who are not returned to their homes or the homes of relatives or friends are placed as soon as suitable homes can be found for them by the state agents, where they remain under the agent's supervision until they are twenty-one years of age. All applications for admission are subject to the approval of the board of control before children can be admitted.

##### *State Juvenile Home, Toledo, A. E. Kepford, Superintendent.*

This institution is for dependent, neglected, delinquent, or destitute children, and admission is by court commitment or upon application to the board of supervisors of the county where the child resides. All applications must be approved by the board of control. Children are received between the ages of four and fifteen years and are subject to placement when suitable homes



are found for them by the state agents, under whose supervision the children remain until they are discharged or are adopted by persons with whom they have been placed.

*Institution for Feeble-minded Children, Glenwood, George Mogridge, M. D., Superintendent.*

Admission to this institution may be either voluntary, by parents, guardian, or county attorney, or by petition presented to the district or juvenile court in the county where such children reside. Releases or paroles are granted upon application to the board of control, when such releases or paroles are recommended by the superintendent in charge of the institution.

*State Sanatorium for the Treatment of Tuberculosis, Oakdale, H. V. Scarborough, M. D., Superintendent.*

Application for admission should be made to the superintendent of the sanatorium, who will furnish proper blanks. When the blanks are received the applicant should carefully fill them in, especially the blank calling for the report of the family or attending physician, and return the blanks to the superintendent. Upon receipt of the application blanks, if approved for admission, the superintendent will advise the applicant when he can be received.

*Training School for Boys, Eldora, O. S. Von Krog, Superintendent.*

*Training School for Girls, Mitchellville, Ray M. Hanchett, Superintendent.*

Commitments to the training schools are made by the juvenile or district courts. Boys and girls are received between the ages of ten and eighteen years. When they have completed their training they are placed in homes on parole, where they remain under the supervision of state agents until they are discharged or returned to the school.

*Mount Pleasant State Hospital, Mount Pleasant, M. C. Mackin, M. D., Superintendent.*

*Independence State Hospital, Independence, R. A. Stewart, M. D., Superintendent.*

*Clarinda State Hospital, Clarinda, Max E. Witte, M. D., Superintendent.*

*Cherokee State Hospital, Cherokee, George Donohoe, M. D., Superintendent.*

Commitments to hospitals for the insane are made by the commissioners of insanity in the county where the patient resides. The commission has three members. The law requires that the clerk of the district court of the county be one member, the other two members being appointed by the district judge, one of whom must be a practicing attorney and the other a physician.

Paroles are granted by the board of control upon recommendation of the superintendent of the hospital with the consent of the commissioners of insanity, and are for a period of one year, at which time if the patient has not been returned to the hospital, he is discharged or the parole is extended for a longer period.

When application is made for the discharge of a patient, the patient must return to the hospital to be examined or may be examined by the commissioners of insanity or by a reputable physician. If examined by the commissioners of insanity, or physician, a statement of their findings must be sent to the superintendent of the hospital, and upon receipt of same by the superintendent, if favorable, he makes his recommendations to the board of control, which board discharges the patient as cured or not cured, as the case may be.

*Hospital for Epileptics and School for Feeble-minded, Woodward, M. N. Voldeng, M. D., Superintendent.*

Procedure with reference to commitment and release of feeble-minded in this institution is the same as at Glenwood. All persons wishing to be admitted for treatment of epilepsy must have resided in this state at least one year preceding the date of application for admission. Admission may be either through court commitment or voluntary. If voluntary, application blanks should be obtained from the superintendent by the party who desires to make application.

Applications for paroles and discharges are granted by the board of control upon recommendation of the superintendent, and with the consent of the commissioners of insanity of the county from which such person was committed.

*State Penitentiary, Fort Madison, T. P. Hollowell, Warden.*

*Men's Reformatory, Anamosa, J. N. Baumel, Warden.*



*Women's Reformatory, Rockwell City, Eleanor Hutchinson, M. D.,  
Superintendent.*

When persons convicted of crime are sentenced by judges of the various courts, men between the ages of eighteen and thirty are usually sent to the Men's Reformatory. At this institution, there is also a building for criminal insane. Persons sentenced to death or to life imprisonment, and the older class of criminals are committed to the State Penitentiary.

All females over eighteen years of age, and married females under eighteen years of age, who are convicted in the district court of offenses punishable by imprisonment in excess of thirty days, shall, if imprisonment be imposed, be committed to the Women's Reformatory. Any unmarried female over ten and under eighteen years of age convicted of an offense punishable by life imprisonment may be committed either to the Training School for Girls or to the Women's Reformatory.

**SOLDIERS' HOME, MARSHALLTOWN**

Special appropriations totaling \$31,500.00 were made by the fortieth general assembly for the Soldiers' Home at Marshalltown. Of this amount \$30,000.00 was for contingent and repair fund, and \$1,500.00 was for lectures, moving pictures, periodicals and band expense.

From the contingent and repair fund the water softener recommended in our last report, costing \$4,510.00, was purchased for use in connection with the laundry.

The greenhouse was also repaired and put in first-class condition at a cost of \$2,905.00.

Two new elevators for the old people's building were installed at a cost of \$12,892.00. These elevators were needed in this building for the reason that many of the members of the Home are becoming so old and feeble that it is almost impossible for them to reach their rooms or apartments on the ordinary stairway.

During the past few years considerable work has been done at the Home with reference to remodeling the interior of a number of the buildings which calls for the expenditure of a considerable amount of the contingent and repair fund during each period. This repair work consists of removing all mop boards, chair rails, window and door casings and replacing with cement and plaster, which makes the quarters much more sanitary and easy to clean.

This work has all been completed in the hospital building. It has also been repainted throughout and is now in splendid condition. The work on the other buildings along this line is progressing as rapidly as possible.

The floors in many of the buildings are in bad condition and will have to be replaced. New gutters and down spouts are also needed on a number of the buildings, which will necessitate the expenditure of a considerable amount during the next period and will require quite a large appropriation for the contingent and repair fund.

When a large amount of the work mentioned above is completed, we feel that our askings for this institution can be reduced considerably during the next period and have accordingly reduced our special askings to \$15,000.00 which is less than one-half the amount appropriated for the use of the Home during the last biennial period.

We have also recommended in our asking for the per capita allowance a reduction of \$1.00 per month for each member. Figuring the population for the next period, the same as it is at the present time, this will make a reduction of approximately \$10,000.00 in the support fund.

**SOLDIERS' ORPHANS' HOME, DAVENPORT**

During the biennial period just ended, the expenditure for improvements and repairs has not been large in connection with this institution. Our special askings granted by the fortieth general assembly, totaled \$29,600.00.

In addition to the ordinary repairs to buildings and machinery metal weather stripping has been installed in the doors and windows of all buildings at a total cost of \$1,500.00. This we believe will aid considerably in reducing the amount of coal used and add greatly to the comfort of the children.

The work of rebuilding bath rooms in the children's cottages is progressing rapidly. The work in connection with this is practically all done by institution employees.

All other special appropriations made are being used as contemplated.

During the next biennial period several new buildings will be needed in connection with the farm. The laundry machinery which has been in use for a number of years, will have to be replaced. These items, with our asking for contingent and repair fund; and the usual special appropriations for dental, oculist and



aurist treatments; also for books, chaplain, amusements and transportation of children, will bring the total askings for the Home for the next biennial period, not including the regular per capita allowance, to \$35,900.00. This amount, we consider very conservative in view of the fact that the Home is caring for more than five hundred children.

#### JUVENILE HOME, TOLEDO

The State Juvenile Home has been in operation about four years and today is caring for approximately two hundred children.

Special funds amounting to \$114,000.00 have been used at this institution during the past biennial period. Among the new buildings authorized for this institution was one to house a general heating plant, including necessary machinery and coal bins. In this building is included a large room for laundry and equipment, and a storeroom for housing institution supplies, together with a cold storage plant.

The fortieth general assembly also authorized the construction of a new dormitory building.

These buildings have been completed and are now ready for occupancy. The dormitory which is a modern building in every respect, will care for one hundred and sixty additional children, which makes it possible to receive all commitments made at this time which we have had to hold up for the past five or six months on account of lack of room to receive them.

The other appropriations for this institution have been expended in part for the purposes for which they were authorized. The unexpended balances will be necessary for use in carrying on the work for which same were appropriated.

We feel that the askings of the forty-first general assembly for this institution need not be large. All that will be necessary is a small amount for the contingent and repair fund and an amount to take care of the dental, oculist and aurist work needed during the period. The total amount, in all probability, aside from the regular per capita allowance, will not exceed \$7,500.00.

#### INSTITUTION FOR FEEBLEMINDED CHILDREN, GLENWOOD

Of the appropriations made by the fortieth general assembly for the Institution for Feeble-minded Children at Glenwood, \$125,000.00 was authorized for one cottage and partial equipment, to care for one hundred and sixty inmates. This cottage is to re-

place two old buildings which have been in use practically ever since the institution was established. These buildings have been a dangerous fire hazard and had been condemned. The work on the cottage is well under way and will be completed in the near future. When this building is completed it will help greatly to eliminate the overcrowded condition existing at this institution for the past two years.

The farm boys' cottage and equipment, for which an appropriation of \$35,000.00 was made, will be constructed at once. Plans and specifications have been prepared for this building and bids have been called for. This building will care for boys who work on the institution farm, and in this way make available room for fifty more children in the other buildings.

The appropriation of \$20,000.00 for plumbing repairs and changes in the heating system has been used in part. The remainder of this work will be taken care of during the next year.

The contingent and repair fund of \$35,000.00 has been used in the repair and repainting of buildings, and other work of immediate necessity that could not otherwise have been taken care of.

We feel that this institution is in first-class shape and will not need a large amount of appropriations for the next period. We believe, however, that with the large population at this institution, more farm land is needed and should be secured. The amount of produce raised on the present acreage is practically all consumed by the institution and helps to a great extent in reducing the cost of maintenance. In addition to the land, we will need repairs to buildings necessary during the next period, a contingent and repair fund of \$40,000.00, and an appropriation of \$1,000.00 for chaplain, lectures and amusements, making the total appropriations asked for for the next biennial period, \$87,000.00, which amount is \$129,500.00 less than was asked for the past biennial period. This includes the estimated value of the land to be purchased as \$46,000.00, but does not take into consideration the regular per capita allowance.

#### STATE SANATORIUM, OAKDALE

The addition to the hospital building mentioned in our last report, for which an appropriation was authorized by the thirty-ninth general assembly, has been completed and is now in use. This building cares for approximately one hundred and sixty additional patients and is one of the most modern and best equipped buildings of its kind in the state.



A large amount of repair work has been done during the past period. The cold storage plant was remodeled, the elevator was extended to the roof of the hospital building, extensive alterations were made in the power plant, and many other repairs absolutely necessary in the operation of this institution have been made.

Our askings of the forty-first general assembly will not be large for this institution, as we feel, with the work we have done during the past biennial period, that the Sanatorium is in first class condition. Askings for special appropriations for the next period, not including the regular per capita allowance, total approximately \$66,000.00. This amount is needed for contingent and repair fund, completion of basement of the hospital addition, new dairy barn and silo in connection with the dairy herd, new coal bunker, and replacement of laundry and pumping machinery.

### EDUCATIONAL WORK

Many thousands of lives have undoubtedly been saved in the campaign against tuberculosis since 1907 when the Board of Control of State Institutions first inaugurated its educational work aimed at prevention as well as cure. The tuberculosis death rate in Iowa at that time was 76 per 100,000 population. Last year it was 43.5, a decrease of approximately 43%. The death rate in Iowa is now less than one-half of that prevailing throughout the entire United States.

No disease, except typhoid, has been so successfully combated. This result is attributed in a large measure by Dr. Louis I. Dublin, statistician of the Metropolitan Life Company of New York, to the work of public and private antituberculosis agencies, not only in providing sanatorium care, which has benefited the majority of the patients as well as protected communities from the spread of disease, but also through the prevention of tuberculosis by the dissemination of information, the education of the public, and the general improvement of health conditions through constant efforts along public health lines.

For the past four years the Board of Control of State Institutions and the Iowa Tuberculosis Association, a statewide organization supported by the sale of Christmas seals, have cooperated in a joint educational movement with gratifying results, which can be measured in lives saved, months of illness avoided and a tremendous economic gain to the state and its citizens.

During the last biennial period, tuberculosis clinics have been held in approximately one-half of the counties of the state. These

have a general educational value as well as making it possible to discover incipient cases and secure treatment in time. The clinics are preceded by special nursing service, and are financed by the local and state organizations, together with the board of control.

The Campaign, a monthly health magazine, is edited by the Iowa Tuberculosis Association and printed by the board of control at the printery and bindery at the Men's Reformatory. It has a selected circulation of about 12,000, including health workers, physicians, nurses, teachers, civic organizations, club women, members of organized labor, ministers, libraries, farm bureau members, county officials, and others who have a natural interest in public health. Special numbers dealt with sanatoria, tuberculosis, periodic medical examinations, the country doctor, health education, dental hygiene with reference to general health, and other subjects of interest to laymen. All of these topics were correlated with the general upbuilding of community health, which is a vital factor in the prevention of tuberculosis. The Associated Press, local papers and other news agencies have rewritten or reprinted regularly articles appearing in The Campaign.

In addition to The Campaign, other health literature has been issued. Fifty thousand illustrated pamphlets containing statistical facts about tuberculosis and general health information, presented in a readable fashion, have been printed each fall and distributed through the Iowa Tuberculosis Association at county fairs, school meetings and through local Christmas seal committees. One pamphlet contained a page devoted to the national health examination movement, which was sponsored in this state under the leadership of Dr. D. S. Fairchild and the field activities committee of the State Medical Society, the State Board of Health, the public health and adult health department of the state federation of women's clubs, the Iowa Tuberculosis Association and other organizations.

Moving picture films relating to both human tuberculosis and bovine tuberculosis as a cause of disease in children have been loaned to farm bureaus, county public health associations and other organizations.

Through the cooperation of the Iowa Tuberculosis Association with its staff nurses and executive secretary, and the board of control, the foregoing educational program has been carried forward. Mr. J. H. Strief of the board of control, is also a member of the board of directors of the state association.



## TRAINING SCHOOL FOR BOYS, ELDORA

The special appropriations made for the Training School for Boys, amounting to \$41,900.00, have been used as contemplated, in part. The remaining balances will be used for the purposes for which they were appropriated.

Our askings for this institution during the next two years, total \$56,900.00, \$25,000.00 of which is for the contingent and repair fund to be expended in repairing buildings, replacing machinery, etc.

The wells supply the water for the various departments of the institution, but because it contains considerable mineral matter, it cannot be used to good advantage in the boilers, heating plant and laundry. We believe it would prove economical to install a water softener in connection with this system. For this equipment an appropriation of \$6,000.00 will be needed.

An appropriation of \$4,000.00 is asked for dental, oculist and aurist work, including treatments and necessary supplies; and \$1,200.00 is asked for chaplain, lectures and amusements.

The remainder of the appropriations asked for this institution include amounts for material and equipment to be used in the many departments of the school necessary to train the boys in useful trades that will be of assistance to them when released from the school.

The ovens in the bakery are warped and worn in many ways so that considerable repair will be necessary. These ovens have been in use for a number of years and are practically worn out. It would be advisable to replace the old ovens with new ones, instead of making further expenditures for repairs, and \$5,000.00 should be appropriated for this purpose.

## TRAINING SCHOOL FOR GIRLS, MITCHELLVILLE

Extensive repairs have been made to buildings and equipment at this institution during the past biennial period.

The rebuilding and fireproofing of two cottages for which the thirty-ninth general assembly made an appropriation of \$20,000.00, have been completed, including the cottage for colored girls. These buildings have been made practically as good as new and will serve their purpose in this connection for many years to come. The remodeling of these buildings necessarily called for the expenditure of a considerable sum of money for new furniture and fixtures, for which approximately \$7,000.00 was used from special appropriations made for such purpose.

New office quarters were installed in cottage No. 4.

The power plant with workshop is being enlarged and a new ice plant is being built adjacent to the power plant. The old ice plant is to be remodeled as a shop for the carpenter.

The boilers have all been retipped and placed in good condition and the steam mains thoroughly overhauled.

A new steel water tank has been placed on the old tower to insure a sufficient supply of water for the institution at all times.

When the present work under progress has been completed, this institution will be in first-class condition, which will make it unnecessary to ask the forty-first general assembly for a large appropriation to care for the needs of the school during the biennium. Our special askings for the next period total \$16,900.00 which is a reduction of more than one-half of that appropriated and used during the past biennium.

## MOUNT PLEASANT STATE HOSPITAL, MOUNT PLEASANT

During the period ending June 30, 1924, it became necessary to install some new equipment and machinery, and to make some needed repairs to the main hospital building, which include: a new portico at the entrance of the main building, a new engine and generator, changes in the steam lines and replacements in the return lines, and the installation of new radiators on all wards occupied by female patients, supplementing the indirect heating system which has been unsatisfactory.

The east and west infirmaries and the farmers' lodge were repainted, as were all buildings occupied by officers and employes.

The boilers and stokers authorized by the thirty-ninth general assembly have been installed.

Remodeling the carriage barn for housing employes, has also been completed and makes a very suitable building for this purpose.

An X-Ray machine, with all necessary equipment, was purchased during the past biennium and put in operation. Such equipment is necessary in all of our larger hospitals, as it aids the physicians in making the diagnosis of various ailments affecting patients.

Extensive repairs have been made to the four elevators in the main building.

New electric switchboards have been installed, also a new feed water heater in the power plant.

As stated in our former report this is the oldest institution of



its kind in the state, and while many repairs have been made and new equipment installed during the past biennial period, there is still much of this kind of work to be done.

Our askings will be the same as granted for the past period, \$50,000.00. Of this amount \$18,000.00 will be used for installing new equipment throughout in the bakery. The location of the bakery at the present time is in the basement of the main building, four or five feet below the surface ground. It is poorly lighted by two ordinary windows near the ceiling, and the ventilation is poor. It is entirely too small to meet the demands of the institution and cannot be kept in a sanitary condition. This equipment will be absolutely necessary during the next period.

We are asking for \$2,000.00 for rebuilding about one-half mile of cement walk which was laid about twenty-five years ago and will have to be replaced.

The remainder of the amount asked for this institution is for contingent and repair items necessary in maintaining an institution of this size.

#### INDEPENDENCE STATE HOSPITAL, INDEPENDENCE

The only appropriation made by the fortieth general assembly for this hospital was in the amount of \$30,000.00 for contingent and repair fund. This has been used in various ways in repairing and painting buildings; also, in the purchase of equipment necessary to replace items worn out or broken, including X-Ray equipment, plumbing supplies, new floors and laundry machinery.

Following the construction of a drainage ditch for which there was an appropriation of \$10,000.00, the institution laid about 160,000 clay tile at a cost of \$14,712.00. Some of the fields in which this tile was laid have already been broken up and we feel that the state will be well repaid for the money and labor expended on this project.

During the night of February 3, 1923, fire practically destroyed the roof on the coal crusher room, causing a loss of approximately \$1,300.00. The cost of repairing this building, including labor, was allowed and paid for by the executive council from the providential-contingent fund appropriated by the fortieth general assembly.

Several new corn cribs and granaries have been erected to care for the farm produce. These were necessary on account of the large acreage in connection with the hospital.

Special askings for this institution during the next biennial period total \$35,000.00, \$20,000.00 of which is to be used for contingent and repair fund, and \$15,000.00 for a new dairy barn and silo. The last two items we feel are absolutely necessary in maintaining the large dairy herd at this institution composed entirely of Holsteins. At present they are milking eighty-five cows that furnish at all times an ample supply of milk for the patients.

#### CLARINDA STATE HOSPITAL, CLARINDA

The fortieth general assembly made special appropriations totaling \$160,000.00 for this institution, to be used as follows: contingent and repair fund \$20,000.00; hospital building and equipment \$125,000.00; for completion of cow barn \$7,000.00; and an additional appropriation of \$8,000.00 for a building for tubercular patients.

In addition to the usual repairs to buildings and purchase of equipment, new tile floors and wainscoting have been placed in a number of the rooms.

Extensive repairs have been made to the cold storage plant.

The cow barn has been completed at a cost of \$6,999.00 and will aid greatly in caring for the large dairy herd.

The new hospital building is under construction, but will not be ready for occupancy for some time. This building will aid greatly in relieving the overcrowded condition at this hospital during the past year, especially on the men's wards.

Appropriations totaling \$56,000.00 have been asked for this institution for the next period: \$20,000.00 for contingent and repair fund, and \$36,000.00 for the purchase of land.

The number of acres of land in connection with this hospital is small as compared with other institutions of this size in the state. We feel that this is an opportune time to purchase land if it is to be purchased at all. We have plenty of help to work more land at this institution and ask that an appropriation be made for this purpose.

#### CHEROKEE STATE HOSPITAL, CHEROKEE

Of the appropriations made for the Cherokee State Hospital, the following expenditures have been contracted for, or made:

Contract for an elevated tank for water supply was awarded to the Pittsburgh-Des Moines Steel Company at a cost of \$8,893.00, erected complete. This is under construction and will be ready for use in the near future.

The canning unit has been installed and is now in operation. The output of this plant during this year will not be as large as was expected on account of the heavy hail and rain storm which visited that vicinity and which practically destroyed the farm and garden crops. This is a severe loss, as they had planned to can practically all of their own fruit and vegetables.

The corn crib and granary authorized for which an appropriation of \$2,500.00 was made, has been erected and is a valuable addition to the farm buildings.

Just recently a contract was let for the erection of a new hospital building to accommodate two hundred patients. This building is now under construction.

During this period two silos and a new hog house were erected. New X-Ray equipment was installed in the hospital building for use in diagnosing cases.

Two new pumps were installed in connection with the water system. Palmer burners and Swift stokers have been installed in connection with one of the large boilers.

Extensive repairs have been made to the heating system.

The plumbing system has been completely overhauled and practically three-fourths of the fixtures, valves and water piping have been replaced with new.

Our special askings for the appropriations needed for this institution during the period beginning July 1, 1925, total \$107,000.00, which amount is to be expended for the following purposes: \$1,000.00 for books and amusements, \$3,600.00 for additional land, \$25,000.00 for increasing and improving water supply, \$20,000.00 for boilers and improving boiler house, \$5,000.00 for rebuilding elevators, and \$20,000.00 for contingent and repair fund.

We believe that the above improvements are necessary and should be taken care of during the next period. A \$20,000.00 contingent and repair fund is necessary for an institution of this size to take care of contingencies that may arise and require immediate attention.

Our special askings for this institution are considerably less than were granted for the last period and have been reduced considerably below the amounts requested by the superintendent.

HOSPITAL FOR EPILEPTICS AND SCHOOL FOR FEEBLEMINDED,  
WOODWARD

The new granary and corn crib authorized by the thirty-ninth general assembly was not erected until during the last period.

New chlorinating apparatus for purifying the water supply was installed. This was considered very necessary by the board in connection with the water used at the institution.

Extension of the sewer system and concrete conduit used in carrying the steam mains to the new building were also necessary.

The dormitory for employes for which the thirty-ninth general assembly made an appropriation of \$45,000.00 and for which an additional appropriation of \$19,000.00 was made to complete the south wing by the fortieth general assembly, has been occupied for some time. The housing of the employes in this building made it possible for the institution to receive a number of additional patients that would otherwise have had to remain on the waiting list.

The children's building for which an appropriation of \$125,000.00 was made, has been completed and is ready for occupancy. This will house one hundred and fifty children. It is an exceptionally fine building and we were very fortunate to get it built within the appropriation authorized.

Other repairs to buildings and replacements of equipment have been made as needed. The institution as a whole, we believe is in very good condition at this time.

Special appropriations asked for the next period total \$170,500.00. Included in this request we have asked for an additional cottage of sufficient size to care for one hundred and sixty boys. We have estimated that such a building will cost \$150,000.00 when completed. We have on the waiting list at this institution and the institution at Glenwood, about four hundred feeble-minded persons who are seeking admission. The new building erected during the last period at Woodward, will relieve this condition somewhat but we will still have a large waiting list and additional applications are being received daily. If the applicants on this waiting list are to be taken care of and admitted, the building requested above is absolutely necessary.

The usual contingent and repair fund is included in the above amount, also, an additional sum of \$500.00 for poultry house.

#### STATE PENITENTIARY, PORT MADISON

The new cell house addition for which appropriations were made by the thirty-ninth and fortieth general assemblies, is still under construction and will not be ready for occupancy before next spring. Two hundred and sixty prisoners can be cared for



in this building which will relieve the overcrowded condition that has existed at this institution for some time.

During the next period we should rebuild a portion of the cell bank in what is known as the old cell house. For this purpose an appropriation of \$30,000.00 will be needed. With the population increasing at both of our penal institutions, it is absolutely necessary that more room be provided.

During the biennial period ending June 30, 1924, it became necessary to install additional equipment in the power plant, consisting of a new boiler and feed pump to be used in connection with the chair industry. These were paid for from the fund for establishing and maintaining industries.

Ordinary repairs to buildings and equipment have been made from the contingent and repair fund, for which there was an appropriation of \$25,000.00.

The amounts asked for the next biennial period covering transportation and gift money have been increased considerably over the amounts requested for the same purpose during the last period. The increase was made necessary by reason of the change in the law made by the special session of the fortieth general assembly, which increased the amount of money to be given to paroled and discharged prisoners from \$5.00 to \$25.00 each.

The asking for dental, oculist and aurist treatments and necessary supplies has been increased \$500.00 over the previous period, which was necessary on account of the increase in population.

Our total special askings for the State Penitentiary for the period beginning July 1, 1925 and ending June 30, 1927, total \$65,000.00, which amount does not include the regular per capita allowance for support.

#### MEN'S REFORMATORY, ANAMOSA

Special appropriations made by the fortieth general assembly for the Men's Reformatory total \$28,500.00. The amounts were used in part for the purposes for which they were authorized. The remaining balances will be used as needed during the remainder of the period.

The special askings for this institution for the period ending June 30, 1927, total \$157,500.00. The major portion of this is to be used in making needed repairs to buildings and new equipment for the power plant, which includes rewiring of the institution throughout; the new engine and generator including connections, remodeling engine room and installing toilets and lavatories in

the south cell house. One hundred twenty-five thousand dollars of the total special askings will be used for these purposes. The remainder of \$32,500.00 is asked for contingent and repair fund to be used in making necessary repairs to buildings and equipment, and in taking care of any unforeseen contingencies that might arise during the period.

Askings for transportation and gift money for prisoners have been increased at this institution the same as at the penitentiary and for the same reason.

We have a number of industries operating in connection with the penal institutions. A full and complete statement of their operations and earnings will be found elsewhere in this report.

#### WOMEN'S REFORMATORY, ROCKWELL CITY

The water supply at this institution has been far from adequate for some time. The situation became so serious during the past year that something had to be done to relieve this condition. It was decided by the board to sink a well of sufficient depth to care for the institution needs along this line at all times. In doing this it was necessary to go to a depth of 1,692 feet, and an abundance of excellent water has been secured. This improvement called for an expenditure of approximately \$8,000.00.

Other needed repairs to buildings and equipment have been made as necessity required. A new slaughter house was erected, enabling the institution to slaughter its own cattle and hogs at a considerable saving to the state.

Special askings for appropriations for the next period will be about \$3,400.00 less than were granted for the biennial period ending June 30, 1925. Our total askings of the forty-first general assembly for this institution will be \$8,600.00, \$600.00 of which is to be used for dental, oculist and aurist treatments and supplies, and the remainder for contingent and repair fund.

#### INDUSTRIES

The large increase in the prison population during this period has made the employment of the convicts at profitable labor considering the funds available, a rather serious problem.

The total average number of convicts in the Men's Reformatory and the State Penitentiary for the period ending June 30, 1922, was 1,355. This number has greatly increased. For the period ending June 30, 1924, the average population was 1,775. The



total number of prisoners for the two years ending June 30, 1914 was 1,204, an increase in ten years of 571.

The fortieth general assembly made provision for the adoption of the state use plan for prison industries. Progress has been made to meet the demand of the legislature and everything possible will be done to live up to the letter of the law.

At the Men's Reformatory a modern and completely equipped factory for the manufacture of automobile number plates is now being constructed and will be completed in time to manufacture the 1926 number plates for state use.

Machinery for making aluminum ware has been installed in connection with the tin shop which is furnishing the larger part of the aluminum ware used at the state institutions.

The shoe shops and tailor shops at the Men's Reformatory and the State Penitentiary are being enlarged for the manufacture of shoes and clothing for the inmates of the other state institutions.

A cheese factory has been established at the Men's Reformatory. An excellent quality of cheese is being manufactured and is furnished to all institutions under control of this board.

A new department for the manufacture of dining room tables has been added to the chair industry at the State Penitentiary which employs forty additional men, when running at capacity.

As compared to business conditions in general throughout the country, the industries have made a very satisfactory showing. In addition to earning substantial profit for the state there has been paid to the prisoners in wages during the two years, an aggregate amount of \$139,840.76.

All capital expenditures and operating expenses have been paid from receipts earned by the various industries as no new appropriations were made by the fortieth general assembly.

Revenue accounts and balance sheets for the principal industries are shown in the financial section.

#### CHAIR AND FURNITURE INDUSTRY, FORT MADISON

The new chair plant was finished and production again started about September 1, 1922.

The factory has been in operation twenty-two months of the period. During the year of 1923 business was practically normal with orders enough on hand to operate the factory at a maximum production and good prices were obtained. The demand for chairs and tables has not been quite so active during 1924 and it became necessary to decrease prices to meet competition. The general average for the two years has been good.

The net sales for the two years were \$665,181.07 and the earnings after paying \$39,042.58 in wages to prisoners were \$132,058.18 or nearly twenty per cent profit on the sales.

During the period, 188,114 chairs and 1,433 tables were manufactured.

#### PRINTING AND BINDING DEPARTMENT, ANAMOSA

The business of this industry has been limited to the printing needs of the offices and institutions under the jurisdiction of the board of control. This department has equipment for double the amount of work that is now being turned out and it is expected under the operation of the new law that sufficient orders will be received from other state, county and municipal offices to operate this industry at full capacity. The sales during the period were \$31,518.23.

The industry gives valuable instruction to the prisoners. They are taught printing, binding, linotype work and expert ruling. Good positions can always be found for men paroled from this department. About thirty prisoners are regularly assigned for instruction and employment in the printing and binding department.



## TAILORING DEPARTMENTS

Tailoring departments are operated in connection with both the Men's Reformatory and the State Penitentiary, for making and repairing all outside clothing worn by the prisoners.

The expenses of these departments and cost of materials have been paid from support funds as they pertain entirely to the cost of clothing the prisoners.

The shops are being enlarged in anticipation of increased orders, under provision of the new law. The operating costs will be transferred to the industrial funds. About forty men are regularly assigned for work in these departments.

## SHOE SHOPS

These shops—one at the Men's Reformatory and one at the State Penitentiary have heretofore been limited to manufacturing and repairing shoes for the prisoners and repair work for some of the other institutions.

The shoe shops like the tailoring departments are being extended to meet the provisions of the new law. The shops furnish employment for about twenty-five prisoners.

## ALUMINUM WARE AND TINWARE DEPARTMENT, ANAMOSA

The sales to institutions during the two years were \$2,080.36. Almost all of the aluminum ware, tinware and articles manufactured from galvanized iron, needed at the state institutions are now being produced in this department. Eight men are employed in this industry.

## CHEESE FACTORY, ANAMOSA

The cheese factory produced 62,787 pounds of cheese during the two years which sold for \$20,445.02. The milk used in the manufacture of the cheese was largely produced on the institution farm. The cheese was used at the state institutions.

## APRON FACTORY, ANAMOSA

At the beginning of the period 220 prisoners were employed in the shirt industry, and this number has been gradually increased until there are now 450 men employed.

During the period, 313,399 dozens aprons were manufactured for which the state received \$186,752.15. Of this amount the

prisoners received in wages \$43,018.80. The old contract having been cancelled, effective July 1, 1924, a new contract was obtained from the same company at an increase of twenty cents per dozen, or about 33 1/3 per cent advance over the prices received on the old contract which was the highest price obtainable.

## SHIRT FACTORY, FORT MADISON

This industry provides employment for about 240 men, and 140,278 dozen shirts were manufactured for which the state received \$91,725.07. The prisoners were paid in wages \$38,023.15 for the two years. The company having the old contract, after its cancellation, refused to bid on a new contract. Only one bid was received.

The new contract provides for an increase of ten cents per dozen and a payment of three hundred dollars per month for heat, light and power.

## DAIRY HERDS

The institution dairy herds are of the Holstein breed. A record has been kept of the milk produced by each cow, and by culling out the unprofitable ones and by careful breeding, the herds have been brought up until they compare very favorably with the best in the country.

We now have a total of 876 dairy cows in the institution herds. The average number of pounds of milk produced by each cow for the year 1924 was 8,583 pounds, an increase during the two years of 25 pounds per cow; and an increase since 1916 of 2,005 pounds per cow.

The value of the milk produced for one year (from September 1, 1923 to August 31, 1924) at prices for which it could have been sold in the markets, was \$206,615.82.

The milk is all consumed at the institutions producing it, except that from the state farm at Clive which is sold in Des Moines. A part of the milk from the dairy herd at the Men's Reformatory is made into cheese for local use and for shipment to other institutions.

## FARMS AND GARDENS

The state-owned land at the institutions under the board of control is now 12,179 acres.

The State Hospital for Inebriates at Knoxville consisting of 345.79 acres with buildings was sold to the United States government for \$200,000.00. We have purchased during the period 413.75 acres at a total cost of \$81,265.52—40 acres for the Institution for Feeble-minded Children at Glenwood, 360 acres for the Mount Pleasant State Hospital, and 13.75 for the Hospital for Epileptics and School for Feeble-minded at Woodward.

A large amount of tiling has been done at the Independence State Hospital, bringing into cultivation several hundred acres of good ground which had never been farmed.

This increases the total acreage of productive farm land, including orchards and gardens, to about 11,000 acres.

The yield of the farms and gardens has been very satisfactory. The total value of products from the farm, orchards and gardens for the two years is \$1,720,694.04 and the net profits for the years 1922 and 1923 were over \$500,000.00.

The products are largely consumed at the institutions and only the surplus sold. Vegetables and fruit of every variety that can be grown profitably are raised in abundance for institution use thereby reducing the cost of supporting the inmates.

Canning plants have been installed at some of the institutions and large quantities of fruit and vegetables are canned for winter use. Those institutions not equipped with canning plants do their canning in the institution kitchens.

Cattle and hogs are fed and slaughtered on the farms to supply most of the meat for institution use, which method has proved much more profitable than purchasing from the packers and furnishes a better quality of meat.

Although prices of farm products during this biennial period have been low, the institution farms have been operated very profitably. The produce has been credited at prices for which it could have been sold in the markets. The farms have paid in excess of eight per cent on the present valuation.
