## REPORT OF THE TREASURER OF STATE

STATE OF IOWA.  
OFFICE OF THE TREASURER OF STATE,  
DES MOINES, July 1, 1889. }

To his Excellency, WILLIAM LARRABEE, Governor of Iowa :

SIR—In compliance with section 2, chapter 175, laws of the Nineteenth General Assembly, a report of the financial transactions of this office is herewith submitted, showing a full and complete statement of the receipts and disbursements of this department for the biennial period commencing July 1, 1887, and ending June 30, 1889, inclusive. The financial showing that this report makes must be very gratifying to you, as the Chief Executive of our State, and to its people generally.

*General Revenue.*—The receipts into the treasury account this fund for the biennial period ending June 30, 1887, were \$3,211,958.63, and for the period ending June 30, 1889, just closed, \$3,292,665.19, which shows an increase in receipts of \$80,706.58 over the former period. During the last period \$3,241,603.56 was paid in the redemption of State Auditor's warrants, and \$66,273.91 in the payment of interest on same, a reduction in *interest* account over former period of \$41,291.32. As it is from the *general revenue fund* that the expenses of our State government is paid, as in my last report, I have prepared a "*Tabulated Statement*" of the receipts into this office, account this fund. These *tables* give every item, the date and source from which derived, and will be of interest if carefully examined. The table of insurance tax, one of the largest, shows a total of \$149,288.48—this is paid by foreign companies. Then these companies, together with our home companies, pay in *fees* \$53,325.75, making a total of more than *two hundred thousand dollars*, contributed to the revenues of this State by insurance companies for the privilege of doing business within its limits.

*Railroad Commissioners' Tax.*—Paid by the railroads of the State, by act of the last General Assembly this law was repealed and provision made for payment of expenses of this commission out of the *general revenue*.

*Commissioners of Pharmacy.*—The *enforcement fund* provision, enacted by the Twenty-first General Assembly, was virtually repealed by the *courts*, and the Twenty-second General Assembly provided for the payment of prosecutions by this commission out of the *general revenue*. In this, as in the railroad commissioners' tax, increasing the drafts upon the *revenue fund*.

*Agricultural College Endowment Fund.*—Of this fund there is now on deposit in this office \$291,165.23, an increase during the last two years of \$43,990.23, and the amount is being constantly increased by the sale of college lands. The bulk of this fund is now invested in mortgage securities, the handling of them, collecting the interest, amounting during the last *period* to \$48,832.52, has largely increased the work in this office.

*State Depositories.*—In accordance with chapter 37, laws of the Seventeenth General Assembly, the Des Moines National Bank, Iowa National Bank, Polk County Savings Bank, American Savings Bank, and Capital City State Bank, of this city, were for a third time designated by me as State depositories. The appointment having been approved, together with their *bonds*, by the Executive Council, they have continued to transact all the business entrusted to them in a most satisfactory manner, and without expense to the State.

*State Debt.*—The biennial report from this office for the period ending June 30, 1883, showed State Auditor's warrants outstanding to the amount of \$16,450.60, none of which were drawing interest, but immediately the amount began to increase until the close of the week ending—

Of this latter amount none were drawing interest, a condition that had not existed since July, 1883. It is a reasonable expectation that when the Legislature convenes in January next there will be no floating debt—better still, there will be a surplus in the treasury.

*Closing.*—As this will be the last biennial report I will be called upon to make of the doings of this office, I desire to express to you my appreciation of the kindness and courtesy with which you have at all times treated me. My official and personal relations with the co-ordinate branches of the State government, and with the officials of the several counties, and others transacting business with this office, and the very efficient support of my deputy and other assistants, has made the discharge of its duties very pleasant indeed.
