## BIENNIAL REPORT.

To his Excellency, WILLIAM LARRABEE, Governor of Iowa:

Siz—The Board of Curators of the State Historical Society of Iowa submit this its Seventeenth Biennial Report.

The Curators hold their regular meetings on the second Saturday evening of each month, and the room of the Society is open to visitors Wednesday and Saturday of each week, and at other times when desirable. Our register of visitors shows a large increase, and the interest taken in the Society is very perceptible.

Our room is large, eighty by thirty-five feet, lighted from front and rear, and by a large sky-light in the center.

The alcoves and shelving are arranged on the sides for books, with glass doors and with the numerous cases we have, articles are so displayed that visitors can readily see each article and the history of the same.

#### EXCHANGES.

By a system of exchange inaugurated by the Department of the Interior at Washington, we have forwarded to the Department four hundred and thirty-five duplicate volumes, and have in return valuable government publications to complete sets. Among which we may mention the Congressional Globe, Congressional Record, Smithsonian Reports, and others that make our public documents valuable.

By the publication of the *Historical Record*, by this Society, it places us in direct communication with all the societies and libraries in the country, and we receive in exchange their publications. The Society, from its organization, has sought to enlist the publishers of the papers of the State to furnish their papers regularly to the Society, where they are carefully filed for binding and preservation, and as soon as volumes are complete are bound. We are now receiving about fifty such papers, and it seems to the Society that the other publishers would find it to their interest to have complete files of their paper placed where they are permanently preserved for reference. We will gladly extend the courtesy of exchange to them.

The report of the Treasurer is hereby appended and statement showing for what purpose the expenses were incurred. A list of donators to the Library and Cabinet, as also a list supplementary to former catalogue and catalogue of the donation of Hon. S. J. Kirkwood.

#### CABINET.

From Arch Hershire, Iowa City: Commission from Robert Lucas, Governor of the Territory of Iowa, appointing Philip Clark justice of the peace for the county of Johnson for three years, dated Burlington, January 19, 1839. Also, a quit-claim deed from James Davis, administrator of the estate of John Gilbert to Philip Clark, for the claim in which the town of Napoleon was situated, dated Johnson county, Iowa Territory, June 14, 1839. A group of photographs of old settlers of Scott county prior to 1840.

From Dr. J. L. Pickard, Iowa City: The Connecticut Courant, issue of October 29, 1764, and a fue simile of the first newspaper ever issued by Benjamin Franklin, July 11, 1723, and printed September 17, 1856, on a press once used by Franklin.
