## REPORT.

OFFICE OF SECRETARY OF STATE,  
DES MOINES, IOWA.

*To His Excellency, HORACE BOIES, Governor of Iowa:*

SIR: In compliance with the provisions of chapter 82, acts of the twenty-second general assembly, I have the honor to submit the following report of the transactions of the land department of this office for the biennial period ending June 30, 1891.

Two years ago my predecessor published a full and complete report of this department, comprising, in detail, a history of the several land grants, and a digest of the legislative and national enactments bearing upon said grants, with valuable comments thereon.

Recognizing the able manner in which the business of the land department has been conducted, and reported in the past, I shall, for the purpose of this report, conform as nearly as practicable to precedents, but confining myself principally to the current business of the biennial period just closed, except where questions of public interest upon which the information afforded in the action may impart some light and suggest a departure from the course stated.

A large part of the business transacted in this department is impracticable to report, such as correspondence, making copies of field notes, plats and records of patents, etc., which is an important part of the work to be performed by the clerk in charge of said department.

The records disclose the fact that there remains at the close of the biennial period a large amount of lands subject to patent, but the time necessarily required in issuing and recording patents is of a minor consideration. For many years after the State lands are all conveyed, there will be sufficient work for the constant employment of a clerk, and the truthfulness of this statement can be the more fully realized when one contemplates the extensive accumula-

tion of valuable records and files, that are systematically deposited in the vault of the land department, and always open to public inspection.

#### THE SCHOOL LANDS.

The following classes of lands constitute the school lands proper, of our State, viz.: The 500,000-acre grant, the sixteenth section grant and the mortgage school lands. The lands received by the State, granted by act of congress of September 4, 1841, and known as the "500,000-acre grant," were granted for internal improvements; but congress, on the admission of the State into the union, consented to a diversion of the same for the use of common schools. These lands were selected by agents of the State from vacant, public lands wherever they could make the best selections throughout the State. Under this grant there was an excess of 35,473.54 acres selected, making the total quantity 535,473.54 acres, and agreeable to an arrangement made with the department of the interior, the State was permitted to retain the excess.

By an examination of the records of this office I find that there are still unpatented of the 500,000-acre grant, about 13,722.01 acres.

By the act of congress of March 3, 1845, the State of Iowa acquired section numbered sixteen in each congressional township in the State, and where section sixteen had been otherwise disposed of, other lands were taken in lieu thereof.

The quantity of lands inuring to the State under said grant is about 1,012,614.31 acres, and the amount now unpatented is about 67,931.51 acres.

The lands bid off on behalf of the State on foreclosure of mortgages, given to secure loans of the school fund in the several counties, were by act of the General Assembly of April 8, 1862, constituted a new class of school lands known as the "Mortgage School Lands." The quantity of this class of lands to which the State has acquired title, cannot be given, for the reason that this office has not been furnished with complete reports of same.

As exhibited by the records of the land department, I find that the amount of school lands patented during the last two years is as follows:

Of the 500,000-acre grant.....	817.72 acres.
Of the sixteenth section grant.....	27,133.10 acres.
Of the mortgage school lands.....	769.00 acres.

In response to a circular letter addressed to each county auditor in the State, requesting a descriptive list of all unsold school lands in his county, but of the mortgage school lands, only those of which the State had acquired title to prior to January 1, 1874, reports were received from every county in the State, and from such reports I find that the unsold school lands of these three classes are as follows:

Of the 500,000-acre grant.....	1,560.33 acres.
Of the sixteenth section grant.....	12,826.70 acres.

There are also twenty-seven town lots unsold which constitute a part of the mortgage school lands.

#### THE UNIVERSITY LANDS.

The University lands embrace two Congressional grants, also lands acquired under Sheriff's deeds and donated lands. The University grant, by act of Congress of July 20, 1840, for the purpose of a State University, contained 45,928.84 acres.

During the last biennial period 403.83 acres of this grant have been patented by the State.

By act of Congress of March 3, 1845, the use of the Saline lands was granted to the State, and by act of Congress of May 27, 1852, the State was given the title in fee to this grant of lands. The amount of this grant originally certified to the State was 46,202.53 acres, but this amount was reduced by a subsequent cancellation of the approval of 480 acres, reducing the quantity in the Saline grant to 45,722.53 acres.

The Board of Regents of the State University, at Iowa City, has control of these lands, and any information desired in relation to matters under the control of said Board can be obtained by addressing the Treasurer of the State University, Lovell Swisher, Esq., at Iowa City, Iowa.

During the last biennial period ending June 30, 1891, there were patented of the Saline grant 560 acres.

I am enabled, through the kindness of Mr. Swisher, Treasurer of the State University, to present a statement of the unsold University lands, taken from his report.

THE AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE LANDS.

These lands were acquired by congressional grants, donations and purchase. The quantity received by the State under the congressional grant of July 2, 1862, was 204,309.30 acres.

By act of congress of March 3, 1845, five sections of land in Jasper county, containing 3,200 acres were granted to the State of Iowa for the purposes of a State Capitol, but afterwards, by an act of the General Assembly of March 22, 1858, and with the consent of congress to the diversion, these lands were appropriated for the use of the Agricultural College. The lands embraced in this grant have long since been patented by the state. The lands known as the "Cusey Purchase," were located and purchased by James C. Cusey, agent of said Agricultural College, and are situated in the counties of Buena Vista, Cherokee, Dickinson, Lyon and Plymouth.

## THE DES MOINES RIVER LANDS.

An act of Congress of August 8, 1846, granted to the Territory of Iowa, "for the purpose of aiding said Territory to improve the navigation of the Des Moines river from its mouth to the Racoon Fork (so called), in said Territory, one equal moiety, in alternate sections, of the public lands (remaining unsold, and not otherwise disposed of, encumbered or appropriated), in a strip five miles in width on each side of said river," to be selected by an agent or agents appointed by the Governor, subject to the approval of the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States. The act of July 12, 1862, extended the grant of 1846, for the improvement of the Des Moines river, "so as to include the alternate sections (designated by odd numbers), lying within five miles of said river, between the Racoon Fork and the northern boundary of said State; such lands are to be held and applied in accordance with the provisions of the original grant"; that the consent of Congress was given to the application of a portion of said lands to aid in the construction of the Keokuk, Fort Des Moines & Minnesota Railroad, in accordance with the provisions of the act of the General Assembly of Iowa, approved March 22, 1858. By said act of 1858, all the lands granted to the then Territory of Iowa, by the

original act of 1846, were granted to aid in the construction of said railroad, from the city of Keokuk, up and along the valley of said river, by way of the city of Des Moines, to the northern line of the State, excepting all the lands belonging to said grant previously sold by the State of Iowa. The United States donated the Des Moines river lands to the State of Iowa for a specific purpose, and that trust was to be carried out in a specific way, it being provided that the lands could only be sold as progress was made on the work of improvement of the navigation of the Des Moines river.

It is unnecessary to present here a complete history of these lands.

A case in the Supreme Court of the United States, *United States of America vs. The Des Moines Navigation & Railway Company, et al.*, is now approaching conclusion, and is nominally a suit in equity to quiet the title of the United States to said lands, and being brought in the name of the United States it is possible that questions have arisen for adjudication which have never before been considered.

The case involves the cancellation of the deeds given by Governor Lowe in 1858, and also the cancellation of certain certificates issued by the Secretary of the Interior.

There are deposited in the vault of the State Land Department about 1,140 patents for Des Moines River lands, issued to individuals who purchased such lands of the State of Iowa and paid for them many years ago. The lands conveyed by these patents were approved and certified to under the original grant, of August 8, 1846. The patentees or their assigns are entitled to these patents, and should have them entered in the proper county records.

Upon presentation of the certificate of purchase given the original purchaser, these patents will be delivered free of charge. In case that said certificate is lost, then an affidavit of the facts, by the owner in fee simple, will be accepted in lieu thereof.

## THE SWAMP LANDS.

—

Forty-one years have elapsed since Congress granted the swamp and overflowed lands to the State of Iowa.

This grant was by act of September 28, 1850, and the true intent and meaning of the act was to grant all the swamp and overflowed lands within the State, that were not otherwise disposed of at that date. By act of January 12, 1853, the State granted to the several counties in which the same are situated, the lands received under said Congressional grant.

It would seem, that after the passage of so many years since these lands were granted, that questions for litigation between swamp land claimants and others would not arise, but many contests have been ordered within the last two years for determination

as to the character of lands claimed as swamp or overflowed, within the meaning of the act granting the swamp lands.

Herewith is published a decision of the Supreme Court of Iowa. (May 28, 1891), in the case of *Hays vs. McCormick*, an action to quiet title, to a tract of land claimed by plaintiff as swamp land under act of 1850.

**HAYS V. MCCORMICK.**

(*Supreme Court of Iowa. May 28, 1891.*)

*Swamp Lands—Selection by State—Railroad Grants.*

1. In an action to quiet title, where plaintiff claims under the swamp-land grant act of Congress of September 28, 1850, and defendant under a railroad aid grant of May 15, 1856, the fact that the land was never selected by the State, as required by the swamp-land act, is not conclusive that it was not swamp land, but its actual character may be shown.

2. Where the land was swamp within the meaning of the act, the title thereto vested in the State on the passage of the act, and was not forfeited, as against the subsequent railroad aid grant, by failure to make selection as required in the act.

3. Payment of taxes on the land by railroad companies and its grantees during the time the land was owned by the county under a grant from the State of all swamp land does not affect the rights of the county's grantee, as the land was exempt from taxation while owned by the county.

4. Such grantee will not be required to refund such taxes, as he would not have been obliged to pay them.

5. Where it appears that by agreement with the board of supervisors plaintiff is entitled to a proper instrument of conveyance of the land from the county, his title is sufficient, as against defendant, though the instrument of conveyance to him is insufficient.

Appeal from district court, Linn county; J. H. PRESTON, Judge.

Action to quiet title to a 40-acre tract of land in Linn county. Decree for plaintiff, and the defendant appealed.

GRANGER, J. The respective parties trace the origin of their titles to grants of land by the United States, that of plaintiff being to the swamp-land grant act, approved September 28, 1850, as amended; and defendant to the Iowa railroad grant of May 15, 1856, as amended. The claim of the record title of the parties is as follows: That of plaintiff, the act of congress of 1850, granting to the states the swamp and overflowed lands unfit for cultivation within their boundaries; the act of the general assembly of 1858, granting to the counties the swamp and overflowed lands within their limits, which were by the act of Congress in 1850 granted to the states; and a conveyance by the county of Linn to him, September 4, 1888. That of the defendant, the Iowa railroad grant of 1856; a certification of the land under the act by the commissioner of the general land-office, December 23, 1858,

approved by the Secretary of the Interior, December 27, 1858, which list was, under chapter 167, acts Eighteenth General Assembly, signed by the Governor, and attested by the Secretary of State of Iowa, for the Cedar Rapids & Missouri Railroad Company, which company conveyed the land to the Iowa Railroad Land Company, and it to the defendant, October 20, 1885.

1. It is important that we first determine from the evidence in the case a question of fact, as to the actual character of the land September 28, 1850, which is the date of the grant to the states of the swamp lands by Congress. No intelligent discussion of the question can be given without quoting a volume of evidence that would be unwarranted, and of no practical use. Our examination of the evidence leads us to the conclusion that at the date of the grant the tract was overflowed land, within the meaning of the act referred to, and the case will be considered with that as an established fact.

2. The land in question is the S. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 19, township 85, range 8. W. A stipulation in the case is as follows: "In order to avoid the introduction of evidence upon the subject hereinafter mentioned, it is stipulated and agreed by and between the parties that the county of Linn, prior to 1875, made selections of swamp lands, as shown by the records of the register of the State land-office, which selections so made embrace certain tracts in section 19, township 85, range 8, in Linn county, and among them the N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  and the S. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of said above named section, (the said selections so made, or a copy thereof, are on file in the Secretary of State's office in the State of Iowa;) and that the tract in controversy was not included in any such selections; and that, so far as shown by any record of the State or county, the tract in controversy has never been patented to the State, nor by the State to the county." It is said in argument that the fact that the land has never been selected as swamp land ought to be conclusive proof that it is not, and that a presumption should follow the acts of the officers appointed to make the selections that they did their duty. That such a presumption should obtain to the extent of devolving on the plaintiff the burden of showing that land was actually swamp or overflowed, so as to bring it within the grant, meets with our approval; but that it should obtain to the extent of becoming conclusive as against the actual facts is a rule unsupported, we think, by either reason or authority. That the grant rested the State with the title to such lands as were within the purview of the act is so well established on authority that only a reference to the fact is required. It has been held that the act by its own force operated to pass the title at once. *Allison v. Halfacre*, 11 Iowa, 450; *Railway Co. v. Smith*, 9 Wall, 95. The provisions of the act of 1850, providing for the selection of the land, have been held of no greater force than to secure an identification of the lands included in the grant, and that in effect it could not operate as a limitation upon the grant. *Railway Co. v. Brown*, 10 Iowa, 333. In *Railway Co. v. Smith, supra*, the principal question in the case was as to the kind of evidence competent to show the character of lands. By an act of Congress land had been granted to aid in the construction of railroads in the State of Missouri, and from the grant lands granted under the act of 1850 were reserved. The case involved the identification of lands under the two acts, and the manner of doing it. To establish the reservation the swampy character of the land was to be shown. The Secretary of the Interior had neglected or failed to furnish the lists, and the

land stood as unselected by any of the ways provided in the act. The case submits this pertinent query: "Must the State lose the land, though clearly swamp land, because that officer has neglected to do this?" The case, after referring to the difficulties under which the Secretary of the Interior must labor to know the fact from which to properly certify the list, again inquires. "Why should not the same kind of testimony, subjected to cross-examination, be competent when the issue is made in a court of justice to show that they are swamp and overflowed, and so excluded from the grant under which plaintiff claims,—a grant which was also a gratuity?" The following is the conclusion in the case: "The matter to be shown is one of observation and examination; and, whether arising before the secretary, whose duty it was primarily to decide it, or before the court, whose duty it became because the secretary had failed to do it, this was clearly the best evidence to be had, and was sufficient for the purpose. Any other rule results in this: That, because the Secretary of the Interior has failed to discharge his duty in certifying these lands to the states, they therefore pass under a grant from which they are excepted beyond doubt; and this, when it can be proved, by testimony capable of producing the fullest conviction, that they were of the class excluded from the plaintiff's grant." Appellant seems to question the correctness of the holding in *Railway Co. v. Smith*, on authority, and refers to *French v. Fyan*, 93 U. S., 169. In that case the action was at law, (ejectment). The land had been properly selected, and listed by the Secretary of the Interior, and a patent issued in pursuance thereof; and the plaintiff, as a grantees under the railroad grant, sought to impeach the conclusiveness of the patent by evidence showing that the land was not in fact swamp or overflowed land. The opinion attaches particular importance to the fact that the action is one at law, and holds that the evidence in such a case is not admissible, and points to a clear distinction between a case where the title following the grant has been confirmed by a compliance with the law as to selections, and a patent given by which particular tracts are specified, and one in which no selections have been made nor patents issued. The case refers to *Railway Co. v. Smith*, and, while it says that the holding in that case was "with hesitation and with some dissent in the court," it is in no way disapproved or overruled, but rather justified by additional comments referring to the facts under which the rule was announced. Importance in argument is given to the fact that in all the cases passed upon by this court there had been some kind of selection by the State or counties of the lands in question, even though there had been neglect or failure on the part of the proper officers of the United States. "But we do not see how that fact changes the rule. This land being, as we have found, under the rule sanctioned in *Railway Co. v. Smith*, overflowed land, the title passed at once to the State on the passage of the act of September 28, 1850. If the plaintiff is not the owner as the grantees of the State, it must be the result of a forfeiture, and under the claim now being considered the forfeiture would result from the neglect of the State to make selection. But the act granting the land does not make the title in the State depend upon any such a duty, nor does it devolve upon the State any duty in this respect. The selections by the State, as we understand, were made in pursuance of instructions from the commissioner of the general land-office, and merely as an aid to the preparation of lists by the Secretary of the Interior. The

fact that the State, even in its own interest, aided the officer of the general government to identify or select the lands belonging to it, should not induce a forfeiture as the result of a mistake or oversight. The title of the State was not intended, as the grant is construed, to depend upon selections, but upon actual physical facts. The means of identification were patent to all. The railroad company took, under the grant in its aid, with knowledge of the law, and with opportunities equal to others to know facts upon which its title would depend. Nothing in the law, that we discover, required the State, in order to protect its title as against another and subsequent grant, which was a gratuity, to make such selections. The fact that it was swamp land, and did not belong to the railroad company, is of paramount significance. The company merely took possession of and sold land to which it never had any title. The certificate of the Secretary of the Interior under the railway grant cannot prevail against a vested title under the grant of 1850. *Mills Co. v. Railway Co.*, 22 Iowa, 91; *Montgomery Co. v. Railway Co.*, 38 Iowa, 208.

3. The railroad company and its grantees paid taxes on the land from the year 1866 to 1888, in the aggregate sum of \$73.53, and that point is urged as against the right of the plaintiff to recover. Plaintiff obtained the land from the county in September, 1888, and no taxes have ever been paid for which he was liable. During the time the taxes were paid, of which complaint is made, the land belonged to the county, and was exempt from taxation. *Buena Vista Co. v. Railway Co.*, 46 Iowa, 226; *Howard Co. v. Bullis*, 49 Iowa, 519. These two cases also control the question of the county being bound or estopped by the acts of its officers in the collection of taxes.

4. The written conveyance of the land from the county to plaintiff is as follows: "In consideration of one dollar, we, J. H. Davis, James Guill and M. E. Bunting, in our official capacity as supervisors of Linn county, State of Iowa, hereby sell and convey and forever quitclaim to J. D. Hays the following described premises in Linn county, Iowa, to-wit, S. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$ , section 19, township 85, range 8, to have and to hold the said premises unto the said J. D. Hayes, his heirs and assigns, forever, with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging. Signed the fourth day of September, 1888. J. H. Davis, Chairman Board of Supervisors Linn County." It is urged that the instrument is insufficient to pass the title, because by Code, section 305, it is provided that "no real estate shall be purchased or sold \* \* \* without a majority of the whole board of supervisors voting therefor and consenting thereto." The following stipulation is in the record: "It is conceded that the plaintiff and the members of the board of supervisors will swear that on or about the 4th day of September, 1888, plaintiff purchased the land in controversy from Linn county, Iowa, through the board of supervisors, for the sum of fifty dollars, which was paid at that time by the plaintiff giving his promissory note therefor, which was accepted by the board in full payment of the value and contract price." The sufficiency of the instrument of conveyance we need not discuss. It plainly appears from the record that there was between the board and the plaintiff an understanding, and such a performance by the plaintiff that he was entitled to a proper instrument of conveyance of the land, and that such a conveyance was intended. If the conveyance is insufficient it is evidently the result of

a mistake, against which the law would afford relief. The title of the plaintiff is sufficient as a basis of recovery against the defendant.

5. It is lastly urged that, if the title is confirmed in the plaintiff, the taxes paid should be refunded. All the taxes paid were when the land belonged to the county, and, as he purchased the land as swamp land from the county, he had no just reason to believe that there had been such payments, but, on the contrary, he had reason to believe otherwise. By the payment of the taxes the plaintiff was not relieved of a burden devolving upon him, so that equity would require him to reimburse. As to the right of defendant elsewhere we are not to consider.

Affirmed.

DECISION OF SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR RELATIVE  
TO INDEMNITY CLAIM OF WOODBURY COUNTY

DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR,  
WASHINGTON, March 21, 1891.

STATE OF IOWA,  
WOODBURY COUNTY,  
SWAMP LAND INDEMNITY.

*The Commissioner of the General Land Office:*

SIR—I have considered the case arising upon the appeal of the State of Iowa, through its agent, Isaac R. Hitt, from your office decision of January 9, 1889, rejecting the application of the said State for cash indemnity under the act of March 2, 1855 (10 Stat., 634), for certain tracts of land situate in Woodbury county, in said State, described in your said office letter of January 9, 1889, alleged to be swamp. The facts of the case, briefly stated, are these: The State presented a claim for indemnity for swamp lands in Woodbury county (*supra*), sold by the United States, amounting in the aggregate to 4,178.42 acres. Your office furnished a list of these lands to its special agent, Charles Shackleford, with instructions to investigate the character of the land. Mr. Shackleford went to Woodbury county, stopping on the way at Chicago, for the purpose of making arrangements with Mr. Isaac R. Hitt, the State agent for Iowa, for the taking of testimony in the matter of said lands. The arrangements finally concluded were, that the deputy State agent, Mr. F. A. Wheeler, should act in the matter. The plan of investigation pursued was this: Mr. Shackleford, as agent of your office, made a personal examination of the tracts in controversy. In cases where, from such personal examination, he became satisfied that the land was actually swamp land within the meaning of the law, and was prepared, upon the basis of facts which he had thus personally observed, and incorporated in his report to your office, to recommend for the allowance of indemnity, it would seem unnecessary to go to the delay, trouble and expense of taking testimony.

Equally so in cases where, upon the same basis, the State swamp land agent should acknowledge that the land was not swampy in character, and waive the claim of the State thereto. It was only in cases where the agent of your office and of the State should disagree that the necessity arose for the taking of testimony.

Of the 4,178.42 acres claimed by the State, the special agent of your office, after personal examination, considered 3,285.32 acres to be "fit for cultivation," but conceded that 893.10 acres were "swamp or overflowed."

Your office decision of January 9, 1889, does not dispute the State's claim to indemnity to the latter; and they are not in question here.

It appears from the record that no testimony was taken as to the character of the 3,285.32 acres of land reported by the special agent as being fit for cultivation, except as to the east half of the northwest quarter of section twenty-seven, and the southeast quarter of the southwest quarter and the southwest quarter of the southeast quarter of section thirty-five, township eighty-eight, north range, forty-seven west.

Testimony was taken as to the character of these one hundred and sixty acres, upon which the special agent reported that they are "not within the scope of the swamp land grant." With reference to the land in section twenty-seven, the testimony of two witnesses, one of whom is a surveyor who has been well acquainted with it, shows that "during the spring months it is well covered with high water, from one to two inches; sometimes a month, sometimes for two; the overflow is caused by creeks running out of the bluffs near by; to reclaim the land would require a ditch about twelve miles long, for outlet; the land is all used for hay purposes;" that, although it is good timothy land, it is not fit for cultivation, except for hay. The plats on file in your office show the greater part of this tract to be swamp; and, considering the field notes and the testimony together, I think it is sufficiently shown by the evidence that this tract is swamp and overflowed and unfit for cultivation within the meaning of the swamp land grant.

The evidence is substantially the same as to the land in section 35, which, while it produces grass and is not swampy or miry to such an extent as to prevent a team from being drawn over it, yet is shown by the witnesses to be swamp and overflowed and could not be cultivated to agricultural crops.

I think the testimony sufficiently shows that all of these last mentioned tract, aggregating one hundred and sixty acres, are swamp and overflowed, within the meaning of the act, and that the State is entitled to indemnity therefor. As to the remaining 3,125.32 acres, no testimony was taken to impeach the report of the special agent that said lands were fit for cultivation, and upon the list is attached the following waiver:

"CHICAGO, ILLS., Nov. 8, 1888.

"I hereby waive and decline to offer testimony on the foregoing tracts of lands, and relinquish claim of the State of Iowa to indemnity on account thereof.

"ISAAC R. HITT, *State Agent.*

"By F. A. WHEELER."

In the appeal of the State from the decision of your officer, Mr. Hitt, the agent of the State, simply says: "The waiver of the State is denied." He offers no evidence, however to disprove the fact that Wheeler did make the waiver, or that he signed the paper, and states no ground upon which he challenges its validity, except that Wheeler had no authority to make such waiver for the State, never being so instructed, and that all waivers are made over his own signature. He states, however, that, "Mr. Wheeler's instructions, I think, were verbal and went as to the examination of witnesses and no farther."

If Wheeler had the authority to examine witnesses he certainly had the authority to decline to examine them, or to offer testimony. Conceding that he had no authority to file a relinquishment of the claim of the State to indemnity, if the testimony showed the land to be swamp and overflowed, yet he did have the authority to determine whether he would introduce testimony, and if the accredited agent of the State invested him with the authority to examine the witnesses, and he waived or declined to offer testimony as to certain tracts, the State is bound and cannot complain that it had not had full opportunity to offer testimony in support of its claim. The State has shown no sufficient reason why the government should be put to the expense of another investigation, or that further opportunity should be allowed the State to offer testimony as to the character of these lands, and it appearing from the report of the special agent that at the date of the swamp land grant, the greater part of each smallest legal subdivision was not swamp or overflowed so as to render them unfit for cultivation, the claim of the State to indemnity for the same is denied.

RULES AND REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR, RELATIVE TO THE PRESENTATION AND ADJUSTMENT OF CLAIMS UNDER THE SWAMP LAND LAWS.

DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR,

GENERAL LAND OFFICE,

WASHINGTON, D. C., September 19, 1891.

The numerous list of swamp land selections heretofore presented to this office, as claims for lands in place and for cash and land indemnity, under the acts of March 2, 1849, September 28, 1850, and March 12, 1860, relating to swamp lands in place, and the acts of March 2, 1855, and March 3, 1857, relating to cash and land indemnity in lieu of swamp lands sold and located with warrants and scrip, and the continued presentation of numerous selection lists in which additional claims for large quantities of land situated in the same townships or counties as were the previous selections, and with a view to putting a term to the work of examining such selected lands in the field by special agents and of repeatedly adjusting claims in this office, the following rules and regulations are prescribed for the closing and adjustment of all claims under the swamp land laws:

1. Preference in the order of consideration will be given to the adjustment of conflicts between homestead, pre-emption, and cash entries and warrant locations and the swamp land claims of the States over other claims arising under the same laws.

2. Claims for swamp lands in place will be taken up for consideration in preference to cash or other indemnity claims.

3. Cash indemnity claims will be adjusted in the third order, *i. e.*, after cases of conflict and claims for lands in place.

4. Land indemnity claims will not be adjusted when there are no public lands with which to satisfy such claims, in the States in which the warrants or the scrip were located.

5. The surveyors-general when constructing and approving segregation maps and surveys, or approving selection lists of swamp and overflowed lands must, in their certificates, find and recite, affirmatively, facts showing that the principal conditions required by the swamp land act to establish the character of the lands, as swamp and overflowed, existed at the date of the passage of the granting act. All evidence taken by surveyors-general to establish the character of the land must be transmitted with the maps or lists approved. This office will not approve maps or accept lists in which it does not affirmatively appear, in the surveyor-general's certificate, that the lands reported as swamp and overflowed were in reality of that character *at the date of the grant*.

6. Before final action is taken on the claim of a State for swamp lands in place or cash or land indemnity, a certificate of a duly authorized agent of the State reciting that the lands selected in each and every township involved in the selection list constituting the claim represents the full and final claim of the State to lands under the swamp land acts in the said townships, and that the State waives all claims or rights, under the said acts, if it have any, to all other lands not selected in the said townships. Such a certificate will be accepted as evidence that the claim of the State to swamp lands in the particular townships to which it applies is final and complete; and it will be recorded in a book kept for that purpose, and as far as practicable all such completed claims will be acted upon as promptly as possible and in the order of their completion.

7. In the case of cash and land indemnity claims, now pending or which may hereafter be presented for the benefit of counties, a certificate of a duly authorized agent of the county, of the character and effect of that provided for in the sixth section of these instructions relating to claims of States, will be required of county agents, covering the entire area of the county.

8. Waivers must be unconditional, and a copy of the authority from the State legislature or from the county authorities to act for the State or the county and to make certificates of waiver must be filed in this office by the State and county agents.

#### RAILROAD LANDS.

Herewith are published a description of the only tracts of land that appear to have been conveyed by the United States to the State of Iowa for railroad purposes, since the publication of the last biennial report of this office.

The quantity so conveyed is small, and in all probability, the conveyances for such purposes will not be materially increased in the future.

On account of conflict with railroad grants some lands have been withheld from conveyance, that will finally be conveyed by the general government, after pending litigation, or other interfering causes have been removed.

Of the lands conveyed, within the last two years, 240 acres were patented to the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railroad Company under act of Congress of May 12, 1864.

There were also approved and certified by the United States to the State of Iowa under act of Congress of May 15, 1856, 6,137.03 acres, and which have been certified by the State to the Cedar Rapids & Missouri River Railroad Company.

The following is a statement of the lands patented to the State by the United States, under act of Congress of May 12, 1864, during the last two years, with date of patent; also showing to whom the same were patented by the State, with date of such patent:

Since the publication of the last biennial report of this office the Supreme Court of Iowa has rendered a decision affecting the title to lands claimed by the Sioux City & St. Paul Railroad Company, which decision is here given in full.

SIOUX CITY & ST. P. R. CO. v. COUNTRYMAN. SAME v. PHILLIPS. SAME v. BATTEN. SAME v. ROYER.

[Supreme Court of Iowa. June 1, 1891.]

*Railroad Land Grant—Construction.*

1. Act of Congress, May 12, 1864, granted land to the State of Iowa in aid of a railroad from Sioux City to the Minnesota line, and of the McGregor Western Railroad Company, being the alternate sections for ten sections in width on each side of said roads; but if, when the lines of the roads were located, it should appear that any part of any section so granted had been sold or reserved by the United States, it was the duty of the Secretary of the Interior to cause to be selected other land in lieu thereof. It

further provided that upon the certificate of the Governor of the State of the completion of each section of ten miles of either road, patents for one hundred sections should be issued to the State: Provided, that, if the roads were not completed within ten years from their acceptance of the grant, the lands not patented should revert to the State of Iowa to secure the completion of the road; that, if the State failed to secure such completion within five years thereafter, then the lands undisposed of should revert to the United States. The State of Iowa accepted the grant, and conferred so much thereof as related to the construction of a railroad from Sioux City to the State line on the plaintiff, and provided that the lands granted by the United States should be held in trust for the plaintiff. The plaintiff completed within the time required a road from the State line to Le Mars—fifty-six and one-quarter miles—and about two miles of main and side track in Sioux City, but has never constructed a track from Le Mars to Sioux City, between which points it runs its trains over the road of another company. The Governor of the State certified the completion of five sections of ten miles each of the road, and patents for an aggregate of 407,870.21 acres were issued to the State, including the lands in controversy. Certificates were issued to plaintiff by the Governor for 322,412.81 acres, (which did not include the land in controversy,) as being held by the State in trust for its benefit. Of the land so certified 41,687.52 acres were claimed by another road. In 1882 the State resumed the lands granted to plaintiff, which had not been earned, and reconveyed such lands, including the lands in controversy, which the Secretary of the Interior restored to entry, and the lands in controversy were entered by defendants. Held, in an action to vacate such entries, that the interest created by the designation by the General Assembly of the plaintiff as the beneficiary of the grant, and by its acceptance thereof, was limited by the terms of the grant itself, and that these could not be varied by the State, and that that interest could only ripen into an equitable title as to the lands which were subsequently earned in the manner provided for.

2. The grant by Congress to the State to aid in the construction of the two railroads described every odd-numbered section within the limits specified on each side thereof, and provided that, if it should appear that any part thereof had been sold or reserved by the United States, other lands might be selected in lieu thereof. Held, that, where the two roads cross each other, and the grants consequently conflicted, the granting to the State of a moiety of the odd-numbered sections for the benefit of one road could not be regarded as a sale or reservation as to the other which would entitle it to other lands in lieu.

*Appeals from District Court, Woodbury County; George W. Wakefield, Judge.*

Each of these actions involves the title to a quarter section of land claimed by plaintiff under a railroad grant and by defendant by virtue of an entry made under the laws of the United States. Plaintiff asks that the entries be vacated, that defendants be enjoined from attempting to acquire title by virtue of their entries, and that the title of plaintiff be quieted. Judgment was rendered in each case in favor of the defendant, and plaintiff appeals. The questions in controversy are common to all the cases, and they are submitted together on one abstract.

ROBINSON, J. The claim of title made by plaintiff is based upon the following: An act of Congress entitled "An act for a grant of lands to the State of Iowa in alternate sections to aid in the construction of a railroad in said State," approved May 12, 1864; chapter 134 of the Acts of the Eleventh General Assembly of the State of Iowa; an alleged compliance with the requirements of said acts; patents issued by the United States to the State of Iowa; chapter 34 of the Private, Local, and Temporary Acts of the Fifteenth General Assembly of Iowa. The defendants, Countryman and Phillips, claim title under homestead entries made on the 12th day of September, 1887, and defendants Royer and Batten claim by virtue of pre-emption entries made on the same date. Those portions of the act of Congress specified which we need to consider are as follows: "Be it enacted \* \* \* that there be and is hereby granted to the State of Iowa for the purpose of aiding in the construction of a railroad from Sioux City, in said State, to the south line of the State of Minnesota; \* \* \* also to said State for the use and benefit of the McGregor Western Railroad Company for the purpose of aiding in the construction of a railroad from a point at or near the foot of Main street, South McGregor, in said State, in a westerly direction, by the most practicable route, on or near the forty-third parallel of north latitude, until it shall intersect the said road running from Sioux City to the Minnesota State line in the county of O'Brien, in said State,—every alternate section of land designated by odd numbers for ten sections in width on each side of said roads; but in case it shall appear that the United States have, when the lines or routes of said roads are definitely located, sold any section or any part thereof granted as aforesaid, \* \* \* or that the same has been reserved by the United States for any purpose whatever, then it shall be the duty of the Secretary of the Interior to cause to be selected, for the purposes aforesaid, from the public lands of the United States nearest to the tiers of sections above specified, so much land in alternate sections or parts of sections designated by odd numbers as shall be equal to such lands as the United States have sold, reserved, or otherwise appropriated \* \* \* as aforesaid, which lands thus indicated by odd numbers and sections by direction of the Secretary of the Interior shall be held by the State of Iowa for the uses and purposes aforesaid; provided, that the lands so selected shall in no case be located more than twenty miles from the lines of said roads; provided, further, that any and all lands heretofore reserved to the United States by any act of Congress, or in any other manner by competent authority, for the purpose of aiding in any object of internal improvement or other purpose whatever, be, and the same are hereby, reserved and excepted from the operation of this act." "Section 4. The lands hereby granted shall be disposed of by said State for the purposes aforesaid only, and in manner following, namely: When the Governor of said State shall certify to the Secretary of the Interior that any section of ten consecutive miles of either of said roads is completed in a good, substantial, and workman-like manner as a first-class railroad, then the Secretary of the Interior shall issue to the State patents for one hundred sections of land for the benefit of the road having completed

the ten consecutive miles as aforesaid. When the Governor of said State shall certify that another section of ten consecutive miles shall have been completed as aforesaid, then the Secretary of the Interior shall issue patents to said State in like manner for a like number; and, when the certificates of the completion of additional sections of ten consecutive miles of either of said roads are from time to time made as aforesaid, additional sections of land shall be patented as aforesaid, until said roads, or either of them, are completed, when the whole of the lands hereby granted shall be patented to the State for the uses aforesaid and none other: \* \* \* provided, further, that, if the said roads are not completed within the ten years from their several acceptance of this grant, the said lands hereby granted and not patented shall revert to the State of Iowa for the purpose of securing the completion of said roads within such time, not to exceed five years, and upon such terms, as the State shall determine; \* \* \* and, should the State fail to complete said roads within five years after the ten years aforesaid, then the said lands undisposed of as aforesaid shall revert to the United States." "Sec. 5. \* \* \* As soon as the Governor of said State of Iowa shall file or cause to be filed with the Secretary of the Interior maps designating the routes of said roads, then it shall be the duty of the Secretary of the Interior to withdraw from market the lands embraced within the provisions of this act." Chapter 134 of the Acts of the Eleventh General Assembly accepted the grant "upon the terms, conditions, and restrictions" contained in the act of Congress. Section 2 conferred "so much of the lands, interests, rights, powers, and privileges, as are or may be granted" in pursuance of the act of Congress upon the plaintiff "for the purpose of aiding in the construction of a railroad from Sioux City, in the State of Iowa, to the south line of the State of Minnesota." Chapter 144 of the acts of the same General Assembly also accepted the grant, and further provided as follows: "Sec. 2. Whenever any lands shall be patented to the State of Iowa in accordance with the provision of the said act of Congress, said lands shall be held by the State in trust for the benefit of the railroad company entitled to the same by said act of Congress, and to be deeded to said railroad company as shall be ordered by the Legislature of the State of Iowa at its next regular session, or at any other session thereafter."

On the 20th day of September, 1866, plaintiff filed in the office of the Secretary of the State of Iowa an acceptance of the grant, and in July, 1867, it filed in the same office and in the Department of the Interior a map showing the location of its proposed road. In August of that year the lands which were claimed to be included in the grant were withdrawn from market. Before the close of the year 1872 plaintiff completed a railway from a point on the south line of the State of Minnesota to Le Mars, a distance of fifty-six and one-quarter miles, and about two miles of main and side track in Sioux City. It has also built in the place last named a round-house, machine and car shops, and other buildings, of the value of \$100,000, but has never constructed a road from Le Mars to Sioux City. It operates trains between those places—a distance of twenty-four miles—over the track used by the Illinois Central Railway Company. The Governor of this State duly certified the completion of five sections of ten miles each, commencing at the south line of the State of Minnesota, as contemplated by the act of Congress; and also certified to the completion of the road from the point of

commencement to Le Mars. Patents were issued by the United States to the State of Iowa for an aggregate of 407,870.21 acres of land, as inuring under the grant to plaintiff, including the lands in controversy. The Fifteenth General Assembly, by Chapter 34, of its Private, Local and Temporary Acts, directed the Governor to certify to plaintiff all lands which were then held by the State of Iowa in trust for its benefit in accordance with Section 2, of Chapter 134, of the Acts of the Eleventh General Assembly. Certificates have been issued to plaintiff under that statute for 322,412.81 acres of land, but not for the land in controversy. Of the lands so certified a large quantity was claimed by the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railway Company under a grant made by the same act of Congress under which plaintiff claims. In an action in the federal courts, in which said company was plaintiff and the plaintiff in these actions and others were defendants, it obtained a decree awarding to it 41,687.52 acres of the lands which had been certified to plaintiff. In the year 1882 the General Assembly enacted a law to resume the lands which had been conferred upon plaintiff under the act of Congress of 1864, and which had not been earned. Two years later a law was enacted by the General Assembly relinquishing and conveying the lands and rights resumed in the year 1882 to the United States, and directing the governor to certify to the Secretary of the Interior all lands which had been patented to the State to aid in constructing a railroad from Sioux City to the south line of Minnesota, but had not been patented by the State to plaintiff. Lands in Dickinson and O'Brien counties were excepted from the provision of that act. In January, 1887, the Governor certified to the Secretary of the Interior, in accordance with the requirements of the act last specified, a list of 26,017.33 acres of lands, including that in controversy. The lands so certified were restored to entry under the settlement laws of the United States in August, 1887, and the entries were made by defendants as already stated.

1. The act of May 12, 1864, when the trust it created was accepted by the State of Iowa, conferred a right to all the lands contemplated by the act, upon the conditions therein specified. *Leavenworth, L. & G. R. Co. v. U. S.*, 92 U. S., 733; *Grinnell v. Railroad Co.*, 103 U. S., 739; *Goodnow v. Wells*, 67 Iowa, 658, 25 N. W. Rep. 864. The lands included in the grant were to be ascertained by survey, and the location of the lines of road it was intended to aid as to the lands in place and by appropriate selection as to indemnity lands. *Sioux City & St. P. R. Co. v. Chicago, M. & St. P. R. Co.*, 117 U. S., 406, 6 Sup. Ct. Rep. 790, and cases therein cited; *Ryan v. Railroad Co.*, 99 U. S. 382. The grant from the State to plaintiff was as broad in terms as that made by the act of Congress. Section 2, chapter 134, acts of the Eleventh General Assembly. But it was necessarily limited by the conditions attached to the grant to the State. The lands were subject to disposal by the Legislature only for the purpose of aiding in the construction of a railroad from Sioux City to the south line of the State of Minnesota. None of them were to be disposed of until the governor should certify to the Secretary of the Interior that a section of ten consecutive miles of road had been completed in the manner required by the act of congress, and upon that certificate it was the duty of the secretary to issue to the State patents for one hundred sections of land for the benefit of the road which had completed the section, and subsequent patents were to be issued in like manner upon

similar certificates. The lands granted were not to be in any manner disposed of or encumbered, except as they were patented. In case the road was not completed within ten years from the acceptance of the grant, the lands granted and not patented were to revert to the State for the purpose of securing the completion of the road; and, if the State failed to complete the road within five years after the expiration of the ten years aforesaid, the lands undisposed of were to revert to the United States. It is plain that it was not the intent of congress to authorize the State to transfer to the plaintiff title to the land, excepting as it should be earned according to the conditions imposed in the granting act. See *Railway Co. v. County of Osceola*, 50 Iowa, 178. No attempt on the part of the State to transfer to plaintiff an interest not authorized by the act of congress would have been effectual. *Schulenberg v. Harriman*, 21 Wall, 44; *Farnsworth v. Railroad Co.*, 92 U. S., 49; *Railroad Co. v. Davison*, (Mich.) 32 N. W. Rep. 733. That an interest was created by the act of the General Assembly which designated plaintiff as beneficiary of the grant, and by the acceptance of the provisions of that act by plaintiff, is undoubtedly true; and we are of the opinion that such interest ripened into an equitable title at least to all the lands which were subsequently earned in the manner provided by the act. But the right remained in the State to resume control of all lands not earned within ten years from the acceptance of the grant, and that right was not impaired by the fact that in the grant from the State to the plaintiff the right to resume was not specifically reserved. It existed by virtue of the act of congress and could not be relinquished to plaintiff by the State. The right of the State to resume control of the lands which were unpatented and unearned within the ten years allowed to plaintiff in which to complete its road, was properly exercised by legislative enactment. *Schulenberg v. Harriman*, 21 Wall, 44; *U. S. v. De Repentigny*, 5 Wall, 267. That there was delay in resuming such control is a matter of which plaintiff has no right to complain, nor can it question the effectiveness of the resumption. It was also proper for the State, by the means it adopted, to relinquish to the United States the color of the title which it held to the unearned lands through the act of May 12, 1864, and the patent issued thereunder.

2. The appellant contends that it has earned the lands in controversy, and is entitled to them for that reason. They are not within the 10-mile limits of this grant, but it seems to be conceded that they are within 20 miles of the line of road, as originally platted by plaintiff. Although plaintiff constructed 56½ miles of road from the south line of the State of Minnesota to Le Mars, and a little more than 1 mile of main track in Sioux City, it is entitled to land only for five completed sections of road of 10 miles each. The line which the grant was designed to aid was to be constructed from Sioux City to the south line of the State of Minnesota. Plaintiff was entitled to land for each completed section of 10 consecutive miles of road, but to nothing for less than such a section until the road should be fully completed. It is pretended that the road has been completed as contemplated by the act of congress; therefore plaintiff is entitled to nothing on account of the last 6½ miles constructed on the line to Le Mars: nor is it entitled to anything for that part of the road built in Sioux City, and the improvements there made. If plaintiff is entitled to the lands in controversy it must be for the reason that they are a part of the indemnity lands which have been earned by reason

of the construction of 50 miles of road. The first two certificates of the governor show that the three sections first completed commenced at the Minnesota line and extended thence in a southerly direction towards Sioux City. The certificate as to the fourth and fifth sections does not show that they continued the line of the first three sections; but in the absence of proof to the contrary, we will presume that the five sections certified formed a continuous line of 50 miles southward from the south line of the State of Minnesota, where it connected with the St. Paul & Sioux City road, and with which it was operated as a continuous line. The number of acres certified by the governor to plaintiff was, as has been stated, 322,412.81. But the act of May 12, 1864, also granted to the State certain lands to aid in the construction of a railroad from South McGregor westward, to a point of intersection with the road to be built from Sioux City, in the county of O'Brien, and the limits of the two grants included the same land in the neighborhood of the point of junction. A conflict between the claimants under the grant was settled by the decision in the case of Sioux City & St. P. R. Co. v. Chicago, M. & St. Paul R. Co., 117 U. S. 406, 6 Supt. Ct. Rep., 790 and resulted in giving to the Milwaukee Company 41,687.52 acres of the land which had been certified to plaintiff. The amount of land it has received for building the five completed sections of its road thus appears to be 280,725.29 acres, instead of 320,000, which it claims. But we do not think plaintiff is entitled to the quantity of land which it claims. The act of congress granted to the State, for the purpose of aiding in the construction of the two railroads described, every odd-numbered section of land within the limits specified, and provided that if it should appear, when the roads were located, that the United States had sold any part of such sections, or that the right of pre-emption or homestead settlement had attached to them, or that they had been reserved by the United States for any purpose whatever, then the Secretary of the Interior should cause to be selected other lands in lieu of those sold, reserved or otherwise appropriated. We are of the opinion that the sale, reservation and appropriation contemplated by the act cannot be held to be anything which was affected by the act itself, but to some disposition of the land made under other provisions of law. The granting to the State for the benefit of each road of a moiety of the odd-numbered sections within the overlapping ten-mile limits was not a sale, reservation or other appropriation of the land, within the meaning of the act. In other words, it was the intent of congress to grant for the benefit of each road but half as much land within as without such overlapping limits. Section 4, considered by itself, seems to authorize a different conclusion, but it must be construed in connection with the remainder of the act. It follows from what we have said that the right to select for plaintiff lands within the indemnity limits for those portions of the odd-numbered sections within the overlapping ten-mile limits which belonged to the Milwaukee Company did not exist. The number of acres of such land awarded to the Milwaukee Company in the suit to which we have referred was 25,269.86; but in an instrument prepared by the secretary of the interior, and introduced in evidence, it is stated that there are, within the overlapping ten-mile limits of the two grants, 70,345.67 acres. Accepting that as the true amount, it appears that plaintiff is entitled to 284,827.17 acres of land for the five completed sections of its road, or 4,101.88 acres more than it has received. There were patented to the

state, as inuring under the grant to plaintiff, but not certified to it, 85,457.40 acres. Of that amount 37,747.89 acres have been awarded by the decree of the federal courts to the Milwaukee Company, and, 26,017.33 acres appear to have been certified to the secretary of the interior as falling within the provisions of the act of the general assembly of 1884, leaving 21,692.18 acres still held by the State to satisfy the grant to plaintiff, or more than five times the amount to which it appears to be entitled. The issuing of patents to the State for more land than plaintiff had earned seems to have been the result of a mistake of fact. But, however that may be, plaintiff acquired no title to the excess so patented. There has been a partial adjustment between the United States and the State of Iowa, and the latter has relinquished to the former a part of the excess, including the land in controversy. Since the authorities charged with the duty of selecting the land to which plaintiff is entitled have decided that the land relinquished had not been earned, the burden is upon the plaintiff to show the title it asserts, for it must be presumed that the deficiency in its grant must be made up from land the title to which appears to be vested in the State for that purpose. But plaintiff has wholly failed to show any reason for holding the land in controversy rather than the land still held by the State. It is not shown to be nearer the tiers of sections within the ten-mile limits than any other land available to ratify the grant. None of it is within twenty miles of the five completed sections of road, and none of it is within twenty miles of the terminus of the road at Le Mars, if the distance be measured by section lines. Whether plaintiff is entitled in any event to land located more than twenty miles from its completed line is a question which we do not find it necessary to determine. In our opinion, plaintiff has failed to show that it has earned the tracts of land claimed by defendants. The judgment of the district court in each case is therefore affirmed.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

---

The following described tracts of land, viz.: The east half of the southwest quarter, and the southwest fractional quarter of the southwest quarter of section 7, township 70, north range 37, west of 5th P. M., were, on April 7, 1863, certified to the State of Iowa by the Department of the Interior, under the Act of Congress approved May 15, 1856, to aid in the construction of a Railroad in said State "from Burlington on the Mississippi River, to a point on the Missouri River, near the mouth of the Platte River.

But on the 15th of October, 1890, the Governor of Iowa was advised by the Commissioner of the General Land Office at Washington, D. C., that Andrew S. White had a prior right to said

tracts of land, at the date of certification, and which right has been sustained in the federal courts.

On the 21st day of October, 1890, the State of Iowa relinquished all right, title or interest in and to said tracts of land, acquired by reason of the certification of the same under the Railroad grant of May 15, 1856.

The following described premises situated in Mills County, Iowa, to-wit: One hundred acres off the east side of the southeast quarter of section 13, township 72, north range 43, west 5th P. M., were conveyed to the State of Iowa by Newton B. Pitzer and wife by warranty deed, on the 6th day of May, 1890.

Consideration \$5,000.

The said premises were purchased for the use of the Institution for Feeble-Minded Children at Glenwood, Iowa, and that in addition to the above premises, the said institution has two hundred acres, making in all, three hundred acres of land, belonging to the Institution for Feeble-Minded Children.

Many inquiries are received by this office in relation to lands owned by the State of Iowa.

Of this class of lands there remains unsold only a small quantity as shown by the following descriptive statement:

The above described lands were taken as the property of Samuel E. Rankin, on account of indebtedness to the Agricultural College fund, and deeded to the State of Iowa by a committee of the Trustees of the Agricultural College under section 4, chapter 78, Acts Fifteenth General Assembly and now under the control of the Executive Council.

The said realty can be purchased from the State, in subdivisions of not less than one-fourth sections, and proposals for the purchase of same will be received and considered by the Executive Council.

## SURVEYS.

On the 30th day of June, 1866, the Office of Surveyor General of the State of Iowa and Wisconsin, terminated, and by Act of the General Assembly approved January 31, 1868, it was made the duty of the Register of the State Land Office to receive the Archives of the Office of said Surveyor General, and to make the necessary arrangements for keeping same as public records.

We now have in the State Land Office all of the said Archives consisting of "305 volumes (bound) of Field-Notes, Subdivisions; 23 volumes (unbound), Surveys of Islands; 267 small volumes of Township Lines; 13 (folio-bound) volumes of Correspondence and Accounts; 9 volumes of Maps of Townships, together with all the correspondence of the late Surveyor General's Office from its beginning." Certified copies of the original field-notes and plats of survey will be furnished for a reasonable compensation.

By Act of the Thirteenth General Assembly, under chapter 183, the manner in which the re-survey of lands in Iowa is defined, and section 2 of said chapter provides for the publication in convenient form, of the laws, rules and regulations governing the re-survey of lands for the use of county surveyors.

In accordance with the provisions of said Act, Hon. C. C. Carpenter, while Register of the State Land Office, published a pamphlet which gave quite fully the information at that date relating to the surveys of the public lands, and furnished each county surveyor with a copy. A few copies of said pamphlet are still on hand to supply such surveyors, where the copy heretofore sent out has been lost or destroyed.

## FEES.

The total amount of fees received by the State Land Office, for the bienniel period commencing July 1, 1889, and ending June 30, 1891, is \$443.09, all of which has been paid into the State Treasury, as provided by law.

In conclusion, I deem it just and proper to express my appreciation of the exemplary manner in which my predecessor conducted the business pertaining to this office; that the neat and thorough system by which the work in the Land Department has been performed is clearly demonstrated by the records and files of the office, and the degree of accuracy attained in the discharge of the responsible duties therein is largely due to the fidelity and efficiency of the former clerk, Mr. John M. Davis, whose services in the office extended back through so many years. I am conscious of the great importance of so conducting the business connected with the Land Department as to keep the records clear from mistakes in names, dates, descriptions and other particulars, realizing that upon such correctness depend most important private and public interests.
