## Pick 4, New Pick 3 Begin Sept. 21

In just a few more weeks, retailers will offer players a new Pick 4 game and an improved Pick 3 game.

The Freeplay Replay game will end on Sept. 20. Pick 3 and Pick 4 game changes take effect on Sept. 21.

Pick 3 will offer a new midday drawing at 12:40 p.m. (Monday though Saturday) as well as the present evening drawing at 9:20 p.m. Sunday through Saturday. Also, Pick 3 players will be able to bet the "front pair" and "back pair" options, matching either the first two numbers drawn or the last two numbers drawn.

Pick 4 offers players the opportunity to pick their four favorite numbers in two drawings per day (12:40 p.m. and 9:20 p.m.). They may bet a straight, box, straight/box, front pair or back pair.

## First Iowa Amber Alert Ends Successfully

Iowa's first Amber Alert ended successfully when police quickly found a 1-year-old Des Moines girl unharmed.

An Alert was activated on Aug. 5 for the toddler, who was found within an hour on the west side of Des Moines with her mother's former boyfriend. Law-enforcement officials were still finalizing details to be released in the case when the child was recovered and the Alert was canceled. Iowa Lottery officials, who were waiting to receive the details when the Alert was canceled, decided at that point not to cause confusion by issuing information to players and retailers.

Iowa's Amber Alert system is activated when the State Patrol reports that a child has been abducted and is in danger of being harmed. The Iowa Lottery was part of the team that developed Iowa's Amber Alert system and team leaders met after the Aug. 5 Alert to review the process. While team members agreed that the system overall worked smoothly, some adjustments will help in the distribution of information.

When an Amber Alert is issued, the lottery plans to provide information to the public about the emergency notification through three main sources:

On This Date in Iowa Lottery History . . .
August 1991: The first of approximately 1,200 pull-tab vending machines were placed in retail locations throughout the state. Hundreds of vending machines were placed in grocery and convenience stores, most equipped to handle six games.

## Get Proper Credit For Powerball, Hot Lotto Mistakes

Everybody makes mistakes. Even if your mistake happens to be a Powerball or Hot Lotto play made in error, it doesn't have to be the end of the world!

Let's review the steps you must take to handle a "mistake" Powerball or Hot Lotto ticket.

## If the ticket did not print or the ticket is misprinted or mutilated so it can't be validated:

-The defective play must be confirmed by immediately producing a REPRINT ticket.
-Call the SGI hotline at 800-$858-4744$. They will provide you with a Control Number. They'll also help you get the information needed to report the problem to the lottery and, if necessary, help you produce the REPRINT ticket.
-Any or all parts of the defective ticket, along with the REPRINT ticket and Control Number, must be returned to the lottery in the retailer settlement envelope.
-When the lottery receives the defective ticket and the REPRINT ticket, we'll examine it and then issue credit to the retailer for the cost of the ticket. You can't receive credit if you don't follow the first three steps!


If the ticket is printed correctly by the terminal, but the clerk or the player makes an error:
-Call the SGI hotline to report the problem and correct ticket information. A Control Number will be provided.
-Remember, the ticket is still valid and can be sold. If you can't sell the ticket, validate it for any prizes won on the ticket after all draws have passed. Then send the ticket and the control number to the lottery in the retailer settlement envelope. The lottery will credit you for the cost of the ticket less any winnings.

## The most common reasons for denying credit:

1) The retailer did not call SGI.
2) No ticket or play was sent to the lottery.

In short, if you don't follow the steps outlined above, you are out of luck!

Think about this: why not sell the ticket? Unless the problem ticket is a mutilated ticket, why not try to sell it to one of your other customers? Especially during busy, high-jackpot times, your customers may be more willing to take that ticket than stand in line.

. A message about the Amber Alert will be printed on lotto tickets sold in Iowa.

- The customer display units at lottery retailers will be reprogrammed during an Alert to show information about the case.

The lottery will use its statewide system of sales and validation terminals to send messages about the Amber Alert case to the 2,200 retailers that sell lotto and instant-scratch tickets in Iowa.

The Amber Alert was created in Texas in 1996 after 9-year-old Amber Hagerman was kidnapped while riding her bicycle in Arlington, a suburb of Dallas, and later murdered.
