

# **Cedar Rapids Civil Rights Commission**

#### The Cedar Rapids Civil Rights Commission will host two free public events on January 17 and 18 in honor of Martin Luther King Jr. Day at the downtown location of the Cedar Rapids Public Library.

The first event is a free showing of the documentary "I Am Not Your Negro" that will take place on Thursday, January 17 from 5:30 – 7:30 PM in the Whipple Auditorium of the Library. The documentary is based on James Baldwin's unfinished manuscript, Remember This House, and explores racism in America through Baldwin's observations of American history, as well as through stories of Martin Luther King Jr., Malcolm X and Medgar Evers. The film won the BAFTA Award for Best Documentary and was nominated for Best Documentary Feature at the 89th Academy Awards. This event is in partnership with the Cedar Rapids Public Library and the African American Museum of Iowa.

The second event is a Public Sector Job Fair that will take place on Friday, January 18 from 2:00 - 4:00 PM in the lobby of the library. In an effort to increase diversity in public sector jobs, representatives from various government agencies will be available to discuss current job openings and requirements for potential job offerings.


Join us to learn about current employment opportunities and employment criteria to better prepare for jobs in the public sector.
