## WHAT IS SIYAC?

The State of Iowa Youth Advisory Council (SIYAC) became a formal council in 2009 with the passage of Iowa Code 286A.140.8.

As a non-partisan advocacy council, SIYAC consists of 24 youth members, ages 14-20 from all around the State of Iowa who serve two-year terms.

## WHAT DO THEY DO?

SIYAC members advocate for issues affecting Iowa youth.

They create position statements that are debated and voted on by the council. Members then advocate for these issues by working with peers, legislators, local and state agencies, and other policy makers.

Members also have the freedom to pursue other projects that improve the lives of Iowa's youth. Members are tasked with serving an individual and a group service project.

For service, members have partnered with Feed Iowa First on their organic farms, Colfax Parks and Recreation to plant trees, and created various food, clothing, school and art supply drives for those in need.



## YOUTH VOICES IN ACTION

- In 2018, SIYAC advocated for a bill that was signed into Iowa law that requires school employees to receive training for suicide prevention, identification of adverse childhood experiences, and methods to lessen toxic stress response.
- Currently, SIYAC has four priority areas of interest:
  - Health
  - Human Rights
  - Education
  - Appropriations
- Under these committees, members have researched and advocated to improve environmental conditions, LGBTQ+ issues, sales tax for education, voter registration, and many more.

### What is the Iowa Youth Congress (IYC)?

IYC is one of Department of Human Rights' youth programs. It is a year long term that provides youth of all backgrounds a unique opportunity for educational experiences in the subject areas of state government, democracy, advocacy, and civic engagement with the hope to enact future legislation in relation to youth issues. IYC was created due to the absence of minority representatives in the Iowa legislature. IYC provides civic education and actual experience to minority youth, empowering them to step into leadership roles. IYC members are high school aged.

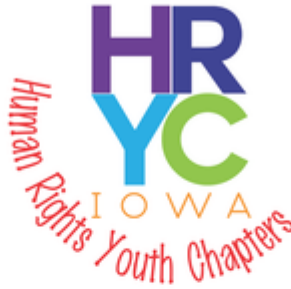

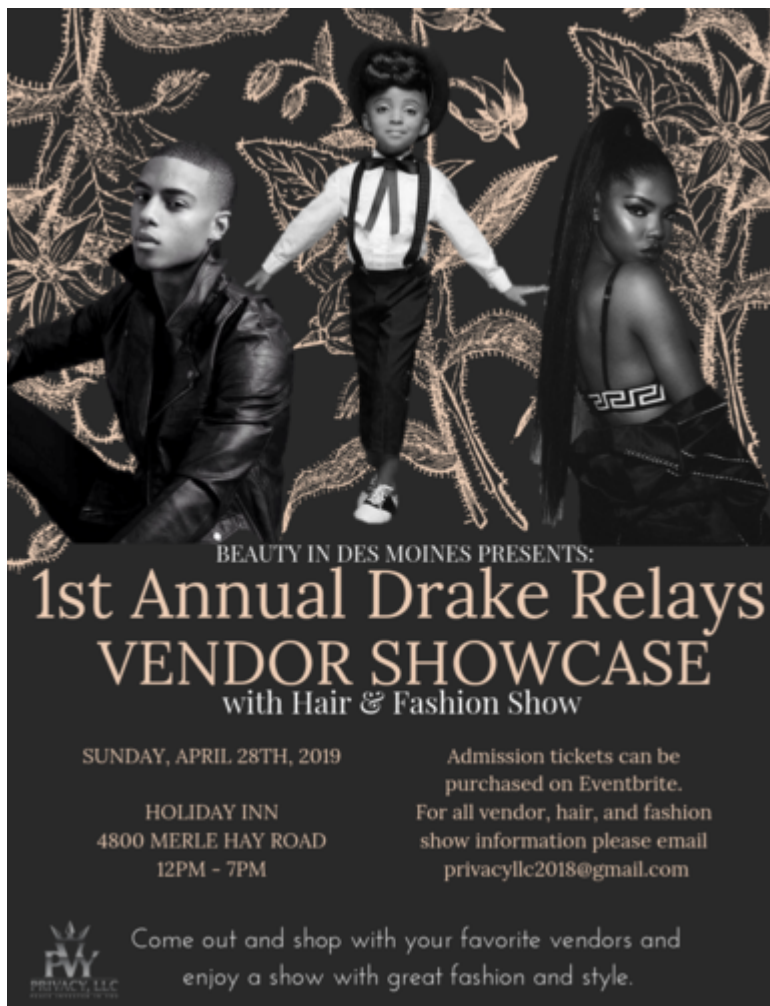
