Social Justice in Education Conference

Eliminating Barriers to Success - Moving Beyond Complacency August 8-9, 2019 Iowa Events Center Des Moines, Iowa

The Iowa Department of Education will be soliciting innovative proposals that embrace a social justice conference theme of addressing educational barriers impacting underrepresented and marginalized students in Iowa schools. This conference is being held to provide personal and professional development opportunities on social justice and equity issues in education. The goal of the conference is to create a forum for an exchange of promising practices and research-based strategies to ensure access to equitable environments, multi-cultural instruction, rigorous and unbiased curriculum, and safety nets including community services and accelerated interventions.

A pre-conference will be held on August 8 specifically for Equity Coordinator & Administrator Training, facilitated by the Office for Civil Rights staff. Registration and a request for proposals will be open the week of June 10th and we will invite all practitioners (secondary and postsecondary teachers, counselors, and administrators), community and social service organizations, and industry representatives to submit a 50minute session proposal. Faculty/staff and student co-presenting is strongly encouraged. Submissions will be reviewed by the planning committee and notifications sent in mid-July. There is no registration fee for the conference.

In preparing a session proposal, presenters should consider the following question: "What approaches should social justice educators take to support student success for Iowa students?" The committee will consider proposals in all areas of social justice that relate to (but are not limited to) the following topics:



We see a future in which all people and communities in Polk County have access to the investment capital and financial services they need to prosper.

The Executive Director of One Economy reports to the Board of Directors and is responsible for the overall leadership and fiscal viability of the organization. Additionally, the Executive Director is responsible for planning, design, implementation and effectiveness of all One Economy programs and services.

Major Functions/ Accountabilities:

- Serve as leader in all activities necessary to achieve One Economy's Mission and Vision statements.
- Ensure staff and Board of Directors have sufficient and up-to-date information.
- Lead in the design and implementation of One Economy's services and programs.
- Temporary: responsible for the day-to-day operations of the small business lending program, from development of loan leads and applications to loan packaging, credit evaluation, underwriting, closing, and servicing.
