Thinking that a statement of the receipts and disbursements of C. B. Richards, as Commissary General, would give satisfactory information, (though not specifically called for by the Resolution,) a statement of his account is appended with copies of vouchers for monies disbursed by him as such, on account of the last expedition.

Chapter ten of the acts of last Session, does not expressly provide for the employment of such an agent as Col. Richards, yet it was absolutely necessary that some one should perform the duties which he did perform, and under sections 8 and 13 of said act, I felt myself authorized to employ and pay him for said services. In the within account there is a charge of \$300 for last year's services, which I do not now allow to be paid out of the State Treasury, but did allow it as a correct charge to be paid by the General Government. Mr. Richards, as I understood at the time, agreed to look to the General Government, where the claim is now pending with the claim of the State, for expense incurred in the protection of the frontier, that year.

Under date of August 17th, 1858, the above sum of \$697 40 was credited to Miscellaneous Disbursements, and charged to Janitor's wages, and is included in the sum reported as expended in payment of Janitor's wages. For items marked "[bill,]" the bills are found on file, for those not marked, the bills have not been found. We have designated the purpose for which payments were made in such cases, as best we could, from the books and the law under which the accounts were audited, and think that our notes are correct, so far as they go.
