Gov. Reynolds and DCA Announce New Iowa Arts & Culture Marketing Grant

Gov. Kim Reynolds and the Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs have announced a new **Iowa Arts & Culture Marketing Grant opportunity**, focused on the safe re-opening and remarketing of arts and culture experiences for Iowans. Funding for the program has been established with **\$1 million of Coronavirus Relief Funds from the CARES Act**, directed to the department by Gov. Reynolds.

The new funding opportunity is designed to help arts and cultural organizations publicize activities and steps taken to ensure a safe experience and may include many types of marketing expenses tied to re-opening. **Awards will range from \$1,500 to \$20,000** and can be transformative for communities and arts and culture organizations looking to increase their visibility, welcome back visitors, and attract new audiences through creative marketing and advertising strategies.

Hurry – the deadline to apply is Oct. 11.

Iowa Tourism Grants

Iowa Tourism Grants promote tourism in Iowa by funding tourism-related marketing initiatives, meetings and events that benefit both local economies and the state's economy. For the fiscal year 2022 grant cycle, **\$300,000 is available**, and awards will range from \$2,500 to \$10,000 with a required 25 percent cash match. **Deadline: Sept. 29.**



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Arts Midwest GIG Fund

Arts Midwest has relaunched its [Grow, Invest, Gather \(GIG\) Fund grants](#) to help organizations grow their capacity and host touring artists.

During [Round Two](#), organizations must present performing or visual artists for at least two public events, which can be virtual or in person between January and June 2022.
