### **The Latest Health Promotion is Newsworthy**

<u>Patients with cancer at significantly increased risk for COVID-19, worse outcomes</u> - Patients with cancer were found to be at significantly increased risk for COVID-19 infection and worse outcomes, according to findings from a case-control study published in *JAMA Oncology*.

<u>Surgeon general: Hypertension control must be national public health priority</u> – Nearly half of U.S. adults have hypertension, yet only 1 in 4 people have it under control, U.S. Surgeon General Jerome Adams said during the release of a call to action by HHS.

<u>CDC expands U.S. Diabetes Surveillance System with new Social Determinants of Health module</u> – The CDC has expanded the U.S. Diabetes Surveillance System with a new social determinants of health module to help identify under-resourced areas of the United States and assess the potential impact of health disparities on diabetes burden and risk factors.

<u>Potential new drug therapy for stroke</u> – New research reports that a combination of a new drug and selected DHA derivatives is more effective in protecting brain cells and increasing recovery after stroke than a single drug.

<u>Blood test for Alzheimer's disease predicts future cognitive decline in healthy people</u> - "Our findings indicate that measuring a tau fragment in plasma can help predict which elderly people are likely to decline and how quickly they are likely to decline," said corresponding author Dennis Selkoe, MD, codirector of the Ann Romney Center for Neurologic Diseases.

#### CDC Announces the Launch of PLACES (Population Level Analysis and Community Estimates)

**PLACES** is the first-of-its-kind effort to release information uniformly across the United States at four geographic levels that can provide estimates for smaller cities and rural areas. **PLACES** provides small area estimates for 27 health measures generated in the 500 Cities Project but expands these model-based estimates to all levels of geography including all U.S. counties, incorporated and census-designated places, census tracts, and ZIP Code Tabulation Areas (ZCTAs). **PLACES** also includes a new public, interactive website which enables users to view, explore, and download county, place, tract, and ZCTA level estimates for all populated areas (with population > 50) in the U.S.
