Have you seen one of the new "**Iowa's People & Places**" pop-up displays? They're now in all 99 counties as Iowa prepares to mark its **175th statehood anniversary** on Dec. 28.

Like the larger, artifact-filled **exhibit** at the State Historical Museum of Iowa and a related exhibit in the **mobile museum**, the smaller **pop-up displays trace 13,000 years of Iowa history**, including the first Native peoples who called this land home, the Iowa soldiers who fought in the Civil War, and the 20th century Iowa farmers who revolutionized food production in an increasingly interconnected world.

Donna Reed to Join the Iowa Women's Hall of Fame

Another honor comes to Donna Reed this weekend: She'll be posthumously inducted into the [**Iowa Women's Hall of Fame**](#) during a ceremony at 10 a.m. Saturday livestreamed on the Iowa Department of Human Rights' Facebook page.

Reed (1921-1986) was born in Denison and is best known for role in "**It's a Wonderful Life**" (1946) and her Oscar-winning performance in "**From Here to Eternity**" (1953). She also wrote, directed, produced and starred in "**The Donna Reed Show**" (1958-1966) at a time when Hollywood reserved most of those jobs for men.



The State Historical Society of Iowa and Produce Iowa, the state office of film and media production, have lined up an array of programs throughout 2021 to celebrate the [**100th anniversary of Reed's birth**](#). 
The Annals of Iowa has been around since 1863, but no previous edition resembles this one, which commemorates Iowa's 175th anniversary of statehood.


