I.

ORGANIZATION AND LEGAL STATUS.

The State Historical Society of Iowa was established pursuant to an act of the Sixth General Assembly entitled "An Act to provide for an annual appropriation for the benefit of a State Historical Society" and approved January 28, 1857. On February 7, 1857, organization of the Society was fully effected by the adoption of a constitution. In 1872 the Society was brought into closer relations with the State by "An Act to Reorganize the State Historical Society" which was passed by the Fourteenth General Assembly and approved on April 23. The Society was incorporated in 1867 and again in 1892.

PRESENT STATUS.

The present organization, authority, and legal status of The State Historical Society of Iowa are based upon the provisions of the Code of 1897 (Title XIII, Chapter 18, Sections 2882-2888, page 975) which read as follows:

SECTION 2882. There is annually appropriated for the support of the state historical society at Iowa City, in connection with and under the auspices of the university, . . . to be expended by that society in collecting, embodying, arranging, and preserving in authentic form, a library of books, pamphlets, maps, charts, manuscripts, papers, paintings, statuary, and other materials illustrative of the state and its history, to save from oblivion the memory of its early pioneers, to obtain and preserve narratives of their exploits, perils and hardy adventures, to secure facts and statements relative to the history, genius and progress or decay of our Indian tribes, to exhibit faithfully the antiquities and past and present resources of the state, and to aid in the publication of such of the collections of the society as it from time to time regards of value and interest, to aid in binding its books, pamphlets, manuscripts and papers, and in paying other necessary and incidental expenses of the society. [18 G. A., ch. 71; C. '73, § 1900; R., § 1959.]

SEC. 2883. The board of curators of the society shall consist of eighteen persons, nine of whom shall be appointed by the governor, and nine elected by members of the society. Their term of office shall be two years, and they shall receive no compensation. The governor shall make his appointments on or before the last Wednesday in June in each even-numbered year, and the terms of the persons appointed shall commence

on that day; and, at the annual meeting of the society in each odd-numbered year, the others shall be elected by ballot from the members of the society, for the term next ensuing, which annual meeting shall be held at Iowa City on the Monday preceding the last Wednesday in June. [C. '73, §§ 1901, 1903.]

SEC. 2884. Members may be admitted to the society at any time under such rules as may be adopted by the board of curators. [C. '73, § 1902.]

Sec. 2885. The board shall appoint annually, or oftener if need be, a corresponding secretary, recording secretary, treasurer and librarian from the members of the society outside of their own number, who shall hold office for one year, unless sooner removed by a majority vote of the board. Said officers shall hold the same position in the society as upon the board of curators, and their respective duties shall be determined by said board. No officer of the society or board shall receive any compensation from the state appropriation thereto. [C. '73, § 1904.]

SEC. 2886. It shall also appoint from its members a president, who shall be the executive head of the board, and hold office for one year and until his successor is elected. [C. '73, § 1905.]

SEC. 2887. The curators, a majority of whom shall reside in the vicinity of the university, and five of whom shall constitute a quorum, shall be the executive board of the society, and have full power to manage its affairs. It shall keep a full and complete account of all of its doings, and of the receipt and expenditure of all funds collected or granted for the purposes of the society, and shall annually report the same to the governor on or before the fifteenth day of August. [22 G. A., ch. 82, § 34; C. '73, § 1906.]

SEC. 2888. Twenty copies of the reports of the supreme court and all other books and documents published by the state or upon its order shall be delivered to the society for the purpose of affecting exchanges with similar societies in other states and countries, and for preservation in its library, or other purposes of the society. [C. '73, § 1907.]

II.

SUPPORT.

In 1857 the sum of \$250 was voted by the General Assembly as a permanent annual allowance for the use of the Society. This permanent annual support was increased to \$500 in 1860; to \$1,000 in 1880; to \$2,500 in 1902; to \$7,500 in 1904; to \$12,000 in 1907; and to \$16,000 in 1911. In addition to the permanent annual support the following special appropriations have been voted by the General Assembly: \$6,000 in 1868; \$1,000 in 1892; \$2,000 in 1900; \$9,500 in 1902; and \$750 in 1906.

PRESENT SUPPORT.

The present support of The State Historical Society of Iowa is provided for by the following acts of the General Assembly:
AN ACT making appropriations to the state historical society of Iowa.
Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. That there be and is hereby appropriated to the state historical society of Iowa, out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of seven thousand and five hundred dollars (\$7,500), annually hereafter as permanent support: For the continued publication of The Iowa Journal of History and Politics; for the continuation of the compilation and publication of the messages and proclamations of the governors of Iowa; for the collection, compilation and publication of documentary materials relating to the history of Iowa, including such of the archives of the state and territory of Iowa as are of historical importance; for the publication of historical monographs, biographies, essays, lectures, bibliographies and indexes; for the proper maintenance of the library of the society, the collection and purchase of publications bearing upon Iowa and American history, and the proper classifying, cataloguing and indexing of such material; for the carrying out of a systematic and scientific anthropological survey of the state; for conducting public lectures of an historical character; and for meeting the incidental and other necessary expenses incurred in connection with the prosecution of the work of the said state historical society of Iowa, as indicated in this act and title XIII, chapter 18, section 2882 of the code.

SEC. 2. That the permanent annual appropriation herein provided for shall take the place and be in lieu of all other permanent annual appropriations heretofore made to the state historical society of Iowa, and the same shall be paid in quarterly installments on the order of the board of curators of the said state historical society of Iowa, the first installment to be paid July 1, 1904.

SEC. 3. This act, being deemed of immediate importance, shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Daily Register and Leader and the Des Moines Daily Capital, newspapers published in Des Moines, Iowa.

Approved April 9, A. D. 1904.

AN ACT making appropriations to the state historical society of Iowa.
Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. That there be and is hereby appropriated to the state historical society of Iowa, out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of four thousand five hundred dollars (\$4,500), annually hereafter as additional permanent support.

SEC. 2. That the said sum shall be paid in quarterly installments on the order of the board of curators of the said state historical society of Iowa, the first installment to be July 4, 1907,

Approved April 1, A. D. 1907.

STATE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

AN ACT making appropriation to the state historical society of Iowa.
Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. That there is hereby appropriated to the state historical society of Iowa, out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of four thousand dollars (\$4,000) annually hereafter as additional permanent support for historical research and publication.

SEC. 2. That the said sum shall be paid in quarterly installments on the order of the board of curators of the said state historical society of Iowa, the first installment to be paid July, 1911.

Approved April 14, A. D. 1911.

VI.

AUXILIARY MEMBERS.

Local historical societies (such as county historical societies, city or town historical societies, and old settlers' associations) may be enrolled as auxiliary members of The State Historical Society of Iowa upon application of such local historical societies and upon the approval of their application by the Board of Curators of The State Historical Society of Iowa.

Patriotic organizations within the State of Iowa (such as the Iowa Society of the Sons of the American Revolution, the Iowa Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution, the Iowa Society of Colonial Wars, and the Iowa Society of Colonial Dames) may be enrolled as auxiliary members of The State Historical Society of Iowa upon application of such organizations and upon the approval of their application by the Board of Curators of The State Historical Society of Iowa.

Auxiliary societies or organizations shall be entitled to member-

ship in The State Historical Society of Iowa and shall have one vote each at the annual meeting of this Society. Each auxiliary society or organization shall be entitled to receive all the publications of The State Historical Society issued during the period of its affiliation as an auxiliary member.

Auxiliary societies or organizations shall not be required to pay any fees or dues to The State Historical Society of Iowa.

IX.

HISTORICAL RESEARCH.

Responding to the progress that has been made in recent years in the application of scientific methods in nearly every sphere of human interest and activity and dominated by the spirit and standards of modern scholarship, The State Historical Society of Iowa has come to make historical research its chief function. In-

deed, in this respect The State Historical Society of Iowa is unique—its financial resources being directed largely in the channels of scientific research and critical publication.

It is a fact that in most States the principal function of the State Historical Society seems to be that of collection and exhibition, leaving historical research for the most part to individual initiative. But with The State Historical Society of Iowa historical research and publication have become the dominant activity. Through its organization and institutional activities the materials of State and local history are discovered, critically studied by specialists, compiled, edited, and published. Thus, instead of attempting to make the largest possible collection of historical materials in one place, the Society endeavors to compile, publish, and distribute the greatest amount of accurate, scientific historical literature. Instead of hoarding books and manuscripts for the use of the few, the Society makes the history of the State accessible to the many.

The work of historical research and investigation is done largely by specialists under the direction of the Superintendent. Neither partisan bias nor personal prejudice is allowed to enter into the work of those who are engaged in research for the Society.

It is, moreover, the aim of the Society to make every investigation exhaustive, to discover and utilize all sources of information. When necessary, investigators are sent to libraries and collections in other States for data. The public archives at Des Moines, Iowa, and at Washington, D. C., are exploited. Through the co-operation of libraries it is possible to secure the loan of books and manuscripts, thus reducing in many cases the expense of the research. Especially does the Society benefit in its research work by the hearty co-operation of the State educational institutions, the Library of Congress, the Department of Historical Research of the Carnegie Institution of Washington, the State Historical Society of Wisconsin at Madison, the Public Archives Department and the Historical Department at Des Moines.

X.

APPLIED HISTORY.

Inspired by the larger view of history, which includes the social and economic life of man as well as his political activities, The State Historical Society of Iowa has already laid the foundations of Applied History in the researches which have been made for the "Iowa Economic History Series". Underlying these researches is the idea that history may be exploited in the cause of social betterment. Indeed, the opportunities for utilizing and making practical application of the results of historical research are perhaps nowhere more promising than in the field of social and economic legislation. To put the facts of history to the utmost practical use is the highest aim of historical research. Moreover, it is believed that the function of a State historical society is not simply to discover, collect, sift, and publish accurate historical information, but also to suggest the proper application of such scientific knowledge in efforts to solve justly the complex problems of social life. Accordingly, The State Historical Society of Iowa proposes to follow up its researches in political, economic, and social history by the publication from time to time of essays in Applied History. It is hoped that the first volume of such essays will be ready for publication before January, 1913.

THE LIBRARY.

Since its establishment in 1857, the State Historical Society of Iowa has maintained a library of books, pamphlets, and manuscripts for the use of those interested in the study of Iowa and American history as well as for the benefit of those who either upon their own initiative or under the direction of the Society are engaged in scientific historical research. It was not, however, until the removal of the Library to the Hall of Liberal Arts in 1901 that the entire collection was completely classified, accessioned, and shelf-listed according to modern library methods. An inventory of the Library taken in July, 1912, records the following statistics:

Besides the large collection of miscellaneous titles bearing upon the general and local history of Iowa, the Mississippi Valley and the United States, the Library contains the various official and scientific publications of the United States Government, publications issued under the authority of the State of Iowa, the laws of the Territories and States of the Mississippi Valley, and the publications of the various historical, scientific, and learned institutions of the whole country. In recent years an effort has been made to collect the writings of Iowa authors.

During the period from July 1, 1910, to July 1, 1912, the Society acquired for its Library approximately 4,000 titles, comparatively few of which were purchased. Indeed, the principal sources of acquisition for the Library are through exchange, solicitation, and voluntary donation. Of the more recent gifts, the Governor Kirkwood Library, presented by Mrs. Samuel J. Kirkwood, is perhaps the largest, and in some respects the most valuable.

The manuscript collections which have been acquired by the Society are securely kept under lock and key in steel safes.

XIII.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

In their twenty-eighth biennial report, the Board of Curators recommended the addition of \$6,000 to the permanent annual support of The State Historical Society of Iowa. Following this recommendation, the Thirty-Fourth General Assembly passed a bill appropriating \$4,000 as additional annual support.

Owing to the rapid growth of the Society in the past two years, the need of additional support has become more pressing than ever before. An appropriation of at least \$4,000 a year should be made to carry on the research and publication work which the Society has undertaken—especially in the field of Applied History. An addition of \$1,000 annually is needed for service in the library; and at least \$1,000 additional is required for general maintenance. Accordingly, the Board of Curators now recommends an additional appropriation of \$6,000 annually for the support of the Society.
