To Hon. B. F. Carroll, Governor of the State of Iowa:

Sir:—Complying with the law, as provided in Sections 150 and 151 Chapter 8 of the Code of Iowa, as amended by Chapter 6, laws of the Thirty-third General Assembly, I have the honor to herewith submit the Biennial Report of this office, containing statements of business transacted from July 1, 1910, to July 1, 1912.

The total expense incurred for the twenty-four months between said dates for all purposes coming properly under the jurisdiction of the Custodian has been \$72,769.98, the details of which are more definitely given in the different statements in the body of this report.

There are a number of improvements that, in my judgment, are needed immediately, or in the near future, to make the service more effective and safer. The next General Assembly should be asked to provide more and better offices for the accommodation of the different boards that are now temporarily located in the legislative committee rooms. They are asking for more than we have, but must soon move out from what they now have.

The old building occupied by the Food and Dairy and Veterinary departments is not at all adequate to the demands made upon it, and must have a new furnace or some other method of heating installed very soon.

The Historical Building is very deficient in toilet facilities for the use of visitors, and I recommend the placing of two toilet rooms, one for each sex, in the basement of said building, plans for which I have on file in my office, and which will cost, with up-to-date fixtures, about \$1,600.00.

The conduit, or tubing, connecting the power house with the Historical Building is also wholly insufficient for the present demands upon it, which are more than double the original. It is

a small structure made of brick, underground, too small for a large man to crawl through it with the necessary pipes in it. I wender that such a thing was ever placed there. Men can only with great difficulty do any work in it, and it is dangerous, so much so that when anything goes wrong in it the power, steam and electrical, has to be cut off, and allowed to cool down so that men can go in. That, in winter, especially, is impracticable, as the whole building depends on the heating and steam pipes and electrical cables passing through this conduit. The necessity will be apparent to anyone who examines it, and I recommend that this conduit be enlarged to a subway not less than six feet wide and seven feet high, so that all the fixtures are accessible at all times for safety and economy of operation. This conduit now carries the steam-heating pipes, water pipes, vacuum and compressed air pipes, and all the electric cables for the use of the Historical Building.

An ash conveyor is needed in the boiler room of the power house. The ashes are now taken out by wheelbarrows, everyone being hoisted by an elevator to the surface. This is done in a very primitive manner, by hand, and should be done by machinery, for which we have ample power, easily attached. It is a great exposure of health for the men to be obliged to go so often in the winter months out into the cold frosty air from the heated boiler room, and I recommend that an ash conveyor on the endless chain principle or its equivalent, be placed there.

The north and west steps of the Capitol Building have been replaced this year, ty Vermont granite, and it is a good piece of work. An idea seems to have been that some of the old steps could be used for repairs to the south side, but our experience, on removing them, shows them to be utterly unfit for repairs, only fit for breaking into concrete work, or hauling to the dump pile, and I recommend that new Vermont granite steps, similar to the other three sides, be placed on the south side of the Capitol Building.

The cement walks and driveways on the Capitol grounds are in bad condition, and provision should be made for repairing them.

A new elevator was placed in the Historical Building this year, by order of the legislature, but no provision was made for a man to attend to it, and I ask that such provision be made, and that I have four janitors in the Historical Building instead of three, as I now have. I am now paying the elevator tender and extra janitor, but cannot continue it on my present allowances.

And I further recommend that a large vacuum cleaner be installed in the engine room for the purpose of better cleaning of Capitol and Historical Building and that the present hydraulic power for elevators in the Capitol Building be changed to electrical power, and that we need an additional general mechanic. The reasons for these will be apparent upon investigation.
