The Latest Health Promotion is Newsworthy

<u>Prediabetes linked to increased risk for mortality, CVD</u> - A meta-analysis of 129 studies involving 10,069,955 individuals found that among those with atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease, and even among the general populations, prediabetes was tied to a higher risk for cardiovascular disease and all-cause mortality. The study was published in *The British Medical Journal*.

<u>Analysis details preventive factors in Alzheimer's</u> - Ten risk factors appeared to have a significant effect on developing Alzheimer's disease, many of which could be targeted with preventive steps, a meta-analysis suggested.

<u>Self-measured blood pressure monitoring gains support</u> – The American Heart Association and American Medical Association published a joint policy statement supporting SMBP by patients as an effective way to detect and manage hypertension.

<u>A new way to target cancers using 'synthetic lethality'</u> - Researchers report that inhibiting a key enzyme caused human cancer cells associated with two major types of breast and ovarian cancer to die and in mouse studies reduced tumor growth.

<u>Obesity and metabolic syndrome are risk factors for severe influenza, COVID-19</u> – A recent review links metabolic syndrome to cases of more severe disease from viral infections.
