Electronic Transfer of Beer Between Brewpubs and Beer Wholesalers

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this bulletin is to provide guidance to Iowa brewpubs and beer wholesalers on how to electronically transfer beer inventory between the brewpub and beer wholesaler for off-premises retail sales purposes.

BACKGROUND

In an effort to mitigate the spread of the COVID-19 virus, many businesses have been ordered to temporarily close. Businesses that have been allowed to remain open have adjusted their operations to limit face-to-face interactions.

To accommodate these operational changes, lowa brewpubs and beer wholesalers have sought guidance from ABD as to how beer manufactured by brewpubs can still pass through the three-tier system in accordance with lowa Code chapter 123 while meeting public health-directed social distancing guidelines.

DISCUSSION

When a brewpub intends to sell beer it has manufactured in original, unopened containers for offpremises consumption from the brewpub's licensed premises, the beer must first be sold to a beer wholesaler and purchased back by the brewpub. Generally, this process involves a beer wholesaler physically picking up the beer inventory from the brewpub, storing the inventory in the beer wholesaler's warehouse overnight, and returning the beer to the brewpub's licensed premises the following day. The beer wholesaler collects the amount of beer barrel tax due during the transaction and remits the tax to ABD.

ABD has determined that current law allows a beer wholesaler to accept an electronic transfer of beer inventory from a brewpub and then invoice a sale back to the brewpub. This guidance is provided in relation to the Proclamation of Disaster Emergency issued on March 17, 2020 by Governor Kimberly K. Reynolds and her order directing all state agencies to coordinate expeditiously to review current statute and identify opportunities to mitigate the economic effects of the closings necessitated by the COVID-19 disaster.

Beer wholesalers are under no obligation to participate in the electronic transfer of inventory. Brewpubs and their beer wholesaler will need to both agree to engage in electronic transfer transactions.

Best Practices

ABD recommends the following best practices for electronic transfer of beer inventory in order to ensure compliance with the requirements of lowa Code chapter 123. Example documentation of these best practices is attached to this bulletin.

- An electronic bill of lading showing each brand of beer and quantity to be electronically transferred from the brewpub to the beer wholesaler.
- A receiving report from the beer wholesaler acknowledging electronic receipt of the beer inventory.
- A sales invoice generated by the beer wholesaler showing each brand of beer and quantity being sold back to the brewpub.
- An electronic bill of lading showing each brand of beer and quantity being electronically transferred back to the brewpub by the beer wholesaler.

Transfer and invoicing documentation should include, at a minimum, the following information:

- Identification of the parties involved in the transaction.
- Correct address information for the parties.
- Description of the inventory transferred and sold.
- Signature (handwritten or electronic) acknowledging the transfer.

VIOLATIONS

A license or permit holder found to be in violation of any of the provisions of Iowa Code chapter 123 may be subject to administrative sanctions, including, but not limited to, civil penalty, license/permit suspension, or license/permit revocation.
