LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

Des Moines, Iowa, December, 1912.

TO THE HONORABLE B. F. CARROLL,

Governor of the State of Iowa.

SIR: In compliance with provisions of Chapter III of the Acts of the Thirty-third General Assembly, we beg leave to hand you herewith the second biennial report of the Board of Parole and the abstract of criminal statistics as reported to us by the clerks of the District Court under the provisions of Section 293 of the Code and the amendment thereto made by the Thirty-third General Assembly, Chapter III, Section II.

The first report of the work of this board, transmitted to you under date of December 1, 1910, included the time from its organization July 1, 1907, to June 30, 1910; and this report begins July 1, 1910, and ends with June 30, 1912.

We have not changed our method of handling the work from that we outlined in our former report, except as herein stated. We now take up the personal examination of the prisoner at the end of nine months from the date of his being received at the prison, or as near to that time as is practical, considering the number of our sessions each year. For illustration, at our July session we call before us all prisoners coming under our jurisdiction who were received at the prison from the first day of September to the 30th day of November of the preceding year, thus as near as may be keeping the examinations three months ahead of the time of determining the case, which under our rule is after service of one year in prison for those sentenced for more than two years, or at the end of six months for those sentenced for two years or less. This enables the members of the board to investigate after the interview with the prisoner, and before we act. We find this most helpful, for it frequently occurs that the interviews with the prisoner result in suggestions of lines of investigation from which we get much information as to the life of the prisoner, family history, his

opportunities and environments, his criminal record or want of it, and such like things which are useful in the final determination of what should be done with him. The board is then able to act more intelligently at the end of one year of the prison period, than could be done if we deferred the personal examination three months longer.

We have recently adopted the following rule governing prisoners on parole:

"No prisoner shall marry during the term of his parole, unless he shall first have the written consent of the Board of Parole; and to do so shall be a violation of his parole, for which the prisoner may be returned to the prison."

This we found from experience was a necessity for the good of the average prisoner on parole, and a protection to unsuspecting parties who might marry paroled prisoners. In many instances we found paroled prisoners getting married without revealing to the other party the fact that they were on parole; in other instances they would, without sufficient means to support the wife or husband, get married, and the result be financial trouble. In others, it would be most difficult to find a home and employment for two, when we could well take care of one. In other cases the conditions would be such that the right thing to do for the good of the paroled person, was to put him some place where the other could not go, and thus have to separate man and wife. There are cases in which marriage should be permitted, but many in which for the good of both parties it should not be. Hence the rule making marriage a violation of the parole unless with the consent of the board.

As is shown by the tables submitted herewith, we paroled in the two years included in this report, 340 persons, 337 from the prisons, and three before commitment. We recommended to the Governor to either pardon or parole or commute the sentence of 51 others; of these recommended to the Governor for clemency all have been released, so that the total number going out of the Penitentiary or Reformatory by the action of the board, or on its recommendation, was 388. Of the number paroled by the board 23.53 per cent had, on the 30th of June, 1912, proved derelict; this is 4.07 per cent more than the per cent of derelicts for the three year period ending June 30, 1910. However, the total number of paroles in that period was 221, while in the two year period included in this

report the total number paroled was 340. In the two years included in this report, 75 per cent of the paroles were out of the Reformatory, and 25 per cent out of the Penitentiary. Could we have released from the Penitentiary in proportion to its population, as we did from the Reformatory, we would have released 73 more, or a total from both prisons of 461. This we could not do, owing to the fact that men going into the Penitentiary are the older men, the old offender, and men serving their second or more terms in prison. The per cent paroled from the Reformatory would have been greater but for the fact that there are many sent there who are second time men, which fact is discovered after they are received. It is not unusual to find prisoners against whom there is no record of prior service, but who have criminal record, and many are sent to the prison as first offenders whose prior prison sentences we discover after they are received. Of the number paroled prior to July 1, 1910, all were discharged or otherwise disposed of, on or before June 30, 1912, except three, and these have since been discharged. So that the final result on the first 221 prisoners paroled is in 46 cases revocation and return to prison service, 26 absconded and not been apprehended; of this number some will yet be apprehended and returned to prison. The remainder of the 221 were finally recommended for discharge, making 67.43 per cent of the total number.

From June 1, 1909, to May 31, 1911, there were received at Anamosa 434 prisoners who were eligible for parole during the time from July 1, 1910, to June 30, 1912, and we paroled from the Reformatory during that time 255. In the same time, there were received at the Penitentiary 270, and in the same time we paroled 85, or the paroles from the Reformatory were 58.75 per cent of the total number received, and from the Penitentiary 31.48 per cent of the number received. Including the number recommended to you for clemency and finally released by you, there were released from the Reformatory 67.51 per cent of the total number received during the time above stated, and from the Penitentiary 36.29 per cent of the total number received. Combining the two prisons, there were 55.11 per cent of the total number received released on our action, or on our recommendation. The number above stated as received in the prison between the dates given, does not include those sentenced for life, or on sentence of death, or for safe keeping. To the number released as

above there must be added, for the purpose of determining the total number going out, those who were released on expiration of sentences, and the total thus found, deducted from the total number received, shows the difference between the number going in and going out in the two years. There has been an increase in the prison population, and this is due partially to the fact that the time of expiration of sentence of those sentenced for a maximum term of seven years or more since July 1, 1907, had not yet arrived; and the number sentenced for seven years or more exceeds those sentenced for less than seven years. Those sentenced for seven years or more and whom we have believed could not be relieved of any part of their sentences begin to go out on expiration of sentence soon, though the man serving a ten year sentence since July 1, 1907, could not be released before October, 1913, and then his sentence would have to have been made soon after the first of July, 1907, and he have the benefit of all good time possible. The expirations, however, are increasing now, and after October, 1913, will increase rapidly. The effect, however, of the parole law and the maximum sentence, has been to increase to some extent the prison population, and has resulted no doubt, in increasing the average term of service of prisoners, for the reason that the old time offender and the man more than once convicted of a felony, is kept longer than the average of prison sentence under the determinate system. What these differences are we cannot tell exactly, for the reason that we do not have statistics showing the average length of time of service under the determinate sentence.

We call special attention to the table showing results in cases of paroles from July 1, 1907, to June 30, 1912, or the entire time since the taking effect of the law providing the maximum in place of determinate, and the law creating the Reformatory and the present parole system. 27.09 per cent of the entire number paroled in that time have proven derelict, 35.82 per cent have been recommended for discharge, 34.75 per cent are still reporting, 2.34 per cent have died, or cases have been reversed by Supreme Court, etc. Included in the paroles granted in the first three years of the work of the board, were many men who had been sent to prison for definite terms, and even yet there are some such. The men paroled who were serving a maximum sentence are included in only four years of the time, for, except in rare instances, is any man paroled until he has served one year of his time.

We are satisfied from our experience that the indeterminate sentence, except in cases for murder of first degree and treason, would for the good of the prisoner and the good of the State, be better than the maximum sentence. It is true that under either it would be the duty of the Court to simply pass on the question of the guilt or innocence of the accused, and the duty of the Board of Parole to fix the time of service in the prison. However, to both Court and convict, the fixing of a certain number of years where that term is long, appears in many cases severe. It also occurs sometimes that defendants are able, by stating the time for which they must be sentenced if found guilty when that time is long, to so impress a jury with the severity of the sentence as to result in acquittal or conviction of some included offense and results in clemency where it should not be given. If it could be understood on the trial that the question to be determined was only the question of guilt, and that another tribunal is to fix the time of service in prison, the long time sentence could not be held before the jury with so much effect. At least the long time sentence could not be anticipated with any greater degree of certainty than under the law providing for definite time to be fixed by the judge. We recognize that there is no difference in fact as to the duty of the Court with either maximum or indeterminate sentence, yet when it can be said that the sentence must be 15, or 20, or 30 years, it sounds more severe and the effect is no doubt greater than when the prosecutor can reply to the attorney for defense; the trial judge has nothing to do with the length of the prison service, but a tribunal who have opportunity to, and whose duty is to investigate, shall determine that matter and determine the length of prison service according to the facts in each particular case.

The better reason, however, for the indeterminate sentence is found in the fact that many men sent to prison are found when time is given to investigate, to be old offenders with criminal record and criminal instincts, which leave no room for doubt that the good of society and their own good requires that they be kept from mingling with their fellows indefinitely. There would still be the possibility of release as age came on the prisoner, or if it seemed for other reasons, good results might be expected from release. The continued confinement of such men is not for punishment, but for the protection of society from its enemy and as well the prisoner from the suffering that sooner or later he is sure to

bring upon himself. Under modern prison methods and the care that is taken for the comfort and health of the prisoner, this confinement is not cruel or inhuman. In the prisons of our own State men are well cared for and well treated, and we are convinced if they suffer from the hardships of prison life, save only of course as they are deprived of their liberty and are subject to orders and rules they must obey, they bring these hardships upon themselves. The universal judgment of those giving time and study to the questions involved in the proposition of an indeterminate sentence, and of men who are active in the handling of men confined in prison, is favorable to the absolutely indeterminate sentence. So far as we are informed, no law-making body has enacted a statute providing for such sentence, but discussion in the American Prison Congress where prison men and criminologists and others intrusted with the administration of the criminal laws of the country, show that for several years the sentiment has been in favor of the indeterminate sentence. The State that shall first enact it into law will be the pioneer in the movement that we believe will soon be nation-wide, and result in great good to both people and prisoner.

The Statute providing for reporting Criminal Statistics by the Clerks of District Court, needs to be amended. Some of the items required to be reported the clerk cannot get with any degree of accuracy, and the expense included in these is so small that they amount to but little in the total of the criminal expenses of a county. Some of these statistics come from the office of the county auditor, and we submit that the law should require that the auditor report such to the clerk, that the clerk may have in his office the data from which to make his report to the board. The items of statistics to be reported should be revised, in order that such as will be useful in determining expenses of criminal prosecutions, particularly as to crimes and criminals, should be included, that the totals may be available to the General Assembly and the officers of the county and State, and useful as the years go by for comparison.

It is most important, for the good of the young men in the reformatory, that the institution be organized along reformatory lines. Such industries should be installed, or trade schools organized, as will give the prisoners work, and while working, afford them an opportunity to learn some trade or avocation that can

be followed when they go out. If several different kinds of work or training can be provided opportunity will be given for the warden to select and assign the prisoners as they are received, to lines in which they seem likely to prove most efficient, and in which they have most interest, and to which they are best adapted. Men working under such conditions are much more likely to be contented, ambitious to do something, and are much more likely to be aroused; and final good results are much more likely to occur. We most heartily endorse the recommendation you made to the Thirty-fourth General Assembly in your annual message to that body on this matter.

This board has, in the five years since its organization, investigated the cases of 1,235 prisoners sent to the Reformatory and Penitentiary under the maximum sentence. In the two years covered by this report, 704 different cases; and in the five years the board has examined and passed on the cases of 391 prisoners serving determinate sentences, and acted on all these cases; besides in that time there have been referred to it from your office the cases of 45 prisoners serving life sentences for murder, making in all 1,671 separate cases investigated. We have also given opportunity to prisoners to interview us when at the prisons, to the end that none may be forgotten or overlooked, and that when the prisoner has something which he wants to submit to us he shall have a chance to do it. Under this rule we have had from 40 to 75 prisoners appearing before us at each prison four times a year, in addition to those regularly on the docket to whom we listen. This, together with the time taken to investigate and determine, should indicate something to you of the time necessary to do the work of the board.

We submit therefore, for your consideration, the question of whether or not the law should provide that the members of the board should give their entire time to this work. If this were true the work could be better done, the prisoners could be released at other times than during the regular sessions of the board.
