International Human Rights Day December 10, 2021

Every year on December 10, the world celebrates [Human Rights Day](#), the day in 1948 when the United Nations General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. The 2021 theme for [Human Rights Day](#), set by the United Nations General Assembly, is: *EQUALITY - Reducing inequalities, advancing human rights*. This year's Human Rights Day theme relates to 'Equality' and Article 1 of the UDHR – "All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights."

At the Iowa Department of Human Rights, our mission leads our work every day - a mission that ensures that Iowa can be a place where all people are important members of our community, and everyone can contribute their unique talents to our state.

We are dedicated to sustaining the focus on inclusion, equity, and removal of barriers to opportunity. We reaffirm our commitment to fostering a resilient and just community by improving the criminal and juvenile justice system through data and research; ensuring homes are warm and safe during the winter season; increasing access to government services and community connectedness; and providing leadership opportunities for youth.

DHR to Participate in Iowa Summit on Justice and Disparities

The Iowa Summit on Justice and Disparities will be held on December 14, 2021. The Iowa Department of Human Rights/[Division of Criminal and Juvenile Justice Planning](#) staff will conduct a workshop on the school to prison pipeline and racial disparities in the juvenile justice system. Our staff will also be participating on a plenary panel that will discuss ways to improve the criminal and juvenile justice systems, which will include recommendations from the Justice Advisory Board and Juvenile Justice Advisory Council. In addition, the 2021 Creative Expressions artwork will be on display. Creative Expressions is an activity supported by the National Youth in Transition Database project for youth who have experience in the child welfare and juvenile justice systems.

Hamilton Relay Scholarship: \$500

Preface

The goal of the Hamilton Relay Scholarship is to support students who are deaf, hard of hearing, DeafBlind or have difficulty speaking in their post-secondary education. The Hamilton Relay Scholarship is extended to qualifying high school students living within each of the states where Hamilton Relay is the contracted Telecommunications Relay and/or Captioned Telephone service provider. Hamilton Relay selects one recipient from each state annually. Scholarship recipients will be determined on or before March 1, 2022.

Eligibility Criteria

1. Applicant must be a graduating high school senior who is deaf, hard of hearing, DeafBlind or has difficulty speaking.
2. Applicant must be a resident of one of the following states: CA, DC, GA, ID, IA, KY, LA, MA, MD, MI, MT, NM, PA, UT, VA or WA.
3. Applicant must complete and submit application, essay, letter of recommendation and signed talent release form to be eligible.
4. Scholarship will be awarded to the selected applicant in each state after the Hamilton Relay Scholarship Committee reviews all applications submitted on or before the posted deadline.

Guidelines for Hamilton Relay Scholarship

1. Application packet must be completed and postmarked by January 31, 2022 and must include all the following items:
 1. Scholarship Application
 2. Letter of Recommendation from faculty staff member at high school or from employer
 3. One page essay as required (topic assigned on application)
 4. Signed Talent Release Form

Scholarship award recipients must complete and return a "Scholarship Recipient Agreement Form" and provide a copy of their Letter of Acceptance from the post-secondary school they will attend, allowing Hamilton to process payment directly to the school.
