## LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

Des Moines, Iowa, December 1, 1910.

TO THE HONORABLE B. F. CARROLL,

Governor of the State of Iowa.

Sir: In compliance with provisions of Chapter Three (3) of the acts of the Thirty-third (33) General Assembly, we beg leave to submit to you the first report of the doings of this board, and the abstract of the criminal returns received from the clerks of the district court under the provisions of section two hundred ninety-three (293) of the code and the amendment thereto made by the Thirty-third (33) General Assembly, section two (2), chapter three (3).

Prior to the act of the Thirty-third (33) General Assembly, there was no provision for report to any one from the Board of Parole, therefore this is the first report to be made by us. We have thought it advisable to cover in this report, the time from the organization of the board under the law, July 1, 1907, to June 30, 1910, or three full years but hereafter reports will include a period of two years. We do this for the reason that we believe it valuable to have the entire work of the board reported, and that a report of even years will be most convenient and useful for comparison of statistics in the future.

Of course, for this state, the board entered a new field when it began to administer the indeterminate sentence and parole system. We have been greatly aided in our work by yourself and Governor A. B. Cummins (under whose administration the board was organized) and your immediate predecessor, Governor Warren Garst, and we acknowledge our obligations to all for the co-operation we have had from the executive office of the state. Under the provisions of our laws, the success of the administration of the law for the exercise of clemency to the inmates of the prisons will depend to a considerable extent on the co-operation of the executive department and the Board of Parole.

We investigated as best we could by correspondence and examination of reports the operation of the indeterminate and parole system in other states, and visited personally the office of the Board of Pardons for the state of Illinois, and were with that board to observe its work at the penitentiary of that state located at Joliet, and here desire to acknowledge our obligations to the members and officers of the several boards, and especially to Governor Deneen and the Board of Pardons of the state of Illinois.

We concluded that under the law we were only to consider the parole of prisoners serving determinate sentences, when application was made to us therefor, or when referred to us by the chief executive; but as to prisoners serving indeterminate sentences, it was our duty to examine their cases and take them up for the purpose of determining how long a time they should serve in the penitentiary or reformatory before being paroled, whether they made application to us or not. We therefore adopted the following rule:

"Convicts serving under indeterminate sentence shall be considered applicants for parole after serving a period of eleven months in the reformatory or penitentiary, but in cases where the maximum sentence is two years or less they shall be considered applicants after serving a period of six months. Convicts serving definite terms may apply for a parole at any time. Any convict may in person apply to the board when it is in session at the reformatory or penitentiary, to have his case considered before he has served the time fixed herein."

It will be observed that under this rule, a year would elapse after the first of July 1907, before any one serving an indeterminate sentence would come regularly for consideration, and hence while this report covers three year's work, it only includes cases of indeterminate sentence for twenty-three months.

Under the law limiting the time that the board may employ in its work, it was not found practical to hold more than four regular sessions in any one year, hence it is not possible to reach and consider all cases at the exact time they would be entitled to be heard under the above rule. Our custom has been to take at each session all those who were serving more than a two years maximum, and who had been received at the prison from ten to thirteen months prior to the first day of the session. This is the best application of the rule that can be made, unless the board could be in practically continuous session. If such were the law examinations

might then be made from time to time, so that all prisoners may have been examined by the time they have served eleven months. The board then could take up their cases when under the rule they were entitled to be considered, or sooner, if special reasons were found why it should be done, and same would not necessarily be delayed longer than the time fixed by the rule, and some would be considered earlier.

When the board comes to the consideration of the question of fixing the time when parole should be granted a prisoner, we either parole, continue to a future date, which date determines the time we think a man should serve (conditioned always on the effect that other information we might thereafter obtain would have on his case and on his behavior in the prison after the date of continuance), or we deny parole, which means that in our judgment as then informed, we think the prisoner should serve the maximum sentence. We provide however, that the prisoner may in all cases when the action has been adverse to parole, request his case to be re-examined, when he may present to us any new facts or reasons he may have why we should shorten his term, and if on investigation we think there is a possibility that we should change our order, we re-consider the case. With this procedure we seek to give every man a hearing, and not to lose sight of any, even after first consideration.

In the period covered by this report, prisoners serving indeterminate sentences received from the first day of July 1907, to the thirty-first day of May 1909, have been considered, the number being 531. In that time we have paroled of those 131, continued to a future date 262 (and the larger number of continuances will expire by July 1, 1912); we have denied 122, and have referred to the governor for his action 16. Of those denied 39 per cent are at the reformatory, and 71 per cent are at the penitentiary. The excess of the denied men is at the penitentiary for the reason that all over thirty years of age are sent there, as well as all who are serving a second term, or a higher number of terms. We frequently find men serving at the reformatory who have deceived the court as to age or previous imprisonment, which adds to the per cent of denied cases at the reformatory.

We submit tables with the information required by the statute, and in addition thereto, such facts as we believe would be valuable for future reference and comparison, and valuable to those 6

who are using criminal statistics for the purpose of arriving at conclusions as to how best to handle the criminal class. By these tables you will observe that 17 per cent of the indeterminate men paroled have violated their paroles and been either apprehended and returned to the penitentiary or reformatory, or have absconded: while 83 per cent have made good and been recommended for discharge, or are still reporting. Of the men who were serving determinate sentences on parole, 22 per cent have proven derelict, and 78 per cent have made good. Of the entire number paroled, both determinate and indeterminate, forty-three have violated their paroles: of this number nineteen have been returned to the penitentiary or the reformatory, and twenty-four have absconded and are still at large, except one who has been located in prison in another state and will be returned to serve the remainder of his sentence. Of th total number paroled one hundred forty-six are from the reformatory, and seventy-five are from the penitentiary. Of the total number who have violated their parole, thirty-two are from the reformatory, and eleven from the penitentiary.

While the securing of employment for paroled prisoners and of men who will have oversight over them and verify their reports to the board and keep the board informed as to their conduct while on parole are problems which sometimes cause delay in the release of men after their parole has been voted, yet we have not experienced serious difficulty in these matters. We have been greatly aided by the wardens and the officers of the prisons in securing places for men, and also by the Rev. Charles Parsons of the city of Des Moines who is representative for the Iowa Division of the "National Society for the Friendless," a society whose general office is at Kansas City in the state of Missouri, and whose work, if it is to be judged by what he is doing in Iowa, is a good factor in the work of aiding the unfortunate of our fellow men. We have found the need of more direct supervision of paroled men than it was possible for us to give, and have recently employed a parole agent, who began his work September 1, 1910, and we believe such work will result in saving some to good lives, who would otherwise not make good. Personal supervision of paroled men is as we believe, found to be by all who have had to do with the administration of the parole system necessary to the best results, and from the limited experience we have had, it is our judgment that such is the fact.

In dealing with men who have been convicted of crime, there are at least three things which must be taken into account in administering the penalties provided by law:

First, the punishment of the offender.

Second, the deterrent effect of punishment on others.

Third, the reformation of the individual.

The last for his own good and the good of his family and friends, and the indirect benefit which the making of a good citizen out of a bad one will be to society. These things are important in the reverse order of their statement.

The study of the individual, the obtaining of the most accurate information possible concerning his past life, environment and habits are necessary to the determination of when clemency should be extended to a derelict, and these things cannot be had as fully as they should be by this board in the time which can now be given to each individual ease, nor is it possible to take up as promptly as it should be done cases where the best results both to the individual and society would come from putting men on parole before commitment to the prisons. From our study and experience, we think there are cases of single offenders belonging to the younger class, whom it would not be wise to imprison, and equally unwise not to convict. However, many which would seem to be such cases are found on examination to be such that a failure to punish to some extent would not be for the best interests of the individual.

We are impressed, from three and one-half years of experience in administering the laws providing for indeterminate sentence and release under parole, that the most valuable feature of these laws is that under them the state does not in the first instance seem to say to a man when he is sentenced, that one year, two years, five years, or other definite time is what you ought to pay as a penalty for your wrong doing, and thus at the end of his time leave him with the impression that he has paid his debt; but rather says to him, you have done such a wrong as that for a time you must for your own good and that of the public, be confined, and in the meantime the state will investigate, and from what you have done and what, "you have been, and what your opportunities and environments have been and what your tendencies seem to be, judge as nearly as possible what may reasonably be expected of you in the future, and deal with you accordingly."

The release of a man under such conditions is equivalent to saying to him, "The state has confidence in you, and because of this releases you and gives you opportunity to prove that such confidence is well placed." A man then goes out, not as a man who by suffering has paid his debt, but feeling that he is released because the state believes in him and believes in his ability and willingness to make good. The per cent of men overtaken in crime, to whom the expression of confidence does not appeal and are not thereby inspired to effort for better living, is small. The man who goes out of prison with this inspiration is much more likely to make good than the man who has served his time; for the man who is not inspired by this expression of confidence in him on the part of the state, there is, as a rule, little hope.

To select the man who has honest impulses and ambitions for better living, from among the men whose only desire is release, is the problem that confronts the tribunals vested with authority to terminate punishment. The fact that it is impossible in all cases to come to correct conclusions, should not cause the state to fail in its efforts to administer the law in a manner that will result in releasing men who give evidence of having such ambitions and desires, with such control of themselves as will justify expectation of good results, as rapidly as justice to the public will warrant.

We present herewith a copy of the rules of the board which apply in consideration of cases for parole and governing convicts who have been paroled, all of which we most respectfully submit.

The tables showing abstract of criminal statistics of the returns received from the clerks of the district court, begin with October 1, 1908, and cover the period from that date to and including June 30, 1910. This was made necessary by the reason that the general assembly changed the date to which the clerk should report from September 30th of each year, to June 30th of each year, and the report by the secretary of state made November 21, 1908, brought the tables to and including September 30, 1908, and to have included in this report the time from July 1, 1908, to September 30, 1908, making a full two year period, would have been a duplication that would have confused statistics.

We beg to call your attention to the fact that the item of "Printing and postage used in connection with criminal statistics," named as one of the items of expense to be reported by the clerks, is one that we do not believe can ever be arrived at with any considerable

degree of accuracy, besides it is not a large item of expense, and we recommend that section two (2), chapter three (3) of the acts of the Thirty-third General Assembly be amended by striking out the clause above quoted. It will be found by examination of the above mentioned section that the expense of witnesses in the trial of criminal cases is not included. This expense is one of considerable amount, and we recommend that said section be amended so as to include that item of expense.

#### RULES GOVERNING APPLICATION FOR PAROLE.

- 1. The regular sessions of the board will be held at its office in the Capitol, on the first Monday in January, April, July and October; provided that when the first Monday shall fall on a holiday, the board will meet on the following day. At the regular sessions of the board special sessions may be arranged for. Special session in case of emergency may be called by the Chairman of the board.
- 2. All convicts serving under indeterminate sentence shall be considered applicants for parole after serving a period of eleven months in the reformatory or penitentiary, but in cases where the maximum sentence is two years or less, they shall be considered applicants after serving a period of six months. Convicts serving definite terms may apply for a parole at any time. Any convict may in person apply to the board when it is in session at the reformatory or penitentiary, to have his case considered before he has served the time fixed herein.
- 3. Prisoners being considered for parole will be required to make a statement on blanks furnished for that purpose. The applicant must make out his own statement, if he is able to do so; if unable to make such statement, the same will be made out for him by a prison official designated for that purpose by the warden. Statements prepared by persons outside the prison and sent to the prisoner for his signature, or applications signed in blank and sent to one not authorized, to be filled in, will not be considered.
- 4. Judgment by the Board of Parole as to worthiness of the applicant for parole will be based on the following considerations, arranged in the order of their relative importance:
  - 1st. Previous record and environment,
  - 2nd. Record and character of the applicant as established in the institution.
  - 3rd. Nature and character of the crime committed.
  - 4th. Probable surroundings of paroled.
  - 5th. Information and impressions gained from a personal interview with the applicant.
  - 6th. All other facts bearing upon the advisability of parole the board may be able to obtain.
- 5. Employment at some honorable calling, with some responsible and respectable person or persons, or corporation, shall first be secured for the proposed paroled inmate for a term not less than six months; such employment to be within the state of Iowa. When by a corporation, some individual member of the same, or other person, must assume the responsibility as an individual to care for the proposed paroled inmate. Such employer shall promise to report promptly any unnecessary absence from work, tendency to evil associations, intemperance or other violation of the conditions of the parole, and shall

certify to the correctness of the monthly report required. The fitness of the employer to advise and superintend the conduct of the convict while on parole shall be certified to by a district judge, county official, or by one personally known by a member of the board.

6. Each application will be considered in the order in which it is received, except in extraordinary cases when the board may order that an exception be made to the rule. An application which has once been denied will not be reopened within one year, unless when the same is passed upon, the board shall make order therefor. The question of the sufficiency of the showing for a reopening lies wholly within the discretion of the board.

Any evidence tending to sustain or disprove the grounds of an apheard by the board when in session. All persons possessing material information which will be of value in determining the merit of the application are requested to communicate the same to the board. Correspondence should be addressed to the Secretary of the Board of Parole, Des Moines, Iowa. Correspondence addressed to the individual members of the board will not be considered. Oral statements must be made to the board when in session and not to the individual members thereof.

7. The files in any case will not be open to inspection by the applicant or other persons unless it is shown that the ends of justice require their disclosure, and then only on the order of the board.

8. The board may impose upon the convict ordered paroled such special conditions as it may deem advisable, failure to comply with which shall constitute a violation of parole, for which the convict may be returned to the institution from which he was paroled.

9. It is inadvisable for a convict or his relatives or friends to expend money in the employment of attorneys to draw papers. All cases will be given equal consideration and action will be taken as promptly as possible. Oral statements by attorneys will not be permitted during the sessions of the board at which parole applications are being determined. All matters appertaining to the case must so far as practicable be submitted in writing and filed with the Secretary.

#### GENERAL RULES GOVERNING CONVICTS ON PAROLE.

The paroled prisoner shall proceed at once to the place of employment provided for him and enter upon his work, and shall not change his place of employment or residence without the consent of the Board of Parole.

2. He shall on the first day of each month, until his final release, transmit to the board a report of himself, stating whether he has been constantly at work during the preceding month, and if not employed the reason for the same. His report must show how much he has earned, how much expended, how much he has on hand, and a general statement of his surroundings and prospects. Such report must be indorsed as correct by his employer.

- 3. He shall in all respects conduct himself honestly, avoid evil associations, spend his evenings after working hours at home, and, in general, conduct himself as an honorable and law-abiding citizen, and shall totally abstain from the use of intoxicating liquors, from smoking cigarettes, and from visiting saloons and all places of evil repute.
- He shall, while on parole, remain in the legal custody and under the control of the board.
- 5. He shall be liable to be retaken and again confined within the prison or reformatory from which he was paroled for any reasons that are satisfactory to the board.
- 6. If he fails to report to the board on the first day of each month or violates any of the conditions imposed in his parole agreement, he forfeits his parole and renders himself liable to be returned at once to the institution from which he was paroled, to serve out the unexpired portion of his maximum sentence.
- No paroled prisoner shall, during the term of his parole, leave the state.
- 8. The Board of Parole takes a lively interest in all paroled prisoners, and they need not hesitate to freely communicate with the Secretary in case they become unable to labor by reason of sickness or otherwise. It is the intention of the board in granting a parole to give the convict the option of becoming a good, respectable and industrious cities or of serving out the unexpired portion of his maximum sentence.
