Since 1994, the Quad City Engineering and Science Council with its member societies, local businesses, and regional universities have annually provide one-time scholarships to high school seniors studying [STEM](#) ([Science](#), [Technology](#), [Engineering](#) or [Mathematics](#)) at either an accredited four-year college or university, an Associates degree at a community or junior college, or a skilled trades certification.

Applicants must be a Quad City area resident in the Illinois Counties of Carroll, Henry, Knox, Lee, Mercer, Rock Island, or Whiteside, or in the Iowa Counties of Clinton, Scott, Muscatine, or Louisa.

Hamilton Relay Scholarship

High School Scholarships

Creating opportunities to further a student's higher education is a priority for Hamilton Relay. The goal of the Hamilton Relay Scholarship is to support students who are deaf, hard of hearing, DeafBlind or have difficulty speaking in their post-secondary education.

The Hamilton Relay Scholarship is extended to a qualifying high school student living within one of the states where Hamilton Relay is the contracted telecommunications relay and/or captioned telephone service provider. This includes California, District of Columbia, Georgia, Idaho, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Montana, New Mexico, Pennsylvania, Saipan, Utah, Virginia and Washington.

In each of these states, a \$500 scholarship will be awarded to one eligible applicant.

WHAT

Iowa College & Career Readiness Academy is a suite of Iowa-specific online courses for college access and success professionals.

HOW

The courses enable educators, school counselors and administrators to provide equitable postsecondary opportunities for all students.

WHY

School counselors and other educators are crucial to Iowa students' postsecondary access and success!

Iowa College & Career Readiness Academy graduates help their schools and districts develop practices that lead to postsecondary success, ensuring that all students—especially low-income and first-generation—have access to postsecondary opportunities. Participants learn to effectively prepare students for education beyond high school, whether through on-the-job training or at a trade school, college or university.

These are Iowa's only online interactive college and career courses, developed by our state's professionals and based on current data. Iowa College & Career Readiness Academy is open to anyone working in the college access field. Participants earn a certificate and can also earn license renewal or graduate credit.
