Cooke (The Augusta Baker Endowed Chair in Childhood Literacy at the University of South Carolina) announces a new online publication, *The Reservoir: A Chronicle for Collective Change*. Beginning in 2022, *The*

Reservoir will publish **critical reviews of youth books** that prominently feature characters and people from historically marginalized communities, **critical annotated bibliographies**, and **biographies of BIPoC who engage in this important work**. Initially, publication will be biannual (May and November).

Molly of Denali is designed to help kids develop knowledge and skills for interacting with informational texts through video content, interactive games and real-world activities. Join Molly, an Alaska Native girl, her dog Suki, and friends Tooey and Trini on their adventures in epically beautiful Alaska. In each episode, Molly's life and adventures are enhanced, illuminated and broadened by using and creating a variety of informational texts, including books, online resources, Indigenous knowledge from elders, maps and more. With a strong emphasis on literacy education and outdoor adventures, this kit will be a perfect addition to your library's

summer program.

To provide your library ample planning time, the kit will arrive by June 1 and will include all the items you need to host a fun and engaging event for the children in your community! You are welcome to use the materials whenever it works best for your program schedule.

Edelweiss+ serves as a single source of information to sell, discover, and order new titles.

Above the Treeline proudly serves thousands of book retailers, libraries, and publishing houses across the United States and Europe with millions of titles, including virtually all of the currently available US Trade frontlists.

Once you create a free account you can request advanced reader ebook copies. There are different catalogs you can view to help with collection development, as well as reviews from other librarians, publishers, etc.
