The Fourth Quarter Fiscal Year 2022 Intended Use Plans (IUPs) for the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) and the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) are now available for public review and comment at the following locations:

The IUPs cover the period of July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022. Public comments are welcome. Draft project lists are also available for review.

ASDWA's LSL Inventory Symposium

On Wednesday, February 2nd, ASDWA kicked off the first of an eight-part webinar series to examine an assortment of topics related to lead service line (LSL) inventories. The intent of ASDWA's Lead Service Line Symposium is to maximize the transfer of data

and information between states, utilities, consultants, technical assistance providers, and drinking water sector partners.

ASDWA's Lead Service Line Symposium will be held each Wednesday in February (2/2, 2/9, 2/16, and 2/23) and will feature a morning session (from 11:00-12:30 p.m. EST) and an afternoon session (3:00-4:30 p.m. EST). Each session will consist of approximately 45-60 minutes of presentations and panel discussion, followed by 30-45 minutes for questions and answers. The symposium will be recorded and archived on ASDWA's website so please register to ensure access to the archive. The symposium is free to attend and open to all who work in drinking water. Note, ASDWA is unable to provide CEUs for this event.

Unregulated Contaminants Monitoring Rule (UCMR5) Meetings and Materials

EPA is in the process of contacting lowa's public water systems (PWS) to make them aware that the EPA's records indicate that the PWS is subject to the requirements of the next <u>Unregulated Contaminants Monitoring Rule (UCMR 5)</u>, published on December 27, 2021 (86 FR 73131). UCMR 5 requires certain PWSs to collect drinking water samples for 29 per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) and lithium analysis during a 12-month period between 2023 and 2025.

EPA will host two identical virtual meetings (via webinar) on March 16 and 17, 2022, to provide public water systems (PWSs), states, laboratories, and other stakeholders with a comprehensive overview of the UCMR 5 program. The meetings will address: a general introduction to the UCMR program, PWSs subject to UCMR 5 requirements, the analytes to be monitored, monitoring locations and frequency, reporting requirements, ground water representative monitoring plans (GWRMPs), and the laboratory approval program.
