

Today, three centuries later, people are still discovering that lowa's northeast corner is one of the most beautiful parts of this land that is laced with history and natural scenic beauty.


It is a land that is rich with the heritage of miners, trappers, hunters, explorers and Indian culture.










Great Rivers Region



You can enjoy a variety of activities—canoeing, boating, camping, fall color displays and some of the country's best river fishing.












Indian Hills Lake Region


Plan also to spend time enjoying this region's charming and quaint country festivals which celebrate everything from tulips to antique airplanes.



It is not surprising, in a region chocked full of history, to find a number of museums and landmarks. Much of what was left behind has been preserved for everyone to enjoy today.


The Missouri River fly-way provides a heavy migration of ducks and geese every spring and fall, making this region a paradise for sportsmen & naturalists alike.



Heart of Iowa




When you travel to the Heart of Iowa region, whether on vacation or a weekend trip, you will experience that which is the most "typically Iowa" of all the regions.



Siouxland



Indian canoes cut quietly through the waters of a blue lake, proud hunters ride across the prairie grass chasing huge herds of buffalo. Smoke drifts softly skyward from and Indian camp near a stream, "The Beautiful Land" unfolds as far as the eye can see.

The region is Siouxland, an original hunting and fishing land of the Sioux Indians.

Today this area is a recreational haven for all who visit this region's many lakes. One is the sight of a famous massacre, another is one of three blue water lakes in the world.

In addition to the recreational facilities at the lakes, there are quaint small town festivals throughout the region celebrating everything from Irishmen to tulips.


Other sightseeing musts are a replica of an original prairie fort and a religious grotto, which has been called one of the "Wonders" of the world.

Winter sports have seen rapid growth making Siouxland, like all of Iowa, twelve months of recreational fun.












In early summer you can almost hear the music man and his "76 trombones," as this region plays host to a mammoth high school band festival.



EXPLANATION OF INTERLOCKING LOOPS


This map is designed to show you how you can combine the loops of more than one region to make your own multi-regional mini-vacation.
