




Celebrate Iowa History Month in March

The Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs invites Iowans of all ages to learn more about our state's past throughout **Iowa History Month**. Every March, this statewide tradition offers new opportunities to learn more about remarkable Iowans from all walks of life who have influenced their communities, their state, their country and, in many cases, the entire world.

Starting with a proclamation from Gov. Kim Reynolds, the month offers an array of in-person and online programs organized by the State Historical Society of Iowa. Tune in to [online presentations](#), take part in [activities designed for families and children](#), browse the [new Iowa History Collection Catalog](#) and take [guided tours](#) at the State Historical Museum of Iowa in Des Moines.

This year, Iowans can also see a pop-up display about "**Iowa's People & Places**," which the museum sent to all 99 counties to mark Iowa's 175th anniversary of statehood. (Here's a [list of locations](#), but we suggest calling ahead to confirm.) Across the state, schools, libraries, museums and other organizations are hosting their own history events to add to the month-long celebration.
