

## 'Hollywood in the Heartland' Virtual Tour




## Americana Corner Grant

### Teacher Professional Development Class

**June 20-21**

Teachers are invited to a **new in-person professional development** opportunity led by State Historical Museum of Iowa staff along with elementary- and middle-school teachers. The course will lead participants through **best practices for integrating inquiry and primary sources** into K-12 classrooms and show how to create a lesson plan using compelling or supporting questions and relevant primary sources. ## New Round of History Grants Now Open

The State Historical Society of Iowa has opened a new **round of grant opportunities** that support the preservation of Iowa history. Iowans are encouraged to apply for the following programs:

### **Research Grants for Authors**

Up to \$1,000 each is available to support original research related to the history of Iowa, or Iowa and the Midwest. If you apply and receive a grant, you'll also produce an annotated manuscript to be considered for publication in The Annals of Iowa, our scholarly history journal. **Application deadline: April 15.**



### **Country School Grants**

Up to \$5,000 each is available to preserve or maintain a one- or two-room country school in Iowa, or provide historical interpretation or educational activities related to the school. **Application deadline: May 2**

### **Historical Resource Development Program Grants**

Up to \$50,000 each is available to help preserve, conserve, interpret, enhance and educate the public about historic preservation, museum collections and documentary collections. **Application deadline: May 2**

Applicants are highly encouraged to review the guidelines and note the deadlines for the program to which they are applying.


