Iowa Department of Natural Resources Air Quality Bureau Chief, Catharine Fitzsimmons, and ambient air monitoring program lead, Sean Fitzsimmons, are retiring after a combined 59 years of public service in air quality. Catharine will retire on March 31, and Sean will retire on April 14.
