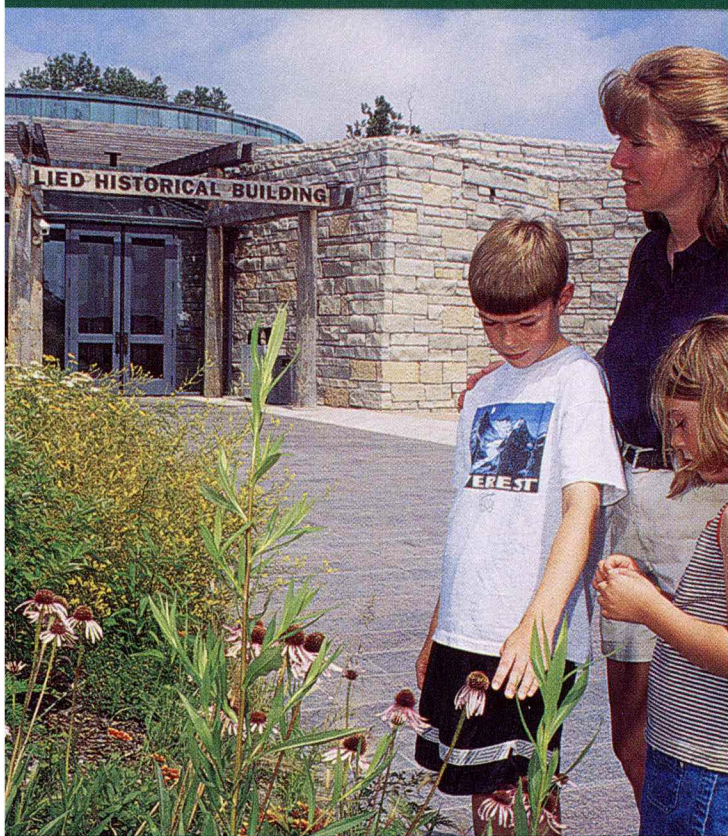


Western Historic Trails Center

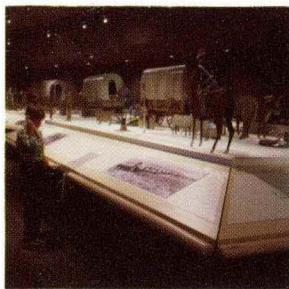
Western Historic Trails Center

Council Bluffs, Iowa

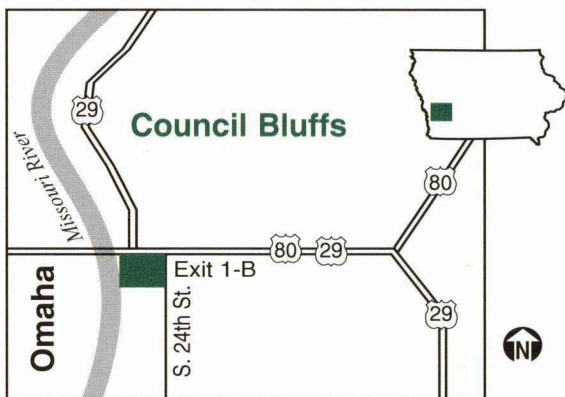
On the banks of the Missouri River in Council Bluffs, explore the Western Historic Trails Center. The center boasts new exhibits

on the history of four western historic trails, original sculptures by Tim Woodman, contemporary photographs by Greg MacGregor and a film by award-winning filmmaker John Allen. The WHTC is an official Iowa Welcome Center. A museum shop offers books, maps, videos and souvenirs related to western history.

Other points of interest in the area include the General Dodge House, the Rails West Museum, the Squirrel Cage Jail, Lake Manawa State Park, the reconstructed log Mormon Tabernacle, the Western Heritage Museum, the Joslyn Museum, Boys Town and the Henry Doorly Zoo. There are three new casinos in Council Bluffs, many fine restaurants and a wide choice of lodging.
