

#### FOREWORD

Chapter 280 of the <u>Code</u> of <u>Iowa</u> requires that the history of Iowa be included in the courses of study and taught in Iowa schools.

Senate File 553, passed by the 61st General Assembly, amends Chapter 257 of the  $\underline{\text{Code}}$  of  $\underline{\text{Iowa}}$  and requires that Iowa history be taught at the elementary level (grades 1 through 6). This is an indication of the importance of Iowa's heritage to the youth of Iowa. A knowledge of history helps us in understanding how we became what we are. Local history has special merit in that it supplies illustrative material which may be related to national history.

To meet the continuing need of teachers for curriculum and instructional materials, the Iowa State Department of Public Instruction has furnished educators with courses of study, handbooks, curriculum guides, and resource units. In addition, a variety of articles on teaching methods and techniques have appeared in the Educational Bulletin. As a continuation of this program, this Directory has been developed with the help of county and local historical societies and museums in Iowa. The Directory provides information, much of which has not previously been available, in convenient reference form, and should be of special interest to teachers of history.

The basic organization of the <u>Directory</u> is by areas of the state. Iowa has been divided into quarters, as indicated by the map (page iv), with approximately the same number of counties in each of the four areas. Within each of these areas, the counties appear in alphabetical order. Under each county will be found the names of all known societies and museums within the county, listed in alphabetical order by name of organization. Whenever available and applicable, information for each entry includes name of society, organization, or museum; address; person to contact; date organized; meetings; number of members; dues; features; hours open to the public; admission; and activities.


The <u>Directory</u> provides the teacher of history with a number of possibilities for enriching units of study. It offers resource material for use within the class. It may be used as a guide to construct an itinerary for a field trip. It provides information which may be used to stimulate interest in forming a junior historian's club, or establishing a school museum resource center.

An attempt has been made to make the <u>Directory</u> as inclusive and accurate as possible. All readers are encouraged to bring to the attention of the Publications Section, Department of Public Instruction, any additions or corrections so these may be included in supplements to, or future editions of, this <u>Directory</u>.






